Agenda: The agenda for this meeting was filed with the Office of the Lieutenant Governor, as required by section 92-7(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS").

Call to Order: There being a quorum present, the Chair called the meeting to order at 9:10 a.m.

Chair's Report: **Announcements/Introductions**

The Chair excused the Vice Chair and asked the audience to introduce themselves.

Additions and Additional Distribution

Upon a motion by Dr. Ma, seconded by Mr. Inafuku, it was voted on and unanimously carried to add the following application to today's agenda:

Approval of the Previous Minutes – April 19, 2012 Meeting

The Chair asked if there were any amendments to the minutes of the April 19, 2012 meeting.

Mr. Lau stated that on page 5, the first line should read, "Mr. Lau stated that he understands that this is a safety issue if restocking is not done by a pharmacist or pharmacy technician under the pharmacist supervision."

There being no further amendments, upon a motion by Ms. Kumasaka, seconded by Dr. Ma, it was voted on and unanimously carried to approve the minutes as amended.

Executive Officer's Report

2012 Legislature

HB 1965 – Relating to Continuing Education

The EO reported that the Governor signed HB 1965 into law (Act 24, SLH 2012) on April 17, 2012.

Mr. Lau wanted to clarify that based on Section 4 of the bill, the repeal of recognizing continuing medical education applies to license renewals for the licensing biennium beginning on January 1, 2014.

SB 2229, SD2, HD1 - Relating to Vaccines

The EO reported that the Governor signed SB 2229, SD2, HD1 into law (Act 42, SLH 2012) on April 20, 2012 and that she recommends that the Board clarify the new law and the training requirements

After some discussion, including information from the Hawaii Pharmacists Association, the Board issues the following interpretation of the new law:

- The Board will recognize the initial training/certification immunization course approved by the ACPE, regardless of when the course was taken and provided a completion certificate was issued and submitted to the Board, prior to administering the influenza vaccine to persons between the ages of fourteen and seventeen.

- The pharmacist who administers the influenza vaccine to persons between the ages of fourteen and seventeen shall also complete a training program or update training in the administration of vaccines prior to the renewal of their Hawaii pharmacist license. The training program or update training shall be approved by the ACPE and be at least one (1) hour in length. The pharmacist shall submit the completion certificate to the Board upon completion of the training or update training.

Mr. Lau asked if the Board's clarification on these matters are final and could the Board change its mind later.

The EO stated that the Board can issue an informal interpretation and that any subsequent requests will be brought before the Board for consideration.

There being no further discussion, upon a motion by Mr. Inafuku, seconded by Mr. Lau, it was voted on and unanimously carried that it is the Board's informal interpretation that the Board recognize the initial training/certification immunization course approved by the ACPE, regardless of when the course was taken and provided a completion certificate was issued and submitted to the Board, prior to administering the influenza vaccine to persons between the ages of fourteen and seventeen and that the pharmacist who administers the influenza vaccine to persons between the ages of fourteen and seventeen shall also complete a training program or update training in the administration of vaccines prior to the renewal of their Hawaii pharmacist license that the training program or update training shall be approved by the ACPE and at least one (1) hour in length and the pharmacist shall submit the completion certificate to the Board upon completion of the training or update training.

This is an informal interpretation for informational and explanatory purposes only and is not an official opinion or decision and therefore is not to be considered binding on the Board.

The EO stated that she will develop FAQs for the new law and post on the Board's web page under "Important Announcements".

Regulated Industries Complaints Office – Pharmacy Advisory Committee Addition

Upon a motion by Dr. Ma, seconded by Mr. Inafuku, it was voted on and unanimously carried to approve the addition to the RICO Pharmacy Advisory Committee.

Status on Continuing Education Audit – Verbal Report

The EO reported that audit letters were sent out to approximately 105 pharmacists. Pharmacists were given 60 days to submit proof of the continuing education by May 15, 2012. So far, 6 individuals have failed to respond and there is one request for consideration of continuing medical education pending the Board's review on today's agenda. The EO stated that she will be referring the 6 names to RICO for appropriate action.

Laws and Rules
Committee Report:

Report on May 31, 2012 Meeting

Mr. Inafuku reported that the Laws and Rules Committee met this morning to continue their discussion on proposed amendments to the definition of the "Practice of pharmacy".

He reported that the Committee reviewed and discussed the following definitions:

"Prescription" means a lawful order or formula issued within the scope of the practitioner's practice for a specific patient or animal by a practitioner licensed by the State or authorized by the laws of the State, including but not limited to, medical orders derived from collaborative pharmacy practice for the compounding or dispensing of drugs or an order or formula issued by an out-of-state practitioner in compliance with HRS 328-17.6.

"Medication therapy management services" means a distinct service or group of services that optimize therapeutic outcomes for individual patients. Medication therapy management services are independent of, but can occur in conjunction with, the provision of a drug or a device. Medication therapy management services encompass a broad range of professional activities and responsibilities within the registered pharmacist's scope of practice. These services may include, but are not limited to the following, according to the individual needs of the patient:

- (1) Performing or obtaining necessary assessments of the patient's health status;
- (2) Performing drug reconciliation;
- (3) Formulating a drug treatment plan;
- (4) Selecting, initiating, modifying, or administering medication therapy;
- (5) Monitoring and evaluating the patient's response to therapy, including safety and effectiveness;
- (6) Performing a comprehensive medication review to identify, resolve, and prevent drug-related problems, including adverse drug events;
- (7) Documenting and communicating essential information of the care delivered to the patient's other primary care providers;
- (8) Providing education and training designed to enhance patient understanding and appropriate use of his or her drugs or devices;
- (9) Providing information, support services and resources designed to enhance patient adherence with his or her therapeutic regimens;
- (10) Coordinating and integrating medication therapy management services within the broader health care management services being provided to the patient; and
- (11) Such other patient care services as may be allowed by law.

"Collaborative pharmacy practice" means that practice of pharmacy whereby one or more pharmacists have jointly agreed, on a voluntary basis, to work in conjunction with one or more practitioners under protocol whereby the pharmacist may perform certain patient care functions as authorized by the practitioner or practitioners under certain specified conditions and/or limitations.

"Collaborative agreement" means a written accord, involving mutually agreeable practice protocols and guidelines, between one or more Hawaii registered pharmacists and one or more practitioners that authorizes the registered pharmacist to perform certain patient care services, procedures or functions for which the registered pharmacist has received appropriate training required by these policies, procedure, or protocols, pursuant to HRS 461-1 and under specified conditions according to an order.

Mr. Inafuku stated that a draft of the amendments to date will be sent to the advisory members for their consideration and that any feedback will be discussed at the Committee's July meeting.

Correspondence:

Walgreens' "Well Experience" Pharmacy Video

The Chair asked the members if they had any comments regarding the Walgreens video.

Mr. Inafuku stated that he spoke with Al Carter of Walgreens and that this model allows for video monitoring of the pharmacy, including off-site.

The Chair stated that he had concerns because there did not appear to be immediate supervision by the pharmacist since the pharmacist was placed outside the pharmacy area consulting and counseling patients.

The EO stated that she also spoke with Al Carter and the lack of supervision of the pharmacy area and pharmacy technicians was also a concern in other states.

After further discussion, it was the consensus of the Board that based on the information contained in the video, it does not appear that the pharmacist is properly supervising the pharmacy area or pharmacy personnel, including pharmacy technicians.

Inquiry Regarding Strength of Medication Dispensed, Lynn Donovan

The Chair asked Mr. Lau to lead the Board in the discussion of the inquiry from Ms. Donovan.

Mr. Lau read an email from Ms. Donovan: "When a physician prescribes a medication (example: Isoniazid 300 mg po QD) and the drug comes in different strengths (example: 100mg and 300 mg tablets). Does the prescriber have to indicate which strength will be dispensed or can the patient/parent/nurse case manager decide?"

According to Ms. Donovan, the reason for the question is 100mg tablets are smaller and easier to swallow, often children and even some adults prefer 3 of these to the larger 300 mg tablet and that currently, the prescriber is asked to indicate 100mg tabs be provided but is this required?

Dr. Ma stated that pursuant to HAR 16-95-82 a valid prescription includes strength, quantity and directions and that changing the dispensed drug strength or quantity would require the prescriber's authorizations.

Mr. Edwards stated that the directions would also change.

After some discussion, it was the consensus of the Board to inform Ms. Donovan that in order to dispense a different strength than what was prescribed is prohibited unless you receive authorization from the prescriber.

Prescriber Information Leaflet

The Chair asked Dr. Ma to lead the discussion on an inquiry regarding the prescriber information leaflet that comes with every prescription medicine item.

Dr. Ma stated that according to the email, a pharmacist is questioning what the standard of practice is for including the information leaflet in the container for the patient or to discard.

Mr. Edwards noted that HRS 328-15 refers to the labeling of stock bottles, however, 328-16(g) refers to the label and packaging requirements for items dispensed to the patient or end user.

The Chair stated that federal regulations require certain medications include a medication guide.

Mr. Lau added that the federal regulation regarding the Medication Guides for Prescription Drug Products includes a Medication Guide Enforcement Discretion Policy and that it appears that for outpatient, the medication guide must be provided, when requested, for the initial fill and each time the drug is dispensed, when the medical guide materially changes.

After some discussion, it was the consensus of the Board that that there are federal regulations regarding medication guides that should be complied with even though the pharmacy laws and rules do not specifically address this matter.

Drug Information Fact Sheet

The Board determined that the same answer to the previous inquiry would also apply.

Old Business:

HAR Title 16, Chapter 95 – Status Report

The EO reported that she is still working on the justification but hope to have it completed and sent to the Licensing Administrator, Director and DAG before the next Board meeting.

Approved APRN-Rx for Controlled Substances – Joint Meeting with the Board of Nursing

The EO reported that the Board of Nursing appointed 3 members to meet with the Board.

After some discussion, the following members volunteered to meet with the Board of Nursing to clarify the APRN's scope of practice and specialties so that pharmacist may have a better understanding of the APRN's prescriptive authority:

The EO said she would work with the Board of Nursing to see when they would be available to meet and that the Board should be prepared to change their meeting date and time.

Issuing of a Pharmacy Permit Number Prior to the Pharmacy Submitting a Complete Application

The EO stated that she has been unable to complete the research on the NCPDP, DEA and NED process.

After some discussion, Mr. Inafuku volunteered to check on other states' process for issuing a pharmacy license/permit.

Open Forum:

Ms. Chock reported on the ACPE CE tracker and if the Board would consider accepting a summary report in lieu of the individual completion certificates.

The EO stated that she has accepted summary reports from the provider in the past and has reviewed information on the ACPE CE tracker program and does not see any problems accepting the report, however, she did clarify that she would accept the report from the pharmacist or if the information was readily available and easy to download, would consider downloading the information directly from the provider.

Upon a motion by Dr. Ma, seconded by Dr. Oliveira Gray, it was voted on and unanimously carried to approve the attached ratification list.

At 10:37 a.m., upon a motion by Ms. Kumasaka, seconded by Dr. Ma, it was voted on and unanimously carried to move into executive session pursuant to §92-5(a)(1) and (4), HRS, "to consider and evaluate personal information relating to individuals applying for professional or vocational licenses cited in section 26-9 or both;" and "To consult with the Board's attorney on questions and issues pertaining to the board's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities;".

At 12:10 p.m., Dr. Oliveira Gray was excused from the meeting.

At 12:17 p.m. upon a motion by Mr. Lau, seconded by Mr. Inafuku, it was voted on and unanimously carried to move out of executive session.

Upon a motion by the Chair, seconded by Dr. Ma, it was voted on with the Chair, Dr. Ma, Mr. Lau and Ms. Kumasaka voting yes and Mr. Inafuku voting no, to deny Mr. Bodendorfer's application based on the following sections:

HAR §16-95-110 Grounds for revocation, suspension, refusal to renew or restore, denial, or conditioning of license or permit. (a) In addition to any other acts or conditions provided by law, the board may revoke, suspend, refuse to renew or restore, deny, or condition a license or permit for any one or more of the following acts or omissions:

- (11) Professional misconduct, gross carelessness, or manifest incapacity;
- (12) Violation of any state or federal drug, controlled substance, or poison law;

HRS §461-21 Disciplinary action. (a) In addition to any other actions authorized by law, the board shall have the power to deny, revoke, or suspend any license or permit applied for or issued by the board in accordance with this chapter, and to fine or otherwise discipline a licensee or permit holder for any cause authorized by law, including but not limited to the following:

- (2) Professional misconduct, gross carelessness, or manifest incapacity;
- (5) Violation of any state or federal drug, controlled substance, or poison law;

HRS §436B-19 Grounds for refusal to renew, reinstate or restore and for revocation, suspension, denial, or condition of licenses. In addition to any other acts or conditions provided by law, the licensing authority may refuse to renew, reinstate or restore or may deny, revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license for any one or more of the following acts or conditions on the part of the licensee or the applicant thereof:

- (7) Professional misconduct, incompetence, gross negligence, or manifest incapacity in the practice of the licensed profession or vocation;
- (8) Failure to maintain a record or history of competency, trustworthiness, fair dealing, and financial integrity;
- (9) Conduct or practice contrary to recognized standards of ethics for the licensed profession or vocation;
- (12) Failure to comply, observe, or adhere to any law in a manner such that the licensing authority deems the applicant or holder to be an unfit or improper person to hold a license;
- (13) Revocation, suspension, or other disciplinary action by another state or federal agency against a licensee or applicant for any reason provided by the licensing laws or this section;
