Executive Summary 2nd Quarter 2019

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This *Quarterly Statistical and Economic Report* has been prepared by the staff of the Research and Economic Analysis Division of the State Department of Business, Economic Development & Tourism (DBEDT). The report provides concise statistical information and analyses on Labor, Income and Prices, Taxes, Tourism, Construction, and other indicators, as well as an overview of the State of Hawaii and the four counties.

Technical notes and source descriptions have been kept to a minimum. However, the staff of the Research and Economic Analysis Division would be happy to respond to any inquiries of a technical nature that readers may have (586-2466). The quarterly information contained in this report reflects data received by the Research Division on or before May 17, 2019.

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STATE OF THE ECONOMY

Hawaii's major economic indicators were mixed in the first quarter of 2019. Visitor arrivals, wage and salary jobs, personal income (through the fourth quarter of 2018), and private building authorizations increased in the quarter compared to the first quarter of 2018. However, visitor expenditures, State general fund tax revenues, and government contracts awarded decreased in the quarter.

In the first quarter of 2019, the total number of visitors arriving by air to Hawaii increased 63,989 or 2.6 percent. Due to shorter lengths of stay, the daily visitor census increased 0.2 percent in the quarter. Since visitors spent less on a daily basis in the first quarter of 2019, total visitors by air spending decreased 2.4 percent in the quarter. Historical data shows that, after seventeen quarters of positive growth from the third quarter of 2009 to the third quarter of 2013, Hawaii's tourism sector experienced one quarter of negative growth in the fourth quarter of 2013. Since the first quarter of 2014, however, Hawaii's tourism sector has shown positive growth compared with the same quarter in the previous year.

In the first quarter of 2019, jobs in the construction sector increased 1.1 percent or 400 jobs, the government contracts awarded decreased \$376.5 million or 70.7 percent, and the permit value for private construction increased \$61.2 million or 8.7 percent, compared with the same quarter of 2018. According to the most recent excise tax base data available, current construction put-in-place increased \$225.8 million or 10.4 percent in the fourth quarter of 2018, compared with that quarter in 2017.

In the first quarter of 2019, State general fund tax revenues were down \$22.9 million or 1.3 percent over the same period of 2018. Net individual income tax revenues increased \$10.7 million or 2.1 percent, Transient Accommodations Tax (TAT) increased \$10.8 million or 6.9 percent, but State general excise tax revenue decreased \$42.7 million or 4.5 percent in the first quarter of 2019, compared to first quarter 2018. In 2018, State general fund tax revenues increased \$448.1 million or 6.9 percent, and state general excise tax revenue increased \$76.7 million or 2.3 percent, compared to the previous year.

Labor market conditions were mixed. Hawaii's jobs increased for the 34th consecutive quarter beginning in fourth quarter 2010. In the first quarter of 2019, Hawaii's non-agricultural wage and salary jobs averaged 657,500 jobs, an increase of 2,600 jobs or 0.4 percent from the same quarter of 2018.

The job growth in the first quarter of 2019 was due to job increases in both the private sector and the government sector. In this quarter, the private sector added about 700 non-agricultural jobs compared to the first

quarter of 2018. Jobs increased the most in Food Services and Drinking Places, adding 600 jobs or 0.9 percent; followed by Information, adding 500 jobs or 5.7 percent, Accommodation, adding 500 jobs or 1.2 percent, Financial Activities, adding 400 jobs or 1.4 percent, Natural Resources, Mining & Construction, adding 400 jobs or 1.1 percent, and Health Care & Social Assistance, adding 400 jobs or 0.6 percent in the quarter. For the private sector, in the first quarter of 2019, Retail Trade lost 1,100 jobs, Manufacturing lost 700 jobs, and Arts, Entertainment & Recreation lost 400 jobs in the quarter. The three levels of government added 1,900 jobs or 1.5 percent in the first quarter of 2019 compared to the same quarter of 2018. The Federal Government added 500 jobs or 1.5 percent; State Government added 1,500 jobs or 2.0 percent, and Local Government added 100 jobs or 0.5 percent, compared to the first quarter of 2018.

