
NOTE. Although the American Community Survey (ACS) produces population, demographic and housing unit estimates, it is the Census Bureau's Population Estimates Program that produces and disseminates the official estimates of the population for the nation, states, counties, cities and towns and estimates of housing units for states and counties.

HOUSEHOLDS AND FAMILIES: In 2005-2009 there were 440 households in Kaanapali CDP. The average household size was 2.2 people.

Families made up 71 percent of the households in Kaanapali CDP. This figure includes both married-couple families (66 percent) and other families (6 percent). Nonfamily households made up 29 percent of all households in Kaanapali CDP. Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were composed of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.


NATIVITY AND LANGUAGE: Thirteen percent of the people living in Kaanapali CDP in 2005-2009 were foreign born. Eighty-seven percent was native, including 12 percent who were born in Hawaii.

Among people at least five years old living in Kaanapali CDP in 2005-2009, 8 percent spoke a language other than English at home. Of those speaking a language other than English at home, 22 percent spoke Spanish and 78 percent spoke some other language; 3 percent reported that they did not speak English "very well."

GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY: In 2005-2009, 85 percent of the people at least one year old living in Kaanapali CDP were living in the same residence one year earlier; 9 percent had moved during the past year from another residence in the same county, less than 0.5 percent from another county in the same state, 5 percent from another state, and 1 percent from abroad.



EDUCATION: In 2005-2009, 97 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 50 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Three percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Kaanapali CDP was 160 in 2005-2009. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 24 and elementary or high school enrollment was 110 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 24.

The Educational Attainment of People in Kaanapali CDP, Hawaii in 2005-2009






DISABILITY: In Kaanapali CDP, among people at least five years old in 2005-2009, percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from percent of people 5 to 15 years old, to percent of people 16 to 64 years old, and to percent of those 65 and older.

INDUSTRIES: In 2005-2009, for the employed population 16 years and older, the leading industries in Kaanapali CDP were Finance and insurance, and real estate and rental and leasing, 25 percent, and Educational services, and health care, and social assistance, 14 percent.


OCCUPATIONS AND TYPE OF EMPLOYER: Among the most common occupations were: Management, professional, and related occupations, 54 percent; Sales and office occupations, 29 percent; Service occupations, 11 percent; Construction, extraction, maintenance, and repair occupations, 6 percent; and Production, transportation, and material moving occupations, less than 0.5 percent. Seventy-three percent of the people employed were Private wage and salary workers; 11 percent was Federal, state, or local government workers; and 13 percent was Self-employed in own not incorporated business workers.

TRAVEL TO WORK: Sixty-six percent of Kaanapali CDP workers drove to work alone in 2005-2009, 6 percent carpooled, 2 percent took public transportation, and 15 percent used other means. The remaining 12 percent worked at home. Among those who commuted to work, it took them on average 14.4 minutes to get to work.

INCOME: The median income of households in Kaanapali CDP was \$110,714. Seventy-nine percent of the households received earnings and 21 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Thirty-three percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$18,103. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.

POVERTY AND PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS: In 2005-2009, 5 percent of people were in poverty. Six percent of related children under 18 were below the poverty level, compared with 3 percent of people 65 years old and over. Five percent of all families and less than 0.5 percent of families with a female householder and no husband present had incomes below the poverty level.






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Percent below poverty level

POPULATION OF Kaanapali CDP: In 2005-2009, Kaanapali CDP had a total population of 990 - 470 (48 percent) females and 510 (52 percent) males. The median age was 53.2 years. Seventeen percent of the population was under 18 years and 18 percent was 65 years and older.

The Age Distribution of People in Kaanapali CDP, Hawaii in 2005-2009



For people reporting one race alone, 90 percent was White; less than 0.5 percent was Black or African American; less than 0.5 percent was American Indian and Alaska Native; 3 percent was Asian; less than 0.5 percent was Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and 1 percent was Some other race. Six percent reported Two or more races. Three percent of the people in Kaanapali CDP was Hispanic. Eighty-eight percent of the people in Kaanapali CDP was White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Kaanapali CDP had a total of 1,900 housing units, 77 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 22 percent was in single-unit structures, 78 percent was in multi-unit structures, and less than 0.5 percent was mobile homes. Seventeen percent of the housing units were built since 1990.

OCCUPIED HOUSING UNIT CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Kaanapali CDP had 440 occupied housing units - 360 (81 percent) owner occupied and 83 (19 percent) renter occupied. Two percent of the households did not have telephone service and 1 percent of the households did not have access to a car, truck, or van for private use. Multi Vehicle households were not rare. Fifty-one percent had two vehicles and another 10 percent had three or more.
