This *Quarterly Statistical and Economic Report* has been prepared by the staff of the Research and Economic Analysis Division of the State Department of Business, Economic Development & Tourism (DBEDT). The report provides concise statistical information and analyses on Labor, Income and Prices, Taxes, Tourism, Construction, and other indicators, as well as an overview of the State of Hawaii and the four counties.

Technical notes and source descriptions have been kept to a minimum. However, the staff of the Research and Economic Analysis Division would be happy to respond to any inquiries of a technical nature that readers may have (586-2466). The quarterly information contained in this report reflects data received by the Research Division on or before February 20, 2009.

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Hawaii's economy continued to slow through the fourth quarter of 2008, primarily the result of worsening national economic conditions and the decline of visitor industry activity in the state. Wage and salary jobs in the fourth guarter decreased from the year before, as gains in government jobs were more than offset by job losses in the private sectors. Among the private sectors, only Health Care and Social Assistance, Educational Services, and Other Services showed positive job growth in the fourth quarter of 2008. Total civilian employment also decreased in the fourth quarter from the year before; combined with increases in civilian labor force, resulted in an increase in the number of unemployed and the unemployment rate from the same quarter in 2007. Visitor arrivals, visitor expenditures. new private building authorizations, and total tax collections distributed to the State general fund revenues all declined for the quarter. Only the value of government contracts awarded increased in the fourth quarter.

Civilian labor force in Hawaii increased in the fourth quarter to 659,800, an increase of 12,700 people or 2.0 percent from the fourth quarter of 2007. However, the civilian employment decreased 1,400 people or 0.2 percent from the same quarter in 2007. As a result, the average number of civilian unemployed for the quarter jumped to 32,100, 78.3percent higher than the year before. This pushed the unemployment rate up to 4.9 percent in the fourth quarter of 2008, compared with 2.8 percent a year earlier. In 2008, unemployment rate averaged 4.0 percent, 1.4 percentage point higher than that of 2007.

In the fourth quarter of 2008, wage and salary jobs in Hawaii totaled 628,600, a decrease of 7,200 jobs or 1.1 percent from the same quarter of 2007. Increases in government jobs were more than offset by losses in private sector jobs. Among the private sectors, Transportation, Warehousing, and Utilities lost the most jobs (4,000 jobs or 12.2 percent), followed by Natural Resources, Mining, and Construction (lost 2,350 jobs or 5.9 percent), Accommodation (lost 2,200 jobs or 5.7 percent), Professional and Business Services (lost 1,500 jobs or 2.0 percent), and Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation (lost 1,000 jobs or 8.3 percent). In 2008, the average jobs in Hawaii totaled 630,050, same as the average jobs in 2007.

According to the most recent data available, in the third quarter of 2008, total personal income before

correcting for inflation increased \$1,999 million or 4.0 percent from the same quarter of 2007. The sharpest growth was in Personal Current Transfer Receipts (9.8 percent), followed by Supplements to Wages and Salaries (4.7 percent), Wage and Salary Disbursements (3.3 percent), and Dividends, Interest, and Rent (2.5 percent). Contributions for Government Social Insurance, which is subtracted from personal income, increased 3.4 percent. For 2007, total personal income increased 5.9 percent from 2006.

In the second half of 2008, Honolulu's consumer price index increased 3.6 percent -1.3 percentage point lower than the increase in the first half of 2008.

For the fourth quarter of 2008, total tax collections distributed to the State general fund totaled \$1076.6 million, a \$48.2 million or 4.3 percent decrease over the fourth quarter of 2007. General Excise and Use Tax (GET) revenues totaled \$593.1 million, a decrease of \$59.7 million or 9.1 percent. Net Individual Income Tax revenues increased \$15.9 million or 4.3 percent to \$386.3 million. Transient Accommodations Tax (TAT) revenues were down \$6.2 million or 11.5 percent. In 2008, State general fund tax revenues totaled \$4,611.2 million, down \$71.8 million or 1.5 percent from 2007.

As in the third quarter, indicators of tourism activity in Hawaii declined sharply in the fourth quarter from last year. The total number of visitors arriving by air to Hawaii declined 15.5 percent in the fourth compared to the same quarter of 2007. The overall, average daily census decreased 13.5 percent in the quarter. Average hotel occupancy rate was down 8.3 percentage points to 63.7 percent in the fourth quarter from a year earlier.

The fourth quarter indicators of Hawaii's construction industry were mostly negative. For the first time since early 2002, construction jobs showed a significant decline from the previous year's comparable quarter, down 5.9 percent or 2,350 jobs. The value of private building authorizations decreased \$439.5 million compared to the same quarter of 2007. The value of government contracts awarded increased \$155.4 million or 133.4 percent in the fourth quarter. In the existing housing market, for both single-family and condominium units, the median resale prices and the numbers of units resold were down in the fourth quarter of 2008 compared to the same quarter last year.

OUTLOOK FOR THE ECONOMY

Based on sharper declines now forecast for the national and international economies in the first half of 2009, the Department of Business, Economic Development & Tourism (DBEDT) has lowered its forecast for Hawaii's economy in 2009 and 2010. Assuming national growth turns positive in 2010, Hawaii's economy should begin to see some improvement as that year progresses and modest but solid growth by 2011.

The outlook for Hawaii's economy depends significantly on growth in the U.S. economy and key international economies, especially Japan. In response to weaker-than-expected economic data in recent months, continued problems in the financial markets, and a worsening global economic situation, the consensus forecast for U.S. economic growth has continued to be lowered. According to the February 2009 Blue Chip Economic Consensus Forecasts, real U.S. GDP is expected to decline by 1.9 percent in 2009 as a whole. A quarterly breakdown of the forecast shows sharper declines in GDP for the first two quarters of 2009 than in the previous forecast (now pegged at -4.9 and -1.5 percent respectively). But the consensus forecast still expects positive, although subdued growth in the last two quarters of the year (0.8 and 2.0 percent respectively). For 2010 the consensus forecast now predicts a 2.1 percent growth in U.S. real GDP.

For Japan, real GDP growth is now projected to decline 2.4 percent in 2009. This represents an additional 1 percentage point of decline for 2009 than in the January consensus forecast for Japan. A modest 1.1 percent growth rate is expected for Japan in 2010.

Based on recent Hawaii data and the less optimistic national and international outlook, visitor arrivals are now expected to decline a more substantial 5.9 percent for 2009 as a whole. This is down from a 1.9 percent decrease expected in the last DBEDT forecast issued in November 2008. Visitor days are expected to decline 4.4 percent. The forecast for total, current-dollar visitor expenditure growth in 2009 is similarly revised downward to negative 1.9 percent from a slight increase in the previous forecast. Visitor arrivals and visitor days are expected to achieve modest gains in 2010 of 1.3 percent and 1.2 percent, respectively. Visitor expenditures are forecast to increase 3.6 percent in 2010.

Total wage and salary jobs in Hawaii are now expected to decline 1.3 percent in 2009 instead of the no-growth performance previously projected. In 2010 jobs should stabilize but with little or no net growth. However, turnover in the labor market will likely produce some job openings

Personal income growth in current dollars will likely show a modest gain of 0.8 percent in 2009 but will not match inflation, resulting in a slight, 0.4 percent decline in real personal income for the year. In 2010, current dollar personal income should improve to about a 2.1 percent gain, or 0.6 percent in real terms, after the effects of inflation are subtracted.

The Honolulu Consumer Price Index (CPI), which increased 4.3 last year, is now expected to increase only 1.2 percent in 2009. In 2010, the CPI is projected to increase 1.5 percent.

