This *Quarterly Statistical and Economic Report* has been prepared by the staff of the Research and Economic Analysis Division of the State Department of Business, Economic Development & Tourism (DBEDT). The report provides concise statistical information and analyses on Labor, Income and Prices, Taxes, Tourism, Construction, and other indicators, as well as an overview of the State of Hawaii and the four counties.

Technical notes and source descriptions have been kept to a minimum. However, the staff of the Research and Economic Analysis Division would be happy to respond to any inquiries of a technical nature that readers may have (586-2466). The quarterly information contained in this report reflects data received by the Research Division on or before February 19, 2010.

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STATE OF THE ECONOMY

Hawaii's economy continued to experience the effects of recession in the fourth quarter of 2009, with jobs, tax revenues, and visitor expenditures still showing declines from the year before. However, there were signs that the losses were becoming smaller for the visitor sector, for new construction authorizations, and tax revenues. In fact some measures of visitor activity have actually turned positive in the last two quarters. Thus, despite continued decline in jobs, there were indications that Hawaii was at or near the bottom of the current recession.

The most encouraging signs that a bottom was being reached were in tourism. The total number of visitors arriving by air to Hawaii continued the modest, 2.7 percent upturn experienced in the 2009 third quarter by posting a 0.6 percent increase in the fourth quarter over the same quarter of 2008. Other visitor metrics such as the average daily visitor census and visitor spending were still negative compared with 2008, but not by much. The visitor census was down only 0.3 percent in the fourth quarter compared to being down almost 4 percent for all of 2009 and down nearly 9 percent in 2008. Visitor spending fell 2.2 percent for the fourth quarter. But this was considerably below the 10- to 17 percent quarterly declines experience earlier in 2009.

In construction, building permit data also edged into positive territory. For the full year of 2009 permit values for private construction declined 31.2 percent. But by the fourth quarter of 2009 the decline had flattened out to a slight, 0.1 percent gain in permit values from the same period a year before. Building permits are an indication of future construction. Current construction being put into place based on excise tax data and construction jobs were still showing substantial losses at the end of 2009.

The decline in tax revenues also appeared to be moderating as 2009 ended. State general fund tax revenues recorded their fifth consecutive quarterly decline from a year before in the last quarter of 2009, down 6.9 percent. However, this was less severe than the 9.4 percent decline in the third quarter of 2009 and much less negative than the 18.0 percent decline of the 2009 second quarter.

The area of the economy that has yet to clearly show it is stabilizing is the labor market, which is unfortunately likely to be the last element of the economy to respond. Hawaii's economy continued to lose jobs through the fourth quarter of 2009, ending the year with a 3.4 percent decline in wage and salary jobs from the previous year. This amounted to 19,500 fewer jobs for 2009. In the fourth quarter of 2009 the decline in jobs reached 4.1 percent from same quarter in the previous year.

All but a few major sectors of the economy lost jobs in 2009 and the losses were generally higher in the fourth quarter. The most significantly impacted sector continued to be construction with a 13.2 percent job loss for the year as a whole, rising to a 14.1 percent decline in the fourth quarter. Only the government, health care, and education sectors showed increases in jobs for 2009 as a whole. But by the fourth quarter of the year that list was down to only health care, with government and education also experiencing job losses from the previous year.

The most recent data from the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) shows that Hawaii's total personal income in the third quarter of 2009 increased 0.3 percent from the same quarter of 2008. This includes inflation so the change probably represents a slight decline in real terms. The small growth in personal income was due to a large increase in transfer payments to residents, including retirement and unemployment insurance benefits. The core of personal income -- wages, salaries and proprietors' income -- declined 0.4 percent before inflation is taken into account. Dividends, interest, and rents, also declined. BEA has often made significant revisions to personal income in later quarters. Therefore, these current data for personal income could well change over the coming year.

Consumer prices in Honolulu increased a slight 0.5 percent in 2009 over 2008, as measured by the Honolulu Consumer Price Index (CPI-U). By contrast the U.S. CPI-U declined 0.4 percent in 2009. The second half of 2009 saw a slight uptick in the Honolulu CPI-U, with prices increasing 0.7 percent from the second half of 2008. This compared with a 0.3 percent increase for the first half of 2009.

The modest Honolulu CPI increase in 2009 was primarily due to the limited, 0.4 percent increase in the housing component of the index and a 6.4 percent decline in transportation costs. Prices increased for most other goods and services, including the other goods and services category (8.1 percent), apparel (7.2 percent), education/communications (4.9 percent) and food & beverage (3.6 percent).

While the signs that Hawaii has probably reached a bottom in the current recession are increasing, that stability is also subject to the course of events on the national and international economic levels. Moreover, reaching a bottom is far from a full recovery, and that is likely to be a very gradual process over the next several years.

OUTLOOK FOR THE ECONOMY

Based on the most recent data and analysis, Hawaii's economy is expected to continue seeing more positive signs of stability into 2010, the beginning of recovery in some sectors, and modest growth by 2011. Overall, the DBEDT forecast is changed only modestly from last quarter.

Hawaii's economy depends significantly on conditions in the U.S. economy and key international economies, especially Japan. For the better-than-expected U.S. economy, slightly economic data in recent months has resulted in somewhat more optimism being reflected in the consensus forecast used to guide the DBEDT forecast. According to the February 2010 Blue Chip Economic Consensus Forecasts, U.S. real GDP is expected to increase by 3.0 percent in 2010 as a whole. Real U.S. GDP growth is now expected to accelerate from an annual rate of 2.5 in the first quarter of 2010 to 3.5 percent by the third quarter of the year. For 2011 the consensus forecast now expects an overall 3.1 percent growth in U.S. real GDP.

Forecasts have also improved slightly for Hawaii's most important foreign market, Japan. Real GDP growth for that nation is now expected to increase 1.6 percent in 2010, followed by a modest 1.5 percent growth rate in 2011.

Based on the updated U.S. and International outlook, as well as new data on the Hawaii economy, the revised forecast for Hawaii shows slightly more encouraging expectations, although the basic projection of a slow and gradual recovery has not changed.

Overall, Hawaii's economy measured by real GDP is projected to show a 0.9 percent increase in 2010, up slightly from a 0.8 percent growth forecast last quarter. That growth is expected to increase modestly to 1.4 percent in 2011.

