# QUARTERLY STATISTICAL & ECONOMIC REPORT,

## Executive Summary 3rd Quarter 2015

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This *Quarterly Statistical and Economic Report* has been prepared by the staff of the Research and Economic Analysis Division of the State Department of Business, Economic Development & Tourism (DBEDT). The report provides concise statistical information and analyses on Labor, Income and Prices, Taxes, Tourism, Construction, and other indicators, as well as an overview of the State of Hawaii and the four counties.

Technical notes and source descriptions have been kept to a minimum. However, the staff of the Research and Economic Analysis Division would be happy to respond to any inquiries of a technical nature that readers may have (586-2466). The quarterly information contained in this report reflects data received by the Research Division on or before August 19, 2015.

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#### STATE OF THE ECONOMY

Hawaii's major economic indicators were mostly positive in the second quarter of 2015. State general fund tax revenues, visitor arrivals, visitor expenditures, wage and salary jobs, personal income, government contracts awarded, State CIP expenditures, and private building permits all increased in the quarter as compared to the same quarter of 2014.

In the second quarter of 2015, the total number of visitors arriving by air to Hawaii increased 122,172 or 6.1 percent. Due to shorter lengths of stay, the daily visitor census increased 4.9 percent in the quarter. Since visitors spent more on a daily basis during the second quarter of 2015, the total spending by visitors arriving by air decreased 6.8 percent in the quarter. Historical data shows that after seventeen quarters of positive growth from the third quarter of 2009 to the third quarter of 2013, Hawaii's tourism sector experienced one quarter of negative growth in the fourth quarter of 2013. Since the first quarter of 2014, however, Hawaii's tourism sector returned to positive growth compared with the same quarter in the previous year.

In construction, the government contracts awarded, State CIP expenditures, and the value of private building permits all increased. In the second quarter of 2015, government contracts awarded increased \$389.5 million, State CIP expenditures increased \$27.0 million, and the permit value for private construction increased \$33.9 million. The construction sector added 1,000 jobs compared with the same quarter of 2014. According to the most recent data available, current construction put-in-place increased \$69.1 million or 4.0 percent in the first quarter of 2015 compared with the same quarter of 2014. Construction-put-in-place is based on excise tax data.

In the second quarter of 2015, State general fund tax revenues were up \$41.2 million or 2.8 percent over the same period of 2014. State general excise tax revenue increased \$32.9 million or 4.4 percent in the second quarter of 2015 compared to the same quarter in 2014; an indicator of economic activity. In the first half of 2015, State general fund tax revenues increased \$198.7 million or 7.2 percent, and the state general excise tax revenue increased \$68.4 million or 4.6 percent, compared with the same period of 2014.

Labor market conditions were positive. Since the fourth quarter of 2010, Hawaii's jobs increased for the 19th consecutive quarter. In the second quarter of 2015 Hawaii's civilian non-agricultural wage and salary jobs averaged 633,000 jobs, an increase of 7,600 jobs or 1.2 percent from the same quarter of 2014.

The job increase in the second quarter of 2015 was due to job increases in the private sector. In this quarter, the private sector added about 8,700 nonagricultural jobs compared to the second quarter of 2014. Jobs increased the most in Retail Trade, adding 1,900 jobs or 2.8 percent; followed by Health Care and Social Assistance, adding 1,500 jobs or 2.3 percent, Food Services and Drinking Places, adding 1,400 jobs or 2.3 percent, Professional and Business Services, adding 1,400 jobs or 1.7 percent, and Natural Resources, Mining & Construction, adding 1,000 jobs or 3.2 percent in the quarter. In this quarter, Accommodation lost 600 jobs, Manufacturing lost 300 jobs, Educational Services and Information each lost 200 jobs compared to the same quarter of 2014. During the second quarter of 2015, the three levels of government lost 1,100 jobs or 0.9 percent compared to the same quarter of 2014. The Federal Government lost 600 jobs or 1.8 percent; the State Government lost 800 jobs or 1.1 percent, while the Local Government added 200 jobs or 1.1 percent compared to the second quarter of 2014.