Major indicators of construction activity for 2008 suggest slower construction activity in Hawaii in the near future. Increases in the value of government contracts awarded in 2008 were more than countered by declines in the value of private building authorizations. Going forward, increased government activity is unlikely to completely offset construction declines in the private sector.

Overall, Hawaii's real GDP is projected to decline a slight 0.2 percent in 2009, compared with the previous forecast of no growth. Real GDP is expected to manage 1.1 percent growth in 2010.

Beyond 2010 the gradual recovery is expected to continue with modest job growth of around 0.5 percent for 2011. Visitor arrivals should show a healthier, 4.6 percent increase in 2011. Hawaii's GDP growth in 2011 is expected to reach 1.6 percent. This gradual recovery will continue into 2012, assuming national and international economic conditions continue to improve.

COUNTY ECONOMIC CONDITIONS

Overall economic conditions were mostly negative across counties in the fourth quarter of 2008. Civilian labor force increased in all counties, but civilian employment decreased in all counties, except for a slight increase in Honolulu; total tax revenues were down in Honolulu and remained about the same in the neighbor island counties; and wage and salary jobs were down in all counties, compared to the fourth quarter of 2007 (Tables 2 through 5). The performance of the visitor sector was all negative in all counties. Hotel occupancy rates were also down in all counties. Values of private building permits also decreased in all counties.

In the fourth quarter of 2008, General Excise and Use Tax (GET) revenues (excluding the Honolulu County Surcharge) decreased \$62.7 million or 11.3 percent in Honolulu but increased \$3.0 million in the three neighbor island counties compared to the same quarter of 2007. In 2008, GET revenues decreased \$44.4 million in Honolulu, \$5.2 million in Kauai, and \$3.4 million in Maui. GET revenue in Hawaii County remained about the same in 2008 compared with 2007. The Net Individual Income Tax collections increased \$19.1 million or 6.0 percent in Honolulu but decreased \$3.1 million in the neighbor island counties for the fourth quarter. Transient Accommodation Tax collections decreased \$6.3 million in Honolulu and remained about the same in the neighbor island counties.

In the fourth quarter of 2008, Honolulu lost 3,800 or 0.8 percent wage and salary jobs over the fourth quarter of 2007. The largest job losses occurred in Transportation, Warehousing and Utilities (lost 3,100 jobs or 12.8 percent), followed by Natural Resources, Mining and Construction (lost 1,400 jobs), Accommodation (lost 1,200 jobs), and Arts, Entertainment & Recreation (lost 850 jobs). State Government added the most jobs in the quarter (2,000 jobs or 3.4 percent), followed by Federal Government (1,050 jobs or 3.6 percent), Health Care and Social Assistance (650 jobs), and Educational Services (500 jobs).

In the fourth quarter of 2008, Hawaii County lost 950 wage and salary jobs or 1.4 percent from the fourth quarter of 2007. Increases in the State Government (added 550 jobs) and Federal Government (added 200 jobs) were more than offset by job losses in the private sector. Accommodation lost the most jobs in the quarter (lost 550 jobs), followed by Natural Resources, Mining and Construction (lost 450 jobs), and Transportation, Warehousing and Utilities (lost 350 jobs).

Maui County saw a net loss of 1,200 jobs in the fourth quarter of 2008, a 1.6 percent decrease from the same quarter of 2007. The Natural Resources, Mining and Construction sector lost the most jobs (550 jobs) in the quarter, followed by the Transportation, Warehousing and Utilities sector 350 jobs), Financial Services (lost and Professional and Business Services (both lost 300 jobs), and Retail Trade (lost 200 jobs). The State Government and Local Government added 400 jobs and 100 jobs, respectively, in the quarter.

In the fourth quarter of 2008, Kauai County lost 1,200 wage and salary jobs or 3.8 percent from the same quarter last year. Accommodation lost 500 jobs, followed by Professional and Business Services (lost 450 jobs), and Transportation, Warehousing and Utilities (lost 200 jobs).

Both total visitor arrivals and visitor days by air decreased substantially in all counties in the fourth quarter of 2008, compared to the fourth quarter of 2007. Visitor day decreases were less than visitor arrival decreases in all counties due to longer average length of stay in the quarter.

In the fourth quarter of 2008, the value of total private building permits decreased in all counties from the same quarter of 2007. In dollar terms, Maui County decreased the most at \$230.7 million or 82.5 percent, followed by Hawaii County at \$110.1 million or 53.0 percent, Kauai County at \$49.5 million or 74.3 percent, and Honolulu at \$49.1 million or 15.7 percent (Table E-8).

A. LABOR FORCE AND JOBS

Hawaii's labor market conditions were mostly negative in the fourth quarter of 2008 compared to the same quarter of 2007. While the civilian labor force achieved positive growth, civilian employment decreased and civilian unemployment increased in the quarter. As a result, Hawaii's unemployment rate increased to 4.9 percent in the quarter.

In the fourth quarter of 2008, the civilian labor force totaled 659,800 people, an increase of 12,700 people or 2.0 percent from the same quarter of 2007 (Tables 1 and A-1). In 2008, civilian labor force grew 1.9 percent from 2007.

Civilian employment, however, decreased slightly. In the fourth quarter of 2008, 627,700 people were employed in Hawaii, which is 1,400 people or 0.2 percent less than that in the fourth quarter of 2007 (Tables 1 and A-2). For the year of 2008, total civilian employment increased 0.5 percent from the previous year.

The increasing labor force contributed to the increase in the number of unemployed. The number of civilian unemployed averaged 32,100 in the fourth quarter of 2008, a 78.3 percent increase from the fourth quarter of 2007 (Table A-3). In 2008, the number of unemployed averaged 26,450, 54.2 percent greater than 2007.

Due to a rapid increase in the number of unemployed, the Hawaii unemployment rate (not seasonally adjusted) increased from 2.8 percent in the fourth quarter of 2007 to 4.9 percent in the fourth quarter of 2008 (Table A-4). In 2008, Hawaii's unemployment rate averaged 4.0 percent, significantly higher than that of 2007. The initial liable claims for unemployment, which measures the number of people who lost their jobs in Hawaii and moved to other states, increased 31.6 percent or 261 people in the fourth quarter of 2008 compared to the same quarter last year (Table A-27). In the fourth quarter of 2008, Hawaii's civilian wage and salary jobs totaled 628,600, a decrease of 7,200 jobs or 1.1 percent from the same quarter of 2007 (Table A-5). In 2008, wage and salary jobs remained the same as that of 2007. Wage and salary jobs increased 1.0 percent in 2007 after a 2.5 percent increase in 2006.

There were only a few sectors experienced job growth in the fourth quarter of 2008 compared to the fourth quarter of 2007. Health Care and Social Assistance added 850 jobs or 1.4 percent (Table A-16), followed by Educational Services with 650 jobs or 4.6 percent (Table A-15), and Other Services with 500 jobs or 1.9 percent (Table A-20).

In the fourth quarter of 2008, Transportation, Warehousing, and Utilities lost 4,000 jobs or 12.2 percent (Table A-11) compared to the same quarter of 2007; Natural Resources, Mining and Construction lost 2,350 jobs or 5.9 percent (Table A-7); Accommodation lost 2,200 jobs or 5.7 percent (Table A-18); Professional and Business Services lost 1,500 jobs or 2.0 percent (Table A-14); Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation lost 1,000 jobs or 8.3 percent (Table A-17); Food Services and Drinking Places lost 750 jobs or 1.3 percent (Table A-19); Financial Activities lost 550 jobs or 1.8 percent (Table A-13); and Information lost 450 jobs or 4.2 percent (Table A-12). Agriculture also lost 550 wage and salary jobs or 8.6 percent (Table A-25).

