

NOTE. HOUSEHOLDS AND FAMILIES: In 2005-2009 there were 160 households in Kapalua CDP. The average household size was 2.4 people.

Families made up 66 percent of the households in Kapalua CDP. This figure includes both married-couple families (65 percent) and other families (2 percent). Nonfamily households made up 34 percent of all households in Kapalua CDP. Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were composed of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.

NATIVITY AND LANGUAGE: Fifteen percent of the people living in Kapalua CDP in 2005-2009 were foreign born. Eighty-five percent was native, including 14 percent who were born in Hawaii.

Among people at least five years old living in Kapalua CDP in 2005-2009, 22 percent spoke a language other than English at home. Of those speaking a language other than English at home, 15 percent spoke Spanish and 85 percent spoke some other language; 37 percent reported that they did not speak English "very well."


GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY: In 2005-2009, 84 percent of the people at least one year old living in Kapalua CDP were living in the same residence one year earlier; 4 percent had moved during the past year from another residence in the same county, 2 percent from another county in the same state, 5 percent from another state, and 4 percent from abroad.

Different



EDUCATION: In 2005-2009, 94 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 44 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Six percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Kapalua CDP was 53 in 2005-2009. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 10 and elementary or high school enrollment was 39 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 4.




The Educational Attainment of People in Kapalua CDP, Hawaii in 2005-2009



DISABILITY: In Kapalua CDP, among people at least five years old in 2005-2009, percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from percent of people 5 to 15 years old, to percent of people 16 to 64 years old, and to percent of those 65 and older.

INDUSTRIES: In 2005-2009, for the employed population 16 years and older, the leading industries in Kapalua CDP were Professional, scientific, and management, and administrative and waste management services, 26 percent, and Arts, entertainment, and recreation, and accommodation and food services, 25 percent.


OCCUPATIONS AND TYPE OF EMPLOYER: Among the most common occupations were: Management, professional, and related occupations, 52 percent; Service occupations, 27 percent; Sales and office occupations, 20 percent; Production, transportation, and material moving occupations, 2 percent; and Farming, fishing, and forestry occupations, less than 0.5 percent. Eighty-two percent of the people employed were Private wage and salary workers; 3 percent was Federal, state, or local government workers; and 14 percent was Self-employed in own not incorporated business workers.

TRAVEL TO WORK: Sixty-four percent of Kapalua CDP workers drove to work alone in 2005-2009, 7 percent carpooled, less than 0.5 percent took public transportation, and 11 percent used other means. The remaining 18 percent worked at home. Among those who commuted to work, it took them on average 14 minutes to get to work.

INCOME: The median income of households in Kapalua CDP was \$118,125. Sixty-nine percent of the households received earnings and 27 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Thirty-four percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$19,891. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.

POVERTY AND PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS: In 2005-2009, 4 percent of people were in poverty. Less than 0.5 percent of related children under 18 were below the poverty level, compared with 7 percent of people 65 years old and over. Three percent of all families and less than 0.5 percent of families with a female householder and no husband present had incomes below the poverty level.

Poverty Rates in Kapalua CDP, Hawaii in 2005-2009





POPULATION OF Kapalua CDP: In 2005-2009, Kapalua CDP had a total population of 380 - 180 (47 percent) females and 200 (53 percent) males. The median age was 53 years. Fifteen percent of the population was under 18 years and 26 percent was 65 years and older.


The Age Distribution of People in Kapalua CDP, Hawaii in 2005-2009

For people reporting one race alone, 64 percent was White; less than 0.5 percent was Black or African American; less than 0.5 percent was American Indian and Alaska Native; 13 percent was Asian; 14 percent was Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and 3 percent was Some other race. Six percent reported Two or more races. Seven percent of the people in Kapalua CDP was Hispanic. Sixty percent of the people in Kapalua CDP was White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Kapalua CDP had a total of 890 housing units, 82 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 20 percent was in single-unit structures, 80 percent was in multi-unit structures, and less than 0.5 percent was mobile homes. Sixteen percent of the housing units were built since 1990.




The Types of Housing Units in Kapalua CDP, Hawaii in 2005-2009

OCCUPIED HOUSING UNIT CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Kapalua CDP had 160 occupied housing units - 120 (73 percent) owner occupied and 43 (27 percent) renter occupied. Less than 0.5 percent of the households did not have telephone service and 9 percent of the households did not have access to a car, truck, or van for private use. Thirty-eight percent had two vehicles and another 11 percent had three or more.
