Comparison of Race and Hispanic Origin Data

- Race and Hispanic origin are two separate concepts in the federal statistical system.
 - People who are Hispanic may be of any race.
 - People in each race group may be either Hispanic or Not Hispanic.
 - Each person has two attributes, their race (or races) and whether or not they are Hispanic.
- Overlap of race and Hispanic origin is the main comparability issue.
 - For example, Black Hispanics (Hispanic Blacks) are included in both the number of Blacks and in the number of Hispanics.

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
When You Say: “I Need Demographic Data”

Key Questions When Using Data:

- For which geographic area?
Census geography tells us *where*
- Which demographic characteristic?
Census population and housing data tells us *how many*
- For which year?
Census 2000 or other decennial census

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Census Geographic Pyramid



Census Geography: Two Broad Categories

- Legal and Administrative Entities**
Geographic areas that originate from legal action, treaties, statutes, ordinances, resolutions, or court decisions. Examples: States, Counties, Incorporated Places, Amer. Indian Reservations, Hawaiian Home Lands, Congressional Districts, Voting Districts, ZIP Codes
- Statistical Entities**
Areas that evolve from practice, custom, usage, or need. Specific examples: Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSA's), Urbanized Areas, Census County Divisions, Census Tracts, Block Groups, Blocks

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Census Small-Area Geography

Use census small-area geography to delineate:

- Neighborhoods
- Communities
- Marketing Areas
- Trade Areas
- Social Service Delivery Areas
- Planning Areas

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Census Geography

Census Designated Place

- No legally defined corporate limits (unincorporated)
- Defined by the Census Bureau in cooperation with State, Tribal and local officials
- Identified in data tables by the acronym CDP following the place name
- All places in Hawaii are Census Designated Places

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Census Geography

Census Tract

- Small, relatively permanent statistical subdivision of a county
- Average of 1,000 housing units & 4,000 people
- Census tracts are designed to be relatively homogeneous units with respect to population characteristics, economic status, and living conditions
- Aggregate census tracts to delineate communities, neighborhoods, social service delivery areas, planning areas, marketing or trade areas within a city or CDP

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Census Geography

Block Group

- Subdivision of a census tract
- Block group is the smallest geographic unit for the tabulation of sample data
- Block group consists of all blocks within a census tract with the same beginning number

Block

- Smallest geographic unit for which the Census Bureau tabulates 100% data
- Many blocks correspond to individual city blocks bounded by streets
- Blocks in rural areas, may include many square miles and have boundaries that are not streets



- 249 iterations of race and Hispanic or Latino categories, American Indian and Alaska Native Tribes down to the census tract level
- 1 iteration for the total population
- 100% data for any American Indian, Asian, Hispanic or Latino category
- Threshold: minimum of 100 persons in the group per census tract for data to be shown. Examples: age for Chinese (versus Asian), tenure for Mexican (versus Hispanic), household relationship for Navajo (versus American Indian)

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SF 4 Thresholds

A table is repeated for a race, Hispanic, or ancestry group if :

1. An area has 100 or more persons in that group (applies only to race & Hispanic groups).
2. An area has 50 or more unweighted cases for a specified group (applies to race, Hispanic, & ancestry groups).

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Differences Between Summary File 4 & Summary File 3

- PCT tables generally a subset of the P or PCT tables in SF3
- SF4 HCT tables are all found in SF3
- Some additional detail by age & sex
- Some additional income & poverty detail
- Detailed data for 102 industries broken down by sex - PCT85 (26 industries in SF3)
- Detailed data for 125 occupations broken down by sex - PCT86 (46 occupations in SF3)
- 20 tables unique to SF4

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Ancestry

Use SF3 & SF4 in tandem:

- SF3 (tables PCT 15-18) has population totals for 109 ancestry groups and identifies whether ancestries are the first or second reported.
- SF4 provides characteristics data (i.e., table repetitions) for 86 groups with no reference to first or second ancestry.

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Language Spoken at Home

Use SF3 & SF4 in tandem:

- With a breakdown for age, SF3 (PCT10) has data on 40 different languages spoken at home ("speak only English" and 39 others).
- SF4 (PCT40) has data on broad language groups.

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Place of Birth – Foreign Born

Use SF3 & SF4 in tandem:

- For the foreign-born population, SF3 (PCT19) has population totals for 125 world regions and countries.
- SF4 (PCT47-48) has only regional totals.
- However, SF4 has considerable data on the foreign-born population by sex.



Median Years of Age





Hawaii Median Age by Race Alone, Race Alone or in Combination, & Hispanic











Hawaii Household Size by Race Alone vs. Race Alone or in Combination & Hispanic




Region of Birth of the Foreign-born








Hawaii Median Household Income by Race Alone & Hispanic

Hawaii Per Capita Income by Race Alone & Hispanic



Persons Below Poverty






