7. New Business: a. Inquiry regarding "Certification of Eye Examination" form

Dr. Shoji reported that he had a patient who requested certification for her driver's license renewal. He gave his patient the form that he normally gives out. The patient reported that the form was rejected and they were given the "Certification of Eye Examination" form for completion by the person assisting her at one of the Honolulu Division of Motor Vehicle ("DMV") locations. He expressed concern regarding the section of the form that states "Recommended restrictions or comments: Qualified to drive?" and whether or not it is within the OD's scope of practice to answer such a question.

Chair Lui said he felt that there is no mandate for anyone to answer all of the questions, however, he believes it is understood that the person that fills out the questionnaire is doing so only in the context of their own profession.

The Board also reviewed forms provided by Kauai and Maui counties which did not include a similar question.

EO Matsushima reported that the office had contacted the customer service department of the Honolulu DMV asking where they could find the form that an optometrist/ophthalmologist can fill out in lieu of taking the eye test. A response was received from Jacqueline Windrath, Supervising Driver License Clerk which stated "We do not provide any form. Your eye specialist will need to provide you with a written certification stating that your eye exam was performed within six months and that you meet our minimum requirements of 20/40 visual acuity and 70 degrees or greater on your peripheral vision."

After discussion, it was determined that the question on the form "Qualified to drive?" was not within the scope of practice for a licensed optometrist to consider or to answer.

8. Old Business: a. Report from DAG Tsang regarding federal laws on board certification

DAG Tsang reported that she reviewed the case referenced in the September 2012 Optometry Times article "Board certification in optometry: a former insider's view from the outside." She said that the case only relates to the federal law and doesn't bar individual states from using the term "board certified".

EO Matsushima added that using any name in connection with the licensee's practice other than the name under which the licensee is licensed to practice is a violation of §459-9, HRS.
