- 2/ Unsheltered homeless: persons or groups of persons having a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for, or ordinarily used as, a regular sleeping accommodation for persons (including beaches, parks, automobiles, caves, benches, and abandoned or vacant buildings).

- a) share accommodations with other groups in the same household,
- b) are 'doubled up' (two or more families or groups of persons related by birth, marriage or adoption),