Visitor arrivals are expected to increase 2.0 percent in 2010 and 4.0 percent in 2011, about the

same as the previous forecast. However, visitor days are now expected to increase 2.1 percent in 2010, compared with 0.7 percent in the previous forecast, due to a stronger increase in length of stay. However, the 2011 visitor days projection will remain about the same as projected in the previous forecast of 4.1 percent. Moreover, the forecast for visitor expenditure growth in 2010 has been revised upward to 2.3 percent, from no growth projected in the previous forecast. Visitor expenditures are forecast to increase 8.6 percent in 2011.

The projection for wage and salary jobs remains unchanged at a 0.9 percent decline in 2010. Most of this decline will likely occur in the first half of the year, with the expectation that some modest growth in jobs will occur in the second half. In 2011, jobs are projected to increase a modest, 0.8 percent.

The Honolulu Consumer Price Index (CPI), which increased 0.5 in 2009, is expected to increase 1.7 percent in 2010, up slightly from the previous forecast. In 2011, the CPI is projected to increase 2.2 percent.

Personal income growth in current dollars will likely show a modest increase of 1.7 percent in 2010. However, a slightly higher inflation rate in 2010 will likely result in no real growth in personal income for the year. In 2011, current-dollar personal income is forecast to increase 3.0 percent, which will be 0.8 percent in real terms, about the same as projected in the previous forecast.

Beyond 2011 the gradual recovery is expected to continue with modest job growth of around 1.0 percent for 2012. Visitor arrivals should show a healthier, 4.5 percent increase in 2012. Hawaii's real GDP growth in 2012 is expected to reach 2.0 percent. The gradual recovery should continue into 2013, assuming national and international economic conditions continue to improve.

COUNTY ECONOMIC CONDITIONS

The counties generally mirrored the state in terms of overall economic conditions in the fourth quarter of 2009. Civilian employment, wage and salary jobs, and tax revenues were down in all counties, compared to the fourth quarter of 2008. The performance of the visitor sector was mostly negative. Total visitor days for tourists arriving by air increased in Honolulu but declined in all neighbor island counties.

Honolulu lost 3.3 percent of its wage and salary jobs between the fourth quarters of 2008 and 2009. Among the private sectors, the largest job losses occurred in construction¹ (2,850 jobs), followed by Professional and Business Services (2,250 jobs), Retail Trade (2,000 jobs), and Food Services & Drinking Places (1,250 jobs). Job gain in Federal Government (1,400) was more than offset by losses in State Government (4,050 jobs). In the private sector, only Health Care and Social Assistance and Accommodation added jobs in the quarter. For 2009 as a whole, Honolulu lost 11,550 jobs or 2.5 percent wage and salary jobs from the same quarter in 2008.

Hawaii County lost 5.3 percent of its wage and salary jobs between fourth quarters of 2008 and 2009. Construction lost the most jobs in the quarter (1,100 jobs), followed by Retail Trade (450 jobs), Accommodation (350 jobs), and Professional and Business Services (350 jobs). In 2009, Hawaii County lost 3,350 jobs, or 4.9 percent of its total wage and salary jobs from 2008.

Maui County saw a net loss of 6.8 percent of its wage and salary jobs from the same quarter of 2008. Accommodation lost the most jobs (950) in the quarter, followed by food services & drinking places (800 jobs), construction (800 jobs), retail

trade (600 jobs), and professional and business services (400 jobs). For 2009 as a whole, Maui County lost 4,650, or 6.4 percent of its wage and salary jobs from 2008.

Kauai County's wage and salary job count fell by 2,250 or 7.5 percent in the fourth quarter of 2009 from the same quarter of 2008. Construction lost the most jobs in the quarter (500). Kauai County lost 2,050, or 6.7 percent of its wage and salary jobs for 2009 as a whole.

While Honolulu experienced modest increases in visitor traffic in the fourth quarter, the other counties continued to show declines. Total visitor arrivals by air increase 1.6 percent for Honolulu in the fourth quarter of 2009, compared to declines ranging from 1.3- to 3.1 percent in the other counties. For 2009 as a whole, visitor arrivals declined 3.9 percent in Honolulu, 7.4 percent in Hawaii County, 9.2 percent for Maui, and 9.6 percent in Kauai County.

The value of total private building permits in the fourth quarter increased in all counties except for Hawaii County which almost completely offset the increases in the other counties. For 2009 as a whole, the value of total private building permits declined 15.8 percent for Honolulu, 56.1 percent for Hawaii County, 49.4 percent for Maui, and 21.3 percent for Kauai County.

With only a couple of notable exceptions, fourth quarter tax collections were uniformly down in all counties. The only exceptions were a significant, 85.3 percent increase in TAT taxes on Oahu and a slight TAT increase for Kauai County. These increases probably reflect a rate increase in the TAT that has been effective since July 2009.

A. LABOR FORCE AND JOBS

Hawaii's economy continued to lose jobs through the fourth quarter of 2009, ending the year with a 3.4 percent decline in wage and salary jobs from the previous year. This amounted to 19,500 fewer jobs for the year. The fourth quarter 2009 decline in jobs was 4.1 percent from same quarter in the previous year.

Hawaii's unemployment rate for 2009 averaged 7.0 percent with a 6.8 percent average for the fourth quarter.

Contributing to the rising unemployment rate was a substantial increase in the number of unemployed persons in the state, from 25,850 in 2008, to 45,100 in 2009. The calculated unemployment rate was also pushed up because the labor force itself shrunk by 8,750 workers for the year.

Fourth quarter data on the labor force generally mirrored the 2009 trend, although the decline in employed persons was slightly less in that quarter than for the year as a whole and the increase in unemployed persons was clearly slowing – from a 125 percent increase in the first quarter, to a 37 percent increase in the fourth quarter.

All but a few major sectors of the economy lost jobs for 2009 as a whole and the losses appeared to be generally higher in the fourth quarter. The most significantly impacted sector continued to be construction with a 13.2 percent job loss for the year as a whole, rising to 14.1 percent decline in the fourth quarter.

Only the government, health care, and education sectors showed increases in jobs for 2009 as a whole. By the fourth quarter of the year that list was down to only health care, with government and education finally experiencing job losses from the previous year.



B. INCOME AND PRICES

Consumer prices in Honolulu during 2009 increased a slight 0.5 percent over 2008, as measured by the Honolulu Consumer Price Index (CPI-U). By contrast the U.S. CPI-U declined 0.4 percent in 2009.

The second half of 2009 saw a slight uptick in the Honolulu CPI-U, with prices increasing 0.7 percent from the same 2008 half. This compared with a 0.3 percent increase in the first half of 2009.

The modest Honolulu CPI increase in 2009 was primarily due to the low, 0.4 percent increase in the housing component of the index and a 6.4 percent decline in transportation costs. Prices increased for most other goods and services, including the other goods and services category (8.1 percent), apparel (7.2 percent), education/communications (4.9 percent) and food & beverage (3.6 percent).

Total personal income in Hawaii (in current dollars) showed a slight, 0.3 percent increase for the third quarter of 2009 from the same quarter the year before, but that was thanks to a large increase in transfer payments to residents, including retirement and unemployment insurance benefits. The core of personal income, wages, salaries and proprietors' income, declined 0.4 percent. Dividends, interest, and rent, also declined.

The private sector (apart from farming) was the hardest hit by personal income declines in the third quarter, falling 3.5 percent below the third quarter of 2008. Farm income fell by 5.0 percent. Personal income in the public sector increased a substantial 5.9 percent in the third quarter from the year before, led by Federal agencies with an 8.0 percent increase.

State and local governments showed a moderate 2.6 percent increase in the third quarter. However, this will likely change when fourth quarter income becomes available and reflects the beginning of layoffs and furloughs in State government.

By private sector industry, forestry, fishery and related activity showed the steepest decline in the third quarter with a 21.7 decline in income from the 2008 third quarter. This was followed by a 16.5 percent decline in income for construction and a 6.3 percent decline among real estate, rental and leasing workers.

Gains in third quarter year-over-year personal income were experienced in utilities, up 10.4 percent, and health and social assistance, up 4.8 percent. In addition, education services and finance/insurance activity both showed increases of 3.7 percent in the third quarter.

The increase in transfer payments was 16.5 percent for the third quarter on a year-to-year basis. Transfers represent about 16 percent of total personal income, mostly social security payments. Unemployment payments in personal income increased nearly 200 percent in the third quarter. Unemployment payments are a relatively small portion of total transfer payments amounting to 9 percent of the total in the third quarter. However, that proportion is up from just 4 percent of transfers a year before and just 2 percent of the total in the full year of 2007.

Overall, personal income in Hawaii reached an annualized, \$54.4 billion in the third quarter of 2009.



C. TAX REVENUES

The fourth quarter of 2009 saw the fifth consecutive decline in State general fund tax revenues on a year-over-year basis, but the rate of decline was clearly slowing. Revenues were down 6.9 percent compared with the fourth quarter of 2008. However, this was less severe than the 9.4 percent decline in the third quarter of 2009 and much less negative than the 18.0 percent decline of the 2009 second quarter.¹

For calendar year 2009 as a whole, general fund revenues fell 12.8 percent from 2008, which followed a modest 1.8 percent decline in the previous calendar year.

The major components of tax revenues were also down for the latest (fourth) quarter, but less so than earlier in 2009. GET revenues (excluding the Honolulu County half percent mass transit surcharge) declined 7.4 percent over in the fourth quarter of 2008. This was the smallest quarterly loss in five quarters. GET taxes represented about 57 percent of general fund revenues in 2009 as a whole.

Net individual income tax revenues declined 11.8 percent in the fourth quarter of 2009. This was higher than the third quarter loss (-6.7 percent), but much better than the 33.7 percent decline in the second quarter or 21.1 percent decline in the first quarter. Net individual income taxes represented about 30 percent of general fund tax revenues in 2009.

The fourth quarter decline in individual income taxes was due mainly to a 10.7 percent fall in the revenues from withholding taxes on wages. However, declaration of estimated taxes contributed to the overall decline with a 30.6 percent fall. Only Payments with Returns showed an increase in this tax component, increasing 67.4 percent from the fourth quarter of 2008.

Net corporate income tax revenues, which tend to be volatile, were actually negative in the fourth quarter due to a sharp increase in refunds. Corporate income tax payments with returns were down a sharp 46.6 percent in the fourth quarter, while estimated taxes in this component fell 9.8 percent. Net corporate income taxes represented only about 1% of general fund tax revenues in 2009.

The bright spot in tax collections for the fourth quarter of 2009 was the Transient Accommodations Tax. TAT revenues, which increased 18.4 percent compared to the same quarter of 2008. However, this probably reflected an increase in the tax rate that became effective in July 2009.






Figure 4. Transient Accommodations Tax Revenues

D. TOURISM

Hawaii's tourism sector, which has been in decline since the second quarter of 2008, appeared to be finding a bottom in the second half of 2009. Overall visitor arrivals by air increased 2.7 percent in the third quarter of 2009 from the previous year, and followed that with a smaller, but still positive 0.6 percent gain in the fourth quarter.

The average daily visitor census, which takes into account visitors' length of stay, increased 2.2 percent in the third quarter before slipping to a slight, 0.3 percent decline in the fourth quarter. Still this was a considerable improvement from the roughly 10- to 14 percent quarterly declines experienced though most of 2008 and into the first quarter of 2009.

Visitor expenditures are the lagging factor in tourism's turn around. Total expenditures were down 2.2 percent in the fourth quarter from the year before. However, this is much better than the 9- to 19 percent declines experienced over the previous six calendar quarters.

The fourth quarter growth in total visitor arrivals was helped by a 6.8 percent increase in international arrivals compared with the year before. Arrivals on domestic flights declined 1.8 percent in the fourth quarter of 2009, down from a 2.8 percent increase in the third quarter.

For 2009 as a whole, visitor arrivals were down 4.4 percent, compared with a 10.4 percent decline in 2008. The daily visitor census showed a 3.8 percent decline in 2009 compared with an 8.9 percent fall in 2008. Finally, visitor expenditures for 2009 were down 11.7 percent, following an 11.1 percent decline in 2008.

The US West market area was the strongest in the fourth quarter with arrivals increasing 0.8 percent from the same 2008 quarter. Arrivals from the U.S. East declined 3.1 percent in the quarter.

Arrivals from Japan in the fourth quarter showed their first positive quarterly growth since the third quarter of 2007. In fact, it was only the second positive quarter for this market since the second quarter of 2005. Visitors from Japan in the fourth quarter increased 3.0 percent from the same period of 2008.

For 2009 as a whole, however, the U.S. West market was down 1.8 percent for arrivals, with the U.S. East market down 7.2 percent and Japan arrivals down 4.9 percent.

Total airline capacity, in terms of the number of available seats flown to Hawaii, declined 2.0 percent in the fourth quarter of 2009 from the previous year. A 1.9 percent increase in international seats was more than offset by a 3.5 percent decline in domestic seats. For 2009 as a whole, available seats decline 5.6 percent from 2008.

