This *Quarterly Statistical and Economic Report* has been prepared by the staff of the Research and Economic Analysis Division of the State Department of Business, Economic Development & Tourism (DBEDT). The report provides concise statistical information and analyses on Labor, Income and Prices, Taxes, Tourism, Construction, and other indicators, as well as an overview of the State of Hawaii and the four counties.

Technical notes and source descriptions have been kept to a minimum. However, the staff of the Research and Economic Analysis Division would be happy to respond to any inquiries of a technical nature that readers may have (586-2466). The quarterly information contained in this report reflects data received by the Research Division on or before February 17, 2011.

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STATE OF THE ECONOMY

Hawaii's economic indicators were mostly positive in the fourth quarter of 2010. Visitor arrivals, visitor expenditures, civilian wage and salary jobs, private building permits, and government contracts awarded all increased in the quarter from the same quarter last year.

The most encouraging signs that the recovery is accelerating were in tourism. The total number of visitors arriving by air to Hawaii continued the upturn experienced since the fourth quarter of 2009 by posting a 13.5 percent increase in the fourth quarter of 2010 over the same quarter of 2009. Other visitor metrics such as the average daily visitor census and visitor spending were all increased substantially compared with 2009. The visitor daily census was up 12.8 percent in the fourth quarter of 2010. Visitor spending increased 23.9 percent in the fourth quarter of 2010.

In construction, both the value of private building permits and government contracts awarded increased. In the fourth quarter of 2010 the permit value for private construction increased \$8.0 million, while government contracts awarded increased \$87.8 million from the same quarter of 2009. For the first time since the second quarter of 2008, construction jobs increased in the fourth quarter of 2010 compared with the same quarter of 2009. According to the most recent data available, current construction put-in-place based on excise tax data was still showing a loss at the end of third quarter of 2010.

The State general fund tax revenues decreased in the third quarter of 2010 compared to the same quarter of 2009, mainly due to the payments of delayed income tax refunds. In the first three quarters of 2010, State general fund tax revenues were up 6.7 percent over the same period last year; as compared to the substantial 12.8 percent decrease in 2009. As an indicator of current economic activity, state general excise tax revenue increased 5.8 percent in the third quarter compared to the same quarter in 2009.

The labor market conditions also show that the economy is improving. After nine consecutive quarterly decreases in jobs from the second quarter of 2008 to the second quarter of 2010, Hawaii's jobs increased for the second time. In the fourth quarter of 2010 Hawaii's civilian wage and salary jobs averaged 602,000 jobs, an increase of 4,750 jobs or 0.8 percent from the same quarter of 2009.

Job increase in the fourth quarter of 2010 was due to job increases in both the private sector and the government sector. In this quarter, the private sector added about 3,000 jobs mainly in visitor related industries. Accommodation experienced the largest job gains, followed by Food Services and Drinking Places, Educational Services. Manufacturing, Natural Resources, Mining and Construction, and Retail Trade. Private sector job losses were largest in Information, followed by Financial Activities, Wholesale, and Professional and Business Services. During the fourth quarter of 2010, government added 1,800 jobs or 1.4 percent compared to the same quarter of 2009. Both the Federal government and the State government added about 900 jobs in the quarter.

The most recent data from the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) shows that Hawaii's total nominal personal income in the third quarter of 2010 increased \$1,351 million or 2.5 percent from the same quarter of 2009. This increase includes inflation so that the growth of real personal income was either negative or very small. The increase in nominal personal income during the third quarter of 2010 was due to increases in all major components of personal income. In dollar term, the largest increase occurred in personal current transfer receipts, followed by supplements to wage and salaries, which include retirement and unemployment insurance benefits, dividends, interest, and rents, wage and salary disbursements, and proprietors' income.

According to the most recent data available, consumer prices in Honolulu increased 1.7 percent in the second half of 2010 over the same period of 2009, as measured by the Honolulu Consumer Price Index for Urban Consumers (CPI-U). By contrast the U.S. CPI-U increased 1.2 percent in the second half of 2010. For the whole year of 2010, Honolulu CPI-U increased 2.1 percent from the previous year.

The higher Honolulu CPI-U in the second half of 2010 was primarily due to relatively large increase in the price index of Other Goods and Services (5.5 percent); followed by the index for Education and Communication (5.1 percent), and the index for Apparel (4.5 percent). Consumer price for Housing increased only 0.9 percent and the index for Food and Beverages increased only 0.5 percent. The index for Medical Care decreased slightly in the second half of 2010 compared to the second half of 2009.

Hawaii's economy continues to recover in 2011 but at an accelerating rate. Economic expansion is expected to start in 2012.

OUTLOOK FOR THE ECONOMY

Based on the most recent development in tourism industry, labor market, and construction activities, Hawaii's economy is expected to continue positive growth into 2011, the recovery will spread into all areas especially I the construction industry. Overall, the DBEDT forecast is more optimistic from last quarter.

Hawaii's economy depends significantly on conditions in the U.S. economy and key international economies, especially Japan. For the U.S. economy, better-than-expected economic data in recent months have resulted in more optimistic expectations being reflected in the consensus forecast used to guide the DBEDT forecast. According to the February 2011 *Blue Chip Economic Consensus Forecasts*, U.S. real GDP is expected to increase by 3.2 percent in 2011 as a whole, higher than the 2.5 percent growth projected in the November 2010 forecast. For 2012 the consensus forecast now expects an overall 3.3 percent growth in U.S. real GDP.

Similarly, forecasts for Hawaii's most important foreign market, Japan, were also more optimistic in the February 2011 *Blue Chip Economic Consensus Forecasts*. Real GDP growth for Japan is now expected to increase 1.5 percent in 2011, followed by a slightly higher 1.8 percent growth rate in 2012.

Similar to the expectations on the U.S. economy, the revised forecast for Hawaii shows more encouraging expectations, the recovery process is accelerating.

Overall, Hawaii's economy measured by real GDP is projected to show a 2.0 percent increase in 2011, up from a 1.8 percent growth forecast last quarter. That growth is expected to increase to 2.1 percent in 2012.

Visitor arrivals are expected to increase 4.0 percent and visitor days are expected to increase 4.1 percent in 2011, the same as the previous forecast.

However, the forecast for visitor expenditure growth in 2011 has been revised upward to 9.2 percent, from 8.4 percent growth projected in the previous forecast. For 2012, the growth rates of visitor arrivals, visitor days, and visitor expenditures are now expected to be 2.5 percent, 2.6 percent, and 5.6 percent, respectively.

The projection for wage and salary jobs in 2011 changed from a 1.1 percent growth in the previous forecast to a 1.3 percent growth in the current forecast. In 2012, jobs are now projected to increase 1.5 percent compared to 1.2 percent growth in the previous forecast.

The Honolulu Consumer Price Index (CPI), which increased 2.1 percent in 2010, is expected to increase 2.2 percent in 2011, same as the previous forecast. In 2012, the CPI is projected to increase 2.3 percent.

Personal income growth in current dollars and real dollars are expected to grow 3.2 percent and 1.0 percent, respectively, the same as the growth in the previous forecast. In 2012, current-dollar personal income is forecast to increase 4.0 percent, which will be 1.7 percent in real terms, 0.5 of a percentage point higher than that projected in the previous forecast.