During the fourth quarter of 2008, government added 4,700 jobs or 3.8 percent (Table A-21) compared to the same quarter of 2007. Federal government added 1,100 jobs (Table A-22); State government added 3,050 jobs (Table A-23); and Local government added 550 jobs (Table A-24) in the fourth quarter of 2008 compared with the fourth quarter of 2007.



B. INCOME AND PRICES

Hawaii total personal income continued to increase at a solid pace during the third quarter of 2008 (the period for which the latest data are available from the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis) over the same quarter of 2007. The rate of increase was the highest for Personal Current Transfer Receipts. Earnings grew in most major sectors except for Transportation and Warehousing, Information, Management of Companies and Enterprises, Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation, Accommodation and Food Services. and Construction (Table B-1).

In the third quarter of 2008, total nominal personal income (i.e., not adjusted for inflation) increased \$1,999 million or 4.0 percent from the third quarter of 2007 (Tables B-1 and B-2). For the year of 2007, total personal income increased 5.9 percent from 2006.

During the third quarter of 2008, Wage and Salary Disbursements, the largest component of personal income, increased \$952 million or 3.3 percent from the third quarter of 2007. For 2007, Wage and Salary Disbursements grew 5.6 percent from 2006, lower than the 6.7 percent growth between 2005 and 2006 (Table B-3). Wage and Salary Disbursements comprised about 57 percent of total personal income.

Supplements to Wages and Salaries, consisting of employer payments to retirement plans, private group health insurance plans, private workers compensation plans, and other such benefits, increased \$376 million or 4.7 percent in the third quarter of 2008 from the same quarter of 2007 (Table B-4). For 2007, Supplements to Wages and Salaries increased 4.8 percent, 0.9 percentage point lower than the 5.7 percent annual increase between 2005 and 2006.

Proprietors' Income, the income most closely related to entrepreneurial activity, decreased 1.2 percent in the third quarter of 2008 over that of 2007 (Table B-5). For 2007, Proprietors' Income was down 5.5 percent from 2006, compared to 6.7 percent increase between 2005 and 2006. Dividends, Interest, and Rent increased \$205 million or 2.5 percent in the third quarter of 2008 from the same quarter of 2007. For the year of 2007, Dividends, Interest, and Rent were up 8.7 percent from 2006, compared to 13.1 percent growth between 2005 and 2006 (Table B-6).

Personal Current Transfer Receipts grew by \$641 million or 9.8 percent in the third quarter of 2008 from the same quarter of 2007. For 2007, Personal Current Transfer Receipts grew at a rate of 9.7 percent compared to a 5.3 percent growth in 2006 (Table B-7).

In the third quarter of 2008, Contributions to Government Social Insurance, which is subtracted from total personal income, increased \$138 million or 3.4 percent compared to the third quarter of 2007. For 2007, Contributions to Government Social Insurance grew 3.6 percent from 2006 (Table B-8).

In the third quarter of 2008, total non-farm private sector earnings increased \$374 million or 1.4 percent from the third quarter of 2007. Earnings increased across most private sectors in the third quarter of 2008 over 2007. In dollar terms, the largest increase occurred in Professional and Technical Services, followed by Health Care and Social Assistance, Wholesale Trade, Other Services, Except Public Administration, and Administrative and Waste Services. During the third quarter of 2008, total government earnings increased \$973 million or 7.5 percent from the third quarter of 2007 (Table B-1).

In the second half of 2008, Honolulu's consumer price index (CPI) increased 3.6 percent from the same period last year, compared to the U.S. average CPI increase of 3.4 percent for the same period (Table B-9). The Honolulu CPI increase in the second half of 2008 was primarily due to increases in Food and Beverages, Other Goods and Services, Education and Communication, and Transportation components, which increased 6.7 percent, 5.2 percent, 3.5 percent, and 3.3 percent, respectively in the second half of 2008 compared to the second half of 2007.



The State general fund tax revenues decreased in the fourth quarter of 2008 compared to the same quarter of 2007.¹ Increases in Net Individual Income Tax collections and Net Corporate Income Tax collections were more than offset by decreases in General Excise and Use Tax (GET) revenues and Transient Accommodations Tax (TAT) collections.

For the fourth quarter of 2008, total tax collections distributed to the State general funds totaled \$1,076.6 million, a decrease of \$48.2 million or 4.3 percent over the fourth quarter of 2007 (Tables C-1 and C-2). In 2008, State general fund tax revenues amounted to \$4,611.2 million, a decrease of \$71.8 million or 1.5 percent over 2007.

During the fourth quarter of 2008, GET revenues (excluding the Honolulu County Surcharge) totaled \$593.1 million, a decrease of \$59.7 million or 9.1 percent over the fourth quarter of 2007 (Tables C-1 and C-3). In 2008, GET revenues decreased \$53.0 million or 2.0 percent from the previous year.

Compared to the fourth quarter of 2007, Net Individual Income Tax revenues increased \$15.9 million or 4.3 percent to \$386.3 million in the fourth quarter of 2008 (Table C-4). This increase was due to a \$16.2 million or 4.6 percent increase in Revenues from Withholding Tax on Wages (Table C-7), an \$18.6 million or 33.4 percent decrease in Refunds (Table C-8), which is subtracted from the categories of individual income tax revenues, and a \$6.8 million or 39.7 percent increase in Payments with Returns (Table C-6), which is related to self-employment income. However, these increases were offset partially by a \$25.7 million or 43.9 percent decrease in Declaration of Estimated Taxes (Table C-5). In 2008, Net Individual Income Tax collections decreased \$14.4 million or 0.9 percent from the previous year. The annual increases from 2004 to 2007 in the Net Individual Income Tax collections were 15.3 percent, 17.2 percent, 8.9 percent, and 0.2 percent, respectively.

Net Corporate Income Tax revenues, which tend to be very volatile in nature, increased \$1.7 million or 136.6 percent in the fourth quarter of 2008 compared to the fourth quarter of 2007 (Table C-9). A \$7.7 million or 32.6 percent decrease in Declaration of Estimated Taxes (Table C-10) was offset by a \$7.3 million or 25.1 percent decrease in Refunds (Table C-12) and a \$2.1 million or 32.2 percent increase in Corporate Payments with Returns (Table C-11). In 2008, Net Corporate Income Tax revenues decreased \$3.4 million or 4.3 percent from 2007.

In the fourth quarter of 2008, Transient Accommodations Tax (TAT) revenues decreased \$6.2 million or 11.5 percent compared to the fourth quarter of 2007 (Table C-13). In 2008, TAT collections decreased \$8.4 million or 3.6 percent from 2007.

According to the most recent data available, compared to the third quarter of 2007, changes in the major categories of the GET tax base were mixed in the third quarter of 2008. Retailing tax base decreased 1.1 percent or \$70.9 million (Table C-14), the Services tax base increased 6.4 percent or \$171.1 million (Table C-15), the Contracting tax base increased 8.9 percent or \$171.0 million (Table C-16), and the Hotel Rentals tax base decreased 5.7 percent or \$50.5 million (Table C-17).






Figure 4. Transient Accommodations Tax Revenues

D. TOURISM

In the fourth quarter of 2008, Hawaii's tourism sector continued the negative growth started in the second quarter of 2008. Domestic arrivals and international arrivals both decreased significantly. In the fourth quarter of 2008, average daily visitor census, visitor expenditures, total air capacity, and hotel occupancy also decreased substantially.

