It was moved by Dr. Guevara, seconded by Dr. Chun, and unanimously carried to deny the following applications based on the Board's previous decision that active duty military applying for licensure pursuant to Act 248, SLH 2012, must pass the ADEX dental exam.

c. <u>Application for Permit to Administer General Anesthesia and</u> Intravenous-Conscious Sedation

It was moved by Dr. Guevara, seconded by Dr. Sherman and unanimously carried to delegate the approval or denial of the following application to the Executive Officer pending the results of the dental office inspection.

The following agenda item was taken as the next order of business:

6. Old Business: a. Report of Investigative Committee on Use of BOTOX and

Dermal Fillers/Correspondence from Dr. Craig Fujioka

Mr. Paige questioned if this was the first or second discussion on this inquiry. Dr. Sherman clarified that this inquiry was discussed and deferred from previous meetings.

It was moved by Vice Chair Nakagawa, seconded by Dr. Wada to amend the title of 6.a. to read "Discussion and Action on the Report of Investigative Committee on the Use of BOTOX and Dermal Fillers/Correspondence from Dr. Craig Fujioka".

At the committee meeting, the Investigative Committee (IC) concluded that the use of BOTOX falls within the scope of practice in dentistry as defined by Hawaii statues. The IC recommended that licensed dentists in Hawaii including general dentists, oral maxillofacial surgeons and other ADA/CODA recognized dental specialists be allowed to utilize BOTOX specifically for the treatment of TMD/myofacial pain or other conditions specific to within the oral cavity complex. Dental practitioners should receive appropriate training; acquire necessary knowledge, skills, and experience necessary to provide this service in a safe and efficacious manner.

Dr. Chun questioned whether the Board could limit the use of Botox to the oral cavity. Mr. Ching stated if you go beyond the scope of practice, malpractice insurance may not cover should a claim be filed. Dr. Wada suggested the Board not include cosmetic procedures.

It was moved by Dr. Wada, seconded by Vice Chair Nakagawa, and unanimously carried to accept the recommendations by the Committee, and to not include cosmetic procedures.

b. <u>American Association of Dental Boards Survey on Allowable</u> Procedures

Dr. Sherman commented that the IC has determined that dermal fillers are allowed within the oral cavity for a dental procedure. Mr. Ching suggested that the Board should remain within their scope of practice in dentistry.

After discussion, the Board decided to defer on the matter until the next meeting.

c. <u>Discussion on Amending Board's Application Forms</u>

This matter was deferred to the next meeting.

d. <u>E-mail from Nic van der Lee Relating to Dental Assistants</u>

Performing Intra-Oral Scanning on Patients for Crown, Inlay, and Only Design as Part of CAD/CAM

This matter was deferred to the next meeting, pending further research by Dr. Chun.

e. <u>Letter from Professional Protection Plan for Dentist Relating</u> to Use of Botox

The Board accepted a recommendation by the IC that the use of BOTOX falls within the scope of practice in dentistry as defined by Hawaii statutes.

The IC recommends that licensed dentists in Hawaii including general dentist, oral maxillofacial surgeons and other ADA/CODA recognized dental specialists be allowed to utilize BOTOX specifically for the treatment of TMD/myofacial pain or other conditions specific to within the oral cavity complex.

f. Ratify Approval of Continuing Education Courses

It was moved by Vice Chair Nakagawa, seconded by Dr. Wada, and unanimously carried to ratify the following:

- 7. New Business: a. Matters Related to the American Association of Dental Boards ("AADB")
 - Dr. Sherman and Ms. Matsushima submitted reports which were distributed to the members for their information.

b. <u>Matters Relating to the Central Regional Dental Testing</u> <u>Service ("CRDTS")</u>