In the fourth quarter of 2018, total annualized nominal GDP increased \$3,404 million or 3.8 percent, from the fourth quarter of 2017. In 2018, total annualized nominal GDP increased \$2,983 million or 3.4 percent from the previous year. In the fourth quarter of 2018, total annualized real GDP (in chained 2012 dollars) increased \$1,034 million or 1.3 percent from the fourth quarter of 2017. In 2018, total annualized real GDP increased \$800 million or 1.0 percent from the previous year.

In the fourth quarter of 2018, a personal income component, total non-farm private sector annualized earnings, increased \$1,231.6 million or 3.2 percent from the fourth quarter of 2017. In dollar terms, the largest increase occurred in health care and social assistance; followed by construction, administrative & waste management services, retail trade, and other services. During the fourth quarter of 2018, total government earnings increased \$299.0 million or 1.9 percent from the same quarter of 2017. Earnings from the federal government increased \$302.0 million or 3.6 percent. Earnings from the state and local governments decreased \$3.1 million in the quarter.

In the second half of 2018, Honolulu's Consumer Price Index for Urban Consumers (CPI-U) increased 2.1 percent from the same period in 2017. This is 0.3 of a percentage point below the 2.4 percent increase for the U.S. average CPI-U and is lower than the second half of 2017 Honolulu CPI-U increase of 2.5 percent from the same period of the previous year. In the second half of 2018, the Honolulu CPI-U increased the most in Transportation (4.9 percent), followed by Recreation (3.7 percent), Housing (2.4 percent), Other Goods and Services (1.7 percent), and Food and Beverages (1.2 percent). The price of Education and Communication decreased 0.6 percent and the price of Apparel decreased 6.7 percent compared to the second half of 2017.

OUTLOOK FOR THE ECONOMY

Hawaii's economy is expected to continue positive growth in 2019 and 2020. This outlook is based on the most recent developments in the national and global economies, the performance of Hawaii's tourism industry, labor market conditions, and the growth of personal income and tax revenues.

Hawaii's economy depends significantly on conditions in the U.S. economy and key international economies, especially Japan. According to the May 2019 *Blue Chip Economic Consensus Forecasts*, U.S. real GDP is expected to increase by 2.6 percent in 2019, 0.1 of a percentage point above the growth rate projected in the February 2019 forecast. For 2020 the consensus forecast predicts an overall 1.9 percent growth in U.S. real GDP.

According to the May 2019 *Blue Chip Economic Consensus Forecast*, real GDP growth for Japan is now expected to increase 0.7 percent in 2019, 0.2 of a percentage point below the growth rate projected in the February 2019 forecast. For 2020, the consensus forecast now projects an overall 0.5 percent growth rate for Japanese real GDP.

For the local economy, DBEDT expects that visitor expenditures will grow at a lower rate than projected in the previous forecast for 2019, and real GDP growth rate will remain the same as projected in the previous forecast.

Overall, Hawaii's economy, as measured by real GDP, is projected to show a 1.2 percent increase in 2019, the same as the growth rate forecast last quarter. The real GDP growth forecast for 2020 is 1.3 percent, 0.1 of a percentage point below the previous forecast.

Hawaii's unemployment rate is projected to be 3.0 percent in 2019, 0.3 of a percentage point above the previous forecast. The unemployment rate in 2020 is projected to be 3.1 percent, same as the previous forecast.

Visitor arrivals are expected to increase 2.6 percent in 2019, 0.6 of a percentage point above the previous forecast. The forecast for visitor days in 2019 decreased 1.0 percentage point to 0.6 percent. The 2019 forecast for visitor expenditure growth was revised downward to 1.1 percent, from 3.3 percent growth projected in the previous forecast. For 2020, the growth rate of visitor arrivals, visitor days, and visitor expenditures are now expected to be 1.9 percent, 1.4 percent, and 3.0 percent, respectively.