The total number of visitors arriving by air to Hawaii decreased 281,387 people or 15.5 percent in the fourth quarter of 2008 compared to the same quarter of 2007 (Tables D-1 and D-2). Similarly, total average daily census was down 24,802 or 13.5 percent in the quarter. For the year of 2008, total visitor arrivals by air decreased 797,396 people or 10.9 percent from that of 2007, while average daily census decreased 17,539 or 8.1 percent from 2007.

The decrease was more severe in domestic arrivals. Total visitor arrivals on domestic flights decreased 229,468 or 17.2 percent in the fourth quarter of 2008 from the fourth quarter in 2007 (Table D-3). In 2008, domestic arrivals were down 680,260 or 12.2 percent from that in 2007.

Arrivals on international flights decreased 51,919 or 10.9 percent in the fourth quarter of 2008 compared to the fourth quarter of 2007 (Table D-4). In 2008, international arrivals were down 117,136 or 6.1 percent from 2007.

In terms of major market areas, from the fourth quarter of 2007 to the fourth quarter of 2008, arrivals from the U.S. West decreased 157,526 or 20.0 percent (Table D-5), the second largest quarter-over-quarter decrease since 1990 for this market; while arrivals from the U.S. East decreased 59,965 or 14.6 percent (Table D-6). This was the sixth consecutive quarterly decline in the U.S. East Market. Similarly, arrivals from Japan decreased 45,419 or 13.9 percent (Table D-7). In the fourteen quarters from the fourth quarter of 2005 to the fourth quarter of 2008, only one quarter (2007Q3) had a quarter-over-quarter increase in the Japanese market. For the year of 2008, arrivals from U.S. West were down 457,784 or 14.7 percent from that of 2007; arrivals from the U.S. East were down 218,829 or 11.5 percent; and Japanese arrivals were down 135,691 or 10.5 percent from 2007.

The total average daily visitor census was down 13.5 percent or 24,802 visitors per day in the fourth quarter of 2008 over the same quarter of 2007 (Table D-8). Domestic average daily census decreased 14.8 percent or 21,732 visitors per day (Table D-9), while international average daily census decreased 8.1 percent or 3,070 visitors per day (Table D-10). In 2008, domestic average daily census decreased 15,700 or 10.4 percent from that of 2007; international average daily census decreased 1,838 or 4.8 percent from the previous year.

Nominal visitor expenditures by air totaled \$2,617.8 million in the fourth quarter of 2008, down 17.4 percent from the same quarter of 2007 (Table D-11). In 2008, visitor expenditures decreased \$1,242.4 million or 9.9 percent from 2007.

Total airline capacity, as measured in terms of the number of available seats flown to Hawaii, decreased substantially in the fourth quarter of 2008 compared to the same quarter of 2007 (Table D-12). A 15.8 percent or 293,095 decrease in domestic seats (Table D-13) combined with a 8.8 percent or 59,111 decrease in international seats (Table D-14) led to a 13.9 percent or 352,206 seats decrease in the number of total available seats for the quarter. For the year of 2008, the number of total available seats decreased 10.2 percent or 1,064,855 seats from 2007.

In the fourth quarter of 2008, statewide hotel occupancy rate averaged 63.7 percent, down 8.3 percentage points from the same quarter of 2007 (Table D-15). For all of 2008, occupancy rate averaged 70.4 percent, down 4.6 percentage points from 2007. In the fourth quarter of 2008, hotel occupancy rate decreased the most in Maui (lost 13.5 percentage points to 59.6 percent), followed by Kauai (lost 12.1 percentage points to 61.3 percent), Hawaii (lost 11.9 percentage points to 50.8 percent), and Honolulu (lost 4.0 percentage points to 70.0 percent).



The value of government contracts awarded increased in the fourth quarter of 2008 compared with the same quarter last year; however, the increase in government contracts value was more than offset by a decrease private building authorizations in the quarter. All components of private building authorizations decreased in the quarter. State Government Capital Improvement Project (CIP) expenditures also decreased significantly in the quarter. Reflecting the decrease in private construction, construction jobs construction jobs decreased substantially in the quarter for the first time since the first quarter of 2002. At the same time, the median sale prices for both single family resales and condominium resales in Honolulu decreased in the quarter; and the number of both single family and condominium units sold in Honolulu continued to decrease significantly.

Construction was one of the major contributors to job growth in Hawaii. Over the past five years from 2002 to 2007, construction job growth averaged 8.2 percent per year. In the fourth quarter of 2008; however, the Natural Resources, Mining and Construction sector lost 2,350 jobs, a decrease of 5.9 percent compared with the same quarter last year. This is the second negative quarter-over-quarter growth since the first quarter of 2002 (Table 1 and Table A-7). In 2008, construction jobs decreased 0.1 percent or 50 jobs compared to 2007.

In the fourth quarter of 2008, total value of private building authorizations decreased \$439.5 million or 50.7 percent compared with the fourth quarter of 2007 (Tables E-1 and E-8). In the fourth quarter, the value of new residential permits was down \$197.9 million or 54.6 percent; that of new commercial and the industrial permits was down \$231.0 million or 83.3 percent; and that of additions and alternations permits was down \$10.6 million or 4.7 percent, compared to the same quarter last year. In 2008, total private building authorizations decreased \$678.9 million or 18.9 percent compared with that of 2007.

In the fourth quarter of 2008, the value of total private building permits decreased in all counties from the same quarter of 2007. In dollar terms, Maui County decreased the most at \$230.7 million or 82.5 percent, next was Hawaii County at \$110.1 million or 53.0 percent, Kauai County at \$49.5 million or 74.3 percent, and Honolulu at \$49.1 million or 15.7 percent (Table E-8).

Government contracts awarded increased \$155.4 million or 133.4 percent in the fourth quarter of 2008 compared to the same quarter of 2007. In 2008, government contracts awarded increased \$83.3 million or 9.6 percent compared with that of 2007 (Table E-1). State Government CIP expenditures; however, were down \$304.3 million or 46.6 percent in the fourth quarter of 2008 from the same quarter in 2007 (Table E-2). In 2008, CIP expenditures increased \$72.1 million or 4.9 percent from 2007.

The single-family unit authorizations declined 62.3 percent in the fourth quarter of 2008, the single-family 2008. In unit authorizations decreased 36.4 percent from 2007 (Table E-4). The value of multi-family units authorized was up 384.7 percent in the fourth quarter of 2008 compared to the same quarter last year, but was down 17.4 percent for the year of 2008 compared to 2007 (Table E-5).

The Honolulu Construction Cost Index for Single Family Residences increased 5.6 percent in the fourth quarter of 2008 over that of 2007 (Table E-6), while the comparable index for High-Rise Buildings rose 5.7 percent (Table E-7).

In the fourth quarter of 2008, Honolulu's median price for single family resales was \$610,000, decreased 2.4 percent (Table E-9); the median price for condominium resales decreased 1.6 percent to \$315,000 compared to the same quarter in 2007 (Table E-10). In the fourth quarter of 2008, the number of single-family unit and condominium unit resales were down 19.1 percent and 34.2 percent, respectively, from the fourth quarter of 2007 (Tables E-11 and E-12).

