

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INTRODUCTION

About This Report

The report, *Selected Population and Housing Characteristics by County, Island and Census Tract for the State of Hawaii: 2007-2011*, was produced by the Hawaii State Data Center using data from the U.S. Census Bureau's 2007-2011 American Community Survey.

It contains eleven ranking tables by census tract; four summary tables for the state, counties, and islands; and six detailed tables by islands and census tracts on selected demographic, social, economic and housing characteristics. This report also includes six thematic maps which were produced by the Office of Planning's GIS Program.

The American Community Survey is conducted on an annual basis. To increase the accuracy of the data, the Census Bureau combined five years of data (2007 through 2011) and produced 5-year estimates. Therefore, the data in this report does not represent any single year. Instead, they are estimates that describe the average characteristics of the area over the entire 5-year time period. The sample size for this 2007-2011 survey consisted of about 7.7% of Hawaii's total population and about 7.5% of our housing units for that time period.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE DATA

The following analyses were based upon the ranking of the 318 census tracts in the State of Hawaii which contained population. Each table below displays only the 20 census tracts that ranked the highest.

- Sixteen of Hawaii's census tracts contained populations of over 8,000 people. The three top ranking areas were located on different islands. Ewa Villages (census tract 86.17 on Oahu) was #1 with 10,316 people, followed by Waimea-Pu'u Anahulu (census tract 217.02 on the Big Island) with 9,667 people and Pukalani (census tract 304.02 on Maui) with 9,286 people. - Shown below are 20 of the 51 census tracts with civilian unemployment rates of 10% or above. Kolekole Avenue (census tract 95.01 on Oahu) ranked the highest with 34.7%, followed by Civic Center (census tract 39 on Oahu) with 28.4% of the labor force unemployed during the 5-year period. Almost all islands were present in the 51 tract group with 26 census tracts from Oahu, 14 from the Big Island, 8 from Maui Island, 2 from Molokai Island and 1 from Kauai Island. (Table 2)

- Thirty-seven census tracts had median household incomes of \$100,000 or more. All 37 tracts were located on Oahu and the top 20 are displayed below. Waialae-Iki (census tract 4.02) had the highest household income of \$160,417 over the 5-year period. (Table 3)

- In regard to median family income, there were 66 census tracts with family income of over \$100,000. Four of those 66 tracts - Launiupoko (census tract 320), Kula (census tract 303.01), Kapalua (census tract 315.01) and North Wailuku (census tract 309.03) - were located on Maui. The rest were on Oahu. The top 20 areas are shown in the table below. (Table 4)

- Of the 36 census tracts with a population poverty rate of over 20%, 22 were located on Oahu, 10 were on the Big Island, 2 were on Molokai, and 2 were on Maui. Mayor Wright Housing (census tract 54) on Oahu had the highest population poverty rate at 65.4% over the 5-year period. The 20 top ranking tracts are contained in the table below. (Table 5)

- In terms of family poverty rate, 18 census tracts had family poverty rates of 20% or more. Mayor Wright Housing (census tract 54) on Oahu ranked the highest with 64.5% of families below the poverty standard. Five of these 18 census tracts with the highest percentage below the poverty level were located on the Big Island and the rest were on Oahu. (Table 6)

- The top 35 census tracts with 50% or more of their population 25 years or over holding a bachelor's degree or higher were also all located on Oahu. Twenty of those tracts are displayed below. (Table 8)

- Foster Botanical Garden (census tract 51) on Oahu had the highest foreign-born population at 59.3% of the population in this area being born in foreign countries, followed by Aala (census tract 53 on Oahu) with a foreign-born population of 58.6%, and Kaheka Street-Makaloa Street (census tract 36.04 on Oahu) with 56.3% of the population in this area being foreign-born. (Table 9)

- 70.9% of the people in Waiakamilo Road (census tract 58 on Oahu) spoke a language other than English at home and ranked the highest among all the census tracts in the state, followed by Aala (census tract 53 on Oahu) with 69.8% of the people in this area who spoke a language other than English at home, and Foster Botanical Garden (census tract 51 on Oahu) which ranked in third place with 68.6%. (Table 10)

