T Minimum population threshold was not met for that area or components of that area. The population threshold on Summary File 4 is 100. In addition, there must be at least 50 or more unweighted cases of the population group.

1/ Data are based on the U.S. poverty thresholds and for population for whom poverty status is determined. Poverty status was determined for all people except institutionalized people, people in military group quarters and in college dormitories, and unrelated individuals under 15 years old. These groups also were excluded from the numerator and denominator when calculating poverty rates. They were considered neither "poor" nor "nonpoor". Poverty thresholds in Hawaii are about 15 percent higher; these statistics accordingly understate the prevalence of poverty in Hawaii.

2/ Includes Kalawao County.

3/ Maui County excluding Kalawao County contained 99.9% of this area's population while Kalawao County had the remaining 0.1% of the area's Japanese race alone or in combination population according to the 100-percent data (SF1). For Maui County excluding Kalawao County, the median household income was \$51,129; the median family income was \$63,314; the per capital income was \$22,620; the percent below poverty for families was 4.9; and the percent below poverty for persons was 8.1.

4/ Although median income data for Kauai Island are not available, it should be noted that Kauai Island contained 99.9% of the county's Japanese race alone and in combination population while Niihau Island had the remaining 0.1% of the county's population according to the 100-percent data (SF1).
