

HOUSEHOLDS AND FAMILIES: From 2005-2007 there were 10,000 households in Waimalu CDP. The average household size was 2.8 people.

Families made up 72 percent of the households in Waimalu CDP. This figure includes both married-couple families (56 percent) and other families (16 percent). Nonfamily households made up 28 percent of all households in Waimalu CDP. Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were composed of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.

The Types of Households in Waimalu CDP, Hawaii in 2005-2007






NATIVITY AND LANGUAGE: Data for this section cannot be displayed because the number of sample cases is too small. Displaying the data would risk disclosing information for individuals.

GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY: From 2005-2007, 87 percent of the people at least one year old living in Waimalu CDP were living in the same residence one year earlier; 8 percent had moved during the past year from another residence in the same county, less than 0.5 percent from another county in the same state, 3 percent from another state, and 2 percent from abroad.

Geographic Mobility of Residents of Waimalu CDP, Hawaii in 2005-2007





EDUCATION: From 2005-2007, 93 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 35 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Seven percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Waimalu CDP was 7,100 from 2005-2007. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 790 and elementary or high school enrollment was 3,700 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 2,600.

The Educational Attainment of People in Waimalu CDP, Hawaii in 2005-2007






DISABILITY: In Waimalu CDP, among people at least five years old from 2005-2007, 10 percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from 2 percent of people 5 to 15 years old, to 7 percent of people 16 to 64 years old, and to 32 percent of those 65 and older.

INDUSTRIES: From 2005-2007, for the employed population 16 years and older, the leading industries in Waimalu CDP were Educational services, and health care, and social assistance, 22 percent, and Public administration, 13 percent.


OCCUPATIONS AND TYPE OF EMPLOYER: Among the most common occupations were: Management, professional, and related occupations, 39 percent; Sales and office occupations, 25 percent; Service occupations, 20 percent; Construction, extraction, maintenance and repair occupations, 9 percent; and Production, transportation, and material moving occupations, 7 percent. Sixty-five percent of the people employed were Private wage and salary workers; 28 percent was Federal, state, or local government workers; and 6 percent was Self-employed in own not incorporated business workers.

TRAVEL TO WORK: Seventy-four percent of Waimalu CDP workers drove to work alone from 2005-2007, 13 percent carpooled, 5 percent took public transportation, and 5 percent used other means. The remaining 3 percent worked at home. Among those who commuted to work, it took them on average 26.2 minutes to get to work.

INCOME: The median income of households in Waimalu CDP was \$78,695. Eighty-nine percent of the households received earnings and 24 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Twenty-five percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$16,410. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.

POVERTY AND PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS: From 2005-2007, 4 percent of people were in poverty. Four percent of related children under 18 were below the poverty level, compared with 4 percent of people 65 years old and over. Two percent of all families and 6 percent of families with a female householder and no husband present had incomes below the poverty level.


Poverty Rates in Waimalu CDP, Hawaii in 2005-2007

POPULATION OF Waimalu CDP: From 2005-2007, Waimalu CDP had a total population of 29,000 - 15,000 (51 percent) females and 14,000 (49 percent) males. The median age was 41.2 years. Eighteen percent of the population was under 18 years and 13 percent was 65 years and older.

The Age Distribution of People in Waimalu CDP, Hawaii in 2005-2007



For people reporting one race alone, 19 percent was White; 8 percent was Black or African American; less than 0.5 percent was American Indian and Alaska Native; 65 percent was Asian; 7 percent was Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and less than 0.5 percent was Some other race. Nineteen percent reported Two or more races. Four percent of the people in Waimalu CDP was Hispanic. Fifteen percent of the people in Waimalu CDP was White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS: From 2005-2007, Waimalu CDP had a total of 11,000 housing units, 5 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 46 percent was in single-unit structures, 54 percent was in multi-unit structures, and less than 0.5 percent was mobile homes. Five percent of the housing units were built since 1990.

OCCUPIED HOUSING UNIT CHARACTERISTICS: From 2005-2007, Waimalu CDP had 10,000 occupied housing units - 6,600 (63 percent) owner occupied and 3,900 (37 percent) renter occupied. Four percent of the households did not have telephone service and 3 percent of the households did not have access to a car, truck, or van for private use. Multi Vehicle households were not rare. Forty percent had two vehicles and another 21 percent had three or more.