The statewide hotel occupancy rate in the fourth quarter of 2009 averaged 65.4 percent, up 1.6 percentage points from the same quarter of 2008. In 2009, the statewide hotel occupancy rate averaged 66.5 percent, down 4.0 percentage point from 2008.



E. CONSTRUCTION

Construction was one of the major contributors to job growth in Hawaii in recent years. From 2002 to 2007, construction job growth averaged 8.0 percent per year. However, since 2007, construction jobs have declined, culminating in a 13.2 percent fall in jobs for 2009 as a whole. This was the highest rate of job loss among the major industries for 2009. From a high of 40,000 jobs in the fourth quarter of 2007, jobs have fallen to 31,950 in the fourth quarter of 2009, or more than 8,000 jobs.

Fourth quarter results show no improvement in the construction jobs situation, with the job count falling 14.1 percent from the same 2008 period.

The contracting tax base for construction is not yet available for the fourth quarter of 2009. However, data for the first 9 months was down 14.6 percent from 2008.

Building permit data are one indicator of construction expected to take place in the future. For the full year of 2009 permit values for private construction declined 31.2 percent. Quarterly, the steepest decline in year-to-year permits was the second quarter of 2008 which saw values fall by 55.1 percent. By the fourth quarter of 2009 the decline had flattened out to a slight but encouraging 0.1 percent gain in permit values from the same period a year before. Private building permit values increased in all counties for the fourth quarter of 2009 except in Hawaii County.

Gains in new commercial and industrial permits, as well as new residential permit values were the main factor in the stable fourth quarter authorizations total. The value of new residential permits rose 2.8 percent for the quarter, while commercial and the industrial permits were up an impressive 99.3 percent from the same period of 2008. The lagging segment in permit values was additions and alternations, which declined 23.1 percent for the quarter.

In dollar terms, Honolulu authorizations increased the most at \$28.6 million or 10.9 percent, followed by Kauai at \$1.0 million or 6.0 percent, and Maui at \$0.3 million or 0.7 percent. Only the value of total private building permits in Hawaii County declined; by \$29.5 million or 30.3 percent for the quarter.

Government construction activity was mixed. New government contracts awarded declined 33.7 percent in the fourth quarter of 2009 compared to the same quarter of 2008. For 2009 as a whole, government contracts awarded declined 18.3 percent.

However, actual State Government CIP expenditures increased 15.2 percent in the fourth quarter of 2009 from the same quarter in 2008 and posted a 12.1 percent increase for 2009 as a whole.

Honolulu's median price for single family resales was \$575,000 in 2009, a 7.9 percent decline from 2008. For condominium resales the decline was 7.1 percent to an averge \$302,000.

Recently, resales of single family and condo units have accelerated. For the fourth quarter of 2009 the number of single-family units increased 31.0 percent while sales of condominium units were up 31.0 percent from the fourth quarter of 2008.

F. OTHER INDICATORS

The total number of bankruptcy filings in Hawaii increased 28.2 percent or by 179 cases for the fourth quarter of 2009 from the same quarter of 2008. This was the twelfth consecutive quarter-over-quarter increase since the first quarter of 2007. For the year of 2009, total filings increased 49.3 percent or 1,024 cases from 2008.


The number of Chapter 7 filings, the largest category, increased 28.0 percent or 144 cases in the fourth quarter of 2008. Chapter 7 filings are intended to liquidate assets and discharge debt. For the year 2009, Chapter 7 filings were up 53.3 percent or 863 cases from the previous year.

Chapter 11 filings decreased from 11 cases in the fourth quarter of 2008 to 6 cases in the fourth quarter of 2009. For 2009, Chapter 11 filings declined from 23 to 21 cases. Chapter 11 filings involve the structuring of repayment plans for companies.

Chapter 13 filings in the fourth quarter of 2009 increased 36.7 percent, or 40 cases from the fourth quarter of 2008. In the year of 2009, Chapter 13 filings were up 37.7 percent or 164 cases from the previous year. Chapter 13 bankruptcy allows debtors to work out repayment arrangements with creditors.



III. TERMS AND DEFINITIONS

- Accommodation Jobs This industry provides lodging or short-term accommodations for travelers, vacationers, and others. Some provide lodging only; while others provide meals, laundry, and recreational facilities, as well as lodging. There are three industry groups: (1) traveler accommodation includes establishments that primarily provide traditional types of lodging services. This group includes hotels, motels, and bed and breakfast inns. (2) recreational accommodation includes establishments that operate lodging facilities primarily designed to accommodate outdoor enthusiasts. Included are travel trailer campsites, recreation vehicle parks, and outdoor adventure retreats; and (3) rooming and boarding houses includes establishments providing temporary or longer-term accommodations that for the period of occupancy may serve as a principal residence. Board (i.e., meals) may be provided but is not essential.
- Agriculture Wage and Salary Jobs Full- and part-time jobs for which payment was made by the employer in the survey week containing the 12th of the month. Includes farm jobs and machinery operators. Closely related management and services jobs are included for sugar and pineapple but are excluded for other types of agriculture.
- Airline Seat Total number of available seats from all direct flights to Hawaii, including scheduled and chartered flights.
- Arts, Entertainment & Recreation Jobs This industry includes a wide range of establishments that operate facilities or provide services to meet varied cultural, entertainment, and recreational interests of their patrons. This sector comprises (1) establishments that are involved in producing, promoting, or participating in live performances, events, or exhibits intended for public viewing: (2) establishments that preserve and exhibit objects and sites of historical, cultural, or educational interest; and (3) establishments that operate facilities or provide services that enable patrons to participate in recreational activities or pursue amusement, hobby, and leisure-time interests. Excluded from this sector are: (1) establishments that provide both accommodations and recreational facilities, such as hunting and fishing camps and resort and casino hotels; (2) restaurants and night clubs that provide live entertainment in addition to the sale of food and beverages, (3) motion picture theaters, libraries and archives, and publishers of newspapers, magazines, books, periodicals, and computer software; and (4) establishments using transportation equipment

to provide recreational and entertainment services, such as those operating sightseeing buses, dinner cruises, or helicopter rides.

- Average Daily Visitor Census- By Air Average number of visitors present daily in the state. Figures are computed monthly by the Research & Economic Analysis Division, DBEDT based on arrival and departure dates from ground and in-flight surveys.
- Average Length of Stay- By Air Number of days visitors are in the State including the day of arrival and of departure.

