
NOTE. Although the American Community Survey (ACS) produces population, demographic and housing unit estimates, it is the Census Bureau's Population Estimates Program that produces and disseminates the official estimates of the population for the nation, states, counties, cities and towns and estimates of housing units for states and counties.

HOUSEHOLDS AND FAMILIES: In 2005-2009 there were 2,200 households in Waikoloa Village CDP. The average household size was 2.7 people.

Families made up 71 percent of the households in Waikoloa Village CDP. This figure includes both married-couple families (55 percent) and other families (16 percent). Nonfamily households made up 29 percent of all households in Waikoloa Village CDP.


NATIVITY AND LANGUAGE: Eighteen percent of the people living in Waikoloa Village CDP in 2005-2009 were foreign born. Eighty-two percent was native, including 37 percent who were born in Hawaii.

Among people at least five years old living in Waikoloa Village CDP in 2005-2009, 17 percent spoke a language other than English at home. Of those speaking a language other than English at home, 34 percent spoke Spanish and 66 percent spoke some other language; 52 percent reported that they did not speak English "very well."

GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY: In 2005-2009, 80 percent of the people at least one year old living in Waikoloa Village CDP were living in the same residence one year earlier; 9 percent had moved during the past year from another residence in the same county, 2 percent from another county in the same state, 9 percent from another state, and less than 0.5 percent from abroad.

| Different residence, same | 9% |     |



EDUCATION: In 2005-2009, 95 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 34 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Five percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Waikoloa Village CDP was 1,300 in 2005-2009. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 91 and elementary or high school enrollment was 1000 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 210.

#### The Educational Attainment of People in Waikoloa Village CDP, Hawaii in 2005-2009






DISABILITY: In Waikoloa Village CDP, among people at least five years old in 2005-2009, percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from percent of people 5 to 15 years old, to percent of people 16 to 64 years old, and to percent of those 65 and older.

INDUSTRIES: In 2005-2009, for the employed population 16 years and older, the leading industries in Waikoloa Village CDP were Arts, entertainment, and recreation, and accommodation and food services, 36 percent, and Construction, 12 percent.


OCCUPATIONS AND TYPE OF EMPLOYER: Among the most common occupations were: Service occupations, 30 percent; Management, professional, and related occupations, 28 percent; Sales and office occupations, 23 percent; Construction, extraction, maintenance, and repair occupations, 14 percent; and Production, transportation, and material moving occupations, 4 percent. Seventy-eight percent of the people employed were Private wage and salary workers; 10 percent was Federal, state, or local government workers; and 11 percent was Self-employed in own not incorporated business workers.

TRAVEL TO WORK: Seventy-six percent of Waikoloa Village CDP workers drove to work alone in 2005-2009, 12 percent carpooled, less than 0.5 percent took public transportation, and 3 percent used other means. The remaining 8 percent worked at home. Among those who commuted to work, it took them on average 24.3 minutes to get to work.

INCOME: The median income of households in Waikoloa Village CDP was \$72,750. Eighty-nine percent of the households received earnings and 12 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Seventeen percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$17,197. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.

POVERTY AND PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS: In 2005-2009, 8 percent of people were in poverty. Eleven percent of related children under 18 were below the poverty level, compared with 11 percent of people 65 years old and over. Eight percent of all families and 26 percent of families with a female householder and no husband present had incomes below the poverty level.


### Poverty Rates in Waikoloa Village CDP, Hawaii in 2005-2009

POPULATION OF Waikoloa Village CDP: In 2005-2009, Waikoloa Village CDP had a total population of 5,800 - 2,800 (48 percent) females and 3,000 (52 percent) males. The median age was 37.2 years. Twenty-five percent of the population was under 18 years and 7 percent was 65 years and older.

#### The Age Distribution of People in Waikoloa Village CDP, Hawaii in 2005-2009





For people reporting one race alone, 51 percent was White; 2 percent was Black or African American; 1 percent was American Indian and Alaska Native; 22 percent was Asian; 5 percent was Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and 1 percent was Some other race. Seventeen percent reported Two or more races. Fifteen percent of the people in Waikoloa Village CDP was Hispanic. Forty-four percent of the people in Waikoloa Village CDP was White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Waikoloa Village CDP had a total of 2,700 housing units, 18 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 52 percent was in single-unit structures, 48 percent was in multi-unit structures, and less than 0.5 percent was mobile homes. Fifty-nine percent of the housing units were built since 1990.


OCCUPIED HOUSING UNIT CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Waikoloa Village CDP had 2,200 occupied housing units - 1,500 (67 percent) owner occupied and 730 (33 percent) renter occupied. Two percent of the households did not have telephone service and 5 percent of the households did not have access to a car, truck, or van for private use. Multi Vehicle households were not rare. Fifty-one percent had two vehicles and another 22 percent had three or more.

HOUSING COSTS: The median monthly housing costs for mortgaged owners was \$2,298, nonmortgaged owners \$472, and renters \$1,528. Forty-eight percent of owners with mortgages, less than 0.5 percent of owners without mortgages, and 58 percent of renters in Waikoloa Village CDP spent 30 percent or more of household income on housing.
