

NOTE. HOUSEHOLDS AND FAMILIES: In 2006-2008 there were 12,000 households in Kailua CDP (Honolulu County). The average household size was 3.1 people.

Families made up 77 percent of the households in Kailua CDP (Honolulu County). This figure includes both married-couple families (62 percent) and other families (15 percent). Nonfamily households made up 23 percent of all households in Kailua CDP (Honolulu County). Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were composed of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.




The Types of Households in Kailua CDP (Honolulu County), Hawaii in 2006-2008

GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY: In 2006-2008, 88 percent of the people at least one year old living in Kailua CDP (Honolulu County) were living in the same residence one year earlier; 6 percent had moved during the past year from another residence in the same county, less than 0.5 percent from another county in the same state, 5 percent from another state, and less than 0.5 percent from abroad.


Geographic Mobility of Residents of Kailua CDP (Honolulu County), Hawaii in 2006-2008



EDUCATION: In 2006-2008, 95 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 44 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Five percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Kailua CDP (Honolulu County) was 9,400 in 2006-2008. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 1,100 and elementary or high school enrollment was 5,900 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 2,400.







INDUSTRIES: In 2006-2008, for the employed population 16 years and older, the leading industries in Kailua CDP (Honolulu County) were Educational services, and health care, and social assistance, 24 percent, and Arts, entertainment, and recreation, and accommodation, and food services, 13 percent.

OCCUPATIONS AND TYPE OF EMPLOYER: Among the most common occupations were: Management, professional, and related occupations, 48 percent; Sales and office occupations, 22 percent; Service occupations, 16 percent; Construction, extraction, maintenance and repair occupations, 9 percent; and Production, transportation, and material moving occupations, 5 percent. Sixty-eight percent of the people employed were Private wage and salary workers; 20 percent was Federal, state, or local government workers; and 12 percent was Self-employed in own not incorporated business workers.


TRAVEL TO WORK: Sixty-seven percent of Kailua CDP (Honolulu County) workers drove to work alone in 2006-2008, 15 percent carpooled, 5 percent took public transportation, and 6 percent used other means. The remaining 6 percent worked at home. Among those who commuted to work, it took them on average 27.4 minutes to get to work.

INCOME: The median income of households in Kailua CDP (Honolulu County) was \$93,670. Eighty-seven percent of the households received earnings and 26 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Thirty-two percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$16,615. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.

POVERTY AND PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS: In 2006-2008, 6 percent of people were in poverty. Seven percent of related children under 18 were below the poverty level, compared with 3 percent of people 65 years old and over. Five percent of all families and 15 percent of families with a female householder and no husband present had incomes below the

poverty level.






POPULATION OF Kailua CDP (Honolulu County): In 2006-2008, Kailua CDP (Honolulu County) had a total population of 37,000 - 18,000 (50 percent) females and 18,000 (50 percent) males. The median age was 41.7 years. Twenty-four percent of the population was under 18 years and 15 percent was 65 years and older.









For people reporting one race alone, 50 percent was White; 1 percent was Black or African American; 1 percent was American Indian and Alaska Native; 19 percent was Asian; 6 percent was Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and 1 percent was Some other race. Twenty-two percent reported Two or more races. Seven percent of the people in Kailua CDP (Honolulu County) was Hispanic. Forty-nine percent of the people in Kailua CDP (Honolulu County) was White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS: In 2006-2008, Kailua CDP (Honolulu County) had a total of 13,000 housing units, 7 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 81 percent was in single-unit structures, 19 percent was in multi-unit structures, and less than 0.5 percent was mobile homes. Six percent of the housing units were built since 1990.




Percent of housing units

OCCUPIED HOUSING UNIT CHARACTERISTICS: In 2006-2008, Kailua CDP (Honolulu County) had 12,000 occupied housing units - 8,500 (72 percent) owner occupied and 3,300 (28 percent) renter occupied. Two percent of the households did not have telephone service and 5 percent of the households did not have access to a car, truck, or van for private use. Multi Vehicle households were not rare. Forty-six percent had two vehicles and another 26 percent had three or more.

HOUSING COSTS: The median monthly housing costs for mortgaged owners was \$2,801, nonmortgaged owners \$558, and renters \$1,731. Forty-seven percent of owners with mortgages, 9 percent of owners without mortgages, and 51 percent of renters in Kailua CDP (Honolulu County) spent 30 percent or more of household income on housing.