The most recent data from the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) shows that Hawaii's total nominal annualized personal income in the first quarter of 2015 increased \$2,664.2 million or 4.1 percent from the same quarter of 2014. This increase includes inflation so the growth of real personal income was smaller. The increase in nominal personal income during the first quarter of 2015 was due to increases in almost all major components of personal income. In dollar terms, the largest increases occurred in wages and salaries, followed by personal current transfer receipts, dividends, interest, and rent, supplements to wage and salaries, which include retirement and unemployment insurance benefits, and proprietors' income. In 2014, total annualized personal income was \$65,874.4 million, an increase of 3.8 percent from the previous year.

Consumer prices in Honolulu increased 0.7 percent in the first half of 2015 compared with the same period of 2014, as measured by the Honolulu Consumer Price Index for Urban Consumers (CPI-U). In contrast, the U.S. CPI-U decreased 0.1 percent in the first half of 2015. In 2014, the Honolulu CPI-U increased 1.4 percent from the previous year. In the first half of 2015, the Honolulu CPI-U increased the most in the price index of Other Goods and Services (5.3 percent), followed by Medical Care (4.8 percent), Food and Beverages (4.2 percent), Education and Communication (3.1 percent), Housing (1.0 percent), and Recreation (0.9 percent). The price of Transportation and Apparel decreased 8.6 percent and 2.1 percent, respectively, compared to the first half of 2014.

#### **OUTLOOK FOR THE ECONOMY**

Hawaii's economy is expected to continue positive growth for the rest of 2015 and into 2016. This outlook is based on the most recent developments in the national and global economies, the performance of Hawaii's tourism industry, labor market conditions, and the growth of personal income and tax revenues.

Hawaii's economy depends significantly on conditions in the U.S. economy and key international economies, especially Japan. According to the August 2015 *Blue Chip Economic Consensus Forecasts*, U.S. real GDP is expected to increase by 2.3 percent in 2015, 0.2 of a percentage point lower than the 2.5 percent growth rate projected in the May 2015 forecast. For 2016 the consensus forecast predicts an overall 2.7 percent growth in U.S. real GDP.

According to the August 2015 *Blue Chip Economic Consensus Forecast*, real GDP growth for Japan is now expected to increase 0.9 percent in 2015, 0.1 of a percentage point lower than the growth rate projected in the May 2015 forecast. For 2016, the consensus forecast now expects an overall 1.5 percent growth rate for Japanese real GDP.

For the local economy, DBEDT expects visitor related indicators will grow at higher rates than projected in the previous forecast. For GDP growth, however, the current forecast was lower than the previous forecast due to revised historical GDP data from BEA.

Overall, Hawaii's economy, as measured by real GDP, is projected to show a 1.9 percent increase in 2015, 0.6 of a percentage point below the growth rate forecasted last quarter. The real GDP growth forecast in 2016 is 2.3 percent, 0.1 of a percentage point below the growth rate forecasted last quarter.

Hawaii's unemployment rate is projected to be 4.0 percent in 2015 and 3.7 percent in 2016, both are 0.1 of a percentage point higher than the previous forecast.

Visitor arrivals are expected to increase 4.3 percent in 2015, 1.8 percentage points higher than the previous forecast. The forecast for visitor days in 2015 increased 1.5 percentage points to 4.2 percent. The forecast for visitor expenditure growth in 2015 was revised upward to 3.8 percent, from 2.0 percent growth projected in the previous forecast. For 2016, the growth rate of visitor arrivals, visitor days, and visitor expenditures are now expected to be 1.6 percent, 1.5 percent, and 3.5 percent, respectively.

The projection for the non-agricultural wage and salary job growth rate in 2015 is 1.1 percent, same as the previous forecast. In 2016, jobs are projected to increase 1.2 percent, the same as the previous forecast.

The Honolulu Consumer Price Index (CPI) is now expected to increase 1.0 percent in 2015, 0.5 of a percentage point below the previous forecast. In 2016, the CPI is projected to increase 2.3 percent, 0.1 of a percentage point above the previous forecast.