Beyond 2012 the economy will be on the expansion path with job growth of around 1.8 percent and 1.5 percent, respectively, for 2013 and 2014. Visitor arrivals are expected to increase 2.5 percent in 2013 and 2.7 percent in 2014. Visitor expenditures are expected to increase 5.4 percent in 2013 and 4.5 percent in 2014. Real personal income is projected to increase 1.9 percent in 2013 and 2.2 percent in 2014. Hawaii's real GDP growth in 2013 is expected to reach 2.4 percent. The economy is expected to stabilize in 2014, assuming national and international economic conditions will stabilize in 2014.

COUNTY ECONOMIC CONDITIONS

Overall economic conditions were mostly positive across counties in the fourth quarter of 2010. The unemployment rate decreased in all counties. Total visitor arrivals by air and visitor days both increased in all counties. Except for a small decrease in Hawaii County, total wage and salary jobs increased in all other counties, (Tables 2 through 5). The value of private building permits increased in Hawaii and Maui County but decreased in Honolulu and Kauai County.

According to the most recent data available, in the third quarter of 2010, General Excise and Use Tax (GET) revenue (excluding the Honolulu County Surcharge) increased \$31.1 million in Honolulu and increased \$2.6 million in the three neighbor island counties compared to the same quarter of 2009. The Net Individual Income Tax collections decreased \$145.7 million or 46.5 percent in Honolulu and decreased \$46.1 million in the neighbor island counties. Transient Accommodation Tax collections increased \$11.2 million in Honolulu and increased \$5.9 million in the neighbor island counties.

In the fourth quarter of 2010, Honolulu gained 4,200 or 1.0 percent wage and salary jobs over the fourth quarter of 2009. Accommodation added the most jobs in the quarter (1,400 jobs), followed by Food Services and Drinking Places (1,250 jobs), Federal Government (900 jobs), Educational Services (750 jobs), Construction (750 jobs), and State Government (700 jobs). The largest job losses occurred in Professional and Business Services (lost 1,300 jobs), followed by Information (lost 600 jobs), Financial Activities (lost 600 jobs), and Wholesale Trade (lost 500 jobs). In 2010, Honolulu gained 1,050 wage and salary jobs over the previous year.

In the fourth quarter of 2010, Hawaii County lost 50 wage and salary jobs from the fourth quarter of 2009. Increases in Professional and Business Services (350 jobs), Accommodation (200 jobs), and Educational Services (100 jobs) were offset by job loss in Construction (lost 400 jobs), Retail Trade (lost 150 jobs), and Transportation, Warehousing, and Utility (lost 150 jobs). For the whole year of 2010, Hawaii County lost 1,200 or 1.9 percent wage and salary jobs over the previous year.

Maui County saw a net gain of 450 jobs or 0.7 percent increase in the fourth quarter of 2010 from the same quarter of 2009. Job gains in Food Services and Drinking Places (350 jobs), Professional and Business Services (200 jobs), and Accommodation (150 jobs) were partially offset by job losses in Construction (lost 150 jobs) and Arts, Entertainment & Recreation (lost 150 jobs). For the whole year of 2010, Maui lost 1,100 or 1.6 percent wage and salary jobs over the previous year.

In the fourth quarter of 2010, Kauai County gained 150 wage and salary jobs or 0.5 percent from the same quarter last year. Construction added the most jobs in the quarter (150 jobs), followed by Professional and Business Services (100 jobs). Arts, Entertainment & Recreation lost the most jobs (lost 100 jobs) in the quarter. For the whole year of 2010, Kauai County lost 600 or 2.1 percent wage and salary jobs over the previous year.

Visitor arrivals by air and visitor days both increased in all counties in the fourth quarter of 2010. Compared to the same quarter of 2009, visitor arrivals by air in Honolulu, Maui, Hawaii, and Kauai increased 11.3 percent, 16.5 percent, 10.8 percent and 7.9 percent, respectively, in the fourth quarter of 2010. For whole year of 2010, visitor arrivals by air in Honolulu, Maui, Hawaii, and Kauai increased 7.7 percent, 10.4 percent, 6.1 percent, and 3.8 percent, respectively, over the previous year.

In the fourth quarter of 2010, the value of total private building permits increased in the counties of Hawaii and Maui but decreased in Honolulu and Kauai compared with the same quarter of 2009. In dollar terms, Hawaii County increased the most at \$16.5 million or 24.3 percent, followed by Maui County at \$1.6 million or 3.2 percent; private building permits in Honolulu and Kauai decreased \$9.3 million or 3.2 percent and \$0.8 million or 4.5 percent, respectively. For the whole year of 2010, private building permits in Honolulu and Hawaii County increased 8.8 percent and 16.5 percent, respectively, but decreased 13.3 percent and 68.8 percent in Maui and Kauai, respectively.

A. LABOR FORCE AND JOBS

Hawaii's labor market conditions continued to improve in the fourth quarter of 2010 compared to the fourth quarter in 2009. While the civilian labor force decreased slightly in the quarter, civilian employment increased and civilian unemployment decreased in the quarter. As a result, Hawaii's unemployment rate decreased to 6.2 percent in the quarter. For the second time since the first quarter of 2008, civilian wage and salary jobs increased in the quarter.

In the fourth quarter of 2010, the civilian labor force averaged 630,800 people, a decrease of 750 people or 0.1 percent from the same quarter of 2009 (Table A-1). For the whole year of 2010, civilian labor force decreased 0.4 percent from the previous year.

Civilian employment totaled 591,550 people in the fourth quarter of 2010, an increase of 2,050 people or 0.3 percent compared to the fourth quarter of 2009 (Table A-2). This is the second quarterly increase since the second quarter of 2008. In 2010, average civilian employment decreased 0.2 percent from the previous year.

In the fourth quarter of 2010, the number of civilian unemployed averaged 39,250, decreased 2,750 people or 6.5 percent from the same quarter of 2009 (Table A-3). In 2010, the number of unemployed decreased 4.0 percent from the previous year.

The unemployment rate (not seasonally adjusted) decreased from 6.6 percent in the fourth quarter of 2009 to 6.2 percent in the fourth quarter of 2010 (Table A-4). In 2010, unemployment rate averaged 6.5 percent.

In the fourth quarter of 2010, Hawaii's civilian wage and salary jobs averaged 602,000 jobs, an increase of 4,750 jobs or 0.8 percent from the same quarter of 2009 (Table A-5). This is the second quarterly increase in wage and salary jobs after nine consecutive quarterly decreases in jobs since the first quarter of 2008. For the whole year of 2010, average wage and salary jobs decreased 0.3 percent or 1,750 jobs from the previous year.

The job increase in the fourth quarter of 2010 was due to job increases in both the private sector and the government sector. In this quarter, the private sector added about 3,000 jobs compared to the fourth quarter of 2009. The private sector job growth was mainly due to job gains in visitor related industries. Accommodation experienced the largest job gains, adding 1,700 jobs or 4.9 percent (Table A-18) compared to the same quarter of 2009; Food Services and Drinking Places added 1,700 jobs or 3.1 percent (Table A-19). Other private sectors that gained jobs in the quarter include Educational Services which added 900 jobs or 6.0 percent (Table A-15); Manufacturing added 400 jobs or 3.0 percent (Table A-7); Natural Resources, Mining and Construction added 400 jobs or 1.3 percent (Table A-7); and Retail Trade added 400 jobs or 0.6 percent (Table A-10).

In the fourth quarter of 2010, the Information sector lost 650 jobs or 7.3 percent (Table A-12) compared to the same quarter of 2009; Financial Activities lost 650 jobs or 2.3 percent (Table A-13); Wholesale lost 600 jobs or 3.4 percent (Table A-9); and Professional and Business Services lost 600 jobs or 0.9 percent (Table A-14).

During the fourth quarter of 2010, government added 1,800 jobs or 1.4 percent (Table A-21) compared to the same quarter of 2009. The Federal Government added 950 jobs or 2.8 percent (Table A-22); the State Government added 850 jobs or 1.2 percent (Table A-23); and the Local Government jobs remained about the same (Table A-24) in the fourth quarter of 2010 compared with the fourth quarter of 2009.

The initial liable claims for unemployment, which measures the number of people who lost jobs in Hawaii and moved to other states, decreased 13.3 percent or 123 people in the fourth quarter of 2010 compared to the same quarter of 2009 (Table A-27).



B. INCOME AND PRICES

Hawaii's total personal income increased during the third quarter of 2010 over the same quarter of 2009, all major components of personal income increased in the quarter. In dollar term, the largest increased occurred in personal current transfer receipts, followed by supplements to wage and salaries, which include retirement and unemployment insurance benefits, dividends, interest, and rent, wage and salary disbursements, and proprietors' income (Table B-1).

In the third quarter of 2010, total nominal annualized (quarterly value multiplied by 4) personal income (i.e., not adjusted for inflation) increased \$1,351 million or 2.5 percent from the third quarter of 2009 (Table B-2). For the first three quarters of 2010, total personal income was \$55,354 million, increased 1.6 percent from the same period of 2009.

The annualized personal current transfer receipts grew by \$619 million or 7.5 percent in the third quarter of 2010 from the same quarter of 2009 (Table B-7). For the first three quarters of 2010, personal current transfer receipts increased 7.8 percent from the same period of 2009.

In the third quarter of 2010, wage and salary disbursements increased \$222 million or 0.8 percent from the third quarter of 2009. This was the first quarter-over-quarter increase since the third quarter of 2008. For the first three quarters of 2010, wage and salary disbursements decreased 0.5 percent (Table B-3).

Supplements to wages and salaries, consisting of employer payments to retirement plans, private group health insurance plans, private workers compensation plans, and other such benefits, increased \$263 million or 3.1 percent in the third quarter of 2010 from the same quarter of 2009 (Table B-4). For the first three quarters of 2010, supplements to wages and salaries increased 2.0 percent.

Proprietors' income increased \$107 million or 3.2 percent in the third quarter of 2010 over that of 2009 (Table B-5). For the first three quarters of 2010, proprietors' income was up 3.4 percent.

Dividends, interest, and rent increased \$233 million or 2.3 percent in the third quarter of 2010 from the same quarter of 2009. For the first three quarters of 2010, income in this category was up 1.4 percent from the same period of 2009 (Table B-6).

Contributions to government social insurance, which is subtracted from total personal income, increased 2.2 percent in the third quarter of 2010 compared to the third quarter of 2009. For the first three quarters of 2010, contributions to government social insurance increased 1.2 percent (Table B-8).

In the third quarter of 2010, total non-farm private sector annualized earnings increased \$204 million or 0.8 percent from the third quarter of 2009. In dollar terms, the largest increase occurred in accommodation and food services, followed by health care and social assistance, information, and educational services; the largest decrease occurred in construction, followed by real estate and rental and leasing, utilities, and arts, entertainment, and recreation.

During the third quarter of 2010, total government earnings increased \$373 million or 2.6 percent from the same quarter of 2009. The increase in government earnings was due to the increase in Federal government earnings, which increased \$608 million or 7.0 percent in the quarter. State and local governments showed a 4.3 percent or \$235 million decrease in the third quarter of 2010.

In the second half of 2010, Honolulu's Consumer Price Index for Urban Consumers (CPI-U) increased 1.7 percent from the same period last year, higher than the U.S. average CPI-U increase of 1.2 percent for that period (Table B-9).

The Honolulu CPI-U increase in the second half of 2010 was primarily due to relatively large increase in Other Goods and Services (5.5 percent), Education and Communication (5.1 percent), and Apparel (4.5 percent). The prices for Housing and Food & Beverages increased only 0.9 percent and 0.5 percent, respectively, while the price for Medical Care decreased slightly in the second half of 2010 compared to the second half of 2009.



According to the most recent data available, the State general fund tax revenues decreased in the third quarter of 2010 compared to the same quarter of 2009.¹ The decrease in tax revenue, however, was mainly due to the payments of delayed individual income tax refunds. In the third quarter, the decrease in the State general fund revenue was due to decreases in Net Individual Income Tax collections and Net Corporate Income Tax collections; the Transient Accommodations Tax (TAT) collections and the General Excise and Use Tax (GET) revenues, however, increased compared to the third quarter of 2009.

In the third quarter of 2010, total tax collections distributed to the State general fund totaled \$908.9 million, decreased \$142.9 million or 13.6 percent over the same quarter of 2009 (Tables C-1 and C-2). In the first three quarters of 2010, State general fund tax revenues were up \$203.5 million or 6.7 percent over the same period last year.

During the third quarter of 2010, GET revenues (excluding the Honolulu County Surcharge) totaled \$611.6 million, an increase of \$33.7 million or 5.8 percent over the same quarter of 2009 (Tables C-1 and C-3). In the first three quarters of 2010, GET revenues increased \$53.9 million or 3.1 percent from the same period last year.

Compared to the third quarter of 2009, Net Individual Income Tax revenues decreased \$191.9 million or 53.7 percent to \$165.3 million in the third quarter of 2010 (Table C-4). This increase; however, was mainly due to the payments of delayed refunds. In the third quarter of 2010, Refunds increased \$166.8 million or 340.8 percent (Table C-8). In addition, Declaration of Estimated Taxes decreased \$20.9 million or 45.4 percent (Table C-5), and Payments with Returns decreased \$15.0 million or 51.2 percent (Table C-6) in the quarter. In the third quarter of 2010, only Revenues from Withholding Tax on Wages increased \$10.8 million or 3.3 percent (Table C-7). In the first three quarters of 2010, Net Individual Income Tax collections increased \$68.6 million or 7.4 percent from the same period last year.

Net Corporate Income Tax revenues, which tend to be very volatile in nature, decreased \$10.7 million or 85.9 percent in the third quarter of 2010 compared to the same quarter of 2009 (Table C-9). The decrease in Net Corporate Income Tax revenues was mainly due to a \$7.9 million or 37.1 percent decrease in Declaration of Estimated Taxes (Table C-10).

In the third quarter of 2010, Transient Accommodations Tax (TAT) revenues increased \$17.1 million or 32.6 percent compared to the same quarter of 2009 (Table C-13).

According to the most recent data available, compared to the third quarter of 2009, changes in the major categories of the GET tax base were mostly positive in the third quarter of 2010. Only the Contracting tax base decreased, all other components increased in the quarter. In the third quarter of 2010, Retailing tax base increased 5.7 percent or \$334.9 million (Table C-14), the Services tax base increased 5.9 percent or \$164.9 million (Table C-15), the Contracting tax base decreased 5.8 percent or \$92.4 million (Table C-16), and the Hotel Rentals tax base increased 13.6 percent or \$92.0 million (Table C-17) compared with the same quarter of 2009.






