# Unfinished Business: a. <u>Audiologist and Speech Pathologist License</u> <u>Requirements</u>

At the Board's August 2, 2011 meeting, DAG Wong related that if the American Board of Audiology ("ABA") certification requirements are equal to, or greater than the requirements for the ASHA certificate of clinical competence, the Board would be able to amend its rules to accept an ABA certification to qualify for licensure. The Board came to a consensus to research and compare the requirements for an ABA board certification and an ASHA certificate of clinical competence to determine if they are equivalent.

The Executive Officer prepared a comparison of the 2007 and 2011 ASHA Audiology Standards and the ABA requirements for the Board's review. Information on the Standards for Knowledge and Skills Outcomes; Foundations of Practice; Prevention and Identification; Evaluation; Treatment; and Assessment were not available on the ABA website. Dr. Takekawa related that she reviewed the AuD program curriculum for Northwestern University, Towson University, and Arizona State University and it appeared that those programs have the same standards as the ASHA standards.

After much discussion, the Board agreed that Dr. Takekawa would contact the ABA to find out when ABA first issued board certifications and to get more detailed information on ABA board certification requirements and standards.

### New Business: a. <u>New Audiology Praxis Exam</u>

The Executive Officer related that in an email dated October 14, 2011, ASHA informed the Board that Educational Testing Service ("ETS") developed a new audiology examination which will be effective November 12, 2011. The passing score for the new audiology examination is 170. HAR section 16-100-31 requires a passing score of 600 on the examination.

DAG Wong related that HRS section 468E-5(3) and section 468E-10(a) would allow the Board to accept the new Praxis exam and passing score.

It is not possible for the Board to amend HAR section 16-100-31 to reflect the new passing score before the effective date of November 12, 2011. It was moved by Dr. Takekawa, seconded by Ms. Horner, and unanimously carried to accept the ETS recommended passing score of 170.

<u>Hawaii</u> Administrative <u>Rules</u> :	None.	
<u>Hawaii Revised</u> <u>Statutes</u> :		Members discussed whether applicants that have been subject to disciplinary action or convicted of a crime could perform speech pathology and audiology services under HRS section 468E-8(c) which states:
		"A person certified by ASHA or licensed under the laws of another state or the District of Columbia as a speech pathologist or audiologist who has applied for a license in this State may perform speech pathology or audiology services in this State for a period not to exceed ninety days from the time of submitting the person's application."
		DAG Wong related that HRS section 468E-8(c) gives the Board the discretion to allow applicants to perform speech pathology or audiology services. In addition, HRS section 436B-19(13) provides that the Board may deny an application for licensure or condition a license due to disciplinary action by another state or federal agency against a licensee or applicant. Since the Board must review disciplinary actions and convictions before issuing a license, the Board came to a consensus that an applicant who has been subject to disciplinary action or convicted of a crime should not be allowed to perform speech pathology and audiology services under HRS section 468E- 8(c).
