	Upon a motion by Commissioner Abrams, seconded by Commissioner Nishihara, it was voted on and unanimously carried to accept the minutes of the June 14, 2005 Laws and Rules Review Committee meeting.
	The Commissioners were requested to turn in their Schedule of Non- Accessible Dates for the months of July through December 2005 to staff by the end of the month. They were also asked to notify staff if there are any changes once it has been submitted.
<u>Chair's Report:</u>	Chair or Chair Pro Tem of the Real Estate Commission
	The Deputy Attorney General stated pursuant to §467-3, HRS, the Chair of the Real Estate Commission shall be designated by the appointing power, which is the Governor. The Governor has not yet appointed a Chair to the Commission. However, the Committee and the Commission can act in their capacity as a group as long as quorum is ensured. The recommendations of the Committee can be ratified by the Commission when the Chair is appointed.
	For the purposes of today's Committee meetings, the Deputy Attorney General stated that it would not be necessary to appoint a Chair Pro Tem for the Committees. The Commission could conduct the meetings with the existing Chairs in place in order to properly carry out its responsibilities. The Commissioners agreed to continue with the existing Chairs and Vice Chairs until the appointment of the REC Chair has been announced.
