<u>Call to Order</u>: There being a quorum present, the meeting was called to order at

10:00 a.m. by Chairperson Dr. Kaya.

After discussion, it was moved by Dr. Kaufman, seconded by Dr. Woltmon, and unanimously carried to approve the minutes of the July 18, 2012 meeting as amended.

It was moved by Dr. Woltmon, seconded by Dr. Yuen, and unanimously carried for Mr. Kita to be elected to the position of Vice-Chairperson of the Board.

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Scope of Practice: A.

Request for Board response to September 15, 2012 email inquiry from Dr. Lisa Labrecque regarding a non-profit 501c3 organization operating a veterinary clinic that serves the public and shelter animals.

Discussion ensued on an inquiry received from Dr. Labrecque, asking "can a non-profit 501c3 organization operate a veterinary clinic that serves the public, in addition to the shelter animals?". DAG Wong advised that the Board's laws and rules do not specifically address the operation or organization of a profit or non-profit company in the veterinarian business. The Board suggested Dr. Labrecque consult private counsel for appropriate advice and guidance.

In accordance with HAR section 16-201-90, the above interpretation is for informational and explanatory purposes only. It is not an official opinion or decision, and therefore is not to be viewed as binding on the Board.

Dr. Woltmon commented that this inquiry may be related to recent events whereby some states are closing shelters owned by non-veterinarians. He further commented that veterinarians are bound by a code of ethics, standards of care; therefore, may be one of the reasons why some states requires owners of clinics/shelters to be licensed veterinarians.

Chairperson's Report:

A. <u>Joint meeting with the Pharmacy Board regarding</u> <u>guidelines</u>

Chairperson Dr. Kaya summarized his meeting with Dr. Ako and the Pharmacy Board's Executive Officer, Ms. Teshima, regarding veterinary products/medications available for purchase at pharmacy counters to consumers with no medical prescription by a veterinarian. Discussion ensued on the risk an unsuspecting consumer may take by purchasing these medications/products for their pets without consulting their veterinarians, and by relying on the pharmacists, who may be limited in their knowledge of animal care. Dr. Kaya noted that Ms. Teshima was not aware of this situation, and told him that she would follow up with the Regulated Industries Complaints Office on this matter. Dr. Kaya commented that while this may not be illegal, it was "not quite ethical".

Chairperson Dr. Kaya stated Dr. Ako suggested that the two Boards, the Veterinary Board and the Pharmacy Board, have a joint meeting to discuss and possibly set guidelines for pharmacies who are selling over the counter veterinary products/medications. Executive Officer Bhanot commented that Ms. Teshima would like to have this guideline in place by the ending of the year and that they may be able to utilize other existing guidelines they have in place with other Boards to help this Board.

DAG Wong commented that guidelines have no effect of law and are not binding to this Board. DAG Wong further commented that a disclaimer could be placed on the guideline, stating that the Veterinary Board did not vote on any matters regarding the impending guidelines, being that the next Board meeting is January 16, 2013.

Further discussion ensued on forming a committee who could meet and discuss on this matter and report to the Board at its subsequent meeting, to comply with the sunshine law. It was moved by Dr. Woltmon, seconded by Dr. Kaufman, and unanimously carried to form a committee to formulate guidelines for pharmacies, with the following members:

Executive Officer's Report:

A. <u>National Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners ("NBVME")</u>

(1) 2011-2012 NAVLE Technical Report

Executive Officer Bhanot provided a brief summary of the 2011-2012 NAVLE Technical Report, items were written by veterinarians identified by the NBVME. Ms. Bhanot provided the following information based on that report:

Fall 2011 testing window: (Nov – Dec 2011)
 3,828 eligible candidates
 3,767 sat for the exam
 1 Hawaii candidate

Spring 2012 testing window: (Apr 2012)
 1,004 eligible candidates
 962 sat for the exam
 1 Hawaii candidate

Executive Officer Bhanot stated the report included statistics on the performance of candidates, sample score reports and diagnostic score reports, and results of an optional post-test survey.
