

provides that inactive status may only be granted for a cumulative period not to exceed two (2) years over the life of the certificate.

The commission finds that there is good cause to grant Petitioner's request. If Petitioner so desires, he may file, prior to the expiration of the inactive period granted by this Order, a request to extend his inactive status for up to one (1) additional year.

II.

Orders

THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

1. Petitioner's Certificate No. 1479-C is placed on inactive status for a period of twelve (12) months, effective from the date of this Order.

2. Pursuant to HRS § 271-19(b), if Certificate No. 1479-C is not reactivated prior to the expiration of the period of inactivity, it shall be declared abandoned and revoked. The request to reactivate Certificate No. 1479-C, along with the filing of all documents necessary for reactivation must be completed prior to the expiration of the inactivity period, or Certificate No. 1479-C shall be revoked.

3. Petitioner shall not transfer his inactive certificate unless Petitioner can first establish good cause to the commission for the transfer, and the commission has approved the request to transfer.




