
NOTE. HOUSEHOLDS AND FAMILIES: In 2005-2009 there were 340 households in Hoolehua-Palaau Hawaiian Home Land, HI. The average household size was 3.1 people.

Families made up 78 percent of the households in Hoolehua-Palaau Hawaiian Home Land, HI. This figure includes both married-couple families (55 percent) and other families (23 percent). Nonfamily households made up 22 percent of all households in Hoolehua-Palaau Hawaiian Home Land, HI. Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were composed of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.


NATIVITY AND LANGUAGE: Three percent of the people living in Hoolehua-Palaau Hawaiian Home Land, HI in 2005-2009 were foreign born. Ninety-seven percent was native, including 91 percent who were born in their state of residence.

Among people at least five years old living in Hoolehua-Palaau Hawaiian Home Land, HI in 2005-2009, 11 percent spoke a language other than English at home. Of those speaking a language other than English at home, less than 0.5 percent spoke Spanish and 100 percent spoke some other language; 17 percent reported that they did not speak English "very well."

GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY: In 2005-2009, 90 percent of the people at least one year old living in Hoolehua-Palaau Hawaiian Home Land, HI were living in the same residence one year earlier; 5 percent had moved during the past year from another residence in the same county, 5 percent from another county in the same state, less than 0.5 percent from another state, and less than 0.5 percent from abroad.



EDUCATION: In 2005-2009, 89 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 15 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Eleven percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Hoolehua-Palaau Hawaiian Home Land, HI was 340 in 2005-2009. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 31 and elementary or high school enrollment was 250 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 60.

The Educational Attainment of People in Hoolehua-Palaau Hawaiian Home Land, HI in 2005-2009






DISABILITY: In Hoolehua-Palaau Hawaiian Home Land, HI, among people at least five years old in 2005-2009, percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from percent of people 5 to 15 years old, to percent of people 16 to 64 years old, and to percent of those 65 and older.

INDUSTRIES: In 2005-2009, for the employed population 16 years and older, the leading industries in Hoolehua-Palaau Hawaiian Home Land, HI were Educational services, and health care, and social assistance, 31 percent, and Transportation and warehousing, and utilities, 11 percent.


OCCUPATIONS AND TYPE OF EMPLOYER: Among the most common occupations were: Management, professional, and related occupations, 35 percent; Sales and office occupations, 23 percent; Service occupations, 23 percent; Construction, extraction, maintenance, and repair occupations, 12 percent; and Production, transportation, and material moving occupations, 7 percent. Seventy-one percent of the people employed were Private wage and salary workers; 28 percent was Federal, state, or local government workers; and 2 percent was Self-employed in own not incorporated business workers.


TRAVEL TO WORK: Seventy-two percent of Hoolehua-Palaau Hawaiian Home Land, HI workers drove to work alone in 2005-2009, 17 percent carpooled, 3 percent took public transportation, and 8 percent used other means. The remaining less than 0.5 percent worked at home. Among those who commuted to work, it took them on average 20.8 minutes to get to work.

INCOME: The median income of households in Hoolehua-Palaau Hawaiian Home Land, HI was \$50,000. Eighty-two percent of the households received earnings and 34 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Forty percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$15,120. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.

POVERTY AND PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS: In 2005-2009, 9 percent of people were in poverty. Twelve percent of related children under 18 were below the poverty level, compared with 4 percent of people 65 years old and over. Nine percent of all families and 18 percent of families with a female householder and no husband present had incomes below the poverty level.

Poverty Rates in Hoolehua-Palaau Hawaiian Home Land, HI in 2005-2009



POPULATION OF Hoolehua-Palaau Hawaiian Home Land, HI: In 2005-2009, Hoolehua-Palaau Hawaiian Home Land, HI had a total population of 1,000 - 560 (53 percent) females and 490 (47 percent) males. The median age was 46.1 years. Twenty-eight percent of the population was under 18 years and 12 percent was 65 years and older.

The Age Distribution of People in Hoolehua-Palaau Hawaiian Home Land, HI in 2005-2009



For people reporting one race alone, 6 percent was White; less than 0.5 percent was Black or African American; less than 0.5 percent was American Indian and Alaska Native; 5 percent was Asian; 55 percent was Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and less than 0.5 percent was Some other race. Thirty-five percent reported Two or more races. Four percent of the people in Hoolehua-Palaau Hawaiian Home Land, HI was Hispanic. Six percent of the people in Hoolehua-Palaau Hawaiian Home Land, HI was White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Hoolehua-Palaau Hawaiian Home Land, HI had a total of 350 housing units, 3 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 97 percent was in single-unit structures, 3 percent was in multi-unit structures, and less than 0.5 percent was mobile homes. Twenty percent of the housing units were built since 1990.

OCCUPIED HOUSING UNIT CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Hoolehua-Palaau Hawaiian Home Land, HI had 340 occupied housing units - 320 (94 percent) owner occupied and 19 (6 percent) renter occupied. Five percent of the households did not have telephone service and 4 percent of the households did not have access to a car, truck, or van for private use. Multi Vehicle households were not rare. Twenty-nine percent had two vehicles and another 39 percent had three or more.
