<u>Call to Order</u>: There being a quorum present, Chairperson Lau called the meeting to order at

8:35 a.m.

Agenda: The agenda for this meeting was filed with the Office of the Lieutenant Governor,

as required by Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") section 92-7(b).

Minutes:

Executive Officer Oda stated that Ryan Takahashi of the Hawaii Electricians Market Enhancement Program requested that page nine, second paragraph, last sentence under the heading, "TG Electric, LLC" of the Board's June 29, 2012 minutes be amended to read as follows with deletion bracketed and insertion underlined:

"He also understood that [TG Electric, LLC] <u>Utility Partners of America</u> is hiring people from Craig's List to install these meters, which is cause for concern as there may be a safety issue."

Mr. Suehiro also pointed out amendments he wished to make on page two, under "Minutes", fifth paragraph, of the July 27, 2012 minutes as follows:

"Mr. Suehiro asked [whether the county enforces state laws.] if the county enforces Chapter 444, does the Board have the authority to override the county's decision? Deputy Attorney General Tam responded "no", the County does not enforce HRS chapter 444; the Board has the jurisdiction over HRS chapter 444.

It was then moved by Mr. Suehiro, seconded by Mr. Lee, and unanimously carried to approve the June 29, 2012 and July 27, 2012 meeting minutes with the above amendments, and executive session minutes of July 27, 2012 as circulated.

Jo Ann Uchida Takeuchi, Deputy Director of DCCA, made an appearance to inform the Board that the administration is looking to tap the education fund budget as a possible means of warning consumers about unlicensed activity. The fund's budget ceiling may need to be increased, depending on the need for resources.

Deputy Director Takeuchi also informed the Board that through past discussions, there has not been a good interplay between the Board and the procurement office. The Board should have a say on scope issues and DCCA is looking at the best approach to handle these situations. One proposal is that at the time the protest is filed with the agency, the matter should be simultaneously sent to the Board. DCCA is looking to amend HRS chapter 103D so that the Board will have an opportunity for input on the scope issues prior to a protest hearing.

Deputy Attorney General Tam stated that when protests are filed with the procurement office, it goes to the Office of Administrative Hearings ("OAH") with DCCA. OAH may want to check with the Board on scope issues, but the Board may not have a meeting scheduled before OAH must act. Currently, OAH is required to make a decision within 45 days. Since OAH would prefer that the Board determine scope issues, it was proposed that at the time a protest is filed with DAGS, the protestor must simultaneously contact the Board regarding any scope issues. The Board will then make the scope determination, not OAH. This also alleviates any time constraints, as DAGS (or any other procuring agency) does not have a deadline to act on a protest.

Mr. Suehiro stated that the way the procurement law is written, it does not require the second tier contractor to list its subs. The Board briefly discussed the problem of contractors who are listing the "B" General Building contractor as the second tier contractor, who then shops for the multiple trades needed for the projects.

Deputy Director Takeuchi thanked the Board for allowing her to appear and stated that the administration will be giving the Board updates on this issue.

Mr. Alcantara arrived at 9:00 a.m.

Chapter 91, HRS, Adjudicatory Matters:

Chairperson Lau called for a recess from the Board's meeting at 9:00 a.m. to discuss and deliberate on the following adjudicatory matters pursuant to HRS chapter 91.

1. <u>Settlement Agreements</u>

a. In the Matter of the Contractors Licenses of Appia Tile, LLP and Pavel Sedlacek; CLB 2010-239-L

RICO received a complaint alleging that Appia Tile, LLP and Pavel Sedlacek ("Respondents") performed poor workmanship on the complainant's tile project, and RICO alleges that Respondents failed to include the requisite contractual provisions, including bond and lien rights.

The Board discussed the settlement agreement in which Respondents, who do not admit to violating any law or rule, agree to pay, jointly and severally, an administrative fine of \$1,000.00.

After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Yamada, seconded by Mr. Lee, and unanimously carried to approve the Settlement Agreement Prior to Filing of Petition for Disciplinary Action and Board's Final Order in the above case.

b. In the Matter of the Contractors Licenses of MST Constructors, Inc. and James W. Bratton; CLB 2009-78-L

RICO received a complaint alleging that MST Constructors, Inc. and James W. Bratton ("Respondents") failed to follow the licensing laws related to RMEs. In this case, Respondent Bratton was not in residence in Hawaii while a project was under construction.

The Board discussed the settlement agreement in which Respondents, who do not admit to violating any law or rule, agree to voluntarily surrender their licenses.

After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Yamada, seconded by Mr. Lee, and unanimously carried to approve the Settlement Agreement Prior to Filing of Petition for Disciplinary Action and Board's Final Order in the above case.

