### ***Priority management goals/strategic actions***

The definition of “priorities,” for the purpose of the tasks at hand, will be: What your agency can commit to working on in the next 2 years/what is practical. (Two years: July 2007-June 2009)

Note: Once work plans are completed for all ongoing activities and priorities, we will start to focus on the goals/actions we would *like* to do, but don't have the resources to do. This is where the group can hopefully collaborate and find shared goals and efforts. (We will include a list of these goals/actions that we think should be priorities for the state in our report to the Policy Group in March).

### ***Agency work plans***

Please bring your draft work plans to the Dec. 5<sup>th</sup> meeting to discuss any questions/concerns/problems. Final agency work plans on all implementing activities through June of 2009 are due January 15, 2008.

### ***Working Group member presentations***

Each member present gave a brief (10 min) presentation to the group on what their agency is focusing on in relation to the ORMP. Some of the main topics discussed were:

**DLNR:** internal/department-wide collaboration and integrated resources management on geographically-bounded projects. Example: Ha‘ena State Park, major issues include parking, facilities, trails, beach management, inducing vegetation, public access, invasive species, illegal vacation rentals, garden, stream, erosion; other areas of focus include Ka‘ena Point, Kealakekua Bay, Sand Bar, Kawainui Marsh, Kailua Beach, and Ahihi-Kinau Natural Area Reserve.

**DOA:** production of shrimp brood stock threatened by disease; dead fish project to isolate diseased populations; GIS data for locating offshore fish farms; lack of funding to study disease issues

**DOH:** individual wastewater system upgrades and cesspool inventory; Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDLs)- basically pollution budgets; polluted runoff; watershed management, protection, and restoration (handout given for background info); partnership with CZM Coastal Nonpoint Pollution Control Program (CNPCP); lack of data & capacity

**DOT:** increasing growth of cargo ships coming into commercial harbors stresses harbors; special funds- revenues solely from harbor users- constrains ability to make necessary improvements to infrastructure; conducting study to explore solutions for outdated tariff system; anticipating future needs

**Hawaii:** creating and maintaining shoreline public access- current system ineffective to handle increasing pressures; tsunami education program; funding and policy needs for coastal hazard mitigation; lack of accurate topographical data; water quality monitoring in Hilo Bay with plans to expand into other watersheds

**Kauai:** updating comprehensive zoning ordinances and county general plan; shoreline erosion bill; open spaces commission; public beach access; innovation techniques to reduce polluted runoff and enhance watershed management; data limitations – any additional information helpful;

**Maui:** general plan update; streamlining SMA permit system; shoreline development; need joint management plan for Honolua Bay and other Natural Area Reserves; post-disaster planning development; major issue is lack of enforcement - not enough zoning inspectors;

**MACZAC:** importance of stakeholder awareness and involvement; bringing cultural values and ORMP objectives into business; long-term sustainability; economic incentives

**OP:** wind-speed mapping and building code project; SMA gap survey assessment; draft work plan on establishing an interagency watershed coordinating committee in coordination with DOH to develop Watershed Guidance Document as road map for agencies and watershed plan development

**SCD:** statewide tsunami hazards; community exposure and sensitivity; inundation and evacuation zones

**SOEST:** Integrated Ocean Observing System in Hawaii: coastal ocean observing (marine ecosystems, coastal resiliency, modeling and data assimilation); beach safety; coastal erosion; working on goal of Hawaii Ocean Atlas

**Common Needs Identified:** enforcement, more data, increased capacity, and support at policy level

**Information Exchange:**

- “Hawaii Coastal Hazard Mitigation Guide Book” (DLNR- contact Sam Lemmo) created for opportunities such as the update of the county general plans; helps to reference in plans.
