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STATE OF THE ECONOMY

Hawaii's major economic indicators were mostly positive in the third quarter of 2015. State general fund tax revenues, visitor arrivals, visitor expenditures, wage and salary jobs, personal income, government contracts awarded, and private building permits all increased in the quarter, only State CIP expenditures decreased compared to the same quarter of 2014.

In the third quarter of 2015, the total number of visitors arriving by air to Hawaii increased 81,182 or 3.8 percent. Due to slightly shorter lengths of stay, the daily visitor census increased 3.7 percent in the quarter. Since visitors spent less on a daily basis during the third quarter of 2015, the total spending by visitors arriving by air increased only 0.8 percent in the quarter. Historical data shows that after seventeen quarters of positive growth from the third quarter of 2009 to the third quarter of 2013, Hawaii's tourism sector experienced one quarter of negative growth in the fourth quarter of 2013. Since the first quarter of 2014, however, Hawaii's tourism sector returned to positive growth compared with the same quarter in the previous year.

In construction, the government contracts awarded and the value of private building permits all increased. In the third quarter of 2015, government contracts awarded increased \$92.2 million, the permit value for private construction increased \$102.6 million, but the State CIP expenditures decreased \$68.7 million. The construction sector added 1,700 jobs compared with the same quarter of 2014. According to the most recent data available, current construction put-in-place increased \$228.6 million or 12.9 percent in the second quarter of 2015 compared with the same quarter of 2014. Construction-put-in-place is based on excise tax data.

In the third quarter of 2015, State general fund tax revenues were up \$244.8 million or 18.1 percent over the same period of 2014. State general excise tax revenue increased \$76.7 million or 10.2 percent in the third quarter of 2015 compared to the same quarter in 2014. In the first three quarters of 2015, State general fund tax revenues increased \$444.2 million or 10.8 percent, and the state general excise tax revenue increased \$145.1 million or 6.5 percent, compared with the same period of 2014.

Labor market conditions were positive. Since the fourth quarter of 2010, Hawaii's jobs increased for the 20th consecutive quarter. In the third quarter of 2015 Hawaii's civilian non-agricultural wage and salary jobs averaged 631,500 jobs, an increase of 10,800 jobs or 1.7 percent from the same quarter of 2014.

The job increase in the third quarter of 2015 was due to job increases in the private sector. In this quarter, the private sector added about 11,700 non-agricultural jobs compared to the third quarter of 2014. Jobs increased the most in Health Care and Social Assistance, adding 1,800 jobs or 2.8 percent. This was followed by Natural Resources, Mining and Construction, adding 1,700 jobs or 5.2 percent, Food Services and Drinking Places, adding 1,700 jobs or 2.7 percent, Retail Trade, adding 1,500 jobs or 2.2 percent, Professional and Business Services, adding 1,500 jobs or 1.8 percent, and Transportation, Warehousing, and Utilities, adding 1,300 jobs or 4.3 percent in the quarter. In this quarter, only Manufacturing lost 500 jobs, Accommodation lost 200 jobs, and Information lost 200 jobs compared to the same quarter of 2014. The three levels of government lost 900 jobs or 0.7 percent in the third quarter of 2015. The Federal Government lost 600 jobs or 1.8 percent; the State Government lost 400 jobs or 0.6 percent, while the Local Government jobs was unchanged compared to the third quarter of 2014.

The most recent data from the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) shows that Hawaii's total nominal annualized personal income in the second quarter of 2015 increased \$2,686.8 million or 4.1 percent from the same quarter of 2014. This increase includes inflation so the growth of real personal income was smaller. The increase in nominal personal income during the second quarter of 2015 was due to increases in almost all major components of personal income. In dollar terms, the largest increases occurred in wages and salaries, followed by dividends, interest, and rent, personal current transfer receipts, proprietors' income, and supplements to wages and salaries. In the first half of 2015, total annualized personal income was \$67,437.3 million, an increase of 4.4 percent from the same period of last year.