2. Board's Final Orders

a. Sioeli K. Mafi
CLB 2004-337-L; CLB 2005-102-L
Request for Reconsideration of Board's Final Order

On January 14, 2010, the Board approved a settlement agreement which required Mr. Mafi to pay a fine of \$3,000 (in monthly payments of \$500) and restitution of \$2,370 (in five monthly payments of \$500 and final payment of \$370). Mr. Mafi also agreed that failure to make timely payments shall result in the automatic revocation of his license.

On December 22, 2010, the Board received an affidavit from RICO stating that Mr. Mafi did not comply with the terms of the agreement; therefore, on January 10, 2011, Mr. Mafi's license was automatically revoked pursuant to the terms of the settlement agreement.

On August 14, 2012, Mr. Mafi requested an appearance before the Board to request a reconsideration of his license revocation.

Mr. Mafi stated that he knowingly and unknowingly had a friend "use" his license and now knows it was wrong and he should not have done that. He asked the Board for leniency and to give him a second chance as he wants to pay back his customers and pay back a loan from his parents. He stated that he missed his payments to RICO because times were tough and he has a wife and kids to support.

Executive Officer Oda reported that Mr. Mafi had four (4) unlicensed activity judgments against him, for which he was required to pay over \$14,000 in fines and over \$23,000 in restitution. When asked for an explanation, Mr. Mafi stated that in 2005, his insurance expired so his license was forfeited, but he and his friend still did some jobs.

Executive Officer Oda stated that Mr. Mafi was fined a total of \$17,227, of which he paid \$15,000, and has a balance left of \$2,227. He also paid \$2,400 of the \$26,059 restitution imposed, with a balance of \$23,659. She also noted that his license was forfeited in 2005, and that rescinding the revocation will not result in the automatic restoration of his license. However, it would allow Mr. Mafi to reapply for his license prior to January 10, 2016.

Mr. Mafi was excused from the room.

The Board discussed whether they would rescind the revocation of his license allowing Mr. Mafi to reapply for a license before the required five-year period after revocation.

Mr. Mafi returned to the room.

DAG Tam informed Mr. Mafi that the Board was willing to allow him to reapply for a license, but there are no guarantees that he will get his license back. Depending on his financial statement, he may need to get a bond. If his credit report has charged off or collection accounts, he will need to take care of those, and he will need to retake the exams. If he is granted a license, he will need to pay the remainder of the fine and restitution as conditions on his license. Continuing to make payments while reapplying for his license will work in his favor.

After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Dill, seconded by Mr. Lee, and unanimously carried to approve rescinding the revocation of Mr. Mafi's license.

Following the Board's review, deliberation and decisions in these matters, pursuant to HRS chapter 91, Chairperson Lau announced that the Board was reconvening to its open meeting at 9:40 a.m.

Roofing Contractors Association of Hawaii

Executive Officer Oda stated that the Roofing Contractors Association of Hawaii again requested to defer this item.

City & County of Honolulu

The City & County of Honolulu requests determination on whether the C-68TN Communication tower contractor may perform repainting work on a 70' steel radio tower.

<u>Recommendation</u>: The C-33 Painting and decorating contractor license is required to repaint the 70 foot tall steel radio tower.

Lite Solar

Lite Solar requests determination on whether a contractor license is required to install photovoltaic systems ("PV") owned by Lite Solar but installed on other businesses' properties. The power generated will be owned by Lite Solar. Before obtaining a license, can they hire a locally licensed PV contractor to install their systems?

<u>Recommendation</u>: A Hawaii contractor's license is required to contract for the installation of a photovoltaic system, even if the actual installation will be performed by a licensed subcontractor.

After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Dill, seconded by Mr. Akasaki, and unanimously carried to approve the above scope recommendations.

Smart Meters

At its July 27, 2012 meeting, the Board had confirmed its previous determination that the C-13 Electrical contractor's license is required to perform the smart meter installations.

Executive Officer Tamanaha (also Executive Officer of the Board of Electricians and Plumbers ("E&P Board")) reported that the E&P Board had initially determined that no license was required to install the smart meters; however, they were deadlocked at their recent meeting when they revisited the issue. They reviewed additional information and are looking at the Kauai utility, what kind of training the installers have received, what kind of people they are sending out on the field to do the work, and is awaiting additional information on whether smart meters harm the public and why there was a casualty in Texas.

Peter Akamu, E&P Board member, stated that in past discussions, they had determined that alarm systems and irrigation systems required an electrician's license. They had determined that a license was not required for items being plugged into a wall outlet. They also discussed whether removal of an old meter and installing a smart meter would alter the electrical system. Small plug-in transformers that do not disrupt the electrical system would not require a license.

The E&P Board will be discussing this issue again at an upcoming meeting.
