Call to Order: The Chair called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. at which time quorum was established.

The Chair excused Dr. Kula and asked the audience to introduce themselves.

At this time the Chair wished to take the agenda out of order.

Additions/Additional Distribution: Upon a motion by the Vice Chair, seconded by Ms. Stone Murai, it was voted on and unanimously carried to add the following to the agenda:

Old Business:

Hawaii State Center for Nursing

Ms. Yokouchi and Dr. LeVessuer addressed the Board in regards to a workforce survey for nurses.

Dr. LeVessuer asked if the Hawaii State Center for Nursing ("HSCFN") survey, which is currently at the end of the renewal, could be moved to the beginning of the renewal process. She explained that on the June 2011 renewal, the survey was at the end of the online renewal process which they believe is the reason for only a 24% return rate. She also stressed how important it is to conduct such a survey and that it should be mandatory for nurses to complete the survey in order to renew their license.

The Vice Chair stated that some states have better participation as they may have a more unified approach, but is it voluntary or mandatory?

The DAG asked how many states mandate that their licensees complete a workforce survey in order to renew their license?

Dr. LeVessuer and Ms. Yokouchi did not have that information available.

Ms. Yokouchi asked the Board to consider making the survey a mandatory renewal requirement.

Dr. Fleming asked how the HSCFN could ensure that the nurses respond to the survey accurately and if they fail to do so would their license be subject to disciplinary action?

The DAG stated that if it is mandatory as part of the renewal requirement, failure to do so may affect the license, although she doesn't think RICO would pursue if someone answered the survey incorrectly.

The Chair stated that he doesn't believe a law making it mandatory for nurses to complete a survey can be justified.

Ms. Yokouchi stated that the more responses they receive the more accurate the information in determining the future of the nursing workforce.

Mr. Hoban asked what the purpose or value of the data?

Dr. LeVessuer explained that the information would help employers forecast their employees, impact on the economy, determine what the workforce is doing, moving forward and the affect on patients.

Mr. Hoban questioned who would be fiscally responsible for collecting and processing data from the surveys.

Dr. LeVessuer stated HSCFN would foot the bill and that she would personally process the data from the surveys.

The Chair asked that HSCFN work with PVL before they decide to introduce a bill to mandate taking a survey in order to renew a nurse license.

The DAG stated that the Board has a mission and so does the Department.

Ms. Yokouchi stated that the HSCFN also has a mandate.

The Chair resumed the order of the agenda.

Approval of the Minutes: The Chair called for a motion in regards to the minutes of the September 6, 2012 meeting.

The Vice Chair stated that on page 2, under "Vice Chair's Report", it should read "She also mentioned that it was the recommendation of the delegate assembly to amend the NCSBN model act in regard to the EO being an RN, discussion on the increase in the NCLEX-RN pass score and concerns from the CGFNS regarding diploma mills.

Ms. Stone Murai stated that on page 3, under "Report from the Hawaii State Center for Nursing", after the first paragraph, it should read "The Chair asked, why would other departments support the reso and not the bill".

Ms. Stone Murai also stated on page 3, under the same Report, it should read "Ms. Stone Murai stated that under staffing can result in delays in updating and amending rules."

The Vice Chair stated that on page 3, under "Report from the Hawaii State Center for Nursing", it should read "The Vice Chair noted that an issue was raised regarding the students in the MEPN program not issued a nursing degree before taking the NCLEX."

Ms. Stone Murai stated that on page 4, under Chapter 91, HRS, Adjudicatory Matters, under Darren Ishii, delete "in length" under the second bullet.

There being no further amendments or discussion, upon a motion by the Vice Chair, seconded by Ms. Stone Murai, it was voted on and unanimously carried to approve the minutes of the September 6, 2012 meeting as amended.

The Chair asked for a motion in regards to the September 6, 2012 executive session minutes.

Upon a motion by the Vice Chair, seconded by Ms. Cohen, it was voted on and unanimously carried to approve the executive session minutes of the September 6, 2012 meeting as circulated.