F. OTHER INDICATORS


The total number of bankruptcy filings in Hawaii increased 76.4 percent for the fourth quarter of 2008 from the same quarter of 2007. For 2008, total filings increased 50.4 percent from 1,381 cases in 2007 to 2,077 cases in 2008. The 2008 total filings were still significantly below the 4,480 total filings in 2005 when significant changes in the laws governing bankruptcy were put in place. Between 1996 and 2005, total filings fluctuated between about 3,000 and 6,000 cases per year.

The number of Chapter 7 filings, the largest category, increased 82.6 percent or 233 cases from 282 cases in the fourth quarter of 2007 to 515 cases in the fourth quarter of 2008. Chapter 7 filings are intended to liquidate assets and discharge debt to provide the debtor with a fresh start. For 2008, Chapter 7 filings were up 46.3 percent or 512, following an increase of 39.5 percent or 313 cases in 2007.

Chapter 11 filings increased from 5 cases in the fourth quarter of 2007 to 11 cases in the fourth quarter of 2008. For 2008, Chapter 11 filings increased from 16 to 23. Chapter 11 filings involve the structuring of repayment plans for companies. Chapter 11 filings were up from 9 cases in 2006 to 16 cases in 2007.

In the fourth quarter of 2008, Chapter 13 filings increased 49.3 percent or 36 cases from 73 filings in the fourth quarter of 2007. In 2008, Chapter 13 filings were up 68.6 percent or 177 cases from 258 cases in 2007. Chapter 13 bankruptcy allows debtors to work out repayment arrangements with creditors. In 2007, Chapter 13 filings were up 70.9 percent or 107 cases from 2006.



III. TERMS AND DEFINITIONS

- Accommodation Jobs This industry provides lodging or short-term accommodations for travelers, vacationers, and others. Some provide lodging only; while others provide meals, laundry, and recreational facilities, as well as lodging. There are three industry groups: (1) traveler accommodation includes establishments that primarily provide traditional types of lodging services. This group includes hotels, motels, and bed and breakfast inns. (2) recreational accommodation includes establishments that operate lodging facilities primarily designed to accommodate outdoor enthusiasts. Included are travel trailer campsites, recreation vehicle parks, and outdoor adventure retreats; and (3) rooming and boarding houses includes establishments providing temporary or longer-term accommodations that for the period of occupancy may serve as a principal residence. Board (i.e., meals) may be provided but is not essential.
- Agriculture Wage and Salary Jobs Full- and part-time jobs for which payment was made by the employer in the survey week containing the 12th of the month. Includes farm jobs and machinery operators. Closely related management and services jobs are included for sugar and pineapple but are excluded for other types of agriculture.
- Airline Seat Total number of available seats from all direct flights to Hawaii, including scheduled and chartered flights.
- Arts, Entertainment & Recreation Jobs This industry includes a wide range of establishments that operate facilities or provide services to meet varied cultural, entertainment, and recreational interests of their patrons. This sector comprises (1) establishments that are involved in producing, promoting, or participating in live performances, events, or exhibits intended for public viewing: (2) establishments that preserve and exhibit objects and sites of historical, cultural, or educational interest; and (3) establishments that operate facilities or provide services that enable patrons to participate in recreational activities or pursue amusement, hobby, and leisure-time interests. Excluded from this sector are: (1) establishments that provide both accommodations and recreational facilities, such as hunting and fishing camps and resort and casino hotels; (2) restaurants and night clubs that provide live entertainment in addition to the sale of food and beverages, (3) motion picture theaters, libraries and archives, and publishers of newspapers, magazines, books, periodicals, and computer software; and (4) establishments using transportation equipment

to provide recreational and entertainment services, such as those operating sightseeing buses, dinner cruises, or helicopter rides.

- Average Daily Visitor Census- By Air Average number of visitors present daily in the state. Figures are computed monthly by the Research & Economic Analysis Division, DBEDT based on arrival and departure dates from ground and in-flight surveys.
- **Average Length of Stay- By Air** Number of days visitors are in the State including the day of arrival and of departure.

Bankruptcy Filings –

- **Chapter 7** Is available to both individuals and business debtors. Its purpose is to achieve a fair distribution to creditors of whatever non-exempt property the debtor has and to give the individual debtor a fresh start through the discharge in bankruptcy.
- **Chapter 11** Is available for both consumer and business debtors. Its purpose is to rehabilitate a business as a going concern or reorganize an individual's finances through a court-approved reorganization plan.
- **Chapter 12** Is designed to give special debt relief to a family farmer with regular income from farming.
- **Chapter 13** Is available for an individual with regular income whose debts do not exceed specific amounts, typically used to budget some of the debtor's future earnings under a plan through which creditors are paid in whole or in part.

- Chained (1996) dollar Gross Domestic Product by State (GDP) [Note: formerly called 'Gross State Product'] series are calculated (using national chaintype implicit price deflators) as the product of the chain-type quantity index and the 1996 current-dollar value of the corresponding series, divided by 100. Because the formula for the chain-type quantity indexes uses weights of more than one period, the corresponding chained-dollar estimates are usually not additive; that is, state totals usually do not add to regional totals or to U.S. totals, and regional totals usually do not add to U.S. totals.
- **Civilian Employment** Persons 16 years of age or older who, during the survey week containing the 12th of the month, were either at work for pay or profit, or

worked without pay for 15 hours or more on a family farm or business, or were with a job but not at work. Both permanent and temporary employees and those who are working either full- or part-time are included.

- **Civilian Labor Force** –Total of employed and unemployed persons, excluding those in the armed forces and 16 years of age or under. U.S. Census Bureau does surveys for the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.
- **Civilian Unemployment** Persons 16 years of age or older who (1) did not work at all during the survey week but were actively seeking work and were available for work; or (2) did not work at all, were available for work, and were waiting to be called back from layoff or were waiting to report to a new wage or salary job within 30 days.
- **Condominium Resales**: Consists of resales of condominium, duplexes and townhomes that are entered in the Multiple Listing Service. It does not include apartments.
- Consumer Price Index: Honolulu or U.S. Measure of the average change in prices over time for a fixed market basket of goods and services. It is compiled by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The index measures changes from a reference date, i.e., 1982-84, which is designated as 100.0. For example, a Honolulu CPI-U (where U refers to All Urban Consumers), All Items, of 171.5 as the annual average for 1998 indicates the average prices of that group's basket was 71.5 percent higher than the weighted average of those same goods and services in 1982-84. Data are published monthly for the U.S. and semiannually for Honolulu. As of January 1998, BLS changed the reference basket based on 1982-84 consumer expenditures to a 1993-95 basket, but the base remains 1982-84 = 100.0. The BLS Internet site information about has more the CPI at http://www.bls.gov/cpi/home.htm.
- **Contracting Tax Base** The total receipts of businesses engaged in contracting to erect, construct, repair, or improve buildings or structures of any kind or description, or to make any installation therein. Attributed to any business engaging in the practice of architecture, engineering, land surveying, landscape architecture, and the practice of pest control or fumigation.
- **Contributions for government social insurance -** New category as part of the 'BEA Comprehensive Revision of the National Income & Product Accounts released

in December 1999. Replaces 'Personal contributions for social insurance'. These contributions, which are subtracted in the calculation of personal income, consist of the contributions, or payments, by employees, by the self-employed, and by other individuals who participate in the following government programs: Old-age, survivors, and disability insurance (social security); hospital insurance; supplementary medical insurance; unemployment insurance; railroad retirement; veterans life insurance; and temporary disability insurance. These contributions are excluded from personal income by definition, but the components of personal income upon which these contributions are basedmainly wage and salary disbursements and proprietors' income-are presented gross of these contributions.

