Agenda: The agenda for this meeting was filed with the Office of the Lieutenant Governor, as required by Section 92-7(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS").

Call to Order: There being a quorum present, the Vice Chair called the meeting to order at 9:12 a.m.

Vice Chair's Report: **Announcements**

None.

Approval of the Previous Minutes – August 4, 2011 Meeting

The Vice Chair asked the members if they had any questions about the previous minutes.

Ms. Nagashima stated that she would like the following change to be made: On page 6, under "Human Remodeling LLC", sixth paragraph, #2 should be "to her knowledge, the Board has never approved any MAE without a ~~roof~~ solid walls;".

The Vice Chair noted that the comment was attributed to her and she concurs with Ms. Nagashima's requested change.

The Vice Chair directed the Board to page 6, the third paragraph under "Human Remodeling LLC". She stated that she does not feel that the statements attributed to her accurately reflect her feelings on the issue.

The EO stated that the purpose of the minutes is to accurately reflect what was said at the meeting. She asked the Vice Chair if the statements attributed to her are correct.

The Vice Chair said it was possible, however, she would like the statements to more accurately reflect her thoughts.

The EO reiterated that the minutes are a recordation of what members say during discussion. If any of the members would like to clarify their position on any issue, they can bring it up, however, it is not appropriate to change the minutes of the meeting to reflect something that was not discussed.

There being no further discussion or amendments to the minutes, Ms. Nagashima voted to approve the minutes of the August 4, 2011 meeting as amended. It was seconded by Ms. Chock, voted on and unanimously carried.

Executive Officer's Report:

The EO reported that the PVL Division has hired a new EO, Kenyatta Nichols, who will be starting at the end of this month. Mr. Nichols' assignments will include the Board of Massage Therapy. She assured the Board that she will assist Mr. Nichols toward a smooth transition.

The Vice Chair asked if she had received any information about filling the Board's vacant position.

The EO stated that she has not received any information from the Governor's Office.

Ms. Gillespie stated that she had called the Governor's office and was told that no one had applied for the vacancy. She asked if it was still the Board's policy that you cannot hold a position with a national organization like the AMTA if you want to be on the Board.

The EO stated that the Board does not have a policy that prohibits anyone with a national affiliation from becoming a member of the Board. If anyone is interested in becoming a member of the Board, they may apply to the Governor's Office of Boards and Commissions.

The Vice Chair stated that she had asked several massage therapists ("MATs") and has been told that they do not have the time to serve on the Board, especially in light of the tough economic times.

Correspondence: None.

Open Forum: The Vice Chair asked the audience if they would like to address the Board.

Ms. Gillespie stated that she just returned from the AMTA National Convention in Portland, Oregon. While she was there, she was able to speak with NCBTMB representatives regarding the difficulty of Hawaii educated MATs have in obtaining licensure in other jurisdictions. She read a letter, dated November 1, 2011, from NCBTMB's CEO and Chair stating that the NCBTMB would work with massage graduates from the Department of Education ("DOE") schools and apprentice programs that fall within their educational requirements. Those that do not meet their eligibility requirements may use an alternate method known as Portfolio Review.

The EO noted that the Board did not receive a copy of the letter and that it is not on the agenda, therefore, the Board is prohibited from discussing it at this meeting. Upon receipt of the letter, it would be placed on the agenda of a subsequent meeting for discussion.

After discussion, it was moved by the Vice Chair, seconded by Ms. Chock, and unanimously carried to accept the hours that Ms. Tayloff completed at Massage School of Santa Monica, as follows:

Massage (Continuing Education Programs) – 500 hours
Massage Therapist – 150 hours

The Board directed the EO to inform Ms. Tayloff that based on the review of the documents submitted, she meets the education requirements for a massage therapist license.

New Business: **2012 Board Meeting Schedule**

Board members were provided with a copy of the 2012 meeting schedule.

The Vice Chair noted that the Board previously met on a Wednesday, however, the meeting day was changed to Thursday to accommodate the schedule of a previous member. She asked if the meeting day could be changed back to Wednesday.

