

would constitute cause for the commission to vacate the Decision and Order. We served Applicant with a copy of the Decision and Order by mail, postage prepaid, on the same day that the Decision and Order was issued, in accordance with Hawaii Administrative Rules §§ 6-61-21 and 6-61-122.

Findings and Conclusions

The one hundred and twenty (120)-day time period has passed, and Applicant has not complied with the requirements set forth in the Decision and Order filed on February 5, 2009. The commission, thus, determines that the Decision and Order filed on February 5, 2009 should be vacated.

Order


THE COMMISSION ORDERS:


The Decision and Order filed on February 5, 2009, is vacated and this docket is closed unless otherwise ordered by the commission.