The projection for the non-agricultural wage and salary job growth rate for 2019 is 0.6 percent, 0.3 of a percentage point below the previous forecast. In 2020, jobs are projected to increase 0.7 percent, 0.2 of a percentage point below the previous forecast.

The Honolulu Consumer Price Index (CPI) is expected to increase 1.7 percent in 2019, 0.2 of a percentage point below the previous forecast. In 2020, the CPI is projected to increase 2.1 percent, same as the previous forecast.

Personal income in current dollars is expected to increase 3.2 percent in 2019, 0.1 of a percentage point below the previous forecast. Real personal income is now projected to grow 1.5 percent in 2019, same as the previous forecast. In 2020, current-dollar personal income and real personal income are expected to increase 3.6 and 1.6 percent, respectively.

Beyond 2020, the economy is expected to continue its expansion path, with job growth projected to be 0.6 percent in 2021 and 2022. Visitor arrivals are expected to increase 1.7 percent in 2021 and 1.4 percent in 2022. Visitor expenditures are expected to increase 2.8 percent in 2021 and 2.6 percent in 2022. Real personal income is projected to increase 1.5 percent in 2021 and 1.6 percent in 2022. Hawaii's real GDP growth is expected to increase 1.3 percent in 2021 and 1.4 percent in 2022. The unemployment rate is expected to increase to 3.4 percent in 2021 and 3.6 percent in 2022.

COUNTY ECONOMIC CONDITIONS

Overall economic conditions were mixed across the counties in the first quarter of 2019. The unemployment rate increased in all counties. Total non-agricultural wage and salary jobs increased in all counties, except Hawaii County. Total visitor arrivals by air increased in Honolulu and Maui, however decreased in Hawaii County and Kauai. Visitor expenditures increased in Honolulu, however decreased in all other counties. The value of private building permits increased in Honolulu, however the value decreased in all Neighbor Island counties.

In the first quarter of 2019, the unemployment rate in Honolulu increased 0.5 of a percentage point from 2.2 percent to 2.7 percent; the unemployment rate in Maui County increased 0.6 of a percentage point from 2.3 percent to 2.9 percent; the unemployment rate in Hawaii County increased 1.1 percentage point from 2.6 percent to 3.7 percent; and the unemployment rate in Kauai County increased 0.9 of a percentage point from 2.1 percent to 3.0 percent.

In the first quarter of 2019, Honolulu gained 3,400 or 0.7 percent of non-agricultural wage and salary jobs over the same quarter of 2018. Food Services and Drinking Places added the most jobs (900 jobs), followed by Health Care & Social Assistance (600 jobs), Information (500 jobs), Financial Activities (400 jobs), and Professional & Business Services (300 jobs). The Government sector added 1,900 jobs. The largest private sector job losses occurred in Retail Trade (lost 900 jobs); followed by Manufacturing (lost 500 jobs), and Arts, Entertainment & Recreation (lost 300 jobs).

In the first quarter of 2019, Hawaii County lost 1,200 or 1.7 percent of non-agricultural wage and salary jobs over the same quarter of 2018. Almost all sectors stayed the same or lost jobs. The Accommodation sector lost the most at 500 jobs; followed by Food Services and Drinking Places (lost 400 jobs) in the quarter. The Government sector also lost 100 jobs in the quarter.

Maui County saw a net gain of 700 jobs or a 0.9 percent increase in the first quarter of 2019 over the same quarter of 2018. Jobs increased the most in Accommodation (600 jobs); followed by Food Services and Drinking Places (200 jobs), and Other Services (200 jobs). Arts, Entertainment & Recreation lost 300 jobs, and Professional & Business Services lost 200 jobs in the quarter. Government added 100 jobs in the quarter.