Personal income in current dollars is now expected to increase 4.3 percent in 2015, the same as the previous forecast. Real personal income is currently projected to grow 3.5 percent in 2015, 1.0 percentage point higher than the previous forecast. In 2016, current-dollar personal income and real personal income are expected to increase 4.6 percent and 2.9 percent, respectively.

Beyond 2016, the economy will continue its expansion path, with job growth expected to be 1.0 percent in 2017 and 1.1 percent in 2018. Visitor arrivals are expected to increase 1.7 percent in 2017 and 2018. Visitor expenditures are expected to increase 4.3 percent in 2017 and 2018. Real personal income is projected to increase 2.7 percent in 2017 and 2.6 percent in 2018. Hawaii's real GDP growth is expected to increase 2.4 percent in 2017 and 2018. The unemployment rate is expected to decrease to 3.4 percent in 2017 and 3.3 percent in 2018.

#### **COUNTY ECONOMIC CONDITIONS**

Overall economic conditions were mostly positive across the counties in the second quarter of 2015. The unemployment rate decreased in all counties. Total visitor arrivals by air and visitor days increased in all counties. The value of private building permits increased in Maui and Kauai, but decreased in Honolulu and Hawaii County. Total non-agricultural wage and salary jobs increased in Honolulu and Maui, but decreased in Hawaii County and Kauai.

In the second quarter of 2015, the unemployment rate in all counties decreased. The unemployment rate in Honolulu decreased 0.4 of a percentage point from 4.2 percent to 3.8 percent; the unemployment rate in Maui County decreased 0.7 of a percentage point from 4.8 percent to 4.1 percent; the unemployment rate in Hawaii County decreased 0.8 of a percentage point from 5.9 percent to 5.1 percent; and the unemployment rate in Kauai County decreased 0.4 of a percentage point from 5.0 percent to 4.6 percent.

In the second quarter of 2015, Honolulu gained 6,700 or 1.5 percent of non-agricultural wage and salary jobs over the same quarter of 2014. Natural Resources, Mining, and Construction added the most jobs in the quarter (1,700 jobs), followed by Food Services and Drinking Places (1,300 jobs), Health Care and Social Assistance (1,300 jobs), Professional and Business Services (1,000 jobs), and Retail Trade (900 jobs). The Government sector lost 1,200 jobs. The largest private sector job losses occurred in Educational Services (300 jobs lost) and Information (300 jobs lost).

In the second quarter of 2015, Hawaii County lost 300 non-agricultural wage and salary jobs or 0.5 percent over the same quarter of 2014. Retail Trade added the most jobs in the quarter (300 jobs), followed by Transportation, Warehousing, and Utilities (200 jobs). The largest private sector job losses occurred in Natural Resources, Mining, and (600 jobs lost), followed Construction by Manufacturing (300 jobs lost), Financial Activities (300 jobs lost), and Accommodation (300 jobs lost). In the second quarter of 2015, Government added 100 jobs over the same quarter of 2014.

Maui County saw a net gain of 1,200 jobs or a 1.7 percent increase in the second quarter of 2015 over the same quarter of 2014. Job gains in Retail Trade (500 jobs), Arts, Entertainment and Recreation (300 jobs), and Professional and Business Services (200 jobs) exceeded job losses in Accommodation (200 jobs lost). Government jobs remained the same in the quarter.

In the second quarter of 2015, Kauai County lost 300 wage and salary jobs or 1.0 percent from the same quarter of 2014. Retail Trade added 200 jobs in the quarter. The largest private sector job losses occurred in Natural Resources, Mining, and Construction (300 jobs lost), followed by Accommodation (200 jobs lost). Public sector jobs remained the same in the quarter.

