ORDER

I.

By letter received by the commission on November 14, 2002, JUNE A. NOZOE, dba ISLAND EXCLUSIVE (Petitioner), requests that the inactive status of her certificate of public convenience and necessity no. 4825-C (Certificate No. 4825-C) be extended for an additional year. By Order No. 19088, filed on November 29, 2001, in this docket, Certificate No. 4825-C was placed on inactive status until November 29, 2002.

The commission notes that under Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) § 271-19, the commission may grant inactive status for a cumulative period not to exceed two years over the life of the certificate. Petitioner has 90 days remaining of this

cumulative two-year period.¹ Accordingly, we find that there is good cause to extend Petitioner's inactive status for this additional 90-day period.

II.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

1. Petitioner's Certificate No. 4825-C is placed on inactive status for an additional 90 days, until February 27, 2003.


2. If Certificate No. 4825-C is not reactivated prior to the expiration of the period of inactivity, it shall be declared abandoned and revoked. Petitioner may reactivate the certificate at any time prior to the expiration of the inactive period by filing a request to reactivate with the commission, and fulfilling the requirements for motor carriers including, but not limited to, filing of appropriate insurance documents and publication of a lawful tariff.


3. Petitioner shall not transfer her inactive certificate unless Petitioner can first establish good cause to the commission for the transfer, and the commission has approved the request to transfer.

¹ By Order No. 18122, filed on October 4, 2000, Certificate No. 4825-C was placed on inactive status for a period of one year, until October 4, 2001. Pursuant to Petitioner's request, Certificate No. 4825-C was reactivated on July 6, 2001, by Order No. 18669, thus leaving one year and 90 days available to Petitioner if she desired to place Certificate No. 4825-C on inactive status for a cumulative period of two years. By Order No. 19088, filed on November 29, 2001, Certificate No. 4825-C was placed on inactive status for an additional year, until November 29, 2002, thus leaving Petitioner 90 days available for inactive status.


