



NOTE. Although the American Community Survey (ACS) produces population, demographic and housing unit estimates, it is the Census Bureau's Population Estimates Program that produces and disseminates the official estimates of the population for the nation, states, counties, cities and towns and estimates of housing units for states and counties.

HOUSEHOLDS AND FAMILIES: In 2005-2009 there were 230 households in Kaumakani CDP. The average household size was 2.7 people.

Families made up 71 percent of the households in Kaumakani CDP. This figure includes both married-couple families (57 percent) and other families (14 percent). Nonfamily households made up 29 percent of all households in Kaumakani CDP. Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were composed of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.

NATIVITY AND LANGUAGE: Forty-one percent of the people living in Kaumakani CDP in 2005-2009 were foreign born. Fifty-nine percent was native, including 50 percent who were born in Hawaii.

Among people at least five years old living in Kaumakani CDP in 2005-2009, 55 percent spoke a language other than English at home. Of those speaking a language other than English at home, less than 0.5 percent spoke Spanish and 100 percent spoke some other language; 55 percent reported that they did not speak English "very well."

GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY: In 2005-2009, 96 percent of the people at least one year old living in Kaumakani CDP were living in the same residence one year earlier; 3 percent had moved during the past year from another residence in the same county, less than 0.5 percent from another county in the same state, less than 0.5 percent from another state, and 1 percent from abroad.


### Geographic Mobility of Residents of Kaumakani CDP, Hawaii in 2005-2009

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

EDUCATION: In 2005-2009, 69 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 7 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Thirty-one percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Kaumakani CDP was 130 in 2005-2009. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 9 and elementary or high school enrollment was 83 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 34.




### The Educational Attainment of People in Kaumakani CDP, Hawaii in 2005-2009



DISABILITY: In Kaumakani CDP, among people at least five years old in 2005-2009, percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from percent of people 5 to 15 years old, to percent of people 16 to 64 years old, and to percent of those 65 and older.

INDUSTRIES: In 2005-2009, for the employed population 16 years and older, the leading industries in Kaumakani CDP were Agriculture, forestry, fishing and hunting, and mining, 30 percent, and Arts, entertainment, and recreation, and accommodation and food services, 25 percent.


OCCUPATIONS AND TYPE OF EMPLOYER: Among the most common occupations were: Service occupations, 28 percent; Production, transportation, and material moving occupations, 21 percent; Sales and office occupations, 17 percent; Farming, fishing, and forestry occupations, 14 percent; and Construction, extraction, maintenance, and repair occupations, 11 percent. Ninetyfour percent of the people employed were Private wage and salary workers; 5 percent was Federal, state, or local government workers; and 1 percent was Self-employed in own not incorporated business workers.

TRAVEL TO WORK: Seventy-six percent of Kaumakani CDP workers drove to work alone in 2005-2009, 14 percent carpooled, 3 percent took public transportation, and 7 percent used other means. The remaining less than 0.5 percent worked at home. Among those who commuted to work, it took them on average 20.9 minutes to get to work.

INCOME: The median income of households in Kaumakani CDP was \$43,816. Eighty percent of the households received earnings and 29 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Thirty-seven percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$14,907. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.

POVERTY AND PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS: In 2005-2009, 6 percent of people were in poverty. Seven percent of related children under 18 were below the poverty level, compared with 5 percent of people 65 years old and over. Four percent of all families and less than 0.5 percent of families with a female householder and no husband present had incomes below the poverty level.

# Poverty Rates in Kaumakani CDP, Hawaii in 2005-2009




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# Percent below poverty level

POPULATION OF Kaumakani CDP: In 2005-2009, Kaumakani CDP had a total population of 620 - 250 (40 percent) females and 370 (60 percent) males. The median age was 45.5 years. Seventeen percent of the population was under 18 years and 20 percent was 65 years and older.


## The Age Distribution of People in Kaumakani CDP, Hawaii in 2005-2009

For people reporting one race alone, 3 percent was White; 3 percent was Black or African American; less than 0.5 percent was American Indian and Alaska Native; 76 percent was Asian; 2 percent was Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and less than 0.5 percent was Some other race. Fifteen percent reported Two or more races. Eight percent of the people in Kaumakani CDP was Hispanic. Three percent of the people in Kaumakani CDP was White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Kaumakani CDP had a total of 240 housing units, 6 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 87 percent was in single-unit structures, 13 percent was in multi-unit structures, and less than 0.5 percent was mobile homes. Two percent of the housing units were built since 1990.

OCCUPIED HOUSING UNIT CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Kaumakani CDP had 230 occupied housing units - less than 0.5 (less than 0.5 percent) owner occupied and 230 (100 percent) renter occupied. Eleven percent of the households did not have telephone service and 10 percent of the households did not have access to a car, truck, or van for private use. Multi Vehicle households were not rare. Thirty-six percent had two vehicles and another 29 percent had three or more.