In the second quarter of 2015, both visitor arrivals by air and visitor days increased in all Visitor arrivals by air increased 4.3 counties. percent in Honolulu, 8.2 percent in Hawaii County, 6.8 percent in Maui, and 4.7 percent in Kauai. Visitor days increased 4.7 percent in Honolulu, 6.9 percent in Hawaii County, 5.4 percent in Maui, and 2.6 percent in Kauai, compared to the same quarter of 2014. In the first quarter of 2015, the most recent quarterly data available, hotel occupancy rate decreased in Honolulu, but increased in all other counties. The hotel occupancy rate was the highest in Honolulu (at 83.4 percent for a decrease of 2.2 percentage points), followed by Maui (at 78.5 percent and an increase of 0.5 of a percentage point), Kauai (at 76.1 percent an increase of 1.7 percentage points), and Hawaii County (at 72.5 percent an increase of 1.8 percentage points in the quarter).

In the second quarter of 2015, the growth rate of private building permits were negative in Honolulu and Hawaii County, but positive in Maui and Kauai. In this quarter, Honolulu private building permits decreased \$2.7 million or 0.6 percent, Hawaii County decreased \$18.8 million or 8.0 percent, Maui increased \$48.6 million or 62.9 percent, and Kauai (residential only available) increased \$6.8 million or 24.6 percent from the same quarter of the previous year.

### A. LABOR FORCE AND JOBS

Hawaii's labor market conditions continued to improve in the second quarter of 2015. Since the civilian labor force increased less than the civilian employment, the civilian unemployment rate decreased 0.5 of a percentage point in the quarter. For the 19<sup>th</sup> consecutive quarter, civilian nonagricultural wage and salary jobs increased.

In the second quarter of 2015, the civilian labor force averaged 676,150 people, an increase of 7,400 people or 1.1 percent from the same quarter of 2014 (Table A-1). In the first half of 2015, the civilian labor force increased 8,950 people or 1.3 percent from the same period of 2014.

Civilian employment totaled 648,700 people in the second quarter of 2015, an increase of 10,400 people or 1.6 percent compared to the same quarter of 2014 (Table A-2). This is the eleventh quarterly increase following four consecutive quarterly decreases from the fourth quarter of 2011 to the third quarter of 2012. In the first half of 2015, average civilian employment increased 11,800 people or 1.9 percent from the same period of 2014.

In the second quarter of 2015, the number of civilian unemployed averaged 27,450, a decrease of 3,000 people or 9.9 percent from the same quarter of 2014 (Table A-3). In the first half of 2015, the number of unemployed decreased 2,850 people or 9.4 percent from the same period of 2014.

The unemployment rate (not seasonally adjusted) decreased from 4.6 percent in the second quarter of 2014 to 4.1 percent in the second quarter of 2015 (Table A-4). In the first half of 2015, the unemployment rate decreased 0.5 of a percentage point from the same period of 2014.

In the second quarter of 2015, Hawaii's civilian non-agricultural wage and salary jobs averaged 633,000 jobs, an increase of 7,600 jobs or 1.2 percent from the same quarter of 2014 (Table A-6). This is the 19<sup>th</sup> consecutive quarterly increase in non-agricultural wage and salary jobs

after ten consecutive quarterly decreases in jobs since the second quarter of 2008. In the first half of 2015, average non-agricultural wage and salary jobs increased 1.1 percent or 6,600 jobs from the same period of 2014.

The job increase in the second quarter of 2015 was due to a job increase in the private sector. In this quarter, the private sector added about 8,700 non-agricultural jobs compared to the second quarter of 2014. Jobs increased the most in Retail Trade, adding 1,900 jobs or 2.8 percent (Table A-10). This was followed by Health Care and Social Assistance, adding 1,500 jobs or 2.3 percent (Table A-16), Food Services and Drinking Places, adding 1,400 jobs or 2.3 percent (Table A-19), Professional and Business Services, adding 1,400 jobs or 1.7 percent (Table A-14), and Natural Resources, Mining and Construction, adding 1,000 jobs or 3.2 percent (Table A-7) in the quarter.

For the private sector, in the second quarter of 2015, Accommodation lost 600 jobs (Table A-18), Manufacturing lost 300 jobs (Table A-8), Educational Services (Table A-15) and Information (Table A-12) each lost 200 jobs compared to the same quarter of 2014.