In the first quarter of 2019, Kauai County gained 100 wage and salary jobs or 0.3 percent from the same quarter of 2018. Health Care & Social Assistance, and Accommodation each added 100 jobs. Retail Trade and Food Services and Drinking Places each lost 100 jobs in the quarter. Government jobs was unchanged in the quarter even as the Federal Government added 100 jobs.

In the first quarter of 2019, visitor arrivals by air increased in Honolulu and Maui, however decreased in Hawaii County and Kauai. Visitor expenditures increased in Honolulu, however decreased in all other counties. Visitor arrivals by air increased 3.7 percent in Honolulu and 2.8 percent in Maui, but decreased 9.3 percent in Hawaii County, and 1.4 percent in Kauai. Visitor expenditures increased 4.6 percent in Honolulu but decreased 4.2 percent in Kauai, 13.3 percent in Hawaii County, and 5.4 percent in Maui compared to the same quarter of 2018.

In the first quarter of 2019, private building permits increased in Honolulu, but decreased in all Neighbor Island counties. In the first quarter of 2019, private building permits increased \$130.1 million or 33.0 percent in Honolulu, decreased \$45.6 million or 36.0 percent in Maui, decreased \$7.1 million or 18.8 percent in Kauai (only residential available), and decreased \$16.2 million or 11.4 percent in Hawaii County from the same quarter of the previous year.

A. LABOR FORCE AND JOBS

Hawaii's labor market conditions were mixed in the first quarter of 2018. Since the civilian labor force decreased less than the decrease in civilian employment, the civilian unemployment rate increased to 2.8 percent in the quarter. For the 34th consecutive quarter-over-quarter, civilian nonagricultural wage and salary jobs increased.

In the first quarter of 2019, the civilian labor force averaged 669,650 people, a decrease of 10,950 people or 1.6 percent from the same quarter of 2018 (Table A-1). In 2018, the civilian labor force declined by 4,850 people or 0.7 percent from the previous year.

Civilian employment totaled 650,700 people in the first quarter of 2019, a decrease of 14,600 people or 2.2 percent compared to the same quarter of 2018 (Table A-2). In 2018, average civilian employment decreased 4,850 people or 0.7 percent from the previous year.

In the first quarter of 2019, the number of civilian unemployed averaged 18,950, an increase of 3,650 people or 23.9 percent from the same quarter of 2018 (Table A-3). In 2018, at 16,600, the number of unemployed showed no change from the previous year.

The unemployment rate (not seasonally adjusted) increased from 2.2 percent in the first quarter of 2018 to 2.8 percent in the first quarter of 2019 (Table A-4). In 2018, at 2.4 percent, the unemployment rate showed no change from the previous year.

In the first quarter of 2019, Hawaii's non-agricultural wage and salary jobs averaged 657,500 jobs, an increase of 2,600 jobs or 0.4 percent from the same quarter of 2018 (Table A-6). This is the 34th consecutive quarter-over-quarter increase in non-agricultural wage and salary jobs after ten consecutive quarter-over-quarter decreases in jobs since the second quarter

of 2008. In 2018, average non-agricultural wage and salary jobs increased 0.5 percent or 3,300 jobs from the previous year.

The job growth in the first quarter of 2019 was due to job increases in both the private sector and the government sector. In this quarter, the private sector added about 700 non-agricultural jobs compared to the first quarter of 2018. increased the most in Food Services and Drinking Places, adding 600 jobs or 0.9 percent (Table A-19); followed by Information, adding 500 jobs or 5.7 percent (Table A-12), Accommodation, adding 500 jobs or 1.2 percent (Table A-18), Financial Activities, adding 400 jobs or 1.4 percent (Table A-13), Natural Resources, Mining & Construction, adding 400 jobs or 1.1 percent (Table A-7), and Health Care & Social Assistance, adding 400 jobs or 0.6 percent (Table A-16) in the quarter.

For the private sector, in the first quarter of 2019, Retail Trade lost 1,100 jobs (Table A-10), Manufacturing lost 700 jobs (Table A-8), and Arts, Entertainment & Recreation lost 400 jobs (Table A-17) in the quarter.

The three levels of government added 1,900 jobs or 1.5 percent (Table A-21) in the first quarter of 2019 compared to the same quarter of 2018. The Federal Government added 500 jobs or 1.5 percent (Table A-22); State Government added 1,500 jobs or 2.0 percent (Table A-23), and Local Government added 100 jobs or 0.5 percent (Table A-24), compared to the first quarter of 2018.

The initial liable claims for unemployment, which measures the number of people who lost jobs in Hawaii and moved to other states, increased 8.1 percent in the first quarter of 2019 compared to the same quarter of 2018 (Table A-27). In 2018, the initial liable claims for unemployment decreased 8.6 percent from the previous year.

B. INCOME AND PRICES

In the fourth quarter of 2018, total annualized nominal GDP increased \$3,404 million or 3.8 percent, from the fourth quarter of 2017. In 2018, total annualized nominal GDP increased \$2,983 million or 3.4 percent from the previous year. In the fourth quarter of 2018, total annualized real GDP (in chained 2012 dollars) increased \$1,034 million or 1.3 percent from the fourth quarter of 2017. In 2018, total annualized real GDP increased \$800 million or 1.0 percent from the previous year (Tables B-1 to B-3).

Hawaii's total personal income increased during the fourth quarter of 2018 over the same quarter of 2017; all major components of personal income increased in the quarter. In dollar terms, the largest increases occurred in wages and salaries; followed by dividends, interest, and rent, personal current transfer receipts, proprietors' income, and supplements to wages and salaries (Table B-4).

In the fourth quarter of 2018, total nominal annualized personal income (i.e. not adjusted for inflation) increased \$2,189.5 million or 2.9 percent over that of 2017 (Table B-5). In 2018, total annualized personal income was \$77,508.6 million, an increase of 2.9 percent from the previous year.

In the fourth quarter of 2018, wages and salaries increased \$1,115.6 million or 3.0 percent over that of 2017. This was the 34th consecutive quarterly year-over-year increase since the third quarter of 2010. In 2018, wages and salaries increased 2.4 percent from the previous year (Table B-8).

Supplements to wages and salaries, consisting of employer payments to retirement plans, private group health insurance plans, private workers compensation plans, and other such benefits, increased \$196.9 million or 1.9 percent in the fourth quarter of 2018, from the same quarter of 2017 (Table B-9). In 2018, supplements to wages and salaries increased 1.6 percent from the previous year.

Proprietors' income increased \$223.4 million or 3.8 percent in the fourth quarter of 2018, over that of 2017 (Table B-10). In 2018, proprietors' income was up 4.3 percent from the previous year.

Dividends, interest, and rent increased \$576.5 million or 3.5 percent in the fourth quarter of 2018, from the same quarter of 2017. In 2018, income in this category was up 4.0 percent from the previous year (Table B-11).

The annualized personal current transfer receipts grew by \$279.3 million or 2.3 percent in the fourth quarter of 2018 from the same quarter of 2017 (Table B-12). In 2018, personal current transfer receipts increased 3.1 percent from the previous year.

Contributions to government social insurance, which is subtracted from total personal income, increased \$202.2 million or 3.3 percent in the fourth quarter of 2018, compared to the fourth quarter of 2017. In 2018, contributions to government social insurance increased 2.9 percent from the previous year (Table B-13).

In the fourth quarter of 2018, total non-farm private sector annualized earnings increased \$1,231.6 million or 3.2 percent from the fourth quarter of 2017. In dollar terms, the largest increase occurred in health care and assistance: followed by construction. administrative & waste management services, retail trade, and other services. During the fourth quarter of 2018, total government earnings increased \$299.0 million or 1.9 percent from the same quarter of 2017. Earnings from the federal government increased \$302.0 million or 3.6 percent. Earnings from the state and local governments decreased \$3.1 million in the quarter (Table B-4).