Bankruptcy Filings –

- **Chapter 7** Is available to both individuals and business debtors. Its purpose is to achieve a fair distribution to creditors of whatever non-exempt property the debtor has and to give the individual debtor a fresh start through the discharge in bankruptcy.
- **Chapter 11** Is available for both consumer and business debtors. Its purpose is to rehabilitate a business as a going concern or reorganize an individual's finances through a court-approved reorganization plan.
- **Chapter 12** Is designed to give special debt relief to a family farmer with regular income from farming.
- **Chapter 13** Is available for an individual with regular income whose debts do not exceed specific amounts, typically used to budget some of the debtor's future earnings under a plan through which creditors are paid in whole or in part.

- Chained (1996) dollar Gross Domestic Product by State (GDP) [Note: formerly called 'Gross State Product'] series are calculated (using national chaintype implicit price deflators) as the product of the chain-type quantity index and the 1996 current-dollar value of the corresponding series, divided by 100. Because the formula for the chain-type quantity indexes uses weights of more than one period, the corresponding chained-dollar estimates are usually not additive; that is, state totals usually do not add to regional totals or to U.S. totals, and regional totals usually do not add to U.S. totals.
- **Civilian Employment** Persons 16 years of age or older who, during the survey week containing the 12th of the month, were either at work for pay or profit, or

worked without pay for 15 hours or more on a family farm or business, or were with a job but not at work. Both permanent and temporary employees and those who are working either full- or part-time are included.

- **Civilian Labor Force** –Total of employed and unemployed persons, excluding those in the armed forces and 16 years of age or under. U.S. Census Bureau does surveys for the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.
- **Civilian Unemployment** Persons 16 years of age or older who (1) did not work at all during the survey week but were actively seeking work and were available for work; or (2) did not work at all, were available for work, and were waiting to be called back from layoff or were waiting to report to a new wage or salary job within 30 days.
- **Condominium Resales**: Consists of resales of condominium, duplexes and townhomes that are entered in the Multiple Listing Service. It does not include apartments.
- Consumer Price Index: Honolulu or U.S. Measure of the average change in prices over time for a fixed market basket of goods and services. It is compiled by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The index measures changes from a reference date, i.e., 1982-84, which is designated as 100.0. For example, a Honolulu CPI-U (where U refers to All Urban Consumers), All Items, of 171.5 as the annual average for 1998 indicates the average prices of that group's basket was 71.5 percent higher than the weighted average of those same goods and services in 1982-84. Data are published monthly for the U.S. and semiannually for Honolulu. As of January 1998, BLS changed the reference basket based on 1982-84 consumer expenditures to a 1993-95 basket, but the base remains 1982-84 = 100.0. The BLS Internet site information about has more the CPI at http://www.bls.gov/cpi/home.htm.
- **Contracting Tax Base** The total receipts of businesses engaged in contracting to erect, construct, repair, or improve buildings or structures of any kind or description, or to make any installation therein. Attributed to any business engaging in the practice of architecture, engineering, land surveying, landscape architecture, and the practice of pest control or fumigation.
- **Contributions for government social insurance -** New category as part of the 'BEA Comprehensive Revision of the National Income & Product Accounts released

in December 1999. Replaces 'Personal contributions for social insurance'. These contributions, which are subtracted in the calculation of personal income, consist of the contributions, or payments, by employees, by the self-employed, and by other individuals who participate in the following government programs: Old-age, survivors, and disability insurance (social security); hospital insurance; supplementary medical insurance; unemployment insurance; railroad retirement; veterans life insurance; and temporary disability insurance. These contributions are excluded from personal income by definition, but the components of personal income upon which these contributions are basedmainly wage and salary disbursements and proprietors' income-are presented gross of these contributions.

- Dividends, Interest, and Rent U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis presents the State Personal Income estimates of these components together. It consists of income received by individuals and on behalf of individuals by private and government employee retirement plans and by quasi-individuals, including non-profit institutions and private trust funds administered by fiduciaries. Personal dividend income is payments in cash or other assets by corporations in the U.S. or abroad to noncorporate stockholders who are Hawaii residents. Personal interest income is the interest income (monetary and imputed) from all sources that is received by individuals, by private and government employee retirement plans, by nonprofit institutions, and by estates and trusts. Rental income of persons with capital consumption adjustment is the net currentproduction income of persons from the rental of real property except for the income of persons primarily engaged in the real estate business; the imputed net rental income received by owner-occupants of farmdwellings; and the royalties received by persons from patents, copyrights, and rights to natural resources. The estimates include BEA adjustments for uninsured losses to real estate caused by disasters, such as hurricanes (e.g. Iniki in 1992) and floods. See Personal Income.
- **Earnings** This BEA aggregate is the sum of three components of personal income: wages and salary disbursements, other labor income, and proprietors' income. BEA presents earnings because it can be used in analyses of regional economies as a proxy for the income generated from participation in current production. See <u>Personal Income</u>.
- **Educational Services Jobs** This industry comprises establishments that provide instruction and training by specialized establishments, such as schools, colleges,

universities, and training centers. These establishments may be privately owned and operated for profit or not for profit, or they may be publicly owned and operated. They may also offer food and accommodation services to their students. Educational services are usually delivered by teachers or instructors that explain, tell, demonstrate, supervise, and direct learning, in diverse settings, such as educational institutions, the workplace, or the home through correspondence, television, or other means.

- **Employer Contributions to Social Insurance -** New category as part of the 'BEA Comprehensive Revision of the National Income & Product Accounts released in December 1999. Replaces 'Other labor income'. This component of personal income consists of employer contributions for employee pension and insurance funds and of employer contributions for government social insurance. See <u>Personal Income</u>.
- Federal Government Jobs Includes those in the civilian agencies, i.e. Department of Defense, Agriculture, United States Postal Service and the various armed services exchange systems.
- Financial Activities Jobs Establishments primarily engaged in financial transactions, i.e. those transactions involving the creation, liquidation, or change in ownership of financial assets, and/or in facilitating financial transactions. Three principal types of activities are identified: (1) raising funds by taking deposits and/or issuing securities and, in the process, incurring liabilities; (2) pooling of risk by underwriting insurance and annuities, (3) providing specialized services facilitating or supporting financial intermediation, insurance, and employee benefit programs. In addition, monetary authorities charged with monetary control are included in this sector. This also includes real estate and the rental and leasing sector which is comprised of establishments primarily engaged in renting, leasing, or otherwise allowing the use of tangible or intangible assets, and establishments providing related services. The major portion of this sector comprises establishments that rent, lease, or otherwise allow the use of their own assets by others. The assets may be tangible, as is the case of real estate and equipment, or intangible, as is the case with patents and trademarks. Excluded from this sector are investment trusts estate (REITS) real and establishments primarily engaged in renting or leasing equipment with operators. In many cases, such as the rental of heavy construction equipment, the operator is essential to operate the equipment.
- Food Services & Drinking Places Jobs These industries prepare meals, snacks, and beverages to

customer order for immediate on-premises and offpremises consumption. Some provide food and drink only; while others provide various combinations of seating space, waiter/waitress services and incidental amenities, such as limited entertainment. The industries are grouped based on the type and level of services provided, i.e. full-service restaurants; limitedservice eating places; and special food services including caterers and mobile food services. Food services and drink activities at hotels and motels; amusement parks, theaters, casinos, country clubs, and similar recreational facilities; and civic and social organizations are included here only if these services are provided by a separate establishment primarily engaged in providing food and beverage services. Excluded are establishments operating dinner cruises which are classified as scenic and sightseeing transportation because those establishments utilize transportation equipment to provide scenic recreational entertainment.