The three levels of government lost 1,100 jobs or 0.9 percent (Table A-21) in the second quarter of 2015 compared to the same quarter of 2014. The Federal Government lost 600 jobs or 1.8 percent (Table A-22); the State Government lost 800 jobs or 1.1 percent (Table A-23), while the Local Government added 200 jobs or 1.1 percent (Table A-24) compared to the second quarter of 2014.

The initial liable claims for unemployment, which measures the number of people who lost jobs in Hawaii and moved to other states, decreased 22.4 percent in the second quarter of 2015 compared to the same quarter of 2014 (Table A-27). In the first half of 2015, the initial liable claims for unemployment decreased 11.5 percent from the same period of 2014.

### **B. INCOME AND PRICES**

Hawaii's total personal income increased during the first quarter of 2015 over the same quarter of 2014, all major components of personal income increased in the quarter. In dollar terms, the largest increases occurred in wages and salaries, followed by personal current transfer receipts, dividends, interest, and rent, supplements to wages and salaries, and proprietors' income (Table B-1).

In the first quarter of 2015, total nominal annualized personal income (i.e., not adjusted for inflation) increased \$2,664.2 million or 4.1 percent from the first quarter of 2014 (Table B-2). In 2014, total annualized personal income was \$65,874.4 million, an increase of 3.8 percent from the previous year.

In the first quarter of 2015, wages and salaries increased \$1,338.9 million or 4.2 percent from the first quarter of 2014. This was the 19th quarterly year-over-year increase since the third quarter of 2010. In 2014, wages and salaries increased 3.6 percent from the previous year (Table B-3).

Supplements to wages and salaries, consisting of employer payments to retirement plans, private group health insurance plans, private workers compensation plans, and other such benefits, increased \$282.9 million or 3.0 percent in the first quarter of 2015 from the same quarter of 2014 (Table B-4). In 2014, supplements to wages and salaries increased 3.1 percent from the previous year.

Proprietors' income increased \$227.5 million or 4.7 percent in the first quarter of 2015 over that of 2014 (Table B-5). In 2014, proprietors' income was up 3.2 percent from the previous year.

Dividends, interest, and rent increased \$450.6 million or 3.3 percent in the first quarter of 2015 from the same quarter of 2014. In 2014, income in this category was up 3.4 percent from the previous year (Table B-6).

The annualized personal current transfer receipts grew by \$570.6 million or 5.6 percent in the first quarter of 2015 from the same quarter of 2014 (Table B-7). In 2014, personal current transfer receipts increased 6.2 percent over the previous year.

Contributions to government social insurance, which is subtracted from total personal income, increased \$206.3 million or 3.7 percent in the first quarter of 2015, compared to the first quarter of 2014. In 2014, contributions to government social insurance increased 4.5 percent from the previous year (Table B-8).

In the first quarter of 2015, total non-farm private sector annualized earnings increased \$1,831.5 million or 4.0 percent from the first In dollar terms, the largest quarter of 2014. increase occurred in construction, followed by accommodation and food services, health care and social assistance, retail trade, administrative and waste services, transportation and warehousing, management of companies and enterprises. and During the first quarter of 2015, total government earnings increased \$210.8 million or 1.5 percent from the same quarter of 2014. Earnings from the federal government increased \$87.8 million or 1.1 percent in the first quarter of 2015. Earnings from the state and local governments increased \$123.0 million or 2.0 percent in the quarter.

In the first half of 2015, Honolulu's Consumer Price Index for Urban Consumers (CPI-U) increased 0.7 percent from the same period in B-9). This is in contrast to the 0.1 2014. (Table percent decrease for the U.S. average CPI-U and is substantially lower than the 2014 Honolulu CPI-U increase of 1.4 percent from the previous year. In the first half of 2015, the Honolulu CPI-U increased the most in Other Goods and Services (5.3 percent), followed by Medical Care (4.8 percent), Food and Beverages (4.2 percent), Education and Communication (3.1 percent), Housing (1.0 percent), and Recreation (0.9 percent). The price of Transportation and Apparel 8.6 decreased percent and 2.1 percent, respectively, compared to the first half of 2014.