- CRDTS introduced their new Executive Director, Laura Jacob, RDH, MA.
- The 2013 Dental Hygiene Examination will be held June 15 and 16, 2013 at the Pearl Harbor Naval base.
- Mr. Kobashigawa informed the Board that Ms.
 Nonaka attended the CRDTS Steering Committee meeting and will make a full report at the January, 2013 meeting. Mr. Kobashigawa noted that CRDTS confirmed its commitment to maintaining and strengthening the perio portion of the dental exam based on findings of its Occupational Analysis and ADA data bank that perio is the most commonly performed service; and that effective 2014, CRDTS will administer a computer simulated perio and prosthodontic exam.

c. <u>Matters Relating to the American Board of Dental Examiners</u> ("ADEX")

- Exam candidates are given a choice if they want to take the perio portion of the exam or not. However, since most Board's, including Hawaii, require the perio portion of the exam be passed for licensure, those wishing to be licensed in Hawaii must choose to take the perio portion of the exam.
- Based on the results of an occupational analysis, the computer portion ("DSCE") will be reduced from six hours to three hours.
- The dental hygiene computer exam will not be shortened but weighting will be changed and local anesthesia will be permitted.
- Southern Regional Testing Agency ("SRTA") and the Nevada Board also administer the ADEX exams.
- Instead of a numerical score, a pass/fail score has been recommended.

- Because exam manuals have differences (due to NERB, SRTA and Nevada administering the exam), ADEX will consolidate and develop one manual for all examiners.
- Changes will be made to the calibration of examiners.
- New typodonts will be used in 2015.

d. <u>Matters Relating to the North East Regional Board of Dental Examiners, Inc. ("NERB")</u>

 Mr. Kobashigawa informed the members that the NERB Annual Meeting will take place on January 10th thru January 12th, 2013. All members are encouraged to attend; however, attendance is not mandatory. Dr. Baird, Mr. Ching, Ms. Nakagawa, Dr. Sherman, Dr. Chun, Dr. Ota and Ms. Matsushima expressed interest in attending.

e. Governor's New Day Plan Relating to Dental Initiatives

 Vice Chair Nakagawa submitted a report which was distributed to the members for their information. The Governor's Initiatives include providing healthcare access for everyone and is seeking ideas on how to reduce health costs, provide access to care, especially to children and the underserved, and to eliminate barriers to care.

f. Orientation for Board Members

 An orientation was held at the State Capitol Auditorium on October 24, 2012. Its main purpose was to make the Board/Commission members aware of their roles and responsibilities. Some of the topics covered were Ethics in Government, Sunshine Law, Attorney Client Privileges, Regulated Industries Complaints Office ("RICO"), and Contested Case Hearings. Additional orientation booklets were distributed to the Board members who were not able to attend the orientation.

8. <u>Correspondence</u>: a. <u>Letter of Inquiry from Vatech America Inc. as to Whether Dental Assistants Are Allowed to Operate Cone Beam CT(CTBC) Machines.</u>

The Board discussed whether an appropriately trained dental assistant can operate the CBCT unit similarly as they are able to operate a dental x-ray machine.

The CBCT is not a true medical Computerized Axial Tomography (CAT scan) unit. Because it is specially made for the dental profession, emits a much smaller amount of radiation than a medical CAT scan, and training is given by a licensed dentist and manufacturer, the dental assistant can safely provide services utilizing the unit. Finally, it should noted that dental assistants can only operate the CBCT unit under the direct supervision of a licensed dentist.

It was moved by Vice Chair Nakagawa, seconded by Dr. Guevara, and unanimously carried to allow dental assistants to operate the CBCT unit.

b. <u>Letter of Inquiry from Lou Ann Gleason, Relating to the Scope of Work of Dental Hygienists</u>

Chair Baird stated he believes this consumer product company wants to use licensed dental hygienists to endorse their product(s). Mr. Kobashigawa indicated that he will request for more detailed information from Ms. Gleason. The Board deferred this matter for more information.

The following agenda item was taken as the next order of business:

d. <u>Letter of Inquiry from Jason M. Lee on reciprocity issues and issues of dental specialist licensing.</u>

It was moved by Vice Chair Nakagawa, seconded by Dr. Wada, and unanimously carried to respond to Dr. Lee that he should contact state legislators in order to amend the statutes, with a caveat that Act 248, SLH 2012 has no provisions for the Board to consider reciprocity at this time.