- General Excise (Gross Income) Tax Tax charged to businesses on gross sales or gross income. The tax rate is 0.5 percent on wholesaling and intermediary services, blind vendors, producing, manufacturing, sugar processing and pineapple canning; all other activities (retailing, business and professional services, contracting, theater, amusement, radio, interest, commissions, rentals) are taxed at 4.0 percent, except insurance commissions to general agents, subagents and solicitors, who are taxed at 0.15 percent.
- General Excise and Use Tax Base The value of all goods and services sold, including the value of tangible personal property imported into Hawaii for own use or consumption. One of the most comprehensive measures of business activity in the state.
- **General Fund Tax Revenues** Receipts of the general excise and use tax, net individual and corporate income taxes comprise over 85 percent of the General Fund tax receipts. The general government fund used to account for all financial resources except those required to be accounted for in another fund, such as the highway, airport or capital improvement fund.
- Gross Domestic Product by State (GDP) [Note: formerly called 'Gross State Product'] – GDP is the value added in production by the labor and property located in a state. GDP for a state is derived as the sum of the GDP originating in all industries in the state. The estimates of real GDP are derived by applying national implicit price deflators by detailed industry to the current-dollar GDP estimates by

detailed industry. Then, in order to capture the differences across states that reflect the relative differences in the mix of goods and services that the states produce, the same chain-type index formula used in the national accounts is used to calculate the estimates of total real GDP and real GDP by major industry.

- Health Care & Social Assistance Jobs This industry includes establishments that provide both health care and social assistance for individuals. Both are included as it is sometimes difficult to distinguish between the boundaries of these two activities starting with those establishments providing medical care exclusively, continuing with those providing health care and social assistance, and finally finishing with those providing only social assistance. These services are delivered by trained professionals and the industries are defined based on the educational degree held by its Excluded are aerobic classes and practitioners. nonmedical diet and weight reducing centers. Although these can be viewed as health services, these services are not typically delivered by health practitioners.
- Honolulu Construction Cost Indexes: High-Rise or Single Family – As compiled, by First Hawaiian Bank, and currently by DBEDT, these indexes measure changes in contractors' costs for building materials and labor. For discussion of Methodology, see <u>Hawaii's Economy May 2000</u> at <u>http://www.hawaii.gov/dbedt/hecon/he5-00/index.html</u>.
- Hotel Occupancy Rate The percentage of occupied rooms in a hotel. Hotel occupancy rates depend not only on the number of visitors and their length of stay, but also on the hotel room inventory, e.g., a large increase in new hotel units results in a drop in occupancy rates, until such time as visitor traffic builds up enough to fill them. Rates are obtained from a sample survey conducted on a monthly basis.
- **Hotel Rental Tax Base** is the economic base from which all hotel business activity is taxed. It includes the furnishing of temporary accommodations in a hotel, or other place in which lodgings are regularly furnished to transients for compensation.
- Implicit Price Deflator The implicit price deflator is calculated as the ratio of the current-dollar value to the corresponding chained-dollar value multiplied by 100.
 OR Implicit price deflators are weighted averages of the detailed price indexes used to prepare each aggregate and component and are calculated as the

ratio of current- to chained-dollar output multiplied by 100.

- Information Jobs Are in establishments engaged in the following processes: (a) producing and distributing information and cultural products, (b) providing the means to transmit or distribute these products as well as data or communications, and (c) processing data. Included are publishing industries, including software publishing, and both traditional publishing and publishing exclusively on the Internet; the motion picture and sound recording industries; the industries, including broadcasting traditional broadcasting and those broadcasting exclusively over the Internet; the telecommunications industries; the industries known as Internet service providers and web search portals, data processing industries, and the information services industries. For the purpose of developing NAICS, it is the transformation of information into a commodity that is produced and distributed by a number of growing industries that is at issue. The Information sector groups three types of establishments: (1) those engaged in producing and distributing information and cultural products; (2) those that provide the means to transmit or distribute these products as well as data or communications; and (3) those that process data. Many of the industries in the NAICS Information sector are engaged in producing products protected by copyright law, or in distributing them (other than distribution by traditional wholesale and retail methods). Examples are traditional publishing industries, software and directory and mailing list publishing industries, and film and sound industries. Broadcasting and telecommunications industries and information providers and processors are also included in the Information sector, because their technologies are so closely linked to other industries in the Information sector.
- **Initial Agent Claims** Notices of unemployment filed against another state by its workers who have moved to Hawaii.
- **Initial Liable Claims** Notices of unemployment filed against Hawaii by Hawaii workers who have moved to another state.
- **Local Government Jobs** Includes those in the county governments.
- Manufacturing Jobs Are in establishments engaged in the mechanical, physical, or chemical transformation of materials, substances, or components into new products. The assembling of component parts of manufactured products is considered manufacturing,

except in cases where the activity is appropriately classified as construction. Included in manufacturing are plants, factories, or mills and characteristically use power-driven machines and materials-handling equipment. However, establishments that transform materials or substances into new products by hand or in the worker's home and those engaged in selling to the general public products made on the same premises from which they are sold, such as bakeries, candy stores, and custom tailors, may also be included in this sector. Manufacturing establishments may process materials or may contract with other establishments to process their materials for them. Both types of establishments are included in manufacturing. The following activities are considered manufacturing in NAICS: milk or water bottling and pasteurizing; fresh fish packaging; printing and related activities; ready-mixed concrete production; ship repair and renovation; machine shops; and tire retreading. Conversely, there are activities that NAICS classifies as non-manufacturing, i.e. agriculture, forestry, fishing and hunting; the construction of structures and fabricating operations performed at the site of construction by contractors, establishments engaged in breaking of bulk and redistribution in smaller lots, including packaging, repackaging, or bottling products, customized assembly of computers, etc

