<u>Correspondence</u>: a. <u>September 7, 2011 email from Marcia L. Courter, Psy.D.</u> regarding proposal for completion of Postdoctoral Fellowship

Members reviewed an email from Marcia L. Courter, Psy.D. dated September 7, 2011, requesting that the Board review and consider two possible postdoctoral fellowship positions.

Discussion followed. The Board advised Ms. Courter of the following:

- 1. Should she accept any of the positions referenced in her letter to satisfy the Board's postdoctoral experience requirement, her supervision shall be completed under the supervision of: 1) a licensed psychologist; 2) a person who holds a doctoral degree in psychology or educational psychology from an accredited institution, granted prior to 1970, and is listed in the National Register of Health Service Providers in Psychology; or 3) a person who is a diplomate, by examination, of the ABPP in accordance with Hawaii Administrative Rules ("HAR") 16-98-8(2). Additionally, her supervisor will be responsible for the direction of her supervision in accordance with HAR § 16-98-2.
- 2. In the past, the Board has informally opined that providing supervision to postdoctoral fellows utilizing teleconference and/or a video teleconference system is an appropriate means of supervision as long as the supervising psychologist is readily available to the supervisee by any means possible, which would include, but is not limited to teleconference or video teleconference system. Also, the Board recommends that at least two (2) hours of in-person supervision be provided as recommended by the American Psychological Association.
- 3. While the Board reviewed each of her proposed options, it determined that it will **not** provide a recommendation as to which career path/option would best fit her situation. Again, it suggests that she adhere to the advice provided in Nos. 1 and 2 above.

Lastly, the Board advised that this response is an informal interpretation in accordance with HAR § 16-201-90. It is not an official opinion or decision, and therefore is **not** to be viewed as binding on the Board or the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs.