Figure 4. Transient Accommodations Tax Revenues

D. TOURISM

In the fourth quarter of 2010, Hawaii's tourism sector continued the strong growth started in the first quarter of 2010. Both domestic and international arrivals increased significantly in the quarter. Although visitors stayed slightly shorter but they spent more on a daily basis during the fourth quarter, resulting in slightly lower growth in daily visitor census and much higher growth in total visitor spending compared to the growth rate of visitor arrivals.

The total number of visitors arriving by air to Hawaii increased 207,500 or 13.5 percent in the fourth quarter of 2010 compared to the same quarter of 2009 (Tables D-1 and D-2). The total average daily census was up 20,274 or 12.8 percent in the quarter. For the whole year of 2010, total visitor arrivals by air increased 562,124 or 8.8 percent from 2009, while 2010 average daily census increased 14,085 or 8.5 percent from 2009.

In the fourth quarter of 2010, total visitor arrivals on domestic flights increased 167,978 or 15.6 percent compared to the same quarter of 2009 (Table D-3). The 2010 annual domestic arrivals were up 350,553 or 7.5 percent from 2009.

Arrivals on international flights also increased significantly by 39,522 or 8.6 percent in the fourth quarter of 2010 compared to the fourth quarter of 2009 (Table D-4). Combined with the sharp increases in the first three quarters, the 2010 annual international arrivals were up 211,571 or 12.1 percent from 2009.

In terms of major market areas, from the fourth quarter of 2009 to the same period of 2010, arrivals from the U.S. West increased 109,818 or 17.3 percent (Table D-5); arrivals from the U.S. East increased 37,379 or 11.0 percent (Table D-6); and arrivals from Japan increased 13,963 or 4.6 percent (Table D-7). For the whole year of 2010, arrivals from U.S. West were up 8.8 percent; arrivals from the U.S. East were up 4.4 percent; and Japanese arrivals were up 5.3 percent from the previous year.

The total average daily visitor census was up 12.8 percent or 20,274 visitors per day in the fourth quarter of 2010 over the same quarter of 2009 (Table D-8). Domestic average daily census increased 13.6 percent or 16,614 visitors per day (Table D-9), while international average daily census increased 10.0 percent or 3,660 visitors per day (Table D-10). For the whole year of 2010, domestic average daily census increased 7.0 percent from 2009; international average daily census increased 15.4 percent from the previous year.

Nominal visitor expenditures by air totaled \$3,033.9 million in the fourth quarter of 2010, up 23.9 percent or \$584.8 million from the same quarter of 2009 (Table D-11). For the whole year of 2010, visitor expenditures increased \$1,588.6 million or 16.2 percent from the previous year.

Total airline capacity, as measured by the number of available seats flown to Hawaii, increased 7.7 percent or 163,548 seats (Table D-12) in the fourth quarter of 2010; domestic seats increased 10.7 percent or 160,435 seats (Table D-13); international seats increased 0.5 percent or 3,113 seats (Table D-14), compared to the same quarter of 2009. For the whole year of 2010, the number of total available seats increased 5.9 percent or 517,233 seats from the same period of 2009.

In the fourth quarter of 2010, statewide hotel occupancy rate averaged 69.5 percent, up 6.0 percentage points from the same quarter of 2009 (Table D-15). For the whole year of 2010, Honolulu County had the highest hotel occupancy rate at 78.2 percent, followed by Maui at 68.1 percent, Kauai at 59.2 percent and Hawaii County at 56.4 percent.



E. CONSTRUCTION

The indicators of Hawaii's construction industry were mostly positive in the fourth quarter of 2010. Both government contracts awarded and the value of private building authorizations increased. Decreases in new residential and additions and alternations permits were more than offset by the increase in commercial and industrial permits in the quarter. Construction jobs also increased by 1.3 percent in the fourth quarter after 10 consecutive quarterly declines. However, both the number of single family units and the number of condominium units sold in Honolulu decreased in the quarter.

Construction of the was one major contributors to job growth in Hawaii over the past few years. From 2002 to 2007, construction job growth averaged 8.0 percent per year. In the fourth quarter of 2007, the average construction job reached a peak of 40,000 jobs. From the second quarter of 2008 to the third quarter of 2010; however, the quarter-over-quarter growth rate of construction jobs has been negative in all quarters. In the fourth quarter of 2010, the Natural Resources, Mining and Construction sector gained 400 jobs, an increase of 1.3 percent compared with the same quarter of 2009. In 2010, construction job decreased 4.9 percent or 1,550 jobs from 2009 (Table A-7).

In the fourth quarter of 2010, the total value of private building authorizations increased a modest \$8.0 million or 1.9 percent compared with the fourth quarter of 2009 (Tables E-1 and E-8); the value of new residential permits was down \$6.5 million or 3.9 percent; that of new commercial and industrial permits was up \$24.5 million or 26.6 percent; and that of additions and alternations permits was down \$9.9 million or 6.0 percent, compared to the same quarter of 2009. For the whole year of 2010, total private building authorizations decreased \$18.6 million or 0.9 percent compared with the previous year.

In the fourth quarter of 2010, the value of total private building permits increased in Hawaii and Maui County but decreased in Honolulu and Kauai County compared with the same quarter of 2009. Hawaii County increased \$16.5 million or 24.3 percent; Maui County increased \$1.6 million or 3.2 percent; Honolulu decreased \$9.3 million or 3.2 percent; and Kauai decreased \$0.8 million or 4.5 percent (Table E-8).

Government contracts awarded increased \$87.8 million or 48.7 percent in the fourth quarter of 2010 compared to the same quarter of 2009. For the whole year of 2010, government contracts awarded increased \$278.9 million or 35.8 percent compared with 2009 (Table E-1). According to the most recent data available, State Government CIP expenditures increased \$21.1 million or 2.5 percent during the first three quarters of 2010 from the same period of 2009.

In the fourth quarter of 2010, the single-family housing unit authorizations decreased 36 units from the fourth quarter of 2009 (Table E-4); the number of multi-family units authorized decreased 99 units compared to the same quarter of 2009 (Table E-5). In 2010, the single-family unit authorizations decreased 475 units, while the number of multi-family units authorized increased 1,133 units, compared to 2009.

The Honolulu Construction Cost Indexes decreased 1.8 percent for Single Family Residence (Table E-6) and decreased 0.5 percent for High-Rise Building (Table E-7) in the fourth quarter of 2010 over that of 2009.

In the fourth quarter of 2010, Honolulu's median price for single family resales was \$585,000, a 0.9 percent increase (Table E-9); the median price for condominium units increased 1.3 percent to \$305,000 compared to the same quarter in 2009 (Table E-10). In the fourth quarter of 2010, the number of single-family unit resale was down 2.6 percent, and the number of condominium unit resale was down 15.8 percent from the fourth quarter of 2009 (Tables E-11 and E-12).

Both single-family unit resales and condominium unit resales in Maui County increased during 2010.

F. OTHER INDICATORS

The total number of bankruptcy filings in Hawaii increased 14.1 percent or by 115 cases for the fourth quarter of 2010 from the same quarter of 2009. This was the sixteenth consecutive quarter-over-quarter increase since the first quarter of 2007. For the whole year of 2010, total filings increased 27.5 percent or 853 cases from the previous year.

The number of Chapter 7 filings, the largest category, increased 2.9 percent or 19 cases in the fourth quarter of 2010. Chapter 7 filings are intended to liquidate assets and discharge debt. For the whole year of 2010, Chapter 7 filings were up 24.1 percent or 597 cases from the previous year.


