Call to Order: The Chair called the meeting to order at 8:40 a.m. at which time quorum was established.

The Chair excused Mr. Hoban from today's meeting.

The Chair asked members of the audience to introduce themselves.

Additions/Additional Distribution: The Chair called for a motion to add the following items to today's agenda:

Approval of the Minutes: The Chair called for a motion in regards to the minutes of the February 2, 2012 meeting.

Ms. Stone Murai stated that on page 9, under the bullets in the first paragraph, the second to the last line should include the words "on licenses" after "Currency and restrictions..." and in the next paragraph, add "s" to "presentation".

There being no further amendments or discussion, upon a motion by the Vice Chair, seconded by Ms. Cohen, it was voted on and unanimously carried to approve the minutes of the February 2, 2012 meeting as amended.

Chair's Report: The Chair stated that he and Ms. Cohen will be attending the NCSBN Mid-Year meeting this month and will provide a report at the next meeting.

Vice Chair's Report: The Vice Chair stated that she did not have anything to report.

Executive Officer's Report: **2012 Legislature**

The EO reported on the following legislative bills:

SB 2103 – Relating to Health

This bill amends the definition of "the practice of nursing as a registered nurse" to require registered nurses to carry out the orders of a physician that are delivered through a physician assistant acting as an agent of the supervising physician.

The EO stated that this bill was heard by both the Senate committees on Health and Consumer Protection, separately and both committees passed the bill out with amendments.

The Board members were provided a copy of the SD2 and it was noted that the amendment to the bill is to allow LPNs to also carry out the orders of a physician that are delivered through a physician assistant acting as an agent of the supervising physician.

It was the consensus of the Board that it had no objections to the proposed amendments in SB 2103, SD2.

HB 2023/SB 2182 – Relating to the Center for Nursing

These bills makes permanent the assessment and deposit of center for nursing fees into the compliance resolution fund and distribution of those funds to the credit of the center for nursing special fund.

The EO stated that both bills were heard by the committees that they were referred to and passed out unamended.

HB 2331 – Relating to Advance Practice Registered Nurses

This bill authorizes advanced practice registered nurses to certify death certificates and certificates of disability for disabled persons to obtain parking placards.

The EO reported that this bill was not scheduled for hearing and therefore is "dead".

HB 2621/SB 2883 – Relating to the Center for Nursing

These bills eliminate the sunset date on the deposit of certain nursing fees into the compliance resolution fund and distribution of the funds to the credit of the center for nursing.

The EO reported that these bills were also not scheduled for hearing and are also considered "dead", however, HB 2023 and SB 2182, should accomplish the same thing and are moving forward as previously reported.

HB 2258/SB2392 – Relating to Professional and Vocational Licensing

These bills require professional and vocational licensing boards to accept military education, training and service towards the qualifications of a license and require the boards to adopt rules.

Ms. Stone Murai stated that in the past, the only recognized military training was for LPNs who received training from Fort Sam Houston in Texas.

The Chair clarified that he believes Fort Sam Houston is affiliated with the University of Texas.

Ms. Fleming noted that HB 2258, HD1 indicates that the licensing authority "may" accept the education and training but that SB 2392, SD1 states that the licensing authority "shall" accept the education and training.

After some discussion, it was the consensus of the Board that the nurse practice act already addresses the requirements for nurse licensure in this State that would ensure that an individual who is licensed as a nurse has acquired the minimum education and training and has taken and

passed the national exam to provide safe patient care. Furthermore, should the education and/or training by the individual for a nursing license be completed while the individual was in the armed forces, the education and training requirements would be subject to the requirements of Hawaii Revised Statutes 457-7 and 457-8 to ensure the individual has received the appropriate education and training to maintain the national standards in the practice of nursing.

#### HB 2257/SB 2395 – Relating to Professional and Vocational Licensing

These bills require licensing boards to allow applicants to demonstrate competency in lieu of work experience required and to establish procedures to expedite the issuance of licenses, certificates, or permits to military spouses.

The EO explained that currently, the Board is authorized to issue temporary licenses to LPNs and RNs who have a current license in another state and have a Hawaii employer to sign the appropriate forms. These temporary licenses are normally issued shortly after the receipt of a complete application and the required documents that day.

After some discussion, it was the consensus of the Board that the current requirements for nursing licensure were established to ensure that individuals have minimum competency to ensure the safe practice of nursing and that anything less would jeopardize patient safety. The Board also determined that the current laws and rules already allow the Board to issue a temporary license in an expeditious manner.

#### SCR 53 – Requesting Collaboration Among Various Agencies to Identify and Remove Barriers Relating to Workforce Data Sharing and Nursing Practice in the State

The Board reviewed and discussed the contents of the resolution.

The EO stated that she was concerned with some of the statements in the resolution as it appears to indicate that the Board is failing to implement “barrier-breaking” legislation to allow APRNs to practice within the full scope of their practice.

Dr. Kula stated that once the resolution is passed, a copy will be sent to the Board and at that time, the Board can discuss the resolution and provide the information as directed in the resolution.

#### **Conference/Meetings/Seminars**

Dr. Kula briefly reported that there were approximately 200 attendees at the NCSBN World Café meeting, most of whom were nursing educators. There was much valuable information presented in a format that encouraged small group discussions. He recommended that a Board member who is an educator should attend if they have another meeting.

Dr. Kula indicated that he has not received a compiled report of the meeting’s discussions as of this time.

#### **Advanced Practice Registered Nurse Specialist – Update**

The Board reviewed an updated list of APRN specialties and national certifying organizations prepared by Ms. Stone Murai.

After some discussion, it was the consensus of the Board to refer this list to the Practice Committee for its review and any recommendations.