Consumer prices in Honolulu increased 0.7 percent in the first half of 2015 compared with the same period of 2014, as measured by the Honolulu Consumer Price Index for Urban Consumers (CPI-U). In contrast, the U.S. CPI-U decreased 0.1 percent in the first half of 2015. In 2014, the Honolulu CPI-U increased 1.4 percent from the previous year. In the first half of 2015, the Honolulu CPI-U increased the most in the price index of Other Goods and Services (5.3 percent), followed by Medical Care (4.8 percent), Food and Beverages (4.2 percent), Education and Communication (3.1 percent), Housing (1.0 percent), and Recreation (0.9 percent). The price of Transportation and Apparel decreased 8.6 percent and 2.1 percent, respectively, compared to the first half of 2014.

OUTLOOK FOR THE ECONOMY

Hawaii's economy is expected to continue positive growth for the rest of 2015 and into 2016. This outlook is based on the most recent developments in the national and global economies, the performance of Hawaii's tourism industry, labor market conditions, and the growth of personal income and tax revenues.

Hawaii's economy depends significantly on conditions in the U.S. economy and key international economies, especially Japan. According to the November 2015 *Blue Chip Economic Consensus Forecasts*, U.S. real GDP is expected to increase by 2.4 percent in 2015, 0.1 of a percentage point higher than the 2.3 percent growth rate projected in the August 2015 forecast. For 2016 the consensus forecast predicts an overall 2.6 percent growth in U.S. real GDP.

According to the November 2015 *Blue Chip Economic Consensus Forecast*, real GDP growth for Japan is now expected to increase 0.6 percent in 2015, 0.3 of a percentage point lower than the growth rate projected in the August 2015 forecast. For 2016, the consensus forecast now expects an overall 1.1 percent growth rate for Japanese real GDP.

For the local economy, DBEDT expects most visitor related indicators will grow at lower rates than projected in the previous forecast. For GDP growth, however, the current forecast was slightly higher than the previous forecast.

Overall, Hawaii's economy, as measured by real GDP, is projected to show a 2.0 percent increase in 2015, 0.1 of a percentage point higher than the growth rate forecasted last quarter. The real GDP growth forecast in 2016 is 2.3 percent, same as the growth rate forecasted last quarter.

Hawaii's unemployment rate is projected to be 3.8 percent in 2015, 0.2 of a percentage point lower than the previous forecast. The unemployment rate in 2016 is now projected to be 3.7 percent, same as the previous forecast.

Visitor arrivals are expected to increase 4.3 percent in 2015, same as the previous forecast. The forecast for visitor days in 2015 decreased 0.2 of a percentage point to 4.0 percent. The forecast for visitor expenditure growth in 2015 was revised downward to 3.2 percent, from 3.8 percent growth projected in the previous forecast. For 2016, the growth rate of visitor arrivals, visitor days, and visitor expenditures are now expected to be 1.7 percent, 1.8 percent, and 3.5 percent, respectively.

The projection for the non-agricultural wage and salary job growth rate in 2015 is 1.3 percent, 0.2 of a percentage point above the previous forecast. In 2016, jobs are projected to increase 1.2 percent, the same as the previous forecast.

The Honolulu Consumer Price Index (CPI) is now expected to increase 1.0 percent in 2015, same as the previous forecast. In 2016, the CPI is projected to increase 2.3 percent, also same as the previous forecast.

Personal income in current dollars is now expected to increase 4.5 percent in 2015, 0.2 of a percentage point above the previous forecast. Real personal income is currently projected to grow 3.6 percent in 2015, 0.1 percentage point higher than the previous forecast. In 2016, current-dollar personal income and real personal income are expected to increase 4.8 percent and 3.0 percent, respectively.

Beyond 2016, the economy is expected to continue its expansion path, with job growth projected to be 1.0 percent in 2017 and 1.1 percent in 2018. Visitor arrivals are expected to increase 1.8 percent in both 2017 and 2018. Visitor expenditures are expected to increase 4.1 percent in 2017 and 4.2 percent in 2018. Real personal income is projected to increase 2.9 percent in 2017 and 2.7 percent in 2018. Hawaii's real GDP growth is expected to increase 2.4 percent in 2017 and 2018. The unemployment rate is expected to decrease to 3.5 percent in 2017 and 3.3 percent in 2018.