5. Chapter 91, HRS, Adjudicatory Matters: At 11:13 a.m., Chair Baird recessed the Board's meeting to discuss the following adjudicatory matter pursuant to Chapter 91, HRS. Guests were excused from the meeting room.

a. In the Matter of the Application for a Dental License of RASHMI VASUDEVA – Hearings Officer's Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Recommended Order

It was moved by Dr. Sherman, seconded by Dr. Vallejos, and unanimously carried to approve the Hearings Officer's Finding of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Recommended Order as the Board's Final Order.

At 11:26 a.m., the Board came out of Chapter 91, HRS. As Chair Baird had to leave, Vice Chair Nakagawa reconvened the meeting and the Board returned to its regular order of business.

Executive Session:

At 11:26 a.m., it was moved by Dr. Guevara, seconded by Dr. Wada, and unanimously carried to enter into executive session pursuant to HRS §§ 92-4 and 92-5(a)(4) to consult with the Board's attorney on questions and issues pertaining to the Board's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities.

Guests were excused from the meeting room.

At 11:37 p.m., it was moved by Dr. Wada, seconded by Ms. Grey, and unanimously carried to move out of executive session.

g. <u>Discussion on Administrative Rules</u>

It was previously noted that the Small Business Regulatory Review Board ("SBRRB") did not currently have enough members for a quorum, thereby, the SBRRB was unable to conduct their meetings, including reviewing proposed rules amendments. Vice Chair Nakagawa informed the Board that if they desired to make additional amendments, this would be an opportune time. Mr. Kobashigawa informed the Board that additional proposed amendments would require AG's review of those proposed amendments.

The Board discussed the proposal related to the dental hygiene exam requirement and whether the exam requirement should be consistent with the current language in the statue allowing for acceptance of the four regional exams, or maintain the current proposal to require the passage of the CRDTS dental hygiene exam for licensure. To be consistent with the statute, the proposed changes would be to amend the following sections from:

"16-79-9(b)(3) Pass the CRDTS dental hygiene examination;"

"16-79-11.5(a)(2) An official verification of having successfully passed the CRDTS."

To change to the following amendments

16-79-9(b)(3) "Pass a regional dental hygiene examination pursuant to HRS 447-1(b) and 447-1(c)** until a national clinical dental hygiene examination becomes available;"

16-79-11.5(a)(2) "An official verification of having successfully passed a regional dental hygiene examination pursuant to HRS 447-1(b) and 447-1(c)** until a national clinical dental hygiene examination becomes available;"

** HRS 447-1(b) "The Board shall require an applicant to take and pass the State's examination or one of the following four regional clinical examinations given after February 1, 2005, by the:

- (1) Western Regional Examination Board;
- (2) Central Regional Dental Testing Service, Inc;
- (3) Southern Regional Testing Agency, Inc; or
- (4) North East Regional Board of Dental Examiners, Inc.
- (c) In addition to the requirement of subsection (a), applicant shall take and pass a national clinical examination once a national clinical examination becomes available and neither the state examination nor any regional examination shall be accepted; provided that an applicant who has taken and pass the state or a regional examination after February 1, 2005, but prior to the availability of a national examination shall be deemed to have met the board's examination requirement.

After discussion, it was moved by Ms. Grey, seconded by Dr. Guevara, and unanimously carried to approve the proposed amendments to further amend the current draft rules regarding the dental hygiene examination.

<u>Letter from Dr. Charles Fischer requesting reinstatement of Dentist license</u>

Dr. Fischer submitted a letter requesting his dental license be reinstated because he believes a clerical error on PVL's part resulted in him not receiving a license renewal and therefore caused his license to lapse.

After much discussion, it was moved by Dr. Guevara, seconded by Dr. Wada, and unanimously carried that Dr. Fischer's license not be reinstated and he must re-apply for dental licensure. In addition, the Board noted that no evidence was found that Dr. Fischer informed the Board of a change of address nor has he renewed his license since December 31, 2001.