### **Pre-employment Drug Screen**

The Board reviewed an email inquiry asking if the Board had any policies regarding nurses who fail a pre-employment drug screen.

After some discussion, the Board determined that the nursing laws and rules do not specifically address pre-employment drug screens, nor does the Board have any informal policies on this issue.

### **Free Standing Birth Centers**

The Board reviewed and discussed a letter from Roxanne Estes, President, Hawaii Affiliate of the American College of Nurse Midwives on free standing birth centers and how Hawaii's regulations on Free Standing Birth Centers ("FSBC") prohibit nurse midwives from independently owning and operating FSBCs.

Ms. Estes was present to briefly discuss her letter to the Board.

Ms. Stone Murai stated that since the FSBC laws and rules fall under the jurisdiction of the Department of Health ("DOH"), perhaps their organization may wish to bring this matter to the DOH to see if it is willing to amend their laws and rules.

After some discussion, it was the consensus of the Board that since there are work force issues and possible barriers for APRN practice discussed in Ms. Estes' letter, that it be referred to the Hawaii Center for Nursing for their review and/or appropriate action/response.

The Board thanked Ms. Estes for attending.

### Education Committee Report:

Ms. Cohen reported on the following:

#### **University of Phoenix**

#### Annual Reports – Deferred to Board from December 1, 2011, January 5, 2012 and February 2, 2012 Board Meetings

The additional information that was requested for Ms. Dreflak was received and appears to indicate that Ms. Dreflak meets the requirements of Hawaii Administrative Rules §16-89-45(d)(6)(A) of having one year of nursing experience in her area of teaching responsibility. Ms. Cohen recommends that based on the information received for Ms. Dreflak, that the annual report for the University of Phoenix be accepted.

Quarterly Reports – Deferred to Board from December 1, 2011, January 5, 2012 and February 2, 2012 Board Meetings

The Board received and reviewed the quarterly report for the periods July – September 2011 and October – December 2011. Ms. Cohen recommended that the Board accept the quarterly reports for these periods.

**Next Education Committee Meeting**

Ms. Cohen announced that the next Education Committee meeting will be held on April 5, 2012, immediately following the Board meeting.

Upon a motion by Ms. Cohen, seconded by Ms. Stone Murai, it was voted on and unanimously carried to accept the recommendations from the Education Committee Chair.

**Request from Eluned Mun, RN, MS**

The Board reviewed Ms. Mun's written inquiry regarding her teaching experience and requirements for prescriptive authority.

Ms. Mun explained in her written letter that she is currently enrolled in the NP program at the University of Hawaii at Manoa. Her "specialty" is in Adult/Geriatric NP and she is scheduled to graduate in the summer of 2013. She currently holds a Master's Degree in Pharmacology from the John A. Burns School of Medicine and has been teaching both pharmacology and pathophysiology courses within the UH system and at Kaiser Permanente where she is currently employed as an intensive care nurse.

Ms. Mun stated that the teaching of both the pharmacology and pathophysiology courses will allow these courses to be waived by the Nursing School, and if her transcripts, which will not include the pharmacology and pathophysiology courses, and her teaching experience be acceptable when she applies for APRN prescriptive authority.

After some discussion, Ms. Cohen requested that Ms. Mun submit detailed information about her teaching experience, including but not limited to when and what she taught and where.

Old Business:

**Amendments to HAR Title 16, Chapter 89 – Status Report**

The EO reported that a copy was transmitted to the DAG for her review and determination if the recommendations by the Legislative Reference Bureau were substantive or not.

The DAG stated that she is in the midst of reviewing the draft of the rules.

**Participation in NURSY – Status Report**

The EO reported that she has submitted approximately 14 disciplinary actions taken by the Board to NURSYS.

### **Discussion/Consideration of Verifying LPN/RN/APRN License(s) of All States for Applicants Applying for Hawaii LPN/RN/APRN License**

The Board discussed whether to require all applicants for a Hawaii nurse license by endorsement to obtain a NURSYS report to verify the applicant's license in another state.

After some discussion, it was the consensus of the Board that since the laws and rules allow the Board to request verification of an applicant's license(s) in other states for those applicants applying via endorsement, applicants should obtain a NURSYS verification and if the state where the applicant holds or ever held a license does not participate in NURSYS, that the applicant obtain a verification of license from that State Board of Nursing. The Board determined that it is necessary to verify the nurse license in all states an applicant holds or ever held a nurse license to ensure that that license is not encumbered.

### **Board Member Vacancies**

The EO will inquire with the Licensing Administrator whether an announcement for the LPN vacancy can be added to the Board's website.

### **Delegation to EO on Applications**

The Board discussed whether they can delegate to the EO the authority to approve applications with prior convictions which were previously approved by the Board.

After some discussion, it was the consensus of the Board to delegate to the EO to approve the following applications for individuals applying for licensure who have prior convictions:

- LPN applying for RN
- RN applying for APRN

Furthermore, provided the applicant submits a signed statement that there has been no subsequent convictions since the Board previously reviewed and approved their prior application and that the delegation to approve falls within the current license renewal period.

The delegation does not apply to applicants with prior disciplinary action, APRN applicants applying for prescriptive authority and to any applicant with prior drug related convictions and/or disciplinary actions relating to illegal or prescription drugs.

### **Executive Session:**

At 10:35 a.m., upon a motion by Dr. Kula, seconded by the Vice Chair, it was voted on and unanimously carried to move into Executive Session in accordance with HRS, 92-5(a) (1) and (4), "To consider and evaluate personal information relating to individuals applying for professional or vocational licenses cited in section 26-9 or both;" and "To consult with the board's attorney on questions and issues pertaining to the board's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities;"

At 11:10 a.m., upon a motion by the Vice Chair, seconded by Dr. Kula, it was voted on and unanimously carried to move out of Executive Session.