COUNTY ECONOMIC CONDITIONS

Overall economic conditions were mostly positive across the counties in the third quarter of 2015. The unemployment rate decreased in all counties. Total visitor arrivals by air and visitor days increased in all counties. The value of private building permits increased in all counties. Total non-agricultural wage and salary jobs increased in Honolulu, Maui, and Kauai, but decreased slightly in Hawaii County.

In the third quarter of 2015, the unemployment rate in all counties decreased. The unemployment rate in Honolulu decreased 0.8 of a percentage point from 4.0 percent to 3.2 percent; the unemployment rate in Maui County decreased 0.9 of a percentage point from 4.4 percent to 3.5 percent; the unemployment rate in Hawaii County decreased 1.1 percentage point from 5.4 percent to 4.3 percent; and the unemployment rate in Kauai County decreased 0.8 of a percentage point from 4.7 percent to 3.9 percent.

In the third quarter of 2015, Honolulu gained 9,400 or 2.1 percent of non-agricultural wage and salary jobs over the same quarter of 2014. Natural Resources, Mining, and Construction added the most jobs in the quarter (2,300 jobs), followed by Food Services and Drinking Places (1,500 jobs), Transportation, Warehousing, and Utilities (1,300 jobs), Health Care and Social Assistance (1,200 jobs), Professional and Business Services (1,200 jobs), and Financial Activities (1,100 jobs). The Government sector lost 400 jobs. The largest private sector job losses occurred in Educational Services (200 jobs lost) and Manufacturing (200 jobs lost).

In the third quarter of 2015, Hawaii County lost 200 non-agricultural wage and salary jobs or 0.3 percent over the same quarter of 2014. Retail Trade and Health Care and Social Assistance both added 400 jobs in the quarter. The largest private sector job losses occurred in Natural Resources, Mining, and Construction (500 jobs lost), followed by Manufacturing (300 jobs lost), and Financial Activities (200 jobs lost). In the third quarter of 2015, Government lost 300 jobs over the same quarter of 2014.

Maui County saw a net gain of 1,200 jobs or a 1.7 percent increase in the third quarter of 2015 over the same quarter of 2014. Jobs gained the most in Retail Trade and Arts, Entertainment and Recreation (both added 400 jobs), followed by Professional and Business Services (added 300 jobs). Government lost 200 jobs in the quarter.

In the third quarter of 2015, Kauai County gained 200 wage and salary jobs or 0.7 percent from the same quarter of 2014. Retail Trade added 300 jobs in the quarter, followed by Arts, Entertainment and Recreation (200 jobs). The largest private sector job losses occurred in Accommodation (200 jobs lost). The public sector lost 100 jobs in the quarter.

In the third quarter of 2015, both visitor arrivals by air and visitor days increased in all counties. Visitor arrivals by air increased 2.0 percent in Honolulu, 3.5 percent in Hawaii County, 5.7 percent in Maui, and 3.1 percent in Kauai. Visitor days increased 2.9 percent in Honolulu, 2.6 percent in Hawaii County, 6.5 percent in Maui, and 2.9 percent in Kauai, compared to the same quarter of 2014. In the second quarter of 2015, the most recent quarterly data available, hotel occupancy rate increased in all counties. The hotel occupancy rate was the highest in Honolulu (at 84.3 percent for an increase of 3.7 percentage points), followed by Maui (at 73.9 percent and an increase of 5.0 percentage points), Kauai (at 69.9 percent and an increase of 0.7 of a percentage point), and Hawaii County (at 65.3 percent and an increase of 9.3 percentage points in the quarter).

In the third quarter of 2015, the growth rate of private building permits were positive in all counties. In this quarter, Honolulu private building permits increased \$44.3 million or 8.1 percent, Hawaii County increased \$28.5 million or 20.5 percent, Maui increased \$27.2 million or 33.9 percent, and Kauai (only residential available) increased \$2.6 million or 9.9 percent from the same quarter of the previous year.

A. LABOR FORCE AND JOBS

Hawaii's labor market conditions continued to improve in the third quarter of 2015. Since the civilian labor force increased less than the civilian employment, the civilian unemployment rate decreased 0.9 of a percentage point in the quarter. For the 20th consecutive quarter, civilian nonagricultural wage and salary jobs increased.

In the third quarter of 2015, the civilian labor force averaged 673,900 people, an increase of 3,750 people or 0.6 percent from the same quarter of 2014 (Table A-1). In the first three quarters of 2015, the civilian labor force increased 7,250 people or 1.1 percent from the same period of 2014.

Civilian employment totaled 650,900 people in the third quarter of 2015, an increase of 9,700 people or 1.5 percent compared to the same quarter of 2014 (Table A-2). This is the 12th quarterly increase. In the first three quarters of 2015, average civilian employment increased 11,150 people or 2.0 percent from the same period of 2014.

In the third quarter of 2015, the number of civilian unemployed averaged 23,000, a decrease of 6,000 people or 20.7 percent from the same quarter of 2014 (Table A-3). In the first three quarters of 2015, the number of unemployed decreased 3,900 people or 13.0 percent from the same period of 2014.

The unemployment rate (not seasonally adjusted) decreased from 4.3 percent in the third quarter of 2014 to 3.4 percent in the third quarter of 2015 (Table A-4). In the first three quarters of 2015, the unemployment rate decreased 0.6 of a percentage point from the same period of 2014.

In the third quarter of 2015, Hawaii's civilian non-agricultural wage and salary jobs averaged 631,500 jobs, an increase of 10,800 jobs or 1.7 percent from the same quarter of 2014 (Table A-6). This is the 20th consecutive quarterly increase in non-agricultural wage and salary jobs

after ten consecutive quarterly decreases in jobs since the second quarter of 2008. In the first three quarters of 2015, average non-agricultural wage and salary jobs increased 1.3 percent or 8,100 jobs from the same period of 2014.

The job increase in the third quarter of 2015 was due to a job increase in the private sector. In this quarter, the private sector added about 11,700 non-agricultural jobs compared to the third quarter of 2014. Jobs increased the most in Health Care and Social Assistance, adding 1,800 jobs or 2.8 percent (Table A-16). This was followed by Natural Resources, Mining and Construction, adding 1,700 jobs or 5.2 percent (Table A-7), Food Services and Drinking Places, adding 1,700 jobs or 2.7 percent (Table A-19), Retail Trade, adding 1,500 jobs or 2.2 percent (Table A-10), Professional and Business Services, adding 1,500 jobs or 1.8 percent (Table A-14), and Transportation, Warehousing, and Utilities, adding 1,300 jobs or 4.3 percent (Table A-11) in the quarter.

For the private sector, in the third quarter of 2015, Manufacturing lost 500 jobs (Table A-8), Accommodation lost 200 jobs (Table A-18), and Information lost 200 jobs (Table A-12) compared to the same quarter of 2014.

The three levels of government lost 900 jobs or 0.7 percent (Table A-21) in the third quarter of 2015 compared to the same quarter of 2014. The Federal Government lost 600 jobs or 1.8 percent (Table A-22); the State Government lost 400 jobs or 0.6 percent (Table A-23), while the Local Government jobs was unchanged (Table A-24) compared to the third quarter of 2014.

The initial liable claims for unemployment, which measures the number of people who lost jobs in Hawaii and moved to other states, decreased 1.6 percent in the third quarter of 2015 compared to the same quarter of 2014 (Table A-27). In the first three quarters of 2015, the initial liable claims for unemployment decreased 8.4 percent from the same period of 2014.

B. INCOME AND PRICES

Hawaii's total personal income increased during the second quarter of 2015 over the same quarter of 2014, all major components of personal income increased in the quarter. In dollar terms, the largest increases occurred in wages and salaries, followed by dividends, interest, and rent, personal current transfer receipts, proprietors' income, and supplements to wages and salaries (Table B-1).

In the second quarter of 2015, total nominal annualized personal income (i.e. not adjusted for inflation) increased \$2,686.8 million or 4.1 percent from the second quarter of 2014 (Table B-2). In the first half of 2015, total annualized personal income was \$67,437.3 million, an increase of 4.4 percent from the same period last year.

In the second quarter of 2015, wages and salaries increased \$1,239.3 million or 3.8 percent from the second quarter of 2014. This was the 20th quarterly year-over-year increase since the third quarter of 2010. In the first half of 2015, wages and salaries increased 4.0 percent from the same period last year (Table B-3).

Supplements to wages and salaries, consisting of employer payments to retirement plans, private group health insurance plans, private workers compensation plans, and other such benefits, increased \$249.5 million or 2.6 percent in the second quarter of 2015 from the same quarter of 2014 (Table B-4). In the first half of 2015, supplements to wages and salaries increased 2.3 percent from the same period last year.

Proprietors' income increased \$318.9 million or 7.3 percent in the second quarter of 2015 over that of 2014 (Table B-5). In the first half of 2015, proprietors' income was up 8.0 percent from the same period last year.

Dividends, interest, and rent increased \$533.9 million or 3.9 percent in the second quarter of 2015 from the same quarter of 2014. In the first half of 2015, income in this category was up 3.6 percent from the same period last year (Table B-6).

The annualized personal current transfer receipts grew by \$444.7 million or 4.3 percent in the second quarter of 2015 from the same quarter of 2014 (Table B-7). In the first half of 2015, personal current transfer receipts increased 5.5 percent from the same period last year.

Contributions to government social insurance, which is subtracted from total personal income, increased \$99.4 million or 1.8 percent in the second quarter of 2015, compared to the second quarter of 2014. In the first half of 2015, contributions to government social insurance increased 1.4 percent from the same period last year (Table B-8).

In the second quarter of 2015, total non-farm private sector annualized earnings increased \$1,393.0 million or 4.0 percent from the second quarter of 2014. In dollar terms, the largest increase occurred in construction, followed by health care and social assistance, accommodation and food services, real estate and rental and leasing, transportation and warehousing, and administrative and waste management services. During the second quarter of 2015, total government earnings increased \$387.3 million or 2.7 percent from the same quarter of 2014. Earnings from the federal government increased \$146.0 million or 1.8 percent. Earnings from the state and local governments increased \$241.2 million or 3.9 percent in the quarter.

In the first half of 2015, Honolulu's Consumer Price Index for Urban Consumers (CPI-U) increased 0.7 percent from the same period in 2014. (Table B-9). This is in contrast to the 0.1 percent decrease for the U.S. average CPI-U and is substantially lower than the 2014 Honolulu CPI-U increase of 1.4 percent from the previous year. In the first half of 2015, the Honolulu CPI-U increased the most in Other Goods and Services (5.3 percent), followed by Medical Care (4.8 percent), Food and Beverages (4.2)percent), Education and Communication (3.1 percent), Housing (1.0)percent), and Recreation (0.9 percent). The price of Transportation and Apparel decreased 8.6 percent and 2.1 percent, respectively, compared to the first half of 2014.

C. TAX REVENUES

The State general fund tax revenues increased in the third quarter of 2015 compared to the same quarter of 2014.1 The GET revenues increased the most, followed by the net Individual Income Tax, the Net Corporate Income Tax, and the Transient Accommodations Tax (TAT).

In the third quarter of 2015, total tax collections distributed to the State general fund totaled \$1,593.5 million, an increase of \$244.8 million or 18.1 percent over the same quarter of 2014 (Tables C-1 and C-2). In the first three quarters of 2015, State general fund tax revenues were up \$444.2 million or 10.8 percent over the same period of 2014.

During the third quarter of 2015, GET revenues (excluding the Honolulu County Surcharge) totaled \$831.1 million, an increase of \$76.7 million or 10.2 percent over the same quarter of 2014 (Table C-3). In the first three quarters of 2015, GET revenues increased \$145.1 million or 6.5 percent from the same period of 2014.

Compared to the third quarter of 2014, Net Individual Income Tax revenues increased \$67.3 million or 14.8 percent to \$520.4 million in the third quarter of 2015 (Table C-4). In the third quarter of 2015, Declaration of Estimated Taxes increased \$42.7 million or 62.6 percent (Table C-5), Payments with Returns increased \$0.5 million or 2.9 percent (Table C-6), Revenues from Withholding Tax on Wages increased \$25.5 million or 6.2 percent (Table C-7), and Refunds increased \$1.4 million or 3.2 percent (Table C-8). In the first three quarters of 2015, Net Individual Income Tax collections increased

\$234.8 million or 17.8 percent from the same period of 2014.

Net Corporate Income Tax revenues, which tend to be volatile in nature, increased \$34.5 million in the third quarter of 2015 compared to the same quarter of 2014 (Table C-9). In the third quarter of 2015, the Declaration of Estimated Taxes increased \$7.8 million or 28.6 percent (Table C-10), the Payment with Returns increased \$17.6 million or 796.5 percent (Table C-11), and the Refunds decreased \$9.1 million or 65.5 percent (Table C-12), compared with the same quarter of 2014. In the first three quarters of 2015, Net Corporate Income Tax revenues increased \$21.1 million or 45.1 percent from the same period of 2014.

In the third quarter of 2015, Transient Accommodations Tax (TAT) revenues increased \$8.4 million or 7.9 percent compared to the same quarter of 2014 (Table C-13). In the first three quarters of 2015, TAT revenues increased \$21.3 million or 6.7 percent from the same period of 2014.

According to the most recent data available, in the second quarter of 2015, the Retailing tax base decreased 3.3 percent or \$247.5 million (Table C-14), the Services tax base decreased 0.2 percent or \$8.6 million (Table C-15), the Contracting tax base increased 12.9 percent or \$228.7 million (Table C-16), and the Hotel Rentals tax base decreased 1.5 percent or \$16.1 million (Table C-17), compared to the same quarter of 2014. In the first half of 2015, the contracting tax base increased 8.5 percent or \$297.8 million, the Hotel Rentals tax base increased 0.6 percent or \$13.4 million, the Retailing tax base decreased 4.8 percent or \$779.0 million, and the Services tax base decreased 2.4 percent or \$166.6 million, from the previous year.

D. TOURISM

Visitor arrivals continue to be strong with both domestic and international visitor arrivals increasing in the third quarter of 2015. Due to shorter lengths of stay, the daily visitor census increased slightly less than the increase of visitor arrivals in the quarter. Since visitors spent less on a daily basis during the third quarter of 2015, total visitor spending increased less than the growth of the average total daily visitor census in the quarter. With the exception of the fourth quarter of 2013, visitor arrivals have increased steadily since the third quarter of 2009.

The total number of visitor arrivals by air increased 81,182 or 3.8 percent in the third quarter of 2015, compared to the same quarter of 2014 (Tables D-1 and D-2). The total average daily census was up 7,632 or 3.7 percent in the quarter. In the first three quarters of 2015, total visitor arrivals by air increased 262,277 or 4.3 percent, while the average daily census increased 7,924 or 3.8 percent from the same period of 2014.

In the third quarter of 2015, total visitor arrivals on domestic flights increased 61,404 or 4.3 percent compared to the same quarter of 2014 (Table D-3). In the first three quarters of 2015, domestic arrivals were up 218,686 or 5.3 percent from the same period of 2014.

Arrivals on international flights increased 19,778 or 2.8 percent in the third quarter of 2015 compared to the third quarter of 2014 (Table D-4). In the first three quarters of 2015, international arrivals were up 43,591 or 2.2 percent from the same period of 2014.

In terms of major market areas, from the third quarter of 2014 to the same period of 2015, arrivals from the U.S. West increased 46,905 or 5.4 percent (Table D-5), arrivals from the U.S. East increased 11,397 or 2.6 percent (Table D-6), and arrivals from Japan increased 3,356 or 0.8 percent (Table D-7). In the first three quarters of 2015, arrivals from U.S. West were up 184,729 or 7.5 percent; arrivals from the U.S. East were up 27,488 or 2.0 percent; and Japanese arrivals were down 11,414 or 1.0 percent from the same period of 2014.

While visitor arrivals have increased, the length of stay per visitor has decreased slightly. Due to the

shorter length of stay, the average total daily visitor census increased slightly less than the growth of visitor arrivals in the quarter. The total average daily visitor census was up 3.7 percent or 7,632 visitors per day in the third quarter of 2015 over the same quarter of 2014 (Table D-8). The domestic average daily census increased 2.4 percent or 3,610 visitors per day (Table D-9), while the international average daily census increased 7.6 percent or 4,022 visitors per day (Table D-10). In the first three quarters of 2015, the domestic average daily census increased 4,939 or 3.3 percent; and the international average daily census increased 2,985 or 5.5 percent from the same period of 2014.

Nominal visitor expenditures by air totaled \$3,749.1 million in the third quarter of 2015, up 0.8 percent or \$30.2 million from the same quarter of 2014 (Table D-11). In the first three quarters of 2015, visitor expenditures increased \$294.5 million or 2.7 percent compared with the same period of 2014.

Total airline capacity, as measured by the number of available seats flown to Hawaii, increased 4.7 percent or 137,770 seats (Table D-12) in the third quarter of 2015, domestic seats increased 4.9 percent or 100,056 seats (Table D-13); international seats increased 4.3 percent or 37,714 seats (Table D-14), compared to the same quarter of 2014. In the first three quarters of 2015, the number of total available seats increased 6.4 percent or 542,961 seats from the same period of 2014.

According to the most recent data available, in the second quarter of 2015, the statewide hotel occupancy rate averaged 77.9 percent, 4.0 percentage points higher than that of the same quarter of 2014 (Table D-15). In the first half of 2015, the statewide hotel occupancy rate averaged 79.1 percent, 1.6 percentage points higher than that of the previous year.

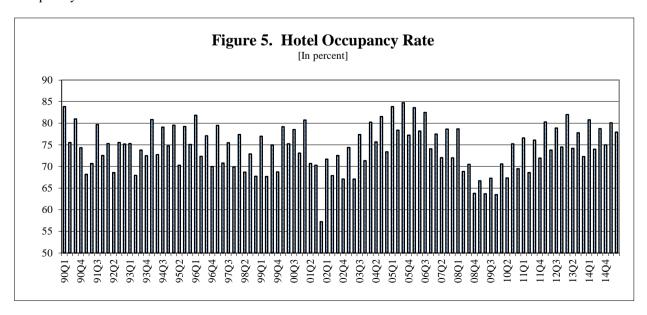

E. CONSTRUCTION

The indicators of Hawaii's construction industry were mostly positive in the third quarter of 2015. The value of private building authorizations, construction jobs, and government contracts awarded increased, but State CIP expenditures decreased.

Construction has been one of the steady contributors to job growth in Hawaii over the past few years. In the third quarter of 2015, the construction sector added 1,700 jobs or 5.2 percent compared with the same quarter of 2014. In the first three quarters of 2015, the construction sector added 1,100 jobs or 3.5 percent (Table A-7) from the same period of 2014. Before the recession, specifically the period from 2002 to 2007, construction job growth averaged 8.0 percent per year. In the fourth quarter of 2007, the average number of construction jobs reached a peak of 40,000 jobs. The strength of the current construction job market is a sharp contrast to the recession period. From the second quarter of 2008 until the second quarter of 2011 quarter-over-quarter construction job growth was negative in all quarters.

In the third quarter of 2015, the private building authorizations in the state increased \$102.6 million or 13.0 percent, compared with the third quarter of 2014 (Table E-8). In the first three quarters of 2015, private building authorizations for the state increased \$675.7 million or 28.7 percent compared with the same period of 2014.

In the third quarter of 2015, private building authorizations in Honolulu increased \$44.3 million or 8.1 percent, compared with the third quarter of 2014 (Table E-8). In the first three quarters of 2015, private building authorizations in Honolulu increased \$278.4 million or 18.7 percent compared with the same period of 2014.

In the third quarter of 2015, private building authorizations in Hawaii County increased \$28.5 million or 20.5 percent, compared with the third quarter of 2014 (Table E-8). In the first three quarters of 2015, private building authorizations in Hawaii County increased \$49.3 million or 10.5 percent compared with the same period of 2014.

In the third quarter of 2015, private building authorizations in Maui increased \$27.2 million or 33.9 percent, compared with the third quarter of

2014 (Table E-8). In the first three quarters of 2015, private building authorizations in Maui increased \$335.4 million or 102.6 percent compared with the same period of 2014.

In the third quarter of 2015, private building authorizations (residential only) in Kauai increased \$2.6 million or 9.9 percent, compared with the third quarter of 2014 (Table E-8). In the first three quarters of 2015, private building authorizations in Kauai increased \$12.7 million or 18.2 percent compared with the same period of 2014.

Government contracts awarded increased \$92.2 million or 23.4 percent in the third quarter of 2015 compared to the same quarter of 2014. In the first three quarters of 2015, government contracts awarded increased \$551.0 million or 65.5 percent compared with the same period of 2014 (Table E-1). State government CIP expenditures decreased \$68.7 million or 20.7 percent in the third quarter of 2015 (Table E-2). In the first three quarters of 2015, CIP expenditures decreased \$121.2 million or 11.8 percent from the same period of the previous year.

The Honolulu Construction Cost Index increased 7.5 percent for Single Family Residence (Table E-6) and 7.4 percent for High-Rise Building (Table E-7) in the first quarter of 2015 over that of 2014.

In the first three quarters of 2015, Honolulu's median price for single family resales was \$696,000, an increase of \$26,500 or 4.0 percent from the same period of 2014 (Table E-9). The median price for condominium units was \$355,000, an increase of \$5,000 or 1.4 percent from the same period of last year (Table E-10). In the third quarter of 2015, the number of single-family unit resales was up 7.3 percent, and the number of condominium unit resales was up 8.1 percent compared with the third quarter of 2014 (Tables E-11 and E-12). In the first three quarters of 2015, the number of single-family unit resales was up 4.9 percent, and condominium unit resales was up 5.1 percent compared with the same period of 2014.

In the third quarter of 2015, single-family unit resales increased 22.1 percent, and condominium unit resales increased 16.7 percent in Maui County compared to the same quarter of 2014 (Tables E-17 and E-18).

F. OTHER INDICATORS

The total number of bankruptcy filings in Hawaii decreased 10.3 percent or by 46 cases for the third quarter of 2015 from the same quarter of 2014. This was the 19th quarter-over-quarter decrease since the first quarter of 2011. In the first three quarters of 2015, total filings decreased 10.2 percent or 138 cases from the same period of 2014.

The number of Chapter 7 filings, the largest category, had a decrease of 7.1 percent or 22 cases in the third quarter of 2015. Chapter 7 filings are intended to liquidate assets and discharge debt. In the first three quarters of 2015, Chapter 7 filings were down 9.6 percent or 90 cases from the same period of 2014.

Chapter 11 filings increased from 3 cases in the third quarter of 2014 to 4 cases in the third quarter of 2015. In the first three quarters of 2015, Chapter 11 filings increased to 11 cases from 7 cases in the same period of 2014. Chapter 11 filings involve the structuring of repayment plans for companies.

Chapter 13 filings in the third quarter of 2015 decreased 18.4 percent or 25 cases from the third quarter of 2014. In the first three quarters of 2015, Chapter 13 filings decreased 13.2 percent or 53 cases from the same period of 2014. Chapter 13 bankruptcy allows debtors to work out repayment arrangements with creditors.