In the second half of 2018, Honolulu's Consumer Price Index for Urban Consumers (CPI-U) increased 2.1 percent from the same period in 2017 (Table B-14). This is 0.3 of a percentage point below the 2.4 percent increase for the U.S. average CPI-U and is lower than the second half of 2017 Honolulu CPI-U increase of 2.5 percent from the same period of the previous year. In the second half of 2018, the Honolulu CPI-U increased the most in Transportation (4.9 percent), followed by Recreation (3.7 percent), Housing (2.4 percent), Other Goods and Services (1.7 percent), and Food and Beverages (1.2 percent). The price of Education and Communication decreased 0.6 percent and the price of Apparel decreased 6.7 percent compared to the second half of 2017.

C. TAX REVENUES

The State general fund tax revenues decreased in the first quarter of 2019 compared to the same quarter of 2018.¹ The decrease in GET more than offset the increases in Transient Accommodations Tax (TAT), the Net Individual Income Tax, and Net Corporate Income Tax in the quarter.

In the first quarter of 2019, total tax collections distributed to the State general fund totaled \$1,687.9 million, a decrease of \$22.9 million or 1.3 percent over the same quarter of 2018 (Tables C-1 and C-2). In 2018, State general fund tax revenues were up \$448.1 million or 6.9 percent over the previous year.

During the first quarter of 2019, GET revenues (excluding the Honolulu County Surcharge) totaled \$916.4 million, a decrease of \$42.7 million or 4.5 percent over the same quarter of 2018 (Table C-3). In 2018, GET revenues increased \$76.7 million or 2.3 percent from that of the previous year.

Compared to the first quarter of 2018, Net Individual Income Tax revenues increased \$10.7 million or 2.1 percent to \$524.2 million in the first quarter of 2019 (Table C-4). In the first quarter of 2019, Declaration of Estimated Taxes decreased \$45.0 million or 24.3 percent (Table

C-5), Payments with Returns increased \$9.8 million or 33.8 percent (Table C-6), Revenues from Withholding Tax on Wages increased \$78.7 million or 16.8 percent (Table C-7), and Refunds increased \$32.7 million or 19.3 percent (Table C-8). In 2018, Net Individual Income Tax collections increased \$249.7 million or 10.9 percent from the previous year.

Net Corporate Income Tax revenues, which tend to be volatile by nature, increased \$2.9 million or 20.1 percent in the first quarter of 2019 from the first quarter of 2018 (Table C-9). In the first quarter of 2019, the Declaration of Estimated Taxes increased \$19.8 million or 81.0 percent (Table C-10), the Payment with Returns increased \$5.0 million (Table C-11), and the Refunds increased \$21.9 million or 218.3 percent (Table C-12), compared with the same quarter of 2018. In 2018, Net Corporate Income Tax revenues increased \$72.1 million or 171.2 percent from the previous year.

In the first quarter of 2019, Transient Accommodations Tax (TAT) revenues increased \$10.8 million or 6.9 percent compared to the same quarter of 2018 (Table C-13). In 2018, TAT revenues increased \$86.9 million or 17.2 percent from the previous year.

D. TOURISM

Visitor arrivals continue to be positive, domestic visitor arrivals increased while international visitor arrivals declined in the first quarter of 2019. Due to shorter lengths of stay, the daily visitor census increased less than the increase of visitor arrivals in the quarter. Since visitors spent less on a daily basis, total visitor spending decreased in the quarter. With the exception of the fourth quarter of 2013, visitor arrivals have increased since the third quarter of 2009.

The total number of visitor arrivals by air increased 63,989 or 2.6 percent in the first quarter of 2019, compared to the same quarter of 2018 (Tables D-1 and D-2). The total average daily census was up 562 or 0.2 percent in the quarter. In 2018, total visitor arrivals by air increased 549,519 or 5.9 percent, while the average daily census increased 12,336 or 5.4 percent from the previous year.

