

GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY: In 2005-2009, 100 percent of the people at least one year old living in Makakupia Hawaiian Home Land, HI were living in the same residence one year earlier; less than 0.5 percent had moved during the past year from another residence in the same county, less than 0.5 percent from another county in the same state, less than 0.5 percent from another state, and less than 0.5 percent from abroad.

Geographic Mobility of Residents of Makakupia Hawaiian Home Land, HI in 2005-2009





EDUCATION: In 2005-2009, 100 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and less than 0.5 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Less than 0.5 percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Makakupia Hawaiian Home Land, HI was 7 in 2005-2009. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was less than 0.5 and elementary or high school enrollment was 3 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 4.



DISABILITY: In Makakupia Hawaiian Home Land, HI, among people at least five years old in 2005-2009, percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from percent of people 5 to 15 years old, to percent of people 16 to 64 years old, and to percent of those 65 and older.

INDUSTRIES: In 2005-2009, for the employed population 16 years and older, the leading industries in Makakupia Hawaiian Home Land, HI were Educational services, and health care, and social assistance, 100 percent, and Agriculture, forestry, fishing and hunting, and mining, less than 0.5 percent.

OCCUPATIONS AND TYPE OF EMPLOYER: Among the most common occupations were: Management, professional, and related occupations, 70 percent; Sales and office occupations, 30 percent; Service occupations, less than 0.5 percent; Farming, fishing, and forestry occupations, less than 0.5 percent; and Construction, extraction, maintenance, and repair occupations, less than 0.5 percent. One hundred percent of the people employed were Private wage and salary workers; less than 0.5 percent was Federal, state, or local government workers; and less than 0.5 percent was Self-employed in own not incorporated business workers.



POPULATION OF Makakupia Hawaiian Home Land, HI: In 2005-2009, Makakupia Hawaiian Home Land, HI had a total population of 17 - 10 (59 percent) females and 7 (41 percent) males. The median age was 38.5 years. Eighteen percent of the population was under 18 years and 24 percent was 65 years and older.

The Age Distribution of People in Makakupia Hawaiian Home Land, HI in 2005-2009





For people reporting one race alone, less than 0.5 percent was White; less than 0.5 percent was Black or African American; less than 0.5 percent was American Indian and Alaska Native; 82 percent was Asian; less than 0.5 percent was Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and less than 0.5 percent was Some other race. Eighteen percent reported Two or more races. Less than 0.5 percent of the people in Makakupia Hawaiian Home Land, HI was Hispanic. Less than 0.5 percent of the people in Makakupia Hawaiian Home Land, HI was White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Makakupia Hawaiian Home Land, HI had a total of 6 housing units, 50 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 100 percent was in single-unit structures, less than 0.5 percent was in multi-unit structures, and less than 0.5 percent was mobile homes. Less than 0.5 percent of the housing units were built since 1990.

OCCUPIED HOUSING UNIT CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Makakupia Hawaiian Home Land, HI had 3 occupied housing units - 3 (100 percent) owner occupied and less than 0.5 (less than 0.5 percent) renter occupied. Less than 0.5 percent of the households did not have telephone service and less than 0.5 percent of the households did not have access to a car, truck, or van for private use. Multi Vehicle households were not rare. Less than 0.5 percent had two vehicles and another 100 percent had three or more.