#### C. TAX REVENUES

The State general fund tax revenues increased in the second quarter of 2015 compared to the same quarter of 2014.<sup>1</sup> The net Individual Income Tax revenues increased the most, followed by the GET, and the Transient Accommodations Tax (TAT). However, the Net Corporate Income Tax decreased in the quarter.

In the second quarter of 2015, total tax collections distributed to the State general fund totaled \$1,528.4 million, an increase of \$41.2 million or 2.8 percent over the same quarter of 2014 (Tables C-1 and C-2). In the first half of 2015, State general fund tax revenues were up \$198.7 million or 7.2 percent over the same period of 2014.

During the second quarter of 2015, GET revenues (excluding the Honolulu County Surcharge) totaled \$773.7 million, an increase of \$32.9 million or 4.4 percent over the same quarter of 2014 (Table C-3). In the first half of 2015, GET revenues increased \$68.4 million or 4.6 percent from the same period of 2014.

Compared to the second quarter of 2014, Net Individual Income Tax revenues increased \$50.0 million or 9.6 percent to \$570.8 million in the second quarter of 2015 (Table C-4). In the second quarter of 2015, Declaration of Estimated Taxes increased \$3.2 million or 1.5 percent (Table C-5), Payments with Returns increased \$21.2 million or 22.1 percent (Table C-6), Revenues from Withholding Tax on Wages increased \$34.3 million or 8.5 percent (Table C-7), and Refunds increased \$8.6 million or 4.4 percent (Table C-8). In the first half of 2015, Net Individual Income Tax collections increased \$167.4 million or 19.3 percent from the same period of 2014.

Net Corporate Income Tax revenues, which tend to be volatile in nature, decreased \$34.3 million in the second quarter of 2015 compared to the same quarter of 2014 (Table C-9). In the second quarter of 2015, the Declaration of Estimated Taxes increased \$0.3 million or 0.6 percent (Table C-10), the Payment with Returns decreased \$31.3 million (Table C-11), and the Refunds increased \$3.3 million or 18.7 percent (Table C-12), compared with the same quarter of 2014. In the first half of 2015, Net Corporate Income Tax revenues decreased \$13.4 million or 43.1 percent from the same period of 2014.

In the second quarter of 2015, Transient Accommodations Tax (TAT) revenues increased \$7.5 million or 7.4 percent compared to the same quarter of 2014 (Table C-13). In the first half of 2015, TAT revenues increased \$12.8 million or 6.1 percent from the same period of 2014.

According to the most recent data available, in the first quarter of 2015, the Retailing tax base decreased 6.6 percent or \$531.5 million (Table C-14), the Services tax base decreased 5.0 percent or \$175.2 million (Table C-15), the Contracting tax base increased 4.0 percent or \$69.1 million (Table C-16), and the Hotel Rentals tax base increased 2.5 percent or \$29.6 million (Table C-17), compared to the same quarter of 2014. In 2014, the only category with a decrease was the contracting tax base, down 4.0 percent or \$69.1 million. The remaining categories increased with the Retailing tax base, the Services tax base, and the Hotel Rentals tax base increased 3.7 percent, 1.4 percent, and 6.0 percent, respectively, from the previous year.

#### **D. TOURISM**

Visitor arrivals continue to be strong with both domestic and international visitor arrivals increasing in the second quarter of 2015. Due to shorter lengths of stay, the daily visitor census increased less than the increase of visitor arrivals in the quarter. Since visitors spent more on a daily basis during the second quarter of 2015, total visitor spending increased more than the growth of the average total daily visitor census in the quarter. With the exception of the fourth quarter of 2013, visitor arrivals have increased steadily since the third quarter of 2009.