In the first quarter of 2019, total visitor arrivals on domestic flights increased 64,135 or 3.9 percent compared to the same quarter of 2018 (Table D-3). In 2018, domestic arrivals were up 526,810 or 8.4 percent from the previous year.

Arrivals on international flights decreased 146 or 0.02 percent in the first quarter of 2019 compared to the first quarter of 2018 (Table D-4). In 2018, international arrivals were up 22,709 or 0.7 percent from the previous year.

In terms of major market areas, from the first quarter of 2018 to the same period of 2019, arrivals from the U.S. West increased 68,182 or 7.1 percent (Table D-5), arrivals from the U.S. East increased 11,342 or 2.0 percent (Table D-6), and arrivals from Japan increased 8,563 or 2.2 percent (Table D-7). In 2018, arrivals from the U.S. West were up 368,278 or 9.6 percent; arrivals from the U.S. East were up 158,005 or 7.9 percent; and Japanese arrivals were down 16,483 or 1.0 percent from the previous year.

In the first quarter of 2019, the length of stay per visitor decreased. Due to the shorter length of stay, the

average total daily visitor census increased less than the growth of visitor arrivals in the quarter. The total average daily visitor census was up 0.2 percent or 562 visitors per day in the first quarter of 2019, over the same quarter of 2018 (Table D-8). The domestic average daily census increased 0.6 percent or 1,031 visitors per day (Table D-9), while the international average daily census decreased 0.6 percent or 470 visitors per day (Table D-10). In 2018, the domestic average daily census increased 11,107 or 6.8 percent; and the international average daily census increased 1,229 or 1.9 percent from the previous year.

Nominal visitor expenditures by air totaled \$4,506.3 million in the first quarter of 2019, down 2.4 percent or \$111.0 million from the same quarter of 2018 (Table D-11). In 2018, visitor expenditures increased \$947.0 million or 5.7 percent from the previous year.

Total airline capacity, as measured by the number of available seats flown to Hawaii, increased 1.1 percent or 35,219 seats (Table D-12) in the first quarter of 2019, domestic seats increased 1.0 percent or 22,354 seats (Table D-13); international seats increased 1.3 percent or 12,865 seats (Table D-14), compared to the same quarter of 2018. In 2018, the number of total available seats increased 8.3 percent or 1,012,461 seats from the previous year.

In the first quarter of 2019, the statewide hotel occupancy rate averaged 80.8 percent, 2.7 percentage points lower than the same quarter of 2018 (Table D-15). In 2018, the statewide hotel occupancy rate averaged 79.8 percent, 0.4 of a percentage point lower than that of the previous year.



E. CONSTRUCTION

The indicators of Hawaii's construction industry were mixed in the first quarter of 2019. The private building authorizations, state government CIP expenditures, and construction jobs increased, while the government contracts awarded decreased.

Construction has been one of the steady contributors to job growth in Hawaii over the past few years. In the first quarter of 2019, the number of jobs in the construction sector increased 1.1 percent or 400 jobs compared with the same quarter of 2018. In 2018, the construction sector lost 100 jobs or 0.3 percent (Table A-7) from the previous year. Before the recession, specifically the period 2002 through 2007, construction job growth averaged 8.0 percent per year. In the fourth quarter of 2007, the average number of construction jobs reached a peak of 40,000 jobs. The strength of the construction job market in the past few years was a sharp contrast to the recession period. From the second quarter of 2008 until the second quarter of 2011 quarterover-quarter construction job growth was negative in all quarters.

In the first quarter of 2019, private building authorizations in the state increased \$61.2 million or 8.7 percent, compared with the first quarter of 2018 (Table E-8). In 2018, private building authorizations in the state increased \$140.5 million or 4.5 percent compared with the previous year.

