#### DECISION AND ORDER

By this Decision and Order, the commission authorizes MAUI OIL COMPANY, INC. ("Applicant") to extend its authority under Permit No. 4606-P to include (1) the transportation of specific commodities (petroleum products) over irregular routes Maui, on the island of pursuant to а contract with Chevron U.S.A., Inc. ("Chevron"), and (2) the authority to transport petroleum products on the island of Maui for contract clients in the future, provided that Applicant files executed contracts for such services with the commission prior to the commencement of such services.

I.

#### Application to Extend Common Carrier Authority

Applicant is currently the holder of Permit No. 4606-P, which authorizes Applicant to deliver petroleum products to Maui Land and Pineapple Company, Inc.'s facilities situated in Haliimaile, Kapalua, and Honolua, on the island of Maui, pursuant to a contract with Chevron. On November 22, 2005, Applicant

filed an application seeking commission approval to extend its authority under Permit No. 4606-P include (1)to the transportation of specific commodities (petroleum products) over irregular routes on the island of Maui, pursuant to a contract with Chevron U.S.A., Inc. ("Chevron"),<sup>1</sup> and (2) the authority to transport petroleum products on the island of Maui for contract clients in the future, provided that Applicant files executed contracts for such services with the commission prior to the commencement of such services.

Applicant served copies of the application on the Hawaii Transportation Association, which consists of carriers that may be affected by Applicant's proposed service, and on the Division of Consumer Advocacy, Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs ("Consumer Advocate"). The Consumer Advocate did not participate in this proceeding, and no persons moved to intervene in this docket.

## II.

## Findings and Conclusions

Based upon our review of the record, we find that Applicant is fit, willing, and able to properly perform the proposed service, and to conform to HRS chapter 271, and the requirements and rules of the commission. We also find that the

proposed service will meet the distinct needs of Chevron, and, pursuant to HRS § 271-13, will be consistent with the public interest and the transportation policy declared in HRS chapter 271. Accordingly, we conclude that Applicant's request for an extension of its contract authority should be granted.

In addition, we find that Applicant should be allowed to provide contract carrier services for other clients in the future without having to file additional applications with the commission, provided that (1) such services are limited to the transportation of specific commodities (petroleum products) on the island of Maui, and (2) Applicant files executed contracts for such services with the commission prior to the commencement of such services.

## III.

#### <u>Orders</u>

#### THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

1. Applicant is authorized to operate as a contract carrier of property by motor vehicle over irregular routes on the island of Maui in the specific commodities (petroleum products) classification pursuant to a contract with Chevron.

2. Applicant may provide contract carrier services for other clients in the future without having to file additional applications with the commission, provided that (1) such services are limited to the transportation of specific commodities (petroleum products) on the island of Maui, and (2) Applicant

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files executed contracts for such services with the commission prior to the commencement of such services.