The total number of visitor arrivals by air increased 122,172 or 6.1 percent in the second quarter of 2015, compared to the same quarter of 2014 (Tables D-1 and D-2). The total average daily census was up 9,750 or 4.9 percent in the quarter. In the first half of 2015, total visitor arrivals by air increased 181,096 or 4.5 percent, while the average daily census increased 8,072 or 3.9 percent from the same period of 2014.

In the second quarter of 2015, total visitor arrivals on domestic flights increased 104,240 or 7.4 percent compared to the same quarter of 2014 (Table D-3). In the first half of 2015, domestic arrivals were up 157,283 or 5.8 percent from the same period of 2014.

Arrivals on international flights increased 17,932 or 2.9 percent in the second quarter of 2015 compared to the second quarter of 2014 (Table D-4). In the first half of 2015, international arrivals were up 23,813 or 1.8 percent from the same period of 2014.

In terms of major market areas, from the second quarter of 2014 to the same period of 2015, arrivals from the U.S. West increased 76,294 or 8.9 percent (Table D-5), arrivals from the U.S. East increased 27,796 or 6.2 percent (Table D-6), and arrivals from Japan increased 2,998 or 0.9 percent (Table D-7). In the first half of 2015, arrivals from U.S. West were up 137,824 or 8.7 percent; arrivals from the U.S. East were up 16,091 or 1.8 percent; and Japanese arrivals were down 14,780 or 2.1 percent from the same period of 2014.

While visitor arrivals have increased, the length of stay per visitor has decreased. Due to the shorter length of stay, the average total daily visitor census increased less than the growth of visitor arrivals in the quarter. The total average daily visitor census was up 4.9 percent or 9,750 visitors per day in the second quarter of 2015 over the same quarter of 2014 (Table D-8). The domestic average daily census increased 5.1 percent or 7,615 visitors per day (Table D-9), while the international average daily census increased 4.4 percent or 2,135 visitors per day (Table D-10). In the first half of 2015, the domestic average daily census increased 5,614 or 3.7 percent; and the international average daily census increased 5,614 or 3.7 percent; and the international average daily census increased 2,458 or 4.4 percent from the same period of 2014.

Nominal visitor expenditures by air totaled \$3,694.4 million in the second quarter of 2015, up 6.8 percent or \$236.7 million from the same quarter of 2014 (Table D-11). In the first half of 2015, visitor expenditures increased \$264.2 million or 3.6 percent compared with the same period of 2014.

Total airline capacity, as measured by the number of available seats flown to Hawaii, increased 9.0 percent or 247,972 seats (Table D-12) in the second quarter of 2015, domestic seats increased 13.2 percent or 246,288 seats (Table D-13); international seats increased 0.2 percent or 1,684 seats (Table D-14), compared to the same quarter of 2014. In the first half of 2015, the number of total available seats increased 7.4 percent or 406,858 seats from the same period of 2014.

According to the most recent data available, in the first quarter of 2015, the statewide hotel occupancy rate averaged 80.1 percent, 0.7 of a percentage point lower than that of the same quarter of 2014 (Table D-15). In 2014, the statewide hotel occupancy rate averaged 77.0 percent, 0.5 of a percentage point higher than that of the previous year.



#### **E. CONSTRUCTION**

The indicators of Hawaii's construction industry were all positive in the second quarter of 2015. The value of private building authorizations, construction jobs, government contracts awarded, and State CIP expenditures all increased in the quarter.

Construction has been one of the major contributors to job growth in Hawaii over the past In the second quarter of 2015, the few years. construction sector added 1,000 jobs or 3.2 percent compared with the same quarter of 2014. In the first half of 2015, the construction sector added 900 jobs or 2.9 percent (Table A-7) from the same period of 2014. Before the recession, specifically the period from 2002 to 2007, construction job growth averaged 8.0 percent per year. In the fourth quarter of 2007, the average number of construction jobs reached a peak of 40,000 jobs. The strength of the current construction job market is a sharp contrast to the recession period. From the second quarter of 2008 until the third quarter of 2011 quarter-overquarter construction job growth was negative in all quarters.