- Fourteen census tracts in Hawaii had owner-occupied homes averaging over a million dollars in value during the 5-year period. Many of these areas were in East Oahu - Portlock (census tract 1.14), Waialae Iki (census tract 4.02), Waialae-Kahala (census tract 5), and Diamond Head (census tract 6). Wailea (census tract 303.03 on the island of Maui), Honokowai (census tract 315.03 on the island of Maui) and Ha'ena-Hanalei (census tract 401.04 on the island of Kauai) were the neighbor island census tracts with over a million dollar median value for their owner-occupied homes. (Table 11)

SUBJECT DEFINITIONS

Shown below are excerpts of definitions from the “American Community Survey and Puerto Rico Survey - 2011 Subject Definitions” document. For the full text, please refer to the source document. Questions referred to below are questions in the 2011 American Community Survey questionnaire form.

POPULATION VARIABLES:

EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT

Data on educational attainment were derived from answers to Question 11, which was asked of all respondents. Educational attainment data are tabulated for people 18 years old and over. Respondents are classified according to the highest degree or the highest level of school completed. The question included instructions for persons currently enrolled in school to report the level of the previous grade attended or the highest degree received.

The educational attainment question included a response category that allowed people to report completing the 12th grade without receiving a high school diploma. Respondents who received a regular high school diploma and did not attend college were instructed to report “Regular high school diploma”. Respondents who received the equivalent of a high school diploma (for example, passed the test of General Educational Development (G.E.D.)), and did not attend college, were instructed to report “GED or alternative credential.” “Some college” is in two categories: “Some college credit, but less than 1 year of college credit” and “1 or more years of college credit, no degree.” The category “Associate’s degree” included people whose highest degree is an associate’s degree, which generally requires 2 years of college level work and is either in an occupational program that prepares them for a specific occupation, or an academic program primarily in the arts and sciences. The course work may or may not be transferable to a bachelor’s degree. Master’s degrees include the traditional MA and MS degrees and field-specific degrees, such as MSW, MEd, MBA, MLS, and MEng. Instructions included in the respondent instruction guide for mailout/mailback respondents only provided the following examples of professional school degrees: Medicine, dentistry, chiropractic, optometry, osteopathic medicine, pharmacy, podiatry, veterinary medicine, law, and theology. The order in which degrees are listed suggested that doctorate degrees were “higher” than professional school degrees, which were “higher” than master’s degrees. If more than one box was filled, the response was edited to the highest level or degree reported.

The instructions further specified that schooling completed in foreign or ungraded school systems should be reported as the equivalent level of schooling in the regular American system. The instructions specified that certificates or diplomas for training in specific trades or from vocational, technical or business schools were not to be reported. Honorary degrees awarded for a respondent’s accomplishments were not to be reported.

High School Graduate or Higher. This category includes people whose highest degree was a high school diploma or its equivalent, people who attended college but did not receive a degree, and people who received an associate’s, bachelor’s, master’s, or professional or doctorate degree. People who reported completing the 12th grade but not receiving a diploma are not included.

EMPLOYMENT STATUS

The data on employment status were derived from Questions 29 and 35 to 37 in the 2011 American Community Survey. The questions were asked of all people 15 years old and over. The series of questions on employment status was designed to identify, in this sequence: (1) people who worked at any time during the reference week; (2) people on temporary layoff who were available for work (3) people who did not work during the reference week, but who had jobs or businesses from which they were temporarily absent (excluding layoff); (4) people who did not work during the reference week, but who were looking for work during the last four weeks and were available for work during the reference week; and (5) people not in the labor force.

The employment status data shown in American Community Survey tabulations relate to people 16 years old and over.

Employed. This category includes all civilians 16 years old and over who either (1) were “at work”, that is, those who did any work at all during the reference week as paid employees, worked in their own business or profession, worked on their own farm, or worked 15 hours or more as unpaid workers on a family farm or in a family business; or (2) were “with a job but not at work”, that is, those who did not work during the reference week, but had jobs or businesses from which they were temporarily absent due to illness, bad weather, industrial dispute, vacation, or other personal reasons. Excluded from the employed are people whose only activity consisted of work around the house or unpaid volunteer work for religious, charitable, and similar organizations; also excluded are all institutionalized people and people on active duty in the United States Armed Forces.

