





ACS Data Products

Data Product	Description
Data Profiles	Provide broad social, economic, housing, and demographic profiles.
Narrative profiles	Summarize the information in the data profiles using concise, nontechnical text.
Comparison profile	Compares over 5-year period selected enhancements.
Selected population profiles	Provide broad social, economic, and housing profiles for a large number of race, ethnic, ancestry, and country/region of birth groups.
Detailed tables	Provide access to the most detailed ACS data and cross tabulations of ACS variables.
Subject tables	Similar to data profiles but include more detailed ACS data, classified by subject.
Ranking tables	Provide state rankings of estimates across 86 key variables.
Geographic comparison tables	Compare geographic areas other than states (e.g., counties or congressional districts) for key variables.

- Population threshold minimum of 50 unweighted sample persons for specific groups
- Similar to Census 2000 Summary File 4

Inflation Adjustment

- Dollar-valued data items are inflation adjusted to the most recent year for the period
 - Income, rent, home value, and energy costs, etc.
- Adjusted using inflation factors based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI)
- Adjustment designed to put the data into dollars with equal purchasing power

ACS Margin of Error (MOE)

- Margin of Error Definition:
 A measure of the precision of an estimate at a given level of confidence (90%, 95%, 99%)
 - MOEs at the 90% confidence level for all published ACS estimates
- Confidence Interval Definition:
 A range that is expected to contain the population value of the characteristic with a known probability







Understanding Census Geography

- Geography provides the framework for the collection, tabulation, and dissemination of Census Data
- Success of the Census and Census surveys rest not only on collecting data, but also linking data to correct geographic areas
- Two key questions when accessing data:
 - ✓ Population data tells us: How many?
 - ✓ Census Geography tells us: Where?

Hierarchy of Census Geography





Census Geography Two Broad Categories

Legal and Administrative Entities

Geographic areas that originate from legal action, treaties, statutes, ordinances, resolutions, or court decisions.

Specific examples: Nation, States, Counties, Incorporated Places, American Indian Reservations, Hawaiian Home Lands, Congressional Districts, Voting Districts, School Districts, Traffic Analysis Zones, ZIP Codes

Statistical Entities

Areas that evolve from practice, custom, usage, or need Specific examples: Regions, Divisions, Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSA's), Consolidated MSA's, Primary MSA's, Urbanized Areas, Census County Divisions, Census Tracts, Block Groups, Blocks

Census Geography

Census Tract

- Small, relatively permanent statistical subdivision of a county
- Census tracts are designed to be relatively homogeneous units with respect to population characteristics, economic status, & living conditions
- 1,200 to 8,000 population (optimum 4,000)
- 480 to 3,200 housing units
- Aggregate census tracts to delineate communities, neighborhoods, social service delivery areas, planning areas, marketing or trade areas



Census Geography


Block Group

- Subdivision of a census tract
- Block group is the smallest geographic unit for the tabulation of sample data
- Block group consists of all blocks within a census tract with the same beginning number
- 600 to 3,000 population
- 240 to 1,200 housing units

Block

- Smallest geographic unit for which the Census Bureau tabulates 100% data (decennial census)
- Many blocks correspond to individual city blocks bounded by streets
- However blocks, especially in rural areas, may include many square miles and may have boundaries that are not streets


Understanding the Relationship between Geographic Entities







These county-based reference maps show and label the census tracts as delineated to support 2010 Census data dissemination. These maps also show the boundaries and names of American Indian areas, Alaska Native areas, Hawaiian home lands, states, counties, county subdivisions, and places. Additionally, these maps display a base feature network including roads, railroads, and water bodies. These features are labeled as map scale permits. Each county is covered by one or more parent map sheets at a single scale. Inset map sheets at larger scales were created where there are clusters of census tracts that cannot be identified at the parent map scale. An index map showing the sheet configuration is included for all counties requiring more than one parent map sheet. The map sheet size is 36 by 32 inches.





Thematic Map of Estimate; Median value (dollars) Geography: by Place within State
