Call to Order: The Chair called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., at which time quorum was

established.

Chair's Report: The Chair announced that the Committee may move into executive session to

consult with the Commission's attorney on questions and issues pertaining to the Commission's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities in accordance

with Section 92-5(a)(4), HRS.

Commissioner Harvey was excused from today's meeting. Prior notice of his

non-attendance was received.

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SEO's Report:

Minutes of Previous Meetings

Upon a motion by Commissioner Loudermilk, seconded by Commissioner Gendrano, it was voted on and unanimously carried to accept the minutes of the December 9, 2010, Laws and Rules Review Committee meeting as circulated.

SEO Fujitani reminded the Commissioners that due to the furloughs the next full Real Estate Commission meeting is scheduled for Thursday, January 28, 2010. The 25th Legislative session will begin on January 20th with an early adjournment of April 29, 2010. The furloughs may have an impact on the Real Estate Branch during this legislative session.

Program of Work, FY10:

Legislative Acts and Resolutions

A copy of a proposed bill relating to real estate brokers and salespersons; continuing education was distributed for informational purposes. The bill intends to increase the continuing education requirements from ten hours to a minimum of 20 hours for real estate brokers and salespersons. Requires that a real estate applicant be a high school graduate or its equivalent as determined by the real estate commission.

SEO Fujitani noted that it will be a challenge to encourage the providers to offer more courses for licensees to meet their requirements. Staff would need time to lay the groundwork and work with schools should there be an increase in CE hours. The bill is looking at the 2011-2012 licensing biennium as a start date.

Myoung Oh, Hawaii Association of REALTORS®, reported that although it is well beyond the statute, HAR is hoping if the bill does lead to an increase of hours, that there will be more leverage of national courses being offered in Hawaii and possibly of having more core courses required during the biennium in core subjects such as agency and fair housing.

Commissioner Kuriyama questioned the Commissions position.

SEO Fujitani replied that looking at past history, the Commission wanted to increase the number of continuing education hours when the industry wanted to increase the hours to raise the professionalism within the industry.

Commissioner Kuriyama noted that this item should be placed on future agendas to give the public the opportunity to provide comments on increasing the number of hours. It also warrants further discussion at the Education Review Committee meeting.

Commissioner Aiona noted that levels and standards for designation course are higher and should be given more credit hours for continuing education.

Commissioners noted their overall support of the bill in concept and suggested referring the issue to the EETF committee for further discussion.

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> Deputy Attorney General Wong noted that in relation to the sunshine law, the public will have the opportunity to provide its comments and testimony on this issue at the legislature if the bill is introduced and heard.

Upon a motion by Commissioner Ball, seconded by Commissioner Aiona, it was voted on and unanimously carried to refer the issue of an increase in continuing education hours to the EETF Committee for further review.