In the second quarter of 2015, the private building authorizations in the state increased \$33.9 million or 4.2 percent, compared with the second quarter of 2014 (Table E-8). In the first half of 2015, private building authorizations for the state increased \$573.1 million or 36.6 percent compared with the same period of 2014.

In the second quarter of 2015, private building authorizations in Honolulu decreased \$2.7 million or 0.6 percent, compared with the second quarter of 2014 (Table E-8). In the first half of 2015, private building authorizations in Honolulu increased \$234.1 million or 24.8 percent compared with the same period of 2014.

In the second quarter of 2015, private building authorizations in Hawaii County decreased \$18.8 million or 8.0 percent, compared with the second quarter of 2014 (Table E-8). In the first half of 2015, private building authorizations in Hawaii County increased \$20.8 million or 6.3 percent compared with the same period of 2014.

In the second quarter of 2015, private building authorizations in Maui increased \$48.6 million or 62.9 percent, compared with the second quarter of 2014 (Table E-8). In the first half of 2015, private building authorizations in Maui increased \$308.2 million or 125.0 percent compared with the same period of 2014.

In the second quarter of 2015, private building authorizations (residential only) in Kauai increased \$6.8 million or 24.6 percent, compared with the second quarter of 2014 (Table E-8). In the first half of 2015, private building authorizations in Kauai increased \$10.0 million or 23.3 percent compared with the same period of 2014.

Government contracts awarded increased \$389.5 million or 133.7 percent in the second quarter of 2015 compared to the same quarter of 2014. In the first half of 2015, government contracts awarded increased \$458.8 million or 102.6 percent compared with the same period of 2014 (Table E-1). State government CIP expenditures increased \$27.0 million or 7.6 percent in the second quarter of 2015 (Table E-2). In the first half of 2015, CIP expenditures decreased \$52.5 million or 7.5 percent from the first half of the previous year.

According to the most recent data available, the Honolulu Construction Cost Index increased 7.5 percent for Single Family Residence (Table E-6) and 7.4 percent for High-Rise Building (Table E-7) in the first quarter of 2015 over that of 2014.

In the first half of 2015, Honolulu's median price for single family resales was \$685,000, an increase of \$15,500 or 2.3 percent from the first half of 2014 (Table E-9). The median price for condominium units was \$358,500, an increase of \$8,500 or 2.4 percent from the first half last year (Table E-10). In the second quarter of 2015, the number of single-family unit resales was up 9.2 percent, and the number of condominium unit resales was up 6.9 percent compared with the second quarter of 2014 (Tables E-11 and E-12). In the first half of 2015, the number of single-family unit resales was up 3.4 percent, and condominium unit resales was up 3.3 percent compared with the same period of 2014.

In the second quarter of 2015, single-family unit resales increased 4.6 percent, and condominium unit resales decreased 9.8 percent in Maui County compared to the same quarter of 2014 (Tables E-17 and E-18).

#### F. OTHER INDICATORS

The total number of bankruptcy filings in Hawaii decreased 12.8 percent or by 59 cases for the second quarter of 2015 from the same quarter of 2014. This was the 18th quarter-over-quarter decrease since the first quarter of 2011. In the first half of 2015, total filings decreased 10.2 percent or 92 cases from the same period of 2014.


The number of Chapter 7 filings, the largest category, had a decrease of 13.3 percent or 42 cases in the second quarter of 2015. Chapter 7 filings are intended to liquidate assets and discharge debt. In the first half of 2015, Chapter 7 filings were down 10.7 percent or 68 cases from the same period of 2014.

Chapter 11 filings decreased from 2 cases in the second quarter of 2014 to zero case in the second quarter of 2015. In the first half of 2015, Chapter 11 filings increased to 7 cases from 4 cases in the same period of 2014. Chapter 11 filings involve the structuring of repayment plans for companies.

Chapter 13 filings in the second quarter of 2015 decreased 11.2 percent or 16 cases from the second quarter of 2014. In the first half of 2015, Chapter 13 filings decreased 10.5 percent or 28 cases from the same period of 2014. Chapter 13 bankruptcy allows debtors to work out repayment arrangements with creditors.
