PUMA delineation criteria:					
	1. meet Census Bureau requirements				
	a. consist of whole census tracts;				
	b. minimum 2010 population of 100,000;				
	c. contiguous land area except for recognized offshore islands;				
	2. approximate the City's eight planning regions, called Development Plan Areas;				
	3. follow Neighborhood Board boundaries;				
	4. maintain historical comparability (with 2000 PUMAs);				
NB modifier:					
p	indicates NB is split amongst multiple PUMAs.				
*	indicates NB boundary generally follows, but is not identical, to PUMA boundary..				
Notes:					
1	Most of NB 24 is assigned to PUMA 301 except for Kahe Power Plant area, which is in PUMA 308.				
2	Most of NB 21 is assigned to PUMA 306 except for Waiawa area, which is in PUMA 307.				
3	NB 26 is split between PUMA 301 (Schofield Barracks and Wheeler AAF) and PUMA 307 (Wahiawa, Whitmore and East Range).				
4	PUMA 306 includes Waipio Peninsula, which was in PUMA 307 in 2000, because of tract boundary revision in 2010.				
5	PUMA 308 includes Waipahu industrial areas bordering West Loch Estates, which share the same census tract (87.03)				
6	PUMA 308, by comprising census tract 86.14, extends northward to Kunia bordering Schofield Barracks.