Civilian employed. This term is defined exactly the same as the term “employed” above.

Unemployed. All civilians 16 years old and over are classified as unemployed if they (1) were neither “at work” nor “with a job but not at work” during the reference week, and (2) were actively looking for work during the last 4 weeks, and (3) were available to start a job. Also included as unemployed are civilians who did not work at all during the reference week, were waiting to be called back to a job from which they had been laid off, and were available for work except for temporary illness. Examples of job seeking activities are:

- Registering at a public or private employment office
- Meeting with prospective employers
- Investigating possibilities for starting a professional practice or opening a business
- Placing or answering advertisements
- Writing letters of application
- Being on a union or professional register

Civilian labor force. Consists of people classified as employed or unemployed in accordance with the criteria described above.

Unemployment rate. The unemployment rate represents the number of unemployed people as a percentage of the civilian labor force. For example, if the civilian labor force equals 100 people and 7 people are unemployed, then the unemployment rate would be 7 percent.

FOREIGN-BORN POPULATION

The foreign-born population includes anyone who was not a U.S. citizen or a U.S. national at birth. This includes respondents who indicated they were a U.S. citizen by naturalization or not a U.S. citizen.

HOUSEHOLD TYPE AND RELATIONSHIP

Household. A household includes all of the people who occupy a housing unit. (People not living in households are classified as living in group quarters.) A housing unit is a house, an apartment, a mobile home, a group of rooms, or a single room that is occupied (or if vacant, is intended for occupancy) as separate living quarters. Separate living quarters are those in which the occupants live separately from any other people in the building and which have direct access from the outside of the building or through a common hall. The occupants may be a single family, one person living alone, two or more families living together, or any other group of related or unrelated people who share living arrangements.

Householder. One person in each household is designated as the householder. In most cases, this is the person, or one of the people, in whose name the home is owned, being bought, or rented and who is listed on line one of the survey questionnaire. If there is no such person in the household, any adult household member 15 years and over could be designated as the householder.

Family household. A family consists of a householder and one or more other people living in the same household who are related to the householder by birth, marriage, or adoption. All people in a household who are related to the householder are regarded as members of his or her family. A family household may contain people not related to the householder, but those people are not included as part of the householder's family in tabulations. Thus, the number of family households is equal to the number of families, but family households may include more members than do families. A household can contain only one family for purposes of tabulations. Not all households contain families since a household may be comprised of a group of unrelated people or of one person living alone – these are called nonfamily households.

Family households and married-couple families do not include same-sex married couples even if the marriage was performed in a state issuing marriage certificates for same-sex couples. Same sex couple households are included in the family households category if there is at least one additional person related to the householder by birth or adoption.

INCOME IN THE PAST 12 MONTHS

The data on income were derived from answers to Questions 47 and 48, which were asked of the population 15 years old and over. "Total income" is the sum of the amounts reported separately for wage or salary income; net self-employment income; interest, dividends, or net rental or royalty income or income from estates and trusts; Social Security or Railroad Retirement income; Supplemental Security Income (SSI); public assistance or welfare payments; retirement, survivor, or disability pensions; and all other income.

Receipts from the following sources are not included as income: capital gains, money received from the sale of property (unless the recipient was engaged in the business of selling such property); the value of income "in kind" from food stamps, public housing subsidies, medical care, employer contributions for individuals, etc.; withdrawal of bank deposits; money borrowed; tax refunds; exchange of money between relatives living in the same household; gifts and lump-sum inheritances, insurance payments, and other types of lump-sum receipts.

Income of households. This includes the income of the householder and all other individuals 15 years old and over in the household, whether they are related to the householder or not. Because many households consist of only one person, average household income is usually less than average family income. Although the household income statistics cover the past 12 months, the characteristics of individuals and the composition of households refer to the time of interview. Thus, the income of the household does not include amounts received by individuals who were members of the household during all or part of the past 12 months if these individuals no longer resided in the household at the time of interview. Similarly, income amounts reported by individuals who did not reside in the household during the past 12 months but who were members of the household at the time of the interview are included. However, the composition of most households was the same during the past 12 months as at the time of interview.

