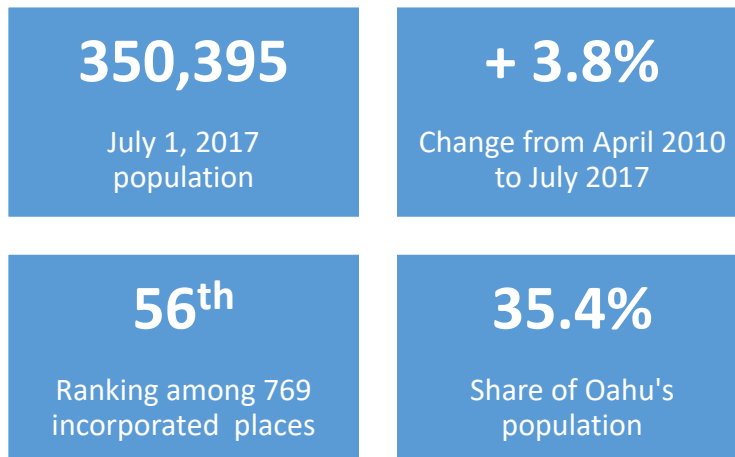


Hawaii Subcounty Population Facts for July 1, 2017

The U.S. Census Bureau released its subcounty population estimates for July 1, 2017 on May 24, 2018. These annual statistics cover all local governmental units, including incorporated places such as cities and towns. Hawaii is the only state that has no incorporated places recognized by the U.S. Census Bureau. Through an agreement with the Bureau, Urban Honolulu Census Designated Place (CDP) is the only subcounty area in Hawaii estimated by the Bureau on an annual basis. Urban Honolulu CDP encompasses an area bordered by Nimitz Highway, Aliamanu Drive, the Koolau Ridge, Waialae Nui Stream and Waialae Nui Canal.

Urban Honolulu CDP



From April 1, 2010 to July 1, 2017, Urban Honolulu CDP had a 3.8% growth in population from 337,721 people to 350,395 people. This growth was about the same as the rest of Honolulu and the City and County of Honolulu; both increased 3.7%. It was, however, lower than the state (4.9%). It was also much lower than the growth for Hawaii County (8.3%), Kauai County (7.6%), and Maui County (7.4%). Both Urban Honolulu CDP and the rest of Honolulu saw a population decrease from July 1, 2016.

Urban Honolulu CDP accounted for 35.4% of Oahu's population in 2017, while 64.6% of Oahu's population lived on the rest of Oahu. Urban Honolulu's share of the population has changed very little over time—varying between 35.4% and 35.5% of Oahu's population since 2010.

The Urban Honolulu CDP area ranked 56th in population among the 769 incorporated places in the U.S. with a population of 50,000 or more in 2017. This was a slight drop in ranking from April 1, 2010, when it was in the 53rd position. Ranking was based on population size with the largest being ranked first. New York City was the largest city in the U.S. with 8.6 million people, followed by Los Angeles with 4.0 million people. Chicago was ranked the third largest city with a population of 2.7 million. Houston and Phoenix were the next two in population size with 2.3 million and 1.6 million people, respectively.

Background information:

CDP stands for **census-designated place**. A CDP is an area identified by the U.S. Census Bureau for statistical purposes. CDPs are delineated for each decennial census as the statistical counterparts of incorporated places such as cities, towns, and villages. CDPs are communities that lack separate municipal government, but which otherwise physically resemble incorporated places. CDPs are delineated to provide data for settled concentrations of population that are identifiable by name but are not legally incorporated under the laws of the state in which they are located. The boundaries of a CDP have no legal status.

In 2010, the former Honolulu CDP was mostly divided into Urban Honolulu CDP and East Honolulu CDP. A small portion of the former Honolulu CDP became part of Hickam Housing CDP.