- Dividends, Interest, and Rent U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis presents the State Personal Income estimates of these components together. It consists of income received by individuals and on behalf of individuals by private and government employee retirement plans and by quasi-individuals, including non-profit institutions and private trust funds administered by fiduciaries. Personal dividend income is payments in cash or other assets by corporations in the U.S. or abroad to noncorporate stockholders who are Hawaii residents. Personal interest income is the interest income (monetary and imputed) from all sources that is received by individuals, by private and government employee retirement plans, by nonprofit institutions, and by estates and trusts. Rental income of persons with capital consumption adjustment is the net currentproduction income of persons from the rental of real property except for the income of persons primarily engaged in the real estate business; the imputed net rental income received by owner-occupants of farmdwellings; and the royalties received by persons from patents, copyrights, and rights to natural resources. The estimates include BEA adjustments for uninsured losses to real estate caused by disasters, such as hurricanes (e.g. Iniki in 1992) and floods. See Personal Income.
- **Earnings** This BEA aggregate is the sum of three components of personal income: wages and salary disbursements, other labor income, and proprietors' income. BEA presents earnings because it can be used in analyses of regional economies as a proxy for the income generated from participation in current production. See <u>Personal Income</u>.
- **Educational Services Jobs** This industry comprises establishments that provide instruction and training by specialized establishments, such as schools, colleges,

universities, and training centers. These establishments may be privately owned and operated for profit or not for profit, or they may be publicly owned and operated. They may also offer food and accommodation services to their students. Educational services are usually delivered by teachers or instructors that explain, tell, demonstrate, supervise, and direct learning, in diverse settings, such as educational institutions, the workplace, or the home through correspondence, television, or other means.

- **Employer Contributions to Social Insurance -** New category as part of the 'BEA Comprehensive Revision of the National Income & Product Accounts released in December 1999. Replaces 'Other labor income'. This component of personal income consists of employer contributions for employee pension and insurance funds and of employer contributions for government social insurance. See <u>Personal Income</u>.
- Federal Government Jobs Includes those in the civilian agencies, i.e. Department of Defense, Agriculture, United States Postal Service and the various armed services exchange systems.
- Financial Activities Jobs Establishments primarily engaged in financial transactions, i.e. those transactions involving the creation, liquidation, or change in ownership of financial assets, and/or in facilitating financial transactions. Three principal types of activities are identified: (1) raising funds by taking deposits and/or issuing securities and, in the process, incurring liabilities; (2) pooling of risk by underwriting insurance and annuities, (3) providing specialized services facilitating or supporting financial intermediation, insurance, and employee benefit programs. In addition, monetary authorities charged with monetary control are included in this sector. This also includes real estate and the rental and leasing sector which is comprised of establishments primarily engaged in renting, leasing, or otherwise allowing the use of tangible or intangible assets, and establishments providing related services. The major portion of this sector comprises establishments that rent, lease, or otherwise allow the use of their own assets by others. The assets may be tangible, as is the case of real estate and equipment, or intangible, as is the case with patents and trademarks. Excluded from this sector are investment trusts estate (REITS) real and establishments primarily engaged in renting or leasing equipment with operators. In many cases, such as the rental of heavy construction equipment, the operator is essential to operate the equipment.
- Food Services & Drinking Places Jobs These industries prepare meals, snacks, and beverages to

customer order for immediate on-premises and offpremises consumption. Some provide food and drink only; while others provide various combinations of seating space, waiter/waitress services and incidental amenities, such as limited entertainment. The industries are grouped based on the type and level of services provided, i.e. full-service restaurants; limitedservice eating places; and special food services including caterers and mobile food services. Food services and drink activities at hotels and motels; amusement parks, theaters, casinos, country clubs, and similar recreational facilities; and civic and social organizations are included here only if these services are provided by a separate establishment primarily engaged in providing food and beverage services. Excluded are establishments operating dinner cruises which are classified as scenic and sightseeing transportation because those establishments utilize transportation equipment to provide scenic recreational entertainment.

- General Excise (Gross Income) Tax Tax charged to businesses on gross sales or gross income. The tax rate is 0.5 percent on wholesaling and intermediary services, blind vendors, producing, manufacturing, sugar processing and pineapple canning; all other activities (retailing, business and professional services, contracting, theater, amusement, radio, interest, commissions, rentals) are taxed at 4.0 percent, except insurance commissions to general agents, subagents and solicitors, who are taxed at 0.15 percent.
- General Excise and Use Tax Base The value of all goods and services sold, including the value of tangible personal property imported into Hawaii for own use or consumption. One of the most comprehensive measures of business activity in the state.
- **General Fund Tax Revenues** Receipts of the general excise and use tax, net individual and corporate income taxes comprise over 85 percent of the General Fund tax receipts. The general government fund used to account for all financial resources except those required to be accounted for in another fund, such as the highway, airport or capital improvement fund.
- Gross Domestic Product by State (GDP) [Note: formerly called 'Gross State Product'] – GDP is the value added in production by the labor and property located in a state. GDP for a state is derived as the sum of the GDP originating in all industries in the state. The estimates of real GDP are derived by applying national implicit price deflators by detailed industry to the current-dollar GDP estimates by

detailed industry. Then, in order to capture the differences across states that reflect the relative differences in the mix of goods and services that the states produce, the same chain-type index formula used in the national accounts is used to calculate the estimates of total real GDP and real GDP by major industry.

- Health Care & Social Assistance Jobs This industry includes establishments that provide both health care and social assistance for individuals. Both are included as it is sometimes difficult to distinguish between the boundaries of these two activities starting with those establishments providing medical care exclusively, continuing with those providing health care and social assistance, and finally finishing with those providing only social assistance. These services are delivered by trained professionals and the industries are defined based on the educational degree held by its Excluded are aerobic classes and practitioners. nonmedical diet and weight reducing centers. Although these can be viewed as health services, these services are not typically delivered by health practitioners.
- Honolulu Construction Cost Indexes: High-Rise or Single Family – As compiled, by First Hawaiian Bank, and currently by DBEDT, these indexes measure changes in contractors' costs for building materials and labor. For discussion of Methodology, see <u>Hawaii's Economy May 2000</u> at <u>http://www.hawaii.gov/dbedt/hecon/he5-00/index.html</u>.
- Hotel Occupancy Rate The percentage of occupied rooms in a hotel. Hotel occupancy rates depend not only on the number of visitors and their length of stay, but also on the hotel room inventory, e.g., a large increase in new hotel units results in a drop in occupancy rates, until such time as visitor traffic builds up enough to fill them. Rates are obtained from a sample survey conducted on a monthly basis.
- **Hotel Rental Tax Base** is the economic base from which all hotel business activity is taxed. It includes the furnishing of temporary accommodations in a hotel, or other place in which lodgings are regularly furnished to transients for compensation.
- Implicit Price Deflator The implicit price deflator is calculated as the ratio of the current-dollar value to the corresponding chained-dollar value multiplied by 100.
 OR Implicit price deflators are weighted averages of the detailed price indexes used to prepare each aggregate and component and are calculated as the

ratio of current- to chained-dollar output multiplied by 100.

