(a) Sian M. Evans, M.D.; MED 2008-107-L

After discussion, it was moved by Dr. Kosasa, seconded by Dr. Yorita and unanimously carried to accept the Settlement Agreement Prior to Filing of Petition for Disciplinary Action and Board's Final Order.

(b) Gerard H. Dericks, M.D.; MED-2008-155-L

After discussion, it was moved by Chair Takanishi, seconded by Dr. Barrickman and unanimously carried to deny Dr. Dericks' request to be released from probation in the State of Hawaii. The Board determined that Dr. Dericks is not compliant with the terms and conditions of his Texas Order, specifically, requirement #2, practice monitoring and requirement #4, chart monitoring.

Following the Board's review, deliberation and decision in these matters pursuant to Chapter 91, HRS, Chair Takanishi announced that the Board reconvene to its regular Chapter 92, HRS, meeting at 1:20p.m.

Dong K. Kim, M.D.

Chair Takanishi recused himself from discussion and decision making on this application.

It was moved by Dr. Kosasa, seconded by Dr. Yorita, and carried, with the exception of Chair Takanishi who recused himself, to approve Dr. Kim's application.

Rita Shah, M.D.

The Board reviewed Dr. Shah's letters of July 22, 2011 and July 28, 2011, requesting to formally withdraw her application for medical licensure.

After due consideration of this information, it was moved by Chair Takanishi, seconded by Mr. Cody, and unanimously carried to deny Dr. Shah's request to withdraw her application, and to further inform Dr. Shah that the withdrawal of an application at the Board level is considered a reportable action to the National Practitioner Data Bank in accordance with Section 1921, 42 U.S.C. 1396r-2. As such, the Board requests that Dr. Shah provide the information previously requested in its July 18, 2011 letter.

Ramy A. Badawi, M.D.

It was moved by Dr. Yorita, seconded by Dr. Akaka, and unanimously carried to approve Dr. Badawi's application.

Prakash S. Eapen, M.D.

It was moved by Chair Takanishi, seconded by Dr. Sept, and unanimously carried to approve Dr. Eapen's application.

Carl R. Griesser, M.D.

The Board reviewed and considered all of the records and files submitted with Dr. Griesser's application and information received from him as well as from other organizations. After due consideration of this information, it was moved by Dr. Kosasa, seconded by Mr. Puletasi, and unanimously carried to defer Dr. Griesser's application.

In deferring the application, the Board determined that:

- Dr. Griesser shall arrange, at his sole expense, to have one of the physician assessment and remedial education programs recognized by the FSMB ("programs") conduct and complete a comprehensive evaluation and assessment. Such evaluation shall include an assessment as to whether Dr. Griesser is able to resume an unconditional practice of medicine as well as any recommendations regarding whether any follow-up or treatment plans are necessary.
- 2. If the program selected to conduct and complete his evaluation determines that he is not able to resume an unconditioned practice of medicine, Dr. Griesser shall arrange for that program to specify what condition(s) would be recommended for him to safely resume the practice of medicine.
- 3. Prior to the Board's next review of Dr. Griesser's application, He shall arrange for the evaluating program to directly send the Board a written report including assessment, determinations and recommendations.
- 4. Depending upon the written report and recommendations, the Board may deny or approve his application for a license to practice medicine in Hawaii. Also, depending upon the written report and recommendations, the Board may evaluate what, if any, conditions are warranted for Dr. Griesser to practice medicine in Hawaii and impose such conditions.

Sumana Nanjundachar, M.D.

The Board reviewed and considered all of the records and files of Dr. Nanjundachar's application and information received from her as well as from other organizations concerning the abovereferenced matter. After due consideration of this information and her personal statements made before the Board, it was moved by Chair Takanishi, seconded by Dr. Yorita, and unanimously carried to deny Dr. Nanjundachar's application for licensure, basing its decision on the following grounds of the Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS"), which find support in the records and files of Dr. Nanjundachar's application:

HRS § 436B-19(1):	Failure to meet or maintain the conditions and requirements necessary to qualify for the granting of a license;
HRS § 436B-19(7):	Professional misconduct, incompetence, gross negligence, or manifest incapacity in the practice of the licensed profession or vocation;
HRS § 436B-19(8):	Failure to maintain a record or history of competency, trustworthiness, fair dealing, and financial integrity; and
HRS § 436B-19(9):	Conduct or practice contrary to recognized standards of ethics for the licensed profession or vocation.

