Executive Summary 1st Quarter 2018

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This *Quarterly Statistical and Economic Report* has been prepared by the staff of the Research and Economic Analysis Division of the State Department of Business, Economic Development & Tourism (DBEDT). The report provides concise statistical information and analyses on Labor, Income and Prices, Taxes, Tourism, Construction, and other indicators, as well as an overview of the State of Hawaii and the four counties.

Technical notes and source descriptions have been kept to a minimum. However, the staff of the Research and Economic Analysis Division would be happy to respond to any inquiries of a technical nature that readers may have (586-2466). The quarterly information contained in this report reflects data received by the Research Division on or before February 7, 2018.

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STATE OF THE ECONOMY

Hawaii's major economic indicators were mostly positive in the fourth quarter of 2017. Visitor arrivals, visitor expenditures, State general fund tax revenues, wage and salary jobs, personal income (through the third quarter) and State CIP expenditures all increased, but private building authorizations, and government contracts awarded decreased in the quarter compared to fourth quarter 2016.

In the fourth quarter of 2017, the total number of visitors arriving by air to Hawaii increased 125,855 or 5.7 percent. Due to shorter lengths of stay, the daily visitor census increased 5.3 percent in the quarter. Since visitors spent slightly less on a daily basis in the fourth quarter of 2017, total visitors by air spending increased 3.9 percent in the quarter. Historical data shows that, after seventeen quarters of positive growth from the third quarter of 2009 to the third quarter of 2013, Hawaii's tourism sector experienced one quarter of negative growth in the fourth quarter of 2013. Since the first quarter of 2014, however, Hawaii's tourism sector has shown positive growth compared with the same quarter in the previous year.

In the fourth quarter of 2017, the construction sector added 1,000 jobs, the government contracts awarded decreased \$159.0 million or 62.0 percent, the permit value for private construction decreased \$180.6 million or 21.4 percent, while State CIP expenditures increased \$175.9 million or 90.3 percent, compared with the same quarter of 2016. According to the most recent excise tax base data available, current construction put-in-place increased \$9.6 million or 0.4 percent in the third quarter of 2017, compared with that quarter in 2016.

In the fourth quarter of 2017, State general fund tax revenues were up \$23.0 million or 1.5 percent over the same period of 2016. State general excise tax revenue increased \$10.7 million or 1.4 percent in the fourth quarter of 2017, compared to fourth quarter 2016. In 2017, State general fund tax revenues increased \$269.1 million or 4.3 percent, and state general excise tax revenue increased \$144.1 million or 4.5 percent, compared to 2016.

Labor market conditions were positive. Hawaii's jobs increased for the 29^{th} consecutive quarter beginning in fourth quarter 2010. In the fourth quarter of 2017, Hawaii's non-agricultural wage and salary jobs averaged 664,500 jobs, an increase of 7,600 jobs or 1.2 percent from the same quarter of 2016.

The job growth in the fourth quarter of 2017 was due to job increases in the private sector. In this quarter, the private sector added about 9,700 non-agricultural jobs compared to the fourth quarter of 2016. Jobs increased the most in Professional & Business Services, adding 2,800 jobs or 3.3 percent. This was followed by Health Care &

Social Assistance, adding 2,100 jobs or 3.1 percent, Transportation, Warehousing, and Utilities, adding 1,500 jobs or 4.7 percent, Accommodation, adding 1,500 jobs or 3.8 percent, Food Services and Drinking Places, adding 1,300 jobs or 1.9 percent, Retail Trade, adding 1,200 jobs or 1.7 percent, and Natural Resources, Mining and Construction, adding 1,000 jobs or 2.7 percent in the quarter. In the private sector, in the fourth quarter of 2017, Wholesale Trade, lost the most jobs, 1,000 jobs or 5.5 percent in the quarter. The three levels of government lost 2,100 jobs or 1.6 percent in the fourth quarter of 2017 compared to the same quarter of 2016. The Federal Government added 100 jobs or 0.3 percent; State Government lost 2,300 jobs or 3.0 percent, while Local Government added 200 jobs or 1.1 percent, compared to the fourth quarter of 2016.

The U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) estimates of quarterly GDP show, in the third quarter of 2017, total annualized nominal GDP increased \$3,132 million or 3.7 percent, from the third quarter of 2016. In the first three quarters of 2017, total annualized nominal GDP increased \$2,960 million or 3.5 percent from the same period of the previous year. In the third quarter of 2017, total annualized real GDP (in chained 2009 dollar) increased \$1,127 million or 1.5 percent from the third quarter of 2016. In the first three quarters of 2017, total annualized real GDP increased \$1,147 million or 1.6 percent from the same period of the previous year.

In the third quarter of 2017 compared to third quarter 2016, total non-farm private sector annualized earnings increased \$513.5 million or 1.4 percent. In dollar terms, the largest increase occurred in accommodation and food services; followed by transportation and warehousing, professional, scientific & technical services, and utilities. Similarly, total government earnings increased \$379.5 million or 2.5 percent and earnings from the federal government increased \$123.3 million or 1.5 percent in the quarter and state and local government earnings increased \$256.2 million or 3.8 percent.

In the second half of 2017, Honolulu's Consumer Price Index for Urban Consumers (CPI-U) increased 2.5 percent from the same period in 2016. This is 0.5 of a percentage point above 2.0 percent increase for the U.S. average CPI-U and is higher than the second half of 2016 Honolulu CPI-U increase of 1.5 percent from the same period of the previous year. In the second half of 2017 over 2016, the Honolulu CPI-U increased the most in Housing (3.6 percent), followed by Food and Beverages (2.9 percent), Transportation (2.8 percent), Medical Care (2.0 percent), Apparel (1.5 percent), Other Goods and Services (0.5 percent), and Recreation (0.5 percent), while Education and Communication decreased 3.6 percent.

OUTLOOK FOR THE ECONOMY

Hawaii's economy is expected to continue positive growth in 2018 and 2019. This outlook is based on the most recent developments in the national and global economies, the performance of Hawaii's tourism industry, labor market conditions, and the growth of personal income and tax revenues.

Hawaii's economy depends significantly on conditions in the U.S. economy and key international economies, especially Japan. According to the January 2018 *Blue Chip Economic Consensus Forecasts*, U.S. real GDP is expected to increase by 2.7 percent in 2018, 0.2 of a percentage point above the growth rate projected in the November 2017 forecast. For 2019 the consensus forecast predicts an overall 2.4 percent growth in U.S. real GDP.

According to the January 2018 *Blue Chip Economic Consensus Forecast*, real GDP growth for Japan is now expected to increase 1.4 percent in 2018, 0.2 of a percentage point above the growth rate projected in the November 2017 forecast. For 2019, the consensus forecast now projects an overall 1.1 percent growth rate for Japanese real GDP.

For the local economy, DBEDT expects that visitor expenditures and real GDP will both grow at a higher rate than projected in the previous forecast for 2018.

Overall, Hawaii's economy, as measured by real GDP, is projected to show a 1.7 percent increase in 2018, 0.2 of a percentage point above the growth rate forecast last quarter. The real GDP growth forecast for 2019 is 1.6 percent, 0.1 of a percentage point above the previous forecast.

Hawaii's unemployment rate is projected to be 2.6 percent in 2018, 0.3 of a percentage point below the previous forecast. The unemployment rate in 2019 is projected to be 3.0 percent, 0.2 of a percentage point below the previous forecast.

Visitor arrivals are expected to increase 2.7 percent in 2018, 0.4 of a percentage point above the previous forecast. The forecast for visitor days in 2018 also increased 0.4 of a percentage point to 2.8 percent. The 2018 forecast for visitor expenditure growth was revised upward to 4.5 percent, from 3.9 percent growth projected in the previous forecast. For 2019, the growth rate of visitor arrivals, visitor days, and visitor expenditures are now expected to be 1.6 percent, 1.6 percent, and 3.7 percent, respectively.

The projection for the non-agricultural wage and salary job growth rate for 2018 is 1.0 percent, 0.1 of a percentage point above the previous forecast. In 2019, jobs are projected to increase 0.9 percent, 0.1 of a percentage point below the previous forecast.

The Honolulu Consumer Price Index (CPI) is expected to increase 2.4 percent in 2018, 0.1 of a percentage point above the previous forecast. In 2019, the CPI is projected to increase 2.7 percent, 0.4 of a percentage point above the previous forecast.

Personal income in current dollars is expected to increase 3.6 percent in 2018, 0.2 of a percentage point above the previous forecast. Real personal income is now projected to grow 1.5 percent in 2018, same as the previous forecast. In 2019, current-dollar personal income and real personal income are expected to increase 3.9 and 1.5 percent, respectively.

Beyond 2019, the economy is expected to continue its expansion path, with job growth projected to be 0.9 percent in 2020 and 0.8 percent in 2021. Visitor arrivals are expected to increase 1.4 percent in 2020 and 2021. Visitor expenditures are expected to increase 3.5 percent in 2020 and 2021. Real personal income is projected to increase 1.5 percent in 2020 and 1.3 percent in 2021. Hawaii's real GDP growth is expected to increase 1.4 percent in both 2020 and 2021. The unemployment rate is expected to increase to 3.2 percent in 2020 and 3.4 percent in 2021.

COUNTY ECONOMIC CONDITIONS

Overall economic conditions were mostly positive across the counties in the fourth quarter of 2017. The unemployment rate decreased in all counties. Total non-agricultural wage and salary jobs increased in all counties, except Hawaii County was unchanged. Total visitor arrivals by air increased in all counties, and visitor expenditures increased in all counties, except a small decrease in Honolulu. The value of private building permits increased in Hawaii County and Kauai but decreased in Honolulu and Maui.

In the fourth quarter of 2017, the unemployment rate in all counties decreased. The unemployment rate in Honolulu decreased 0.8 of a percentage point from 2.6 percent to 1.8 percent; the unemployment rate in Maui County decreased 1.0 percentage point from 3.0 percent to 2.0 percent; the unemployment rate in Hawaii County decreased 1.2 percentage point from 3.4 percent to 2.2 percent; and the unemployment rate in Kauai County decreased 1.3 percentage point from 3.1 percent to 1.8 percent.

In the fourth quarter of 2017, Honolulu gained 5,500 or 1.1 percent of non-agricultural wage and salary jobs over the same quarter of 2016. Professional & Business Services added the most jobs (2,500 jobs), followed by Retail Trade (1,500 jobs), Transportation, Warehousing, and Utility (1,200 jobs), Natural Resources, Mining, and Construction (1,000 jobs), and Accommodation (1,000 jobs). The Government sector lost 400 jobs. The largest private sector job losses occurred in Wholesale Trade (900 jobs lost), followed by Financial Activities (800 jobs lost).

In the fourth quarter of 2017, the non-agricultural wage and salary jobs in Hawaii County was unchanged over the same quarter of 2016. Job gains in Food Services and Drinking Places (200 jobs), Information (100 jobs), Financial Services (100 jobs), Health Care & Social Assistance (100 jobs), and Other Services (100 jobs) were offset by

job losses in Retail Trade (200 jobs lost) and Natural Resources, Mining, and Construction (200 jobs lost). Jobs in the Government sector were unchanged in the quarter.

Maui County saw a net gain of 1,500 jobs or a 2.0 percent increase in the fourth quarter of 2017 over the same quarter of 2016. Jobs increased the most in Health Care & Social Assistance (1,800 jobs), followed by Accommodation (500 jobs), and Arts, Entertainment & Recreation (300 jobs). The only private sector job losses occurred in the Manufacturing sector (100 jobs lost). Government lost 1,600 jobs in the quarter.

In the fourth quarter of 2017, Kauai County gained 600 wage and salary jobs or 2.0 percent from the same quarter of 2016. Food Services and Drinking Places and Health Care & Social Assistance both added 200 jobs in the quarter. The only private sector job losses occurred in Retail Trade (100 jobs lost). Government lost 100 jobs in the quarter.

In the fourth quarter of 2017, visitor arrivals by air increased in all counties, and visitor expenditures increased in all counties, except Honolulu. Visitor arrivals by air increased 3.9 percent in Honolulu, 6.6 percent in Maui, 14.4 percent in Hawaii County, and 8.2 percent in Kauai. Visitor expenditures increased 8.1 percent in Kauai, 10.1 percent in Hawaii County, 8.5 percent in Maui, but decreased 1.6 percent in Honolulu compared to the same quarter of 2016.

In the fourth quarter of 2017, private building permits decreased in Honolulu and Maui, but increased in Hawaii County and Kauai. Honolulu decreased \$203.6 million or 36.2 percent, Maui decreased \$21.4 million or 17.3 percent; Hawaii County increased \$43.8 million or 34.9 percent, and Kauai County (only residential available) increased \$0.6 million or 1.6 percent from the same quarter of the previous year.

A. LABOR FORCE AND JOBS

Hawaii's labor market conditions continued to improve in the fourth quarter of 2017. Since the civilian labor force decreased more than the civilian employment, the civilian unemployment rate decreased 0.9 of a percentage point in the quarter. For the 29th consecutive quarter-over-quarter, civilian non-agricultural wage and salary jobs increased.

In the fourth quarter of 2017, the civilian labor force averaged 681,900 people, a decrease of 8,450 people or 1.2 percent from the same quarter of 2016 (Table A-1). In 2017, the civilian labor force increased 4,800 people or 0.7 percent from the previous year.

Civilian employment totaled 669,050 people in the fourth quarter of 2017, a decrease of 2,000 people or 0.3 percent compared to the same quarter of 2016 (Table A-2). In 2017, average civilian employment increased 8,250 people or 1.2 percent from the previous year.

In the fourth quarter of 2017, the number of civilian unemployed averaged 12,850, a decrease of 6,450 people or 33.4 percent from the same quarter of 2016 (Table A-3). In 2017, the number of unemployed decreased 3,450 people or 16.7 percent from the previous year.

The unemployment rate (not seasonally adjusted) decreased from 2.8 percent in the fourth quarter of 2016 to 1.9 percent in the fourth quarter of 2017 (Table A-4). In 2017, the unemployment rate decreased 0.5 of a percentage point from the previous year.

In the fourth quarter of 2017, Hawaii's non-agricultural wage and salary jobs averaged 664,500 jobs, an increase of 7,600 jobs or 1.2 percent from the same quarter of 2016 (Table A-6). This is the 29th consecutive quarter-over-quarter increase in non-agricultural wage and salary jobs after ten consecutive quarter-over-quarter decreases in jobs since the second quarter of 2008. In 2017, average non-agricultural wage

and salary jobs increased 1.1 percent or 7,200 jobs from the previous year.

The job growth in the fourth quarter of 2017 was due to job increases in the private sector. In this quarter, the private sector added about 9,700 non-agricultural jobs compared to the fourth quarter of 2016. Jobs increased the most in Professional & Business Services, adding 2,800 jobs or 3.3 percent (Table A-14). This was followed by Health Care & Social Assistance, adding 2,100 jobs or 3.1 percent (Table A-16), Transportation, Warehousing, and Utilities, adding 1,500 jobs or 4.7 percent (Table A-11), Accommodation, adding 1,500 jobs or 3.8 percent (Table A-18), Food Services and Drinking Places, adding 1,300 jobs or 1.9 percent (Table A-19), Retail Trade, adding 1,200 jobs or 1.7 percent (Table A-10), and Natural Resources, Mining and Construction, adding 1,000 jobs or 2.7 percent (Table A-7) in the quarter.

For the private sector, in the fourth quarter of 2017, Wholesale Trade, lost the most jobs, 1,000 jobs or 5.5 percent (Table A-9); followed by Manufacturing which lost 100 jobs or 0.7 percent (Table A-8) in the quarter.

The three levels of government lost 2,100 jobs or 1.6 percent (Table A-21) in the fourth quarter of 2017 compared to the same quarter of 2016. The Federal Government added 100 jobs or 0.3 percent (Table A-22); State Government lost 2,300 jobs or 3.0 percent (Table A-23), while Local Government added 200 jobs or 1.1 percent (Table A-24), compared to the fourth quarter of 2016.

The initial liable claims for unemployment, which measures the number of people who lost jobs in Hawaii and moved to other states, decreased 21.3 percent in the fourth quarter of 2017 compared to the same quarter of 2016 (Table A-27). In 2017, the initial liable claims for unemployment decreased 11.2 percent from the previous year.

B. INCOME AND PRICES

The U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) estimates of quarterly GDP (Table B-1 to B-3) show, in the third quarter of 2017, total annualized nominal GDP increased \$3,132 million or 3.7 percent, from the third quarter of 2016. In the first three quarters of 2017, total annualized nominal GDP increased \$2,960 million or 3.5 percent from the same period of the previous year. In the third quarter of 2017, total annualized real GDP (in chained 2009 dollar) increased \$1,127 million or 1.5 percent from the third quarter of 2016. In the first three quarters of 2017, total annualized real GDP increased \$1,147 million or 1.6 percent from the same period of the previous year.

Hawaii's total personal income increased during he third quarter of 2017 over the same quarter of 2016; all major components of personal income increased in the quarter. In dollar terms, the largest increases occurred in wages and salaries, followed by dividends, interest, and rent, personal current transfer receipts, supplements to wages and salaries, and proprietors' income (Table B-4).

In the third quarter of 2017, total nominal annualized personal income (i.e. not adjusted for inflation) increased \$1,714.6 million or 2.4 percent over that of 2016 (Table B-5). In the first three quarters of 2017, total annualized personal income was \$73,696.7 million, an increase of 2.6 percent from the same period of the previous year.

In the third quarter of 2017, wages and salaries increased \$566.5 million or 1.6 percent over that of 2016. This was the 29th consecutive quarterly year-over-year increase since the third quarter of 2010. In the first three quarters of 2017, wages and salaries increased 2.1 percent from the same period of the previous year (Table B-6).

Supplements to wages and salaries, consisting of employer payments to retirement plans, private group health insurance plans, private workers compensation plans, and other such benefits, increased \$249.7 million or 2.4 percent in the third quarter of 2017, from the same quarter of 2016 (Table B-7). In the first three quarters of 2017, supplements to wages and salaries increased 2.1 percent from the same period of the previous year.

Proprietors' income increased \$98.5 million or 1.9 percent in the third quarter of 2017, over that of 2016 (Table B-8). In the first three quarters of 2017, proprietors' income was up 3.6 percent from the same period of the previous year.

Dividends, interest, and rent increased \$497.7 million or 3.3 percent in the third quarter of 2017, from the same quarter of 2016. In the first three quarters of 2017, income in this category was up 3.1 percent from the same period of the previous year (Table B-9).

The annualized personal current transfer receipts grew by \$462.6 million or 4.1 percent in the third quarter of 2017 from the same quarter of 2016 (Table B-10). In the first three quarters of 2017, personal current transfer receipts increased 4.0 percent from the same period of the previous year.

Contributions to government social insurance, which is subtracted from total personal income, increased \$160.4 million or 2.7 percent in the third quarter of 2017, compared to the third quarter of 2016. In the first three quarters of 2017, contributions to government social insurance increased 3.0 percent from the same period of the previous year (Table B-11).

In the third quarter of 2017, total non-farm private sector annualized earnings increased \$513.5 million or 1.4 percent from the third quarter of 2016. In dollar terms, the largest increase occurred in accommodation and food services; followed by transportation and warehousing, professional, scientific & technical services, and utilities. During the third quarter of 2017, total government earnings increased \$379.5 million or 2.5 percent from the same quarter of 2016. Earnings from the federal government increased \$123.3 million or 1.5 percent. Earnings from the state and local governments increased \$256.2 million or 3.8 percent in the quarter.

In the second half of 2017, Honolulu's Consumer Price Index for Urban Consumers (CPI-U) increased 2.5 percent from the same period in 2016. (Table B-12). This is 0.5 of a percentage point above 2.0 percent increase for the U.S. average CPI-U and is higher than the second half of 2016 Honolulu CPI-U increase of 1.5 percent from the same period of the previous year. In the second half of 2017, the Honolulu CPI-U increased the most in Housing (3.6 percent), followed by Food and Beverages (2.9 percent), Transportation (2.8 percent), Medical Care (2.0 percent), Apparel (1.5 percent), Other Goods and Services (0.5 percent), and Recreation (0.5 percent). The price of Education and Communication decreased 3.6 percent compared to the second half of 2016.

C. TAX REVENUES

The State general fund tax revenues increased in the fourth quarter of 2017 compared to the same quarter of 2016. The Net Individual Income Tax increased the most in the quarter in dollar terms, followed by the Transient Accommodations Tax (TAT), and the GET. The Net Corporate Income Tax decreased in the quarter.

In the fourth quarter of 2017, total tax collections distributed to the State general fund totaled \$1,523.3 million, an increase of \$23.0 million or 1.5 percent over the same quarter of 2016 (Tables C-1 and C-2). In 2017, State general fund tax revenues were up \$269.1 million or 4.3 percent over the previous year.

During the fourth quarter of 2017, GET revenues (excluding the Honolulu County Surcharge) totaled \$794.7 million, an increase of \$10.7 million or 1.4 percent over the same quarter of 2016 (Table C-3). In 2017, GET revenues increased \$144.1 million or 4.5 percent from the previous year.

Compared to the fourth quarter of 2016, Net Individual Income Tax revenues increased \$59.6 million or 11.7 percent to \$570.3 million in the fourth quarter of 2017 (Table C-4). In the fourth quarter of 2017, Declaration of Estimated Taxes decreased \$13.8 million or 18.3 percent (Table

C-5), Payments with Returns increased \$0.6 million or 1.6 percent (Table C-6), Revenues from Withholding Tax on Wages increased \$54.3 million or 11.8 percent (Table C-7), and Refunds decreased \$18.6 million or 31.2 percent (Table C-8). In 2017, Net Individual Income Tax collections increased \$167.7 million or 7.9 percent from the previous year.

Net Corporate Income Tax revenues, which tend to be volatile in nature, decreased \$48.3 million to negative \$11.4 million in the fourth quarter of 2017 compared to the same quarter of 2016 (Table C-9). In the fourth quarter of 2017, the Declaration of Estimated Taxes decreased \$19.3 million or 38.3 percent (Table C-10), the Payment with Returns decreased \$37.8 million (Table C-11), and the Refunds decreased \$8.9 million or 29.5 percent (Table C-12), compared with the same quarter of 2016. In 2017, Net Corporate Income Tax revenues decreased \$47.6 million or 53.0 percent from the previous year.

In the fourth quarter of 2017, Transient Accommodations Tax (TAT) revenues increased \$10.9 million or 10.9 percent compared to the same quarter of 2016 (Table C-13). In 2017, TAT revenues increased \$20.3 million or 4.2 percent from the previous year.

D. TOURISM

Visitor arrivals continue to be strong, with both domestic and international visitor arrivals increasing in the fourth quarter of 2017. Due to shorter lengths of stay, the daily visitor census increased slightly less than the increase of visitor arrivals in the quarter. Since visitors spent slightly less on a daily basis, total visitor spending increased less than the growth of the average total daily visitor census in the quarter. With the exception of the fourth quarter of 2013, visitor arrivals have increased since the third quarter of 2009.

The total number of visitor arrivals by air increased 125,855 or 5.7 percent in the fourth quarter of 2017, compared to the same quarter of 2016 (Tables D-1 and D-2). The total average daily census was up 11,397 or 5.3 percent in the quarter. In 2017, total visitor arrivals by air increased 434,959 or 4.9 percent, while the average daily census increased 10,850 or 5.0 percent from the previous year.

In the fourth quarter of 2017, total visitor arrivals on domestic flights increased 82,462 or 5.5 percent compared to the same quarter of 2016 (Table D-3). In 2017, domestic arrivals were up 270,246 or 4.5 percent from the previous year.

Arrivals on international flights increased 43,393 or 5.9 percent in the fourth quarter of 2017 compared to the fourth quarter of 2016 (Table D-4). In 2017, international arrivals were up 164,713 or 5.8 percent from the same period in the previous year.

In terms of major market areas, from the fourth quarter of 2016 to the same period of 2017, arrivals from the U.S. West increased 59,372 or 6.5 percent (Table D-5), arrivals from the U.S. East increased 22,672 or 5.2 percent (Table D-6), and arrivals from Japan increased 6,356 or 1.6 percent (Table D-7). In 2017, arrivals from the U.S. West were up 179,059 or 4.9 percent; arrivals from the U.S. East were up 105,883 or 5.6 percent; and Japanese arrivals were up 80,630 or 5.4 percent from the previous year. In the fourth quarter of 2017, the length of stay per visitor decreased slightly. Due to the shorter length of stay,

the average total daily visitor census increased less than the growth of visitor arrivals in the quarter. The total average daily visitor census was up 5.3 percent or 11,397 visitors per day in the fourth quarter of 2017, over the same quarter of 2016 (Table D-8). The domestic average daily census increased 4.0 percent or 6,240 visitors per day (Table D-9), while the international average daily census increased 8.6 percent or 5,156 visitors per day (Table D-10). In 2017, the domestic average daily census increased 6,322 or 4.0 percent; and the international average daily census increased 4,527 or 7.6 percent from the previous year.

Nominal visitor expenditures by air totaled \$4,203.4 million in the fourth quarter of 2017, up 3.9 percent or \$156.2 million from the same quarter of 2016 (Table D-11). In 2017, visitor expenditures increased \$980.7 million or 6.2 percent from the previous year.

Total airline capacity, as measured by the number of available seats flown to Hawaii, increased 4.9 percent or 142,376 seats (Table D-12) in the fourth quarter of 2017, domestic seats increased 4.1 percent or 83,180 seats (Table D-13); international seats increased 6.4 percent or 59,196 seats (Table D-14), compared to the same quarter of 2016. In 2017, the number of total available seats increased 1.8 percent or 215,063 seats from the previous year.

In the fourth quarter of 2017, the statewide hotel occupancy rate averaged 78.6 percent, 1.1 percentage point higher than the same quarter of 2016 (Table D-15). In 2017, the statewide hotel occupancy rate averaged 80.0 percent, 1.0 percentage point higher than the previous year.



E. CONSTRUCTION

The indicators of Hawaii's construction industry were mixed in the fourth quarter of 2017. The private building authorizations, and government contracts awarded decreased, however, construction jobs and the State CIP expenditures increased.

Construction has been one of the steady contributors to job growth in Hawaii over the past few years. In the fourth quarter of 2017, the construction sector added 1,000 jobs or 2.7 percent, compared with the same quarter of 2016. In 2017, the construction sector lost 200 jobs or 0.5 percent (Table A-7) from the previous year. Before the recession, specifically the period 2002 through 2007, construction job growth averaged 8.0 percent per year. In the fourth quarter of 2007, the average number of construction jobs reached a peak of 40,000 jobs. The strength of the construction job market in the past few years was a sharp contrast to the recession period. From the second quarter of 2008 until the second quarter of 2011 quarter-over-quarter construction job growth was negative in all quarters.

In the fourth quarter of 2017, private building authorizations in the state decreased \$180.6 million or 21.4 percent, compared with the fourth quarter of 2016 (Table E-8). In 2017, private building authorizations in the state decreased \$112.8 million or 3.5 percent compared with the previous year.