- Information Jobs Are in establishments engaged in the following processes: (a) producing and distributing information and cultural products, (b) providing the means to transmit or distribute these products as well as data or communications, and (c) processing data. Included are publishing industries, including software publishing, and both traditional publishing and publishing exclusively on the Internet; the motion picture and sound recording industries; the industries, broadcasting including traditional broadcasting and those broadcasting exclusively over the Internet; the telecommunications industries; the industries known as Internet service providers and web search portals, data processing industries, and the information services industries. For the purpose of developing NAICS, it is the transformation of information into a commodity that is produced and distributed by a number of growing industries that is at issue. The Information sector groups three types of establishments: (1) those engaged in producing and distributing information and cultural products; (2) those that provide the means to transmit or distribute these products as well as data or communications; and (3) those that process data. Many of the industries in the NAICS Information sector are engaged in producing products protected by copyright law, or in distributing them (other than distribution by traditional wholesale and retail methods). Examples are traditional publishing industries, software and directory and mailing list publishing industries, and film and sound industries. Broadcasting and telecommunications industries and information providers and processors are also included in the Information sector, because their technologies are so closely linked to other industries in the Information sector.
- **Initial Agent Claims** Notices of unemployment filed against another state by its workers who have moved to Hawaii.
- **Initial Liable Claims** Notices of unemployment filed against Hawaii by Hawaii workers who have moved to another state.
- **Local Government Jobs** Includes those in the county governments.
- Manufacturing Jobs Are in establishments engaged in the mechanical, physical, or chemical transformation of materials, substances, or components into new products. The assembling of component parts of manufactured products is considered manufacturing,

except in cases where the activity is appropriately classified as construction. Included in manufacturing are plants, factories, or mills and characteristically use power-driven machines and materials-handling equipment. However, establishments that transform materials or substances into new products by hand or in the worker's home and those engaged in selling to the general public products made on the same premises from which they are sold, such as bakeries, candy stores, and custom tailors, may also be included in this sector. Manufacturing establishments may process materials or may contract with other establishments to process their materials for them. Both types of establishments are included in manufacturing. The following activities are considered manufacturing in NAICS: milk or water bottling and pasteurizing; fresh fish packaging; printing and related activities; ready-mixed concrete production; ship repair and renovation; machine shops; and tire retreading. Conversely, there are activities that NAICS classifies as non-manufacturing, i.e. agriculture, forestry, fishing and hunting; the construction of structures and fabricating operations performed at the site of construction by contractors, establishments engaged in breaking of bulk and redistribution in smaller lots, including packaging, repackaging, or bottling products, customized assembly of computers, etc

- NAICS The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) has replaced the U.S. Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) system. NAICS was developed jointly by the U.S., Canada, and Mexico to provide new comparability in statistics about business activity across North America. Estimates of Personal Income earnings, wage and salary disbursements, and employment by NAICS subsector are available starting with 2001. For descriptions of NAICS industries, please see http://www.census.gov/epcd/www/naics.html at the Census Bureau.
- Natural Resources, Mining & Construction Jobs In Hawaii, 99 percent of the jobs in this category are in Construction and the remaining 1 percent in Mining. Included are those establishments that extract naturally occurring mineral solids, such as coal and ores; liquid minerals, such as crude petroleum; and gases, such as natural gas. There are two activities: mine operation and mining support activities. The construction sector comprises establishments primarily engaged in the construction of buildings or engineering projects (e.g., highways and utility systems), additions, alterations, or maintenance and repairs. Establishments primarily engaged in the preparation of sites for new construction and establishments primarily engaged in

subdividing land for sale as building sites also are included in this sector.

- **Net Earnings** BEA also calculates this measure as Earnings less Personal Contributions for Social Insurance. Net earnings is used in the presentation of State and local area personal income as the sum of net earnings, transfer payments, and personal dividend income, personal interest income, and rental income of persons. It can be used as a proxy for income before taxes. See <u>Personal Income</u>.
- Net Individual or Corporation Income Tax Revenue For individuals, it is calculated as declaration of estimated taxes plus payments with returns plus withholding tax on wages less refunds. Net corporate income tax revenue is calculated as declarations of estimated taxes plus payments with returns less refunds.
- **Non-Agriculture Wage and Salary Jobs** Derived monthly from a sample survey of employers reporting the number of persons who received pay for any part of the pay period containing the 12th of the month. Includes all full- and part-time non-agricultural workers, permanent and temporary workers, and workers on paid sick leave and paid vacation.
- Other Goods and Services Honolulu Consumer Price Index component detail. Prior to the CPI 1998 Revision, it measured the change in average prices of tobacco products, personal care goods and services, and personal and educational expenditures. Beginning with January 1998 data, this category includes tobacco, personal care, and miscellaneous goods and services. Other components, for example, schoolbooks and tuition, moved to the new "Education and Communication" and recreational reading to "Recreation". BLS' Monthly Labor Review (December 1996), and BLS' Internet site have more information about the CPI at http://www.bls.gov/cpi/.
- Other Labor Income See Employer Contributions to Social Insurance'.
- Other Services (except public administration) Jobs Are in establishments engaged in providing services not specifically provided for elsewhere in the classification system., such as equipment and machinery repairing, promoting or administering religious activities, grantmaking, advocacy, and providing drycleaning and laundry services, personal care services, death care services, pet care services, photofinishing services, temporary parking services, and dating services. Private households that engage in employing workers on or about the premises in

activities primarily concerned with the operation of the household are included in this sector. Excluded from this sector are establishments primarily engaged in retailing new equipment and also performing repairs and general maintenance on equipment

- **Personal Contributions for Social Insurance** See <u>'Contributions for government social insurance</u>'.
- Personal current transfer receipts Modified category as part of the 'BEA Comprehensive Revision of the National Income & Product Accounts' released in December 1999. Formerly 'Transfer Payments'. This component of personal income is payments to persons for which no current services are performed. It consists of payments to individuals and to nonprofit institutions by Federal, state, and local governments and by businesses. Government payments to individuals includes retirement and disability insurance benefits, medical payments (mainly Medicare and Medicaid), income maintenance benefits, unemployment insurance benefits, veterans benefits, and Federal grants and loans to students. Government payments to nonprofit institutions excludes payments by the Federal Government for work under research and development contracts. Business payments to persons consists primarily of liability payments for personal injury and of corporate gifts to nonprofit institutions.
- **Personal Income** –Income received by persons for participation in production, from government and business transfer payments, and from government interest. It is calculated as the sum of wage & salary disbursements, supplements to wages and salaries, proprietors' income with inventory valuation and capital consumption adjustments, rental income of persons with capital consumption adjustment, personal dividend income, personal interest income, and personal current transfer receipts, less contributions for government social insurance. For additional information see <u>http://www.bea.doc.gov/bea/regional/spi/</u>
- **Professional & Business Services Jobs** Are in establishments that specialize in performing professional, scientific, and technical activities for others and require a high degree of expertise and training. These activities include: legal advice and representation; accounting, bookkeeping, and payroll services; architectural, engineering, and specialized design services; computer services; consulting services; research services; advertising services; photographic services; translation and interpretation services; veterinary services; and other professional, scientific, and technical services to business and sometimes to households, but excludes establishments

primarily engaged in providing a range of day-to-day office administrative services, such as financial planning, billing and recordkeeping, personnel, and physical distribution and logistics. The management sector comprises establishments that hold the securities of companies and enterprises for the purpose of owning a controlling interest or influencing management decisions or establishments that administer, oversee, and manage establishments of the company or enterprise and that normally undertake the strategic organizational planning or and decisionmaking role of the company or enterprise. Establishments in this sector perform essential activities that are often undertaken, in-house, by establishments in many sectors of the economy but by consolidating the performance of these activities, economies of scale are achieved. Also included are establishments that perform routine support activities, such as office administration, hiring and placing of personnel, document preparation and similar clerical services, solicitation, collection, security and surveillance services, cleaning, and waste disposal services on a contract or fee basis.