There were no objections from Ms. Nagashima and Ms. Chock.

The EO was directed to coordinate change of meeting dates as discussed.

8/1/11 Request from Naomi Matsuda Regarding Whether a MAT Can Perform Lymphatic Massage to Treat and Prevent Lymphedema

The Board reviewed an email request on whether a MAT can perform lymphatic massage to treat and prevent Lymphedema.

The Vice Chair stated that in her request, Ms. Matsuda also asked if she can "practice to prevent developing Lymphedema".

After some discussion, upon a motion by the Vice Chair, seconded by Ms. Chock, it was voted on and unanimously carried that it is the Board's informal interpretation that the practice of massage is governed by Chapter 452, HRS and Title 16-84, Hawaii Administrative Rules ("HAR"). Under the definition of massage, as described in §452-1, HRS, Ms. Matsuda would be able to practice Lymphatic massage, provided that she possesses the training and certification.

The Board directed the EO to inform Ms. Matsuda that the practice of massage does not include the practice of prevention for developing Lymphedema. Further, the practice of massage does not include educating people suffering from Lymphedema, so that they can manage the condition.

This is an informal interpretation for informational and explanatory purposes only and is not an official opinion or decision, and therefore is not to be viewed as binding on the Board or the Department.

10/6/11 Request from Cherish Wagner Regarding License Examination Score

The Board reviewed a request from Ms. Wagner for the Board to accept her Hawaii Massage Exam score.

After discussion, upon a motion by the Vice Chair, seconded by Ms. Nagashima, it was voted on and unanimously carried to deny Ms. Wagner's request on the basis of §16-

84-27(a)(2), HAR which requires applicants for license to achieve a passing grade in order to be licensed. A passing grade shall be seventy-five points (75.00).

10/13/11 Vice Chair's Request for Follow-up to 10/29/09 Meeting Regarding Non-Shop Massage Establishment Applications and Attestation Statement

The Board reviewed the Vice Chair's memorandum suggesting that the Board include what was recommended at the 10/29/09 meeting as well as make any needed updates to the rules revision draft.

After discussion, upon a motion by the Vice Chair, seconded by Ms. Nagashima, it was voted on and unanimously carried to add an attestation to the Massage Establishment application that states "'I/We certify that the establishment is in compliance with Chapter 452, Hawaii Revised Statutes and Chapter 16-84, Hawaii Administrative Rules and the sanitation rules of the State of Hawaii Department of Health."

Unfinished Business:

Rule Revisions – Title 16, Chapter 84, Hawaii Administrative Rules ("HAR")

A Summary of Comments & Suggestions for Changes to Draft 10 written by the Vice Chair on behalf of the Rules Revision Subcommittee was distributed to the Board at their 8/4/11 meeting.

The Subcommittee recommended adding the definition for "massage therapist student" and retaining the definition for "massage therapist" as defined in Chapter 452.

The EO stated that if the definitions are already included in the statute, there is no need to repeat the definition in the rules.

The Vice Chair said she feels that people need to have a total understanding and be aware that the Board has laws and rules.

The subcommittee recommended the definition of "Direct Supervision" be changed. They would like the phrase "and who" deleted from the sentence that says "The sponsoring massage therapist or instructor of a student and who shall be at the location that massage therapy services...".

The EO suggested that if this definition deletes references to the duties of the sponsoring massage therapist, these duties/responsibilities should be codified elsewhere.

There was discussion about the pitfalls/consequences of itemizing standards versus adopting the profession's standard of care.

The Vice Chair said she would take the EO's suggestion back to the subcommittee for discussion.

The EO suggested that the subcommittee focus less on word for word amendments and place its efforts on conceptualizing how the rules implement the statutory provisions. For example, the subcommittee could focus on the different activities that the profession engages in, what is performed at each level, what supervisory/oversight duties are required of the principal massage therapist, sponsoring massage therapist, massage apprentice, etc.

The Vice Chair said she feels the subcommittee is not going to be able to address every single scenario.

