Re: Time Warner Entertainment Company, L.P.'s Request for Intervention in DCCA's Public Hearing on Olelo's Application for Designation as a PEG Access Organization

The Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs ("DCCA") received Time Warner Entertainment Company, L.P.'s ("TWE") December 13, 2011 letter and request to intervene in the public hearing for 'Olelo Community Media's ("Olelo") October 25, 2011 Application to Provide Public Access Services Related to the State of Hawaii D&O No. 346 ("Olelo's Application"). According to your letter, TWE, through its Hawaii Division, Oceanic Time Warner Cable ("Oceanic"), represents that: (1) Oceanic has a substantial interest in the outcome of the designation of 'Olelo as a PEG access organization, (2) Oceanic's intervention will not unduly delay the public hearing nor is it intended to harass, hinder or prejudice the rights of 'Olelo, and (3) the denial of Oceanic's request to intervene would substantially prejudice the rights of Oceanic. Your letter further states that if its request to intervene is granted, Oceanic intends to submit written questions to 'Olelo about its Application and make reasonable requests for supporting and clarifying documentation to 'Olelo.

Based on the foregoing and pursuant to HRS section 440G-8.3(b) and DCCA's September 2, 2011 "Guidelines to Designate PEG Access Organizations Pursuant to Act 19 (SLH 2011)", DCCA hereby grants Oceanic's request to intervene in the public hearing process for 'Olelo's Application; provided that Oceanic's intervention shall be subject to the following:

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1. The written questions and requests for supporting and clarifying documentation by Oceanic from 'Ōlelo shall be limited in quantity and scope to what is reasonably necessary to allow Oceanic to formulate its testimony at the public hearing on Olelo's Application;
2. Such questions and documentation requests shall be limited to matters that are materially relevant to Oceanic and specifically relate to the designation of 'Ōlelo as a PEG provider on Oahu;
3. Oceanic shall submit its written questions and requests for supporting and clarifying documentation to 'Ōlelo by January 27, 2012 (with a copy to DCCA);
4. 'Ōlelo shall provide its responses and documents to Oceanic by February 3, 2012 (with a copy to DCCA); and
5. No follow-up questions or requests for documents shall be allowed.

For your information, DCCA intends to hold a public hearing on 'Ōlelo's Application in or about March 2012.