- NAICS The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) has replaced the U.S. Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) system. NAICS was developed jointly by the U.S., Canada, and Mexico to provide new comparability in statistics about business activity across North America. Estimates of Personal Income earnings, wage and salary disbursements, and employment by NAICS subsector are available starting with 2001. For descriptions of NAICS industries, please see http://www.census.gov/epcd/www/naics.html at the Census Bureau.
- Natural Resources, Mining & Construction Jobs In Hawaii, 99 percent of the jobs in this category are in Construction and the remaining 1 percent in Mining. Included are those establishments that extract naturally occurring mineral solids, such as coal and ores; liquid minerals, such as crude petroleum; and gases, such as natural gas. There are two activities: mine operation and mining support activities. The construction sector comprises establishments primarily engaged in the construction of buildings or engineering projects (e.g., highways and utility systems), additions, alterations, or maintenance and repairs. Establishments primarily engaged in the preparation of sites for new construction and establishments primarily engaged in

subdividing land for sale as building sites also are included in this sector.

- **Net Earnings** BEA also calculates this measure as Earnings less Personal Contributions for Social Insurance. Net earnings is used in the presentation of State and local area personal income as the sum of net earnings, transfer payments, and personal dividend income, personal interest income, and rental income of persons. It can be used as a proxy for income before taxes. See <u>Personal Income</u>.
- Net Individual or Corporation Income Tax Revenue For individuals, it is calculated as declaration of estimated taxes plus payments with returns plus withholding tax on wages less refunds. Net corporate income tax revenue is calculated as declarations of estimated taxes plus payments with returns less refunds.
- **Non-Agriculture Wage and Salary Jobs** Derived monthly from a sample survey of employers reporting the number of persons who received pay for any part of the pay period containing the 12th of the month. Includes all full- and part-time non-agricultural workers, permanent and temporary workers, and workers on paid sick leave and paid vacation.
- Other Goods and Services Honolulu Consumer Price Index component detail. Prior to the CPI 1998 Revision, it measured the change in average prices of tobacco products, personal care goods and services, and personal and educational expenditures. Beginning with January 1998 data, this category includes tobacco, personal care, and miscellaneous goods and services. Other components, for example, schoolbooks and tuition, moved to the new "Education and Communication" and recreational reading to "Recreation". BLS' Monthly Labor Review (December 1996), and BLS' Internet site have more information about the CPI at http://www.bls.gov/cpi/.
- Other Labor Income See Employer Contributions to Social Insurance'.
- Other Services (except public administration) Jobs Are in establishments engaged in providing services not specifically provided for elsewhere in the classification system., such as equipment and machinery repairing, promoting or administering religious activities, grantmaking, advocacy, and providing drycleaning and laundry services, personal care services, death care services, pet care services, photofinishing services, temporary parking services, and dating services. Private households that engage in employing workers on or about the premises in

activities primarily concerned with the operation of the household are included in this sector. Excluded from this sector are establishments primarily engaged in retailing new equipment and also performing repairs and general maintenance on equipment

- **Personal Contributions for Social Insurance** See '<u>Contributions for government social insurance</u>'.
- Personal current transfer receipts Modified category as part of the 'BEA Comprehensive Revision of the National Income & Product Accounts' released in December 1999. Formerly 'Transfer Payments'. This component of personal income is payments to persons for which no current services are performed. It consists of payments to individuals and to nonprofit institutions by Federal, state, and local governments and by businesses. Government payments to individuals includes retirement and disability insurance benefits, medical payments (mainly Medicare and Medicaid), income maintenance benefits, unemployment insurance benefits, veterans benefits, and Federal grants and loans to students. Government payments to nonprofit institutions excludes payments by the Federal Government for work under research and development contracts. Business payments to persons consists primarily of liability payments for personal injury and of corporate gifts to nonprofit institutions.
- **Personal Income** –Income received by persons for participation in production, from government and business transfer payments, and from government interest. It is calculated as the sum of wage & salary disbursements, supplements to wages and salaries, proprietors' income with inventory valuation and capital consumption adjustments, rental income of persons with capital consumption adjustment, personal dividend income, personal interest income, and personal current transfer receipts, less contributions for government social insurance. - **Professional & Business Services Jobs** Are in establishments that specialize in performing professional, scientific, and technical activities for others and require a high degree of expertise and training. These activities include: legal advice and representation; accounting, bookkeeping, and payroll services; architectural, engineering, and specialized design services; computer services; consulting services; research services; advertising services; photographic services; translation and interpretation services; veterinary services; and other professional, scientific, and technical services to business and sometimes to households, but excludes establishments

primarily engaged in providing a range of day-to-day office administrative services, such as financial planning, billing and recordkeeping, personnel, and physical distribution and logistics. The management sector comprises establishments that hold the securities of companies and enterprises for the purpose of owning a controlling interest or influencing management decisions or establishments that administer, oversee, and manage establishments of the company or enterprise and that normally undertake the strategic organizational planning or and decisionmaking role of the company or enterprise. Establishments in this sector perform essential activities that are often undertaken, in-house, by establishments in many sectors of the economy but by consolidating the performance of these activities, economies of scale are achieved. Also included are establishments that perform routine support activities, such as office administration, hiring and placing of personnel, document preparation and similar clerical services, solicitation, collection, security and surveillance services, cleaning, and waste disposal services on a contract or fee basis.

- Proprietors' Income This component of BEA Personal income is the current-production income (including income in kind) of sole proprietorships, partnerships and cooperatives. Corporate directors' fees and the imputed net rental income of owner-occupants of farm dwellings is included in proprietors' income but the imputed net rental income of owner-occupants of nonfarm dwellings is included in rental income of persons. Proprietors' income excludes dividends and monetary interest received by nonfinancial business and rental incomes by persons not primarily engaged in the real estate business; these incomes are included in dividends, net interest, and rental income of personas, respectively. See <u>Personal Income</u>.
- Retail Tax Base includes the general excise tax base on retailing. Retail sales include sales for consumption or use by the purchaser and not for resale. The general excise tax at the retail level (4%) is sometimes loosely called a sales tax. However, it differs from a typical sales tax in two respects: (1) it is a tax on the gross income of the seller rather than a tax on the purchase price of the buyer; (2) the retail excise tax in Hawaii applies to all retail sales taxes exempt some commodities such as food and services.
- **Retail Trade Jobs** Are in establishments engaged in retailing merchandise, generally without transformation, and rendering services incidental to the sale of merchandise. The retailing process is the final step in the distribution of merchandise; retailers