Chair's Report: The Chair reported that Hawaii may be one of only four states that do not require criminal background checks for licensure.

Vice Chair's Report: None

Education Committee Ms. Cohen provided the following report for the Education Committee meeting on September 6, 2012:

- The submission deadline for annual reports from Hawaii nursing programs/schools have been extended from September 1st to October 1st;

- Recommend the Board accept the latest quarterly report for Kauai Community College and to remove them from submitting quarterly reports for new faculty as based on the last few quarterly reports, it appears that Kauai Community College is in compliance with HAR §16-89-45;
- Recommend the Board accept the quarterly report from the University of Phoenix;
- Recommend that the administrative rules be amended to reflect a 80% pass rate for Hawaii nursing programs/schools as this appears to be consistent with national practice;
- Based on the information submitted, it appears that Kurt Rutter meets the administrator requirements under HAR §16-89-45(d)(3);
- Based on the information submitted, it appears that Anne Scharnhorst does not meet the administrator requirements under HAR §16-89-45(d)(3); and
- Recommend the following amendments to HAR Subchapter 6 be considered:
 - §16-89-36 Survey of approved programs. Recommend Hawaii nursing education programs may be surveyed on an 8 year cycle and that programs granted probationary approval may be surveyed at a time of less than 8 years at the board's discretion;
 - §16-89-37 Accreditation. Recommend that this section be amended to clarify that all Hawaii nursing programs must be accredited by an accrediting organization recognized by the U.S. Department of Education and also consider amendments to the definition of "accreditation"; and
 - §16-89-40 Requirements. Recommend include clarifying language in reference to an "accredited" university of community college.

Upon a motion by Ms. Cohen, seconded by the Vice Chair it was voted on and unanimously carried to accept the Education Committee's Report and recommendations.

Practice Committee:

Ms. Stone Murai provided the following report on the Practice Committee's meeting on October 4, 2012:

- The Committee is working on clarifying and updating the APRN subspecialties and national certifying organizations;
- Review of amendments to the NCSBN Model Act and Rules in comparison to HRS 457 and HAR 89; and
- In response to an inquiry regarding if the Board had any guidelines or position on RN's administering propofol IV under the direction of a licensed provider, the Committee recommends that the nurse practice act is not specific in prohibiting certain procedures and that they do not recommend guidelines or have a position on propofol or any particular drug administered by an RN under the direction of a physician.

Upon a motion by Ms. Stone Murai, seconded by Ms. Cohen, it was voted on and unanimously carried to accept the Practice Committee's Report and recommendations.

Old Business:

Amendments to HAR Title 16, Chapter 89 – Status Report

The EO reported that the draft was being sent to the Governor's Office for request to hold a public hearing.

Participation in NURSYS – Status Report

The EO reported that there is no change in the submission of reports, however, she will be attending the NCSBN's Operations Conference in November and hopes to resolve some issues.

Criminal Background Checks

The Board reviewed Act 285, SLH 2012, Relating to Background Checks.

Hawaii State Center for Nursing

Continuing Education Joint Advisory Committee

The minutes of the September 14, 2012 meeting was distributed to the Board members for their information. Ms. Cohen and the EO reported that they were unable to call into the meeting as there were issues with the bridgeline.

Board's Consideration of Proposed Legislation Regarding Barriers to APRN Practice – Deferred from September 6, 2012 Meeting

The Board reviewed the proposed House Concurrent Resolution entitled "Requesting Collaboration Among Various State Agencies to Identify and Remove Barriers to Advanced Practice Registered Nursing Practice in the State"

Although the Board supports APRNs practice without barriers, there was no decision at this time on whether to support or oppose the proposed HCR.

Education Session: "Affordable Care Act (ACA) and Its Impact in Hawaii

Ms. Stone Murai gave a brief report on her attendance at this education session, partly sponsored by the HSCFN, held at Queen's Auditorium. Mr. Kula and the EO also attended. Speakers included Ellen Godbey Carson, attorney, Director, Alston Hunt Floyd & Ing and Beth Giesting, Healthcare Transformation Coordinator, Office of the Governor.