Chapters 11 and 12 filings increased from 6 cases in the fourth quarter of 2009 to 9 cases in the fourth quarter of 2010. For the whole year of 2010, Chapters 11 and 12 filings increased to 23

cases from 21 cases in the previous year. Chapter 11 filings involve the structuring of repayment plans for companies. Chapter 12 bankruptcy is a special section of the bankruptcy code that provides debt restructuring for family farms and family fisherman.

Chapter 13 filings in the fourth quarter of 2010 increased 62.4 percent, or 93 cases from the fourth quarter of 2009. For the whole year of 2010, Chapter 13 filings were up 42.4 percent or 254 cases from the previous year. Chapter 13 bankruptcy allows debtors to work out repayment arrangements with creditors.



III. TERMS AND DEFINITIONS

- Accommodation Jobs This industry provides lodging or short-term accommodations for travelers, vacationers, and others. Some provide lodging only; while others provide meals, laundry, and recreational facilities, as well as lodging. There are three industry groups: (1) traveler accommodation includes establishments that primarily provide traditional types of lodging services. This group includes hotels, motels, and bed and breakfast inns. (2) recreational accommodation includes establishments that operate lodging facilities primarily designed to accommodate outdoor enthusiasts. Included are travel trailer campsites, recreation vehicle parks, and outdoor adventure retreats; and (3) rooming and boarding houses includes establishments providing temporary or longer-term accommodations that for the period of occupancy may serve as a principal residence. Board (i.e., meals) may be provided but is not essential.
- Agriculture Wage and Salary Jobs Full- and part-time jobs for which payment was made by the employer in the survey week containing the 12th of the month. Includes farm jobs and machinery operators. Closely related management and services jobs are included for sugar and pineapple but are excluded for other types of agriculture.
- Airline Seat Total number of available seats from all direct flights to Hawaii, including scheduled and chartered flights.
- Arts, Entertainment & Recreation Jobs This industry includes a wide range of establishments that operate facilities or provide services to meet varied cultural, entertainment, and recreational interests of their patrons. This sector comprises (1) establishments that are involved in producing, promoting, or participating in live performances, events, or exhibits intended for public viewing: (2) establishments that preserve and exhibit objects and sites of historical, cultural, or educational interest; and (3) establishments that operate facilities or provide services that enable patrons to participate in recreational activities or pursue amusement, hobby, and leisure-time interests. Excluded from this sector are: (1) establishments that provide both accommodations and recreational facilities, such as hunting and fishing camps and resort and casino hotels; (2) restaurants and night clubs that provide live entertainment in addition to the sale of food and beverages, (3) motion picture theaters, libraries and archives, and publishers of newspapers, magazines, books, periodicals, and computer software; and (4) establishments using transportation equipment

to provide recreational and entertainment services, such as those operating sightseeing buses, dinner cruises, or helicopter rides.

- Average Daily Visitor Census- By Air Average number of visitors present daily in the state. Figures are computed monthly by the Research & Economic Analysis Division, DBEDT based on arrival and departure dates from ground and in-flight surveys.
- **Average Length of Stay- By Air** Number of days visitors are in the State including the day of arrival and of departure.

Bankruptcy Filings –

- **Chapter 7** Is available to both individuals and business debtors. Its purpose is to achieve a fair distribution to creditors of whatever non-exempt property the debtor has and to give the individual debtor a fresh start through the discharge in bankruptcy.
- **Chapter 11** Is available for both consumer and business debtors. Its purpose is to rehabilitate a business as a going concern or reorganize an individual's finances through a court-approved reorganization plan.
- **Chapter 12** Is designed to give special debt relief to a family farmer with regular income from farming.
- **Chapter 13** Is available for an individual with regular income whose debts do not exceed specific amounts, typically used to budget some of the debtor's future earnings under a plan through which creditors are paid in whole or in part.

- Chained (1996) dollar Gross Domestic Product by State (GDP) [Note: formerly called 'Gross State Product'] series are calculated (using national chaintype implicit price deflators) as the product of the chain-type quantity index and the 1996 current-dollar value of the corresponding series, divided by 100. Because the formula for the chain-type quantity indexes uses weights of more than one period, the corresponding chained-dollar estimates are usually not additive; that is, state totals usually do not add to regional totals or to U.S. totals, and regional totals usually do not add to U.S. totals.
- **Civilian Employment** Persons 16 years of age or older who, during the survey week containing the 12th of the month, were either at work for pay or profit, or

worked without pay for 15 hours or more on a family farm or business, or were with a job but not at work. Both permanent and temporary employees and those who are working either full- or part-time are included.

- **Civilian Labor Force** –Total of employed and unemployed persons, excluding those in the armed forces and 16 years of age or under. U.S. Census Bureau does surveys for the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.
- **Civilian Unemployment** Persons 16 years of age or older who (1) did not work at all during the survey week but were actively seeking work and were available for work; or (2) did not work at all, were available for work, and were waiting to be called back from layoff or were waiting to report to a new wage or salary job within 30 days.
- **Condominium Resales**: Consists of resales of condominium, duplexes and townhomes that are entered in the Multiple Listing Service. It does not include apartments.
- Consumer Price Index: Honolulu or U.S. Measure of the average change in prices over time for a fixed market basket of goods and services. It is compiled by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The index measures changes from a reference date, i.e., 1982-84, which is designated as 100.0. For example, a Honolulu CPI-U (where U refers to All Urban Consumers), All Items, of 171.5 as the annual average for 1998 indicates the average prices of that group's basket was 71.5 percent higher than the weighted average of those same goods and services in 1982-84. Data are published monthly for the U.S. and semiannually for Honolulu. As of January 1998, BLS changed the reference basket based on 1982-84 consumer expenditures to a 1993-95 basket, but the base remains 1982-84 = 100.0. The BLS Internet site information about has more the CPI at http://www.bls.gov/cpi/home.htm.
- **Contracting Tax Base** The total receipts of businesses engaged in contracting to erect, construct, repair, or improve buildings or structures of any kind or description, or to make any installation therein. Attributed to any business engaging in the practice of architecture, engineering, land surveying, landscape architecture, and the practice of pest control or fumigation.
- **Contributions for government social insurance -** New category as part of the 'BEA Comprehensive Revision of the National Income & Product Accounts released

in December 1999. Replaces 'Personal contributions for social insurance'. These contributions, which are subtracted in the calculation of personal income, consist of the contributions, or payments, by employees, by the self-employed, and by other individuals who participate in the following government programs: Old-age, survivors, and disability insurance (social security); hospital insurance; supplementary medical insurance; unemployment insurance; railroad retirement; veterans life insurance; and temporary disability insurance. These contributions are excluded from personal income by definition, but the components of personal income upon which these contributions are basedmainly wage and salary disbursements and proprietors' income-are presented gross of these contributions.