In the first quarter of 2019, private building authorizations in Honolulu increased \$130.1 million or 33.0 percent, compared with the first quarter of 2018 (Table E-8). In 2018, private building authorizations in Honolulu decreased \$22.2 million or 1.1 percent, compared with the previous year.

In the first quarter of 2019, private building authorizations in Hawaii County decreased \$16.2 million or 11.4 percent, compared with the first quarter of 2018 (Table E-8). In 2018, private building authorizations in Hawaii County increased \$81.4 million or 16.4 percent, compared with the previous year.

In the first quarter of 2019, private building authorizations in Maui County decreased \$45.6 million or 36.0 percent, compared with the first quarter of 2018 (Table E-8). In 2018, private building authorizations in Maui County increased \$82.3 million or 17.2 percent compared with the previous year.

In the first quarter of 2019, private building authorizations (residential only) in Kauai County decreased \$7.1 million or 18.8 percent, compared with the first quarter of 2018 (Table E-8). In 2018, private building authorizations in Kauai County decreased \$1.1 million or 0.8 percent compared with the previous year.

Government contracts awarded decreased \$376.5 million or 70.7 percent in the first quarter of 2019 compared with the same quarter of 2018. In 2018, government contracts awarded increased \$756.9 million or 63.5 percent compared with the previous year (Table E-1). State government CIP expenditures increased \$32.8 million or 12.5 percent in the first quarter of 2019 compared with the same quarter of 2018 (Table E-2). In 2018, CIP expenditures increased \$324.9 million or 24.8 percent compared with the previous year.

The Honolulu Construction Cost Index increased 1.9 percent in the first quarter of 2019 compared to the same quarter of 2018 for Single Family Residence (Table E-6) and increased 1.7 percent for High-Rise Building (Table E-7). In 2018, the index for Single Family Residence increased 0.4 percent and 0.5 percent for High-Rise Building from the previous year.

In the first quarter of 2019, Honolulu's median price for single family resales was \$780,000, an increase of \$15,000 or 2.0 percent compared to the same quarter of 2018 (Table E-11). The median price for condominium units was \$411,250, down \$13,750 or 3.2 percent over the same quarter of 2018 (Table E-12). In the first quarter of 2019, the number of single-family unit resales declined 5.7 percent, and the number of condominium unit resales declined 10.5 percent, compared with the first quarter of 2018 (Tables E-13 and E-14). In 2018, the number of single-family unit resales declined 7.7 percent, and condominium unit resales declined 2.5 percent compared with the previous year.

In the first quarter of 2019, Maui County's single-family unit resales median price was \$735,000 or \$52,532 and 7.7 percent higher than in the first quarter of 2018. The condominium unit resales median price was \$525,000 or \$48,750 and 10.2 percent higher than in the same quarter of 2018. (Tables E-17 and E-18).

F. OTHER INDICATORS

The total number of bankruptcy filings in Hawaii increased 19.8 percent or by 69 cases for the first quarter of 2019, from the same quarter of 2018. In 2018, total filings increased 10.0 percent or 139 cases from the previous year.

The number of Chapter 7 filings, the largest category, increased 24.6 percent or 58 cases in the first quarter of 2019. Chapter 7 filings are intended to liquidate assets and discharge debt. In 2018, Chapter 7 filings were up 9.9 percent or 93 cases from the previous year.

Chapter 11 filings increased from 1 case in the first quarter of 2018 to 3 cases in the first quarter of 2019. In 2018, Chapter 11 filings decreased to 4 cases from 13 cases in the same period of the previous year. Chapter 11 filings involve the structuring of repayment plans for companies.

Chapter 13 filings increased 8.1 percent or 9 cases in the first quarter of 2019, from the same quarter of 2018. In 2018, Chapter 13 filings increased 13.0 percent or 57 cases from the previous year. Chapter 13 bankruptcy allows debtors to work out repayment arrangements with creditors.