Ms. Gillespie said she likes the EO's idea and feels that method would be easier for the subcommittee to address issues.

The EO reminded the Board that she previously suggested that the subcommittee provide the Board with the concepts they felt needed to be addressed. Once approved by the Board, the EO would have worked on the exact language. This is something that can be discussed with the Board's new EO.

Ms. Gillespie noted that currently there is no standardizing or monitoring of apprenticeship programs. She feels guidelines need to be in place to ensure that apprentices are getting the education and training they require.

The EO noted that the Board does have authority over the apprentice programs and the rules do address the curriculum they must complete. If someone files a complaint, it is referred to the Regulated Industries Complaints Office ("RICO") to do an investigation. Ms. Gillespie is referring to policing these programs, which the Board cannot do, mostly because there is no funding to do so.

Ms. Nagashima noted that when applying for licensure, all apprentices must provide a training report which lists their education and hours which is signed and notarized by both the apprentice's sponsoring therapist and the MAE's PMT.

The subcommittee suggested that §16-84-6(11) should be amended to add "(g) Towels and linens shall be stored in a covered container or receptacle, or a closed closet."

The EO stated that if something is part of the nationally accepted standard of care, then the Board doesn't necessarily need to insert language into their rules. She reminded the Board that Chapter 436B, HRS includes a provision that licensees must comply with the standard of care of their profession. She suggested that the subcommittee review the standard of care of the profession.

The Vice Chair stated that the statute and rules are not as fluid as the national standard of care. Furthermore, she feels that licensees do not have time nor would they research the national standard of care.

Ms. Nagashima stated that she feels the way the subcommittee was handled by the Vice Chair was not right. The subcommittee consists of the Vice Chair, herself, Ms. Gillespie and Michelle Takemoto. The Vice Chair called each member individually to ask their opinions, however, at no point did the entire committee sit down and discuss the proposed amendments.

The Vice Chair stated that everyone is busy and she tried her best to move the rules along. She tried asking additional people to join the subcommittee, however, most people she asked were busy trying to run a business or take care of their families. She does not want it to be based strictly on the AMTA or national guidelines. She stated that she does not feel that the summary she provided to the Board was a wasted effort and feels that the Board should discuss the items in the summary.

The EO reminded the members that the Board's laws and rules set minimum standards for the practice to ensure consumer protection. Each profession develops profession ethics. The EO reminded the Board that when the subcommittee was formed, it was made clear that the subcommittee could have engaged members of the licensing community. The subcommittee was supposed to meet and compile one statement that was unanimously agreed upon. This statement would then be brought to the Board for review. The Board developed the process for expediency. The EO stated that since it appears that the subcommittee has not complied with the Board's directive, the discussion should be deferred to allow the subcommittee time to meet again and come to an agreement.

Ms. Nagashima stated that she is not saying that she is not in agreement with the proposed changes, however, she feels the subcommittee should meet as a whole to review the concepts they would like to address. She stated that each time the Vice Chair called to set up a meeting, she was under the impression that other subcommittee members would also be present, however, on each occasion, when she arrived, she discovered that she would only be meeting with the Vice Chair.

Ms. Gillespie stated that she is willing to meet with the subcommittee prior to the next meeting to discuss the feasibility of the rules revisions.

The Vice Chair stated that she is not available during the last two weeks of December.

The EO noted that the Board's next scheduled meeting is on December 8, 2011, therefore, the subcommittee would have to provide the Board's written report to the Board's secretary no later than November 23, 2011.

By consensus, the Board unanimously carried to defer discussion on the rule revisions.

2012 Term – RICO Massage Therapy Advisory Committee

At their 8/4/11 meeting, the Board reviewed a list of possible advisory committee members and deferred decision-making on the list provided by RICO for the Massage Therapy Advisory Committee to the next meeting.

After some discussion, upon a motion by the Vice Chair, seconded by Ms. Chock, it was voted on and unanimously carried to approve the list provided by RICO for the Massage Advisory Committee.