- Dividends, Interest, and Rent U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis presents the State Personal Income estimates of these components together. It consists of income received by individuals and on behalf of individuals by private and government employee retirement plans and by quasi-individuals, including non-profit institutions and private trust funds administered by fiduciaries. Personal dividend income is payments in cash or other assets by corporations in the U.S. or abroad to noncorporate stockholders who are Hawaii residents. Personal interest income is the interest income (monetary and imputed) from all sources that is received by individuals, by private and government employee retirement plans, by nonprofit institutions, and by estates and trusts. Rental income of persons with capital consumption adjustment is the net currentproduction income of persons from the rental of real property except for the income of persons primarily engaged in the real estate business; the imputed net rental income received by owner-occupants of farmdwellings; and the royalties received by persons from patents, copyrights, and rights to natural resources. The estimates include BEA adjustments for uninsured losses to real estate caused by disasters, such as hurricanes (e.g. Iniki in 1992) and floods. See Personal Income.
- **Earnings** This BEA aggregate is the sum of three components of personal income: wages and salary disbursements, other labor income, and proprietors' income. BEA presents earnings because it can be used in analyses of regional economies as a proxy for the income generated from participation in current production. See <u>Personal Income</u>.
- **Educational Services Jobs** This industry comprises establishments that provide instruction and training by specialized establishments, such as schools, colleges,

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universities, and training centers. These establishments may be privately owned and operated for profit or not for profit, or they may be publicly owned and operated. They may also offer food and accommodation services to their students. Educational services are usually delivered by teachers or instructors that explain, tell, demonstrate, supervise, and direct learning, in diverse settings, such as educational institutions, the workplace, or the home through correspondence, television, or other means.

- **Employer Contributions to Social Insurance -** New category as part of the 'BEA Comprehensive Revision of the National Income & Product Accounts released in December 1999. Replaces 'Other labor income'. This component of personal income consists of employer contributions for employee pension and insurance funds and of employer contributions for government social insurance. See <u>Personal Income</u>.
- **Federal Government Jobs** Includes those in the civilian agencies, i.e. Department of Defense, Agriculture, United States Postal Service and the various armed services exchange systems.
- Financial Activities Jobs Establishments primarily engaged in financial transactions, i.e. those transactions involving the creation, liquidation, or change in ownership of financial assets, and/or in facilitating financial transactions. Three principal types of activities are identified: (1) raising funds by taking deposits and/or issuing securities and, in the process, incurring liabilities; (2) pooling of risk by underwriting insurance and annuities, (3) providing specialized services facilitating or supporting financial intermediation, insurance, and employee benefit programs. In addition, monetary authorities charged with monetary control are included in this sector. This also includes real estate and the rental and leasing sector which is comprised of establishments primarily engaged in renting, leasing, or otherwise allowing the use of tangible or intangible assets, and establishments providing related services. The major portion of this sector comprises establishments that rent, lease, or otherwise allow the use of their own assets by others. The assets may be tangible, as is the case of real estate and equipment, or intangible, as is the case with patents and trademarks. Excluded from this sector are investment trusts estate (REITS) real and establishments primarily engaged in renting or leasing equipment with operators. In many cases, such as the rental of heavy construction equipment, the operator is essential to operate the equipment.
- Food Services & Drinking Places Jobs These industries prepare meals, snacks, and beverages to

customer order for immediate on-premises and offpremises consumption. Some provide food and drink only; while others provide various combinations of seating space, waiter/waitress services and incidental amenities, such as limited entertainment. The industries are grouped based on the type and level of services provided, i.e. full-service restaurants; limitedservice eating places; and special food services including caterers and mobile food services. Food services and drink activities at hotels and motels; amusement parks, theaters, casinos, country clubs, and similar recreational facilities; and civic and social organizations are included here only if these services are provided by a separate establishment primarily engaged in providing food and beverage services. Excluded are establishments operating dinner cruises which are classified as scenic and sightseeing transportation because those establishments utilize transportation equipment to provide scenic recreational entertainment.

- General Excise (Gross Income) Tax Tax charged to businesses on gross sales or gross income. The tax rate is 0.5 percent on wholesaling and intermediary services, blind vendors, producing, manufacturing, sugar processing and pineapple canning; all other activities (retailing, business and professional services, contracting, theater, amusement, radio, interest, commissions, rentals) are taxed at 4.0 percent, except insurance commissions to general agents, subagents and solicitors, who are taxed at 0.15 percent.
- General Excise and Use Tax Base The value of all goods and services sold, including the value of tangible personal property imported into Hawaii for own use or consumption. One of the most comprehensive measures of business activity in the state.
- **General Fund Tax Revenues** Receipts of the general excise and use tax, net individual and corporate income taxes comprise over 85 percent of the General Fund tax receipts. The general government fund used to account for all financial resources except those required to be accounted for in another fund, such as the highway, airport or capital improvement fund.
- Gross Domestic Product by State (GDP) [Note: formerly called 'Gross State Product'] – GDP is the value added in production by the labor and property located in a state. GDP for a state is derived as the sum of the GDP originating in all industries in the state. The estimates of real GDP are derived by applying national implicit price deflators by detailed industry to the current-dollar GDP estimates by

detailed industry. Then, in order to capture the differences across states that reflect the relative differences in the mix of goods and services that the states produce, the same chain-type index formula used in the national accounts is used to calculate the estimates of total real GDP and real GDP by major industry.

- Health Care & Social Assistance Jobs This industry includes establishments that provide both health care and social assistance for individuals. Both are included as it is sometimes difficult to distinguish between the boundaries of these two activities starting with those establishments providing medical care exclusively, continuing with those providing health care and social assistance, and finally finishing with those providing only social assistance. These services are delivered by trained professionals and the industries are defined based on the educational degree held by its Excluded are aerobic classes and practitioners. nonmedical diet and weight reducing centers. Although these can be viewed as health services, these services are not typically delivered by health practitioners.
- Honolulu Construction Cost Indexes: High-Rise or Single Family – As compiled, by First Hawaiian Bank, and currently by DBEDT, these indexes measure changes in contractors' costs for building materials and labor. For discussion of Methodology, see <u>Hawaii's Economy May 2000</u> at <u>http://www.hawaii.gov/dbedt/hecon/he5-00/index.html</u>.
- Hotel Occupancy Rate The percentage of occupied rooms in a hotel. Hotel occupancy rates depend not only on the number of visitors and their length of stay, but also on the hotel room inventory, e.g., a large increase in new hotel units results in a drop in occupancy rates, until such time as visitor traffic builds up enough to fill them. Rates are obtained from a sample survey conducted on a monthly basis.
- **Hotel Rental Tax Base** is the economic base from which all hotel business activity is taxed. It includes the furnishing of temporary accommodations in a hotel, or other place in which lodgings are regularly furnished to transients for compensation.
- Implicit Price Deflator The implicit price deflator is calculated as the ratio of the current-dollar value to the corresponding chained-dollar value multiplied by 100.
 OR Implicit price deflators are weighted averages of the detailed price indexes used to prepare each aggregate and component and are calculated as the

ratio of current- to chained-dollar output multiplied by 100.