Income of families. In compiling statistics on family income, the incomes of all members 15 years old and over related to the householder are summed and treated as a single amount. Although the family income statistics cover the past 12 months, the characteristics of individuals and the composition of families refer to the time of interview. Thus, the income of the family does not include amounts received by individuals who were members of the family during all or part of the past 12 months if these individuals no longer resided with the family at the time of interview. Similarly, income amounts reported by individuals who did not reside with the family during the past 12 months but who were members of the family at the time of interview are included. However, the composition of most families was the same during the past 12 months as at the time of interview.

Median income. The median divides the income distribution into two equal parts: one-half of the cases falling below the median income and one-half above the median. For households and families, the median income is based on the distribution of the total number of households and families including those with no income. The median income for individuals is based on individuals 15 years old and over with income. Median income for households, families, and individuals is computed on the basis of a standard distribution. Median income is rounded to the nearest whole dollar. Median income figures are calculated using linear interpolation.

Adjusting income for inflation. Income components were reported for the 12 months preceding the interview month. Monthly Consumer Price Indices (CPI) factors were used to inflation-adjust these components to a reference calendar year (January through December). For example, a household interviewed in March 2011 reports their income for March 2010 through February 2011. Their income is adjusted to the 2011 reference calendar year by multiplying their reported income by 2011 average annual CPI (January-December 2011) and then dividing by the average CPI for March 2010-February 2011.

In order to inflate income amounts from previous years, the dollar values on individual records are inflated to the latest year's dollar values by multiplying by a factor equal to the average annual CPI-U-RS factor for the current year, divided by the average annual CPI-U-RS factor for the earlier/earliest year.

LANGUAGE SPOKEN AT HOME

Data on language spoken at home were derived from answers to questions 14a and 14b. These questions were asked only of persons 5 years of age and older. Instructions mailed with the American Community Survey questionnaire instructed respondents to mark "Yes" on Question 14a if they sometimes or always spoke a language other than English at home, and "No" if a language was spoken only at school – or if speaking was limited to a few expressions or slang. For question 14b, respondents printed the name of the non-English language they spoke at home. If the person spoke more than one non-English language, they reported the language spoken most often. If the language spoken most frequently could not be determined, the respondent reported the language learned first.

Questions 14a and 14b referred to languages spoken at home in an effort to measure the current use of languages other than English. This category excluded respondents who spoke a language other than English exclusively outside of the home.

POVERTY STATUS IN THE PAST 12 MONTHS

Poverty statistics in ACS products adhere to the standards specified by the Office of Management and Budget in Statistical Policy Directive 14. The Census Bureau uses a set of dollar value thresholds that vary by family size and composition to determine who is in poverty. Further, poverty thresholds for people living alone or with nonrelatives (unrelated individuals) vary by age (under 65 years or 65 years and older). The poverty threshold for two-person families also vary by the age of the householder. If a family's total income is less than the dollar value of the appropriate threshold, then that family and every individual in it are considered to be in poverty. Similarly, if an unrelated individual's total income is less than the appropriate threshold, then that individual is considered to be in poverty.

How the Census Bureau Determines Poverty Status

In determining the poverty status of families and unrelated individuals, the Census Bureau uses thresholds (income cutoffs) arranged in a two-dimensional matrix. The matrix consists of family size (from one person to nine or more people) cross-classified by presence and number of family members under 18 years old (from no children present to eight or more children present). Unrelated individuals and two-person families are further differentiated by the age of reference person (RP) (under 65 years old and 65 years old and over).

To determine a person's poverty status, one compares the person's total family income in the last 12 months with the poverty threshold appropriate for that person's family size and composition (see example below). If the total income of that person's family is less than the threshold appropriate for that family, then the person is considered "below the poverty level," together with every member of his or her family. If a person is not living with anyone related by birth, marriage,

or adoption, then the person's own income is compared with his or her poverty threshold. The total number of people below the poverty level is the sum of people in families and the number of unrelated individuals with incomes in the last 12 months below the poverty threshold.

Since ACS is a continuous survey, people respond throughout the year. Because the income questions specify a period covering the last 12 months, the appropriate poverty thresholds are determined by multiplying the base-year poverty thresholds (1982) by the average of the monthly inflation factors for the 12 months preceding the data collection.