In the fourth quarter of 2017, private building authorizations in Honolulu decreased \$203.6 million or 36.2 percent, compared with the fourth quarter of 2016 (Table E-8). In 2017, private building authorizations in Honolulu decreased \$133.7 million or 6.2 percent, compared with the previous year.

In the fourth quarter of 2017, private building authorizations in Hawaii County increased \$43.8 million or 34.9 percent, compared with the fourth quarter of 2016 (Table E-8). In 2017, private building authorizations in Hawaii County decreased \$78.8 million or 13.7 percent, compared with the previous year.

In the fourth quarter of 2017, private building authorizations in Maui County decreased \$21.4 million or 17.3 percent, compared with the fourth quarter of 2016 (Table E-8). In 2017, private building

authorizations in Maui County increased \$92.8 million or 24.1 percent compared with the previous year.

In the fourth quarter of 2017, private building authorizations (residential only) in Kauai increased \$0.6 million or 1.6 percent, compared with the fourth quarter of 2016 (Table E-8). In 2017, private building authorizations in Kauai increased \$6.8 million or 4.9 percent compared with the same period of the previous year.

Government contracts awarded decreased \$159.0 million or 62.0 percent in the fourth quarter of 2017 compared with the same quarter of 2016. In 2017, government contracts awarded decreased \$481.7 million or 28.8 percent compared with the previous year (Table E-1). State government CIP expenditures increased \$175.9 million or 90.3 percent in the fourth quarter of 2017 (Table E-2). In 2017, CIP expenditures increased \$151.3 million or 13.0 percent compared with the previous year.

The Honolulu Construction Cost Index increased 0.3 percent in the fourth quarter of 2017 compared to the same quarter of 2016 for Single Family Residence (Table E-6) and 0.0 percent for High-Rise Building (Table E-7). In 2017 compared to 2016, the index for Single Family Residence increased 0.8 percent and 0.5 percent for High-Rise Building.

In 2017, Honolulu's median price for single family resales was \$750,000, an increase of \$20,000 or 2.7 percent compared to 2016 (Table E-11). The median price for condominium units was \$405,000, up \$15,000 or 3.8 percent over the previous year (Table E-12). In the fourth quarter of 2017, the number of single-family unit resales was up 8.0 percent, and the number of condominium unit resales was up 5.6 percent, compared with the fourth quarter of 2016 (Tables E-13 and E-14). In 2017, the number of single-family unit resales was up 6.3 percent, and condominium unit resales was up 6.9 percent compared with the previous year.

In 2017, Maui County the single-family unit resales median price was \$695,000 or \$56,000 and 1.9 percent higher than in 2016. The condominium unit resales median price was \$445,000 or \$30,000 and 7.2 percent higher than in 2016. (Tables E-17 and E-18).

F. OTHER INDICATORS

The total number of bankruptcy filings in Hawaii increased 0.9 percent or by 3 cases for the fourth quarter of 2017, from the same quarter of 2016. In 2017, total filings decreased 2.0 percent or 29 cases from the previous year.

The number of Chapter 7 filings, the largest category, increased 9.1 percent or 19 cases in the fourth quarter of 2017. Chapter 7 filings are intended to liquidate assets and discharge debt. In 2017, Chapter 7 filings were down 0.6 percent or 6 cases from the previous year.

Chapter 11 filings increased from 1 case in the fourth quarter of 2016 to 6 cases in the fourth quarter of 2017. In 2017, Chapter 11 filings decreased to 13 cases from 15 cases in the previous year. Chapter 11 filings involve the structuring of repayment plans for companies.

Chapter 13 filings decreased 15.9 percent or 21 cases in the fourth quarter of 2017, from the same quarter of 2016. In 2017, Chapter 13 filings decreased 5.0 percent or 23 cases from the previous year. Chapter 13 bankruptcy allows debtors to work out repayment arrangements with creditors.