are, therefore, organized to sell merchandise in small quantities to the general public. This sector comprises two main types of retailers: store and nonstore retailers. Store retailers operate fixed point-of-sale locations, located and designed to attract a high volume of walk-in customers where they have extensive displays of merchandise and use mass-media advertising to attract customers from the general public for personal or household consumption, but some also serve business and institutional clients. These include establishments such as office supply stores, computer and software stores, building materials dealers, plumbing supply stores, and electrical supply stores. Catalog showrooms, gasoline services stations, automotive dealers, and mobile home dealers are treated as store retailers. Generally, establishments engaged in retailing merchandise and providing after-sales services are classified in this sector. Nonstore retailers are also organized to serve the general public, but they reach customers and market merchandise with methods, such as the broadcasting of "infomercials," the broadcasting and publishing of direct-response advertising, the publishing of paper and electronic catalogs, door-todoor solicitation, in-home demonstration, selling from portable stalls (street vendors, except food), and distribution through vending machines.

- Services Tax Base includes tax base data on establishments primarily engaged in providing a wide variety of services for individuals, business and government establishments, and other organizations; hotels and other lodging places; establishments providing personal, business, repair, and amusement services; health, legal, engineering, and other professional services; educational institutions; membership organizations and other miscellaneous services.
- **Single Family Home Resales:** Consists of resales of single family homes that are entered in the Multiple Listing Service.
- **State Government Jobs Education** includes all employees under the Department of Education (DOE) and the University of Hawaii System. This includes public library personnel, substitute teachers who received pay during the pay period including the 12th of the month, and support personnel such as cafeteria workers, classroom cleaners, and school security attendants. Also included are part-time employees in special programs such as the A+ After School.
- **State Government Jobs Non-Education** Includes all other executive branch departments (i.e. Agriculture, Transportation, etc.), the legislative and judicial

branches, and the Research Corporation of the University of Hawaii (RCUH).

- **Total Wage and Salary Jobs** includes nonagricultural wage and salary workers and agriculture wage and salary workers. Persons on the payroll of more than one establishment during the pay period are counted in each establishment that reports them.
- Transfer Payments See <u>Personal current transfer</u> receipts.
- **Transient Accommodations Tax** Tax levied on resort time-share vacation units and the furnishing of a room, apartment, suite which is customarily occupied by a person or group for fewer than 180 consecutive days by a hotel, apartment, motel, or cooperative apartment, rooming house, or other place in which lodgings are generally furnished to transients. The tax as of January 1, 1999 is imposed at the rate of 7.25 percent and the tax base includes time-share units.
- Transportation, Warehousing, & Utilities Jobs Are in industries providing transportation of passengers and cargo, warehousing and storage for goods, scenic and sightseeing transportation, and support activities related to modes of transportation - air, rail, water, The sector distinguishes road, and pipeline. subsectors for each mode of transportation, a subsector for warehousing and storage, and a subsector for establishments providing support activities for transportation. In addition, there are subsectors for establishments that provide passenger transportation for scenic and sightseeing purposes, postal services, and courier services. Warehousing establishments in this sector are distinguished from merchant wholesaling in that the warehouse establishments do not sell the goods. Excluded are establishments primarily engaged in providing travel agent services that support transportation and other establishments, such as hotels, businesses, and government agencies. The Utilities sector comprises establishments engaged in the provision of the following utility services: electric power, natural gas, steam supply, water supply, and sewage removal. Within this sector, the specific activities associated with the utility services provided vary by utility: electric power includes generation, transmission, and distribution; natural gas includes distribution; steam supply includes provision and/or distribution; water supply includes treatment and distribution; and sewage removal includes collection, treatment, and disposal of waste through sewer systems and sewage treatment facilities. Excluded from this sector are establishments primarily engaged in waste

management services that do not use sewer systems or sewage treatment facilities.

- **Unallocated General Excise & Use Tax Revenues** General excise and use tax revenues that could not be allocated to specific activities of the general excise & use tax. It also includes collections from penalty and interest, assessments and corrections, delinquent collections, refunds, protested payments, settlements, etc.
- **Unemployment Rate** Ratio of unemployed persons to the civilian labor force expressed as a percentage.
- **Use Tax** Excise tax levied on tangible personal property that is imported or purchased from an unlicensed seller for use in the state. The tax is based upon the purchase price or value of the tangible personal property purchased or imported, whichever is applicable. Rates: 0.5 percent, if for resale at retail; 4.0 percent, if for use or consumption.
- Visitor Arrivals- By Air, Total All persons who stayed in Hawaii for a period between one night and one year.
 - **Domestic Visitor Arrivals** Visitors who stayed in Hawaii for at least one night but less than one year, arriving on flights from Mainland U.S. A foreign resident arriving in Hawaii on a flight directly from the U.S. Mainland is counted as a domestic visitor.
 - **International Visitor Arrivals** Visitors who stayed in Hawaii for at least one night but less than one year arriving on flights from foreign countries. An U.S. resident arriving in Hawaii on a flight directly from a foreign country is counted as an international visitor.

- Visitor Days Measures the number of days visitors stay in the State and are the most comprehensive measurement of visitations. Visitor days take into account both the number of visitors and their length of stay and is the main indicator used by most of the tourism-related businesses to plan their activities.
- Wages and Salary Disbursements- This component of Personal Income consists of the monetary remuneration of employees, including the compensation of corporate officers; commissions, tips, and bonuses; and receipts in kind, or pay-in-kind, such as the meals furnished to the employees of restaurants. It reflects the amount of wages and salaries disbursed, but not necessarily, earned during the year. See Personal Income.
- Wholesale Trade Jobs Are in establishments engaged in wholesaling merchandise, generally without transformation, and rendering services incidental to the sale of merchandise and includes the outputs of agriculture, mining, manufacturing, and certain information industries, such as publishing. It is an intermediate step in the distribution of merchandise. Wholesalers are organized to sell or arrange the purchase or sale of goods for resale, capital or durable nonconsumer goods, and raw and intermediate and supplies materials used in production. Wholesalers sell merchandise to other businesses and normally operate from a warehouse or office that have little or no display f merchandise and do not solicit walk-in traffic. Transactions are often conducted between wholesalers and clients that have longstanding business relationships. There are two main types: merchant wholesalers that sell goods on their own account and business to business electronic markets, agents, and brokers that arrange sales and purchases for others generally for a commission or fee.
