DECISION AND ORDER

I.

Application for Common Carrier Authority

By an application filed on October 15, 2004, and amended on October 20, 2004, BERING SEA ECCOTECH, INC. ("Applicant") requests a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a common carrier of property by motor vehicle over irregular routes on the island of Oahu in the specific commodities (hauling black oil) classification. The application is made pursuant to Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") § 271-12. By Decision and Order No. 21431, filed on October 29, 2004, in Docket No. 04-0308, the commission granted Applicant temporary authority to operate as a common carrier of property by motor vehicle, over irregular routes on the island of Oahu, in the specific commodities (hauling black oil) classification.¹

Applicant served copies of the application on the Hawaii Transportation Association, which consists of carriers that

may be affected by Applicant's proposed service, and on the Division of Consumer Advocacy, Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs ("Consumer Advocate"). The Consumer Advocate did not participate in this proceeding, and no persons moved to intervene in this docket.

II.

Findings and Conclusions

Based upon our review of the record, we find that Applicant is fit, willing, and able to properly perform the proposed service, and to conform to HRS chapter 271 and the requirements and rules of the commission. We also find that the proposed service is required by the present and future public convenience and necessity. Accordingly, we conclude that Applicant's request for operating authority, as set forth in the application, should be granted.

III.


Order


THE COMMISSION ORDERS that Applicant is granted a certificate to operate as a common carrier of property by motor vehicle over irregular routes on the island of Oahu in the specific commodities (hauling black oil) classification.²