- Information Jobs Are in establishments engaged in the following processes: (a) producing and distributing information and cultural products, (b) providing the means to transmit or distribute these products as well as data or communications, and (c) processing data. Included are publishing industries, including software publishing, and both traditional publishing and publishing exclusively on the Internet; the motion picture and sound recording industries; the industries, broadcasting including traditional broadcasting and those broadcasting exclusively over the Internet; the telecommunications industries; the industries known as Internet service providers and web search portals, data processing industries, and the information services industries. For the purpose of developing NAICS, it is the transformation of information into a commodity that is produced and distributed by a number of growing industries that is at issue. The Information sector groups three types of establishments: (1) those engaged in producing and distributing information and cultural products; (2) those that provide the means to transmit or distribute these products as well as data or communications; and (3) those that process data. Many of the industries in the NAICS Information sector are engaged in producing products protected by copyright law, or in distributing them (other than distribution by traditional wholesale and retail methods). Examples are traditional publishing industries, software and directory and mailing list publishing industries, and film and sound industries. Broadcasting and telecommunications industries and information providers and processors are also included in the Information sector, because their technologies are so closely linked to other industries in the Information sector.
- **Initial Agent Claims** Notices of unemployment filed against another state by its workers who have moved to Hawaii.
- **Initial Liable Claims** Notices of unemployment filed against Hawaii by Hawaii workers who have moved to another state.
- **Local Government Jobs** Includes those in the county governments.
- Manufacturing Jobs Are in establishments engaged in the mechanical, physical, or chemical transformation of materials, substances, or components into new products. The assembling of component parts of manufactured products is considered manufacturing,

except in cases where the activity is appropriately classified as construction. Included in manufacturing are plants, factories, or mills and characteristically use power-driven machines and materials-handling equipment. However, establishments that transform materials or substances into new products by hand or in the worker's home and those engaged in selling to the general public products made on the same premises from which they are sold, such as bakeries, candy stores, and custom tailors, may also be included in this sector. Manufacturing establishments may process materials or may contract with other establishments to process their materials for them. Both types of establishments are included in manufacturing. The following activities are considered manufacturing in NAICS: milk or water bottling and pasteurizing; fresh fish packaging; printing and related activities; ready-mixed concrete production; ship repair and renovation; machine shops; and tire retreading. Conversely, there are activities that NAICS classifies as non-manufacturing, i.e. agriculture, forestry, fishing and hunting; the construction of structures and fabricating operations performed at the site of construction by contractors, establishments engaged in breaking of bulk and redistribution in smaller lots, including packaging, repackaging, or bottling products, customized assembly of computers, etc

- NAICS The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) has replaced the U.S. Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) system. NAICS was developed jointly by the U.S., Canada, and Mexico to provide new comparability in statistics about business activity across North America. Estimates of Personal Income earnings, wage and salary disbursements, and employment by NAICS subsector are available starting with 2001. For descriptions of NAICS industries, please see http://www.census.gov/epcd/www/naics.html at the Census Bureau.
- Natural Resources, Mining & Construction Jobs In Hawaii, 99 percent of the jobs in this category are in Construction and the remaining 1 percent in Mining. Included are those establishments that extract naturally occurring mineral solids, such as coal and ores; liquid minerals, such as crude petroleum; and gases, such as natural gas. There are two activities: mine operation and mining support activities. The construction sector comprises establishments primarily engaged in the construction of buildings or engineering projects (e.g., highways and utility systems), additions, alterations, or maintenance and repairs. Establishments primarily engaged in the preparation of sites for new construction and establishments primarily engaged in

subdividing land for sale as building sites also are included in this sector.

- **Net Earnings** BEA also calculates this measure as Earnings less Personal Contributions for Social Insurance. Net earnings is used in the presentation of State and local area personal income as the sum of net earnings, transfer payments, and personal dividend income, personal interest income, and rental income of persons. It can be used as a proxy for income before taxes. See <u>Personal Income</u>.
- Net Individual or Corporation Income Tax Revenue For individuals, it is calculated as declaration of estimated taxes plus payments with returns plus withholding tax on wages less refunds. Net corporate income tax revenue is calculated as declarations of estimated taxes plus payments with returns less refunds.
- **Non-Agriculture Wage and Salary Jobs** Derived monthly from a sample survey of employers reporting the number of persons who received pay for any part of the pay period containing the 12th of the month. Includes all full- and part-time non-agricultural workers, permanent and temporary workers, and workers on paid sick leave and paid vacation.
- Other Goods and Services Honolulu Consumer Price Index component detail. Prior to the CPI 1998 Revision, it measured the change in average prices of tobacco products, personal care goods and services, and personal and educational expenditures. Beginning with January 1998 data, this category includes tobacco, personal care, and miscellaneous goods and services. Other components, for example, schoolbooks and tuition, moved to the new "Education and Communication" and recreational reading to "Recreation". BLS' Monthly Labor Review (December 1996), and BLS' Internet site have more information about the CPI at http://www.bls.gov/cpi/.
- Other Labor Income See Employer Contributions to Social Insurance'.
- Other Services (except public administration) Jobs Are in establishments engaged in providing services not specifically provided for elsewhere in the classification system., such as equipment and machinery repairing, promoting or administering religious activities, grantmaking, advocacy, and providing drycleaning and laundry services, personal care services, death care services, pet care services, photofinishing services, temporary parking services, and dating services. Private households that engage in employing workers on or about the premises in

activities primarily concerned with the operation of the household are included in this sector. Excluded from this sector are establishments primarily engaged in retailing new equipment and also performing repairs and general maintenance on equipment

- **Personal Contributions for Social Insurance** See '<u>Contributions for government social insurance</u>'.
- Personal current transfer receipts Modified category as part of the 'BEA Comprehensive Revision of the National Income & Product Accounts' released in December 1999. Formerly 'Transfer Payments'. This component of personal income is payments to persons for which no current services are performed. It consists of payments to individuals and to nonprofit institutions by Federal, state, and local governments and by businesses. Government payments to individuals includes retirement and disability insurance benefits, medical payments (mainly Medicare and Medicaid), income maintenance benefits, unemployment insurance benefits, veterans benefits, and Federal grants and loans to students. Government payments to nonprofit institutions excludes payments by the Federal Government for work under research and development contracts. Business payments to persons consists primarily of liability payments for personal injury and of corporate gifts to nonprofit institutions.
- **Personal Income** –Income received by persons for participation in production, from government and business transfer payments, and from government interest. It is calculated as the sum of wage & salary disbursements, supplements to wages and salaries, proprietors' income with inventory valuation and capital consumption adjustments, rental income of persons with capital consumption adjustment, personal dividend income, personal interest income, and personal current transfer receipts, less contributions for government social insurance. For additional information see <u>http://www.bea.doc.gov/bea/regional/spi/</u>
- **Professional & Business Services Jobs** Are in establishments that specialize in performing professional, scientific, and technical activities for others and require a high degree of expertise and training. These activities include: legal advice and representation; accounting, bookkeeping, and payroll services; architectural, engineering, and specialized design services; computer services; consulting services; research services; advertising services; photographic services; translation and interpretation services; veterinary services; and other professional, scientific, and technical services to business and sometimes to households, but excludes establishments

primarily engaged in providing a range of day-to-day office administrative services, such as financial planning, billing and recordkeeping, personnel, and physical distribution and logistics. The management sector comprises establishments that hold the securities of companies and enterprises for the purpose of owning a controlling interest or influencing management decisions or establishments that administer, oversee, and manage establishments of the company or enterprise and that normally undertake the strategic organizational planning or and decisionmaking role of the company or enterprise. Establishments in this sector perform essential activities that are often undertaken, in-house, by establishments in many sectors of the economy but by consolidating the performance of these activities, economies of scale are achieved. Also included are establishments that perform routine support activities, such as office administration, hiring and placing of personnel, document preparation and similar clerical services, solicitation, collection, security and surveillance services, cleaning, and waste disposal services on a contract or fee basis.