For example, consider a family of three with one child under 18 years of age, interviewed in July 2011 and reporting a total family income of \$14,000 for the last 12 months (July 2010 to June 2011). The base year (1982) threshold for such a family is \$7,765, while the average of the 12 inflation factors is 2.29083. Multiplying \$7,765 by 2.29083 determines the appropriate poverty threshold for this family type, which is \$17,788. Comparing the family's income of \$14,000 with the poverty threshold shows that the family and all people in the family are considered to have been in poverty. The only difference for determining poverty status for unrelated individuals is that the person's individual total income is compared with the threshold rather than the family's income.

Individuals for whom poverty status is determined. Poverty status was determined for all people except institutionalized people, people in military group quarters, people in college dormitories, and unrelated individuals under 15 years old. These groups were excluded from the numerator and denominator when calculating poverty rates.

HOUSING VARIABLES:

HOUSING UNITS

A housing unit may be a house, an apartment, a mobile home, a group of rooms, or a single room that is occupied (or, if vacant, intended for occupancy) as separate living quarters. Separate living quarters are those in which the occupants live separately from any other individuals in the building and which have direct access from outside the building or through a common hall. For vacant units, the criteria of separateness and direct access are applied to the intended occupants whenever possible. If that information cannot be obtained, the criteria are applied to the previous occupants.

OCCUPIED HOUSING UNIT

A housing unit is classified as occupied if it is the current place of residence of the person or group of people living in it at the time of the interview, or if the occupants are only temporarily absent from the residence for two months or less, that is, away on vacation or a business trip. If all the people staying in the unit at the time of the interview are staying there for two months or less, the unit is considered to be temporarily occupied and classified as "vacant". The occupants may be a single family, one person living alone, two or more families living together, or any other group of related or unrelated people who share living quarters. The living quarters occupied by staff personnel within any group quarters are separate housing units if they satisfy the housing unit criteria of separateness and direct access; otherwise, they are considered group quarters.

Occupied rooms or suites of rooms in hotels, motels, and similar places are classified as housing units only when occupied by permanent residents, that is, people who consider the hotel as their current place of residence or have no usual place of residence elsewhere. If any of the occupants in rooming or boarding houses, congregate housing, or continuing care facilities live separately from others in the building and have direct access, their quarters are classified as separate housing units.

OWNER OCCUPIED

A housing unit is owner occupied if the owner or co-owner lives in the unit even if it is mortgaged or not fully paid for. The owner or co-owner must live in the unit and usually is Person 1 on the questionnaire. The unit is “Owned by you or someone in this household with a mortgage or loan” if it is being purchased with a mortgage or some other debt arrangement such as a deed of trust, trust deed, contract to purchase, land contract, or purchase agreement. The unit also is considered owned with a mortgage if it is built on leased land and there is a mortgage on the unit. Mobile homes occupied by owners with installment loan balances also are included in this category.

A housing unit is “Owned by you or someone in this household free and clear (without a mortgage or loan)” if there is no mortgage or other similar debt on the house, apartment, or mobile home including units built on leased land if the unit is owned outright without a mortgage.

VALUE


The data on value (also referred to as “price asked” for vacant units) were obtained from Housing Question 16 in the 2011 American Community Survey. The question was asked at housing units that were owned, being bought, vacant for sale, or sold not occupied at the time of the survey. Value is the respondent’s estimate of how much the property (house and lot, mobile home and lot, or condominium unit) would sell for if it were for sale. If the house or mobile home was owned or being bought, but the land on which it sits was not, the respondent was asked to estimate the combined value of the house or mobile home and the land. For vacant units, value was the price asked for the property. Value was tabulated separately for all owner-occupied and vacant-for-sale housing units, as well as owner-occupied and vacant-for-sale mobile homes.

Median value




Island of Hawaii Total Population by Census Tract 2007-2011 American Community Survey 5-Year Estimates





Islands of Kauai and Niihau Total Population by Census Tract 2007-2011 American Community Survey 5-Year Estimates








Islands of Molokai and Lanai Total Population by Census Tract 2007-2011 American Community Survey 5-Year Estimates




Portion of Oahu Total Population by Census Tract 2007-2011 American Community Survey 5-Year Estimates