- Proprietors' Income This component of BEA Personal income is the current-production income (including income in kind) of sole proprietorships, partnerships and cooperatives. Corporate directors' fees and the imputed net rental income of owner-occupants of farm dwellings is included in proprietors' income but the imputed net rental income of owner-occupants of nonfarm dwellings is included in rental income of persons. Proprietors' income excludes dividends and monetary interest received by nonfinancial business and rental incomes by persons not primarily engaged in the real estate business; these incomes are included in dividends, net interest, and rental income of personas, respectively. See <u>Personal Income</u>.
- Retail Tax Base includes the general excise tax base on retailing. Retail sales include sales for consumption or use by the purchaser and not for resale. The general excise tax at the retail level (4%) is sometimes loosely called a sales tax. However, it differs from a typical sales tax in two respects: (1) it is a tax on the gross income of the seller rather than a tax on the purchase price of the buyer; (2) the retail excise tax in Hawaii applies to all retail sales taxes exempt some commodities such as food and services.
- **Retail Trade Jobs** Are in establishments engaged in retailing merchandise, generally without transformation, and rendering services incidental to the sale of merchandise. The retailing process is the final step in the distribution of merchandise; retailers

are, therefore, organized to sell merchandise in small quantities to the general public. This sector comprises two main types of retailers: store and nonstore retailers. Store retailers operate fixed point-of-sale locations, located and designed to attract a high volume of walk-in customers where they have extensive displays of merchandise and use mass-media advertising to attract customers from the general public for personal or household consumption, but some also serve business and institutional clients. These include establishments such as office supply stores, computer and software stores, building materials dealers, plumbing supply stores, and electrical supply stores. Catalog showrooms, gasoline services stations, automotive dealers, and mobile home dealers are treated as store retailers. Generally, establishments engaged in retailing merchandise and providing after-sales services are classified in this sector. Nonstore retailers are also organized to serve the general public, but they reach customers and market merchandise with methods, such as the broadcasting of "infomercials," the broadcasting and publishing of direct-response advertising, the publishing of paper and electronic catalogs, door-todoor solicitation, in-home demonstration, selling from portable stalls (street vendors, except food), and distribution through vending machines.

- Services Tax Base includes tax base data on establishments primarily engaged in providing a wide variety of services for individuals, business and government establishments, and other organizations; hotels and other lodging places; establishments providing personal, business, repair, and amusement services; health, legal, engineering, and other professional services; educational institutions; membership organizations and other miscellaneous services.
- **Single Family Home Resales:** Consists of resales of single family homes that are entered in the Multiple Listing Service.
- **State Government Jobs Education** includes all employees under the Department of Education (DOE) and the University of Hawaii System. This includes public library personnel, substitute teachers who received pay during the pay period including the 12th of the month, and support personnel such as cafeteria workers, classroom cleaners, and school security attendants. Also included are part-time employees in special programs such as the A+ After School.
- **State Government Jobs Non-Education** Includes all other executive branch departments (i.e. Agriculture, Transportation, etc.), the legislative and judicial

branches, and the Research Corporation of the University of Hawaii (RCUH).

- **Total Wage and Salary Jobs** includes nonagricultural wage and salary workers and agriculture wage and salary workers. Persons on the payroll of more than one establishment during the pay period are counted in each establishment that reports them.
- Transfer Payments See <u>Personal current transfer</u> receipts.
- **Transient Accommodations Tax** Tax levied on resort time-share vacation units and the furnishing of a room, apartment, suite which is customarily occupied by a person or group for fewer than 180 consecutive days by a hotel, apartment, motel, or cooperative apartment, rooming house, or other place in which lodgings are generally furnished to transients. The tax as of January 1, 1999 is imposed at the rate of 7.25 percent and the tax base includes time-share units.
- Transportation, Warehousing, & Utilities Jobs Are in industries providing transportation of passengers and cargo, warehousing and storage for goods, scenic and sightseeing transportation, and support activities related to modes of transportation - air, rail, water, The sector distinguishes road, and pipeline. subsectors for each mode of transportation, a subsector for warehousing and storage, and a subsector for establishments providing support activities for transportation. In addition, there are subsectors for establishments that provide passenger transportation for scenic and sightseeing purposes, postal services, and courier services. Warehousing establishments in this sector are distinguished from merchant wholesaling in that the warehouse establishments do not sell the goods. Excluded are establishments primarily engaged in providing travel agent services that support transportation and other establishments, such as hotels, businesses, and government agencies. The Utilities sector comprises establishments engaged in the provision of the following utility services: electric power, natural gas, steam supply, water supply, and sewage removal. Within this sector, the specific activities associated with the utility services provided vary by utility: electric power includes generation, transmission, and distribution; natural gas includes distribution; steam supply includes provision and/or distribution; water supply includes treatment and distribution; and sewage removal includes collection, treatment, and disposal of waste through sewer systems and sewage treatment facilities. Excluded from this sector are establishments primarily engaged in waste

management services that do not use sewer systems or sewage treatment facilities.

- **Unallocated General Excise & Use Tax Revenues** General excise and use tax revenues that could not be allocated to specific activities of the general excise & use tax. It also includes collections from penalty and interest, assessments and corrections, delinquent collections, refunds, protested payments, settlements, etc.
- **Unemployment Rate** Ratio of unemployed persons to the civilian labor force expressed as a percentage.
- **Use Tax** Excise tax levied on tangible personal property that is imported or purchased from an unlicensed seller for use in the state. The tax is based upon the purchase price or value of the tangible personal property purchased or imported, whichever is applicable. Rates: 0.5 percent, if for resale at retail; 4.0 percent, if for use or consumption.
- Visitor Arrivals- By Air, Total All persons who stayed in Hawaii for a period between one night and one year.
 - **Domestic Visitor Arrivals** Visitors who stayed in Hawaii for at least one night but less than one year, arriving on flights from Mainland U.S. A foreign resident arriving in Hawaii on a flight directly from the U.S. Mainland is counted as a domestic visitor.
 - **International Visitor Arrivals** Visitors who stayed in Hawaii for at least one night but less than one year arriving on flights from foreign countries. An U.S. resident arriving in Hawaii on a flight directly from a foreign country is counted as an international visitor.

- Visitor Days Measures the number of days visitors stay in the State and are the most comprehensive measurement of visitations. Visitor days take into account both the number of visitors and their length of stay and is the main indicator used by most of the tourism-related businesses to plan their activities.
- Wages and Salary Disbursements- This component of Personal Income consists of the monetary remuneration of employees, including the compensation of corporate officers; commissions, tips, and bonuses; and receipts in kind, or pay-in-kind, such as the meals furnished to the employees of restaurants. It reflects the amount of wages and salaries disbursed, but not necessarily, earned during the year. See Personal Income.
- Wholesale Trade Jobs Are in establishments engaged in wholesaling merchandise, generally without transformation, and rendering services incidental to the sale of merchandise and includes the outputs of agriculture, mining, manufacturing, and certain information industries, such as publishing. It is an intermediate step in the distribution of merchandise. Wholesalers are organized to sell or arrange the purchase or sale of goods for resale, capital or durable nonconsumer goods, and raw and intermediate and supplies materials used in production. Wholesalers sell merchandise to other businesses and normally operate from a warehouse or office that have little or no display f merchandise and do not solicit Transactions are often conducted walk-in traffic. between wholesalers and clients that have longstanding business relationships. There are two main types: merchant wholesalers that sell goods on their own account and business to business electronic markets, agents, and brokers that arrange sales and purchases for others generally for a commission or fee.