- Proprietors' Income This component of BEA Personal income is the current-production income (including income in kind) of sole proprietorships, partnerships and cooperatives. Corporate directors' fees and the imputed net rental income of owner-occupants of farm dwellings is included in proprietors' income but the imputed net rental income of owner-occupants of nonfarm dwellings is included in rental income of persons. Proprietors' income excludes dividends and monetary interest received by nonfinancial business and rental incomes by persons not primarily engaged in the real estate business; these incomes are included in dividends, net interest, and rental income of personas, respectively. See <u>Personal Income</u>.
- Retail Tax Base includes the general excise tax base on retailing. Retail sales include sales for consumption or use by the purchaser and not for resale. The general excise tax at the retail level (4%) is sometimes loosely called a sales tax. However, it differs from a typical sales tax in two respects: (1) it is a tax on the gross income of the seller rather than a tax on the purchase price of the buyer; (2) the retail excise tax in Hawaii applies to all retail sales taxes exempt some commodities such as food and services.
- **Retail Trade Jobs** Are in establishments engaged in retailing merchandise, generally without transformation, and rendering services incidental to the sale of merchandise. The retailing process is the final step in the distribution of merchandise; retailers

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are, therefore, organized to sell merchandise in small quantities to the general public. This sector comprises two main types of retailers: store and nonstore retailers. Store retailers operate fixed point-of-sale locations, located and designed to attract a high volume of walk-in customers where they have extensive displays of merchandise and use mass-media advertising to attract customers from the general public for personal or household consumption, but some also serve business and institutional clients. These include establishments such as office supply stores, computer and software stores, building materials dealers, plumbing supply stores, and electrical supply stores. Catalog showrooms, gasoline services stations, automotive dealers, and mobile home dealers are treated as store retailers. Generally, establishments engaged in retailing merchandise and providing after-sales services are classified in this sector. Nonstore retailers are also organized to serve the general public, but they reach customers and market merchandise with methods, such as the broadcasting of "infomercials," the broadcasting and publishing of direct-response advertising, the publishing of paper and electronic catalogs, door-todoor solicitation, in-home demonstration, selling from portable stalls (street vendors, except food), and distribution through vending machines.

- Services Tax Base includes tax base data on establishments primarily engaged in providing a wide variety of services for individuals, business and government establishments, and other organizations; hotels and other lodging places; establishments providing personal, business, repair, and amusement services; health, legal, engineering, and other professional services; educational institutions; membership organizations and other miscellaneous services.
- **Single Family Home Resales:** Consists of resales of single family homes that are entered in the Multiple Listing Service.
- **State Government Jobs Education** includes all employees under the Department of Education (DOE) and the University of Hawaii System. This includes public library personnel, substitute teachers who received pay during the pay period including the 12th of the month, and support personnel such as cafeteria workers, classroom cleaners, and school security attendants. Also included are part-time employees in special programs such as the A+ After School.
- **State Government Jobs Non-Education** Includes all other executive branch departments (i.e. Agriculture, Transportation, etc.), the legislative and judicial

branches, and the Research Corporation of the University of Hawaii (RCUH).

- **Total Wage and Salary Jobs** includes nonagricultural wage and salary workers and agriculture wage and salary workers. Persons on the payroll of more than one establishment during the pay period are counted in each establishment that reports them.
- Transfer Payments See <u>Personal current transfer</u> receipts.
- **Transient Accommodations Tax** Tax levied on resort time-share vacation units and the furnishing of a room, apartment, suite which is customarily occupied by a person or group for fewer than 180 consecutive days by a hotel, apartment, motel, or cooperative apartment, rooming house, or other place in which lodgings are generally furnished to transients. The tax as of January 1, 1999 is imposed at the rate of 7.25 percent and the tax base includes time-share units.
- Transportation, Warehousing, & Utilities Jobs Are in industries providing transportation of passengers and cargo, warehousing and storage for goods, scenic and sightseeing transportation, and support activities related to modes of transportation - air, rail, water, The sector distinguishes road, and pipeline. subsectors for each mode of transportation, a subsector for warehousing and storage, and a subsector for establishments providing support activities for transportation. In addition, there are subsectors for establishments that provide passenger transportation for scenic and sightseeing purposes, postal services, and courier services. Warehousing establishments in this sector are distinguished from merchant wholesaling in that the warehouse establishments do not sell the goods. Excluded are establishments primarily engaged in providing travel agent services that support transportation and other establishments, such as hotels, businesses, and government agencies. The Utilities sector comprises establishments engaged in the provision of the following utility services: electric power, natural gas, steam supply, water supply, and sewage removal. Within this sector, the specific activities associated with the utility services provided vary by utility: electric power includes generation, transmission, and distribution; natural gas includes distribution; steam supply includes provision and/or distribution; water supply includes treatment and distribution; and sewage removal includes collection, treatment, and disposal of waste through sewer systems and sewage treatment facilities. Excluded from this sector are establishments primarily engaged in waste

management services that do not use sewer systems or sewage treatment facilities.

- **Unallocated General Excise & Use Tax Revenues** General excise and use tax revenues that could not be allocated to specific activities of the general excise & use tax. It also includes collections from penalty and interest, assessments and corrections, delinquent collections, refunds, protested payments, settlements, etc.
- **Unemployment Rate** Ratio of unemployed persons to the civilian labor force expressed as a percentage.
- **Use Tax** Excise tax levied on tangible personal property that is imported or purchased from an unlicensed seller for use in the state. The tax is based upon the purchase price or value of the tangible personal property purchased or imported, whichever is applicable. Rates: 0.5 percent, if for resale at retail; 4.0 percent, if for use or consumption.
- Visitor Arrivals- By Air, Total All persons who stayed in Hawaii for a period between one night and one year.
 - **Domestic Visitor Arrivals** Visitors who stayed in Hawaii for at least one night but less than one year, arriving on flights from Mainland U.S. A foreign resident arriving in Hawaii on a flight directly from the U.S. Mainland is counted as a domestic visitor.
 - **International Visitor Arrivals** Visitors who stayed in Hawaii for at least one night but less than one year arriving on flights from foreign countries. An U.S. resident arriving in Hawaii on a flight directly from a foreign country is counted as an international visitor.

- Visitor Days Measures the number of days visitors stay in the State and are the most comprehensive measurement of visitations. Visitor days take into account both the number of visitors and their length of stay and is the main indicator used by most of the tourism-related businesses to plan their activities.
- Wages and Salary Disbursements- This component of Personal Income consists of the monetary remuneration employees, of including the compensation of corporate officers; commissions, tips, and bonuses; and receipts in kind, or pay-in-kind, such as the meals furnished to the employees of restaurants. It reflects the amount of wages and salaries disbursed, but not necessarily, earned during the year. See Personal Income.
- Wholesale Trade Jobs Are in establishments engaged in wholesaling merchandise, generally without transformation, and rendering services incidental to the sale of merchandise and includes the outputs of agriculture, mining, manufacturing, and certain information industries, such as publishing. It is an intermediate step in the distribution of merchandise. Wholesalers are organized to sell or arrange the purchase or sale of goods for resale, capital or durable nonconsumer goods, and raw and intermediate and supplies materials used in production. Wholesalers sell merchandise to other businesses and normally operate from a warehouse or office that have little or no display f merchandise and do not solicit Transactions are often conducted walk-in traffic. between wholesalers and clients that have longstanding business relationships. There are two main types: merchant wholesalers that sell goods on their own account and business to business electronic markets, agents, and brokers that arrange sales and purchases for others generally for a commission or fee.