Pooja Sharma, M.D.

The Board reviewed and considered all of the records and files of Dr. Sharma's application and information received from her as well as other organizations.

After due consideration of this information, it was moved by Dr. Kosasa, seconded by Dr. Bintliff, and unanimously carried to defer Dr. Sharma's application pending additional information and further review.

Daron L. Scherr, M.D.

The Board reviewed and considered all of the records and files of Dr. Scherr's application and information received from him as well as from other organizations, including but not limited to: 1) the disciplinary action taken against his Idaho medical license; and 2) the disciplinary action taken against his Alaska medical license.

After due consideration of this information, it was moved by Chair Takanishi, seconded by Dr. Sept, and unanimously carried to approve Dr. Scherr's application for licensure subject to certain condition(s), basing its decision on the following grounds in the Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS"), which find support in the records and files of his application:

- HRS § 453-8(a)(6): Procuring a license through fraud, misrepresentation, or deceit, or knowingly permitting an unlicensed person to perform activities requiring a license;
- HRS § 453-8(a)(9): Revocation, suspension, or other disciplinary action by another state or federal agency of a license, certificate, or medical privilege for reasons as provided in this section; and
- HRS § 436B-19(a)(6): Aiding and abetting an unlicensed person to directly or indirectly perform activities requiring a license.

The Hawaii Board is aware of Dr. Scherr's position that he believes he has done nothing which would support the disciplinary action taken by the Idaho Board. However, the Hawaii Board concludes that the actions taken against Dr. Scherr's Idaho medical license are grounds for conditioning his Hawaii medical license.

Similarly, the Hawaii Board is concerned with the information in the State of Alaska Medical Board's ("Alaska Board") Memorandum of Agreement ("MOA") dated June 27, 2007.

While the Hawaii Board recognizes that Dr. Scherr disclosed being placed on academic probation while a medical student at the University of Alabama on his Hawaii application, the Hawaii Board considers the misrepresentations on his Alaska application, whether or not unintentional, as significant reflections on his character and abilities to be accurate, honest, and careful at all times.

Based upon the foregoing, the Hawaii Board concludes that the disciplinary actions taken against Dr. Scherr's Alaska medical license are grounds for conditioning his license.

Therefore, the Hawaii Board hereby imposes the following conditions upon Dr. Scherr's license:

1. Dr. Scherr shall have the Idaho Board submit semi-annual written reports to the Hawaii Board regarding his probationary status in that jurisdiction. The written report shall state, at a minimum, whether he is compliant with all terms and conditions of the Idaho Orders.

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- 2. If at any time Dr. Scherr is not in compliance with the Idaho Orders, he shall immediately notify the Hawaii Board and immediately cease practicing medicine until the Idaho Board notifies the Hawaii Board of what conditions, if any, it imposes upon Dr. Scherr to become compliant with the Idaho Orders. Depending upon the Idaho Board's written report, notification, and orders, the Hawaii Board may evaluate what, if any, further conditions are warranted for Dr. Scherr to practice medicine and impose such conditions on his license.
- 3. Should Dr. Scherr wish to have any condition removed from his license he shall make a request in writing to the Hawaii Board, at which time the Hawaii Board may consider his request.

Peter Schneider, M.D.

The Board reviewed and considered all of the records and files of Dr. Schneider's application and information received from him as well as from other organizations concerning the above-referenced matter. After due consideration of this information and his personal statements made before the Board, it was moved by Dr. Kosasa, seconded by Dr. Bintliff, with Dr. Akaka opposing, to deny Dr. Schneider's application for licensure, basing its decision on the following grounds of the Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS"), which find support in the records and files of Dr. Schneider's application:

HRS § 436B-19(1):	Failure to meet or maintain the conditions and requirements necessary to qualify for the granting of a license;
HRS § 436B-19(7):	Professional misconduct, incompetence, gross negligence, or manifest incapacity in the practice of the licensed profession or vocation; and
HRS § 436B-19(8):	Failure to maintain a record or history of competency, trustworthiness, fair dealing, and financial integrity.

Praveen Venigalla, M.D.

It was moved by Dr. Yorita, seconded by Mr. Cody, and unanimously carried to approve Dr. Venigalla's application.

It was moved by Dr. Bintliff, seconded by Dr. Sept, and unanimously carried to approve the following applications:
