Call to Order:	The Chair called the meeting to order at 9:03 a.m., at which time quorum was established.
Chair's Report:	The Chair announced that the Committee may move into executive session to consult with the Commission's attorney on questions and issues pertaining to the Commission's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities in accordance with Section 92-5(a)(4), HRS.

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SEO's Report:	Minutes of Previous Meetings
	Upon a motion by Commissioner Ball, seconded by Commissioner Loudermilk, it was voted on and unanimously carried to accept the minutes of the May 6, 2009, Laws and Rules Review Committee meeting as circulated.
Program of Work, FY09:	Advice, Education, and Referral – Advertising on Social Networks and Forums
	The Hawaii Association of Realtors through Myoung Oh questioned whether licensees were governed by the advertising laws and rules if the licensees participated in the various internet social networking websites.

Commissioners responded that if the discussion pertained to real estate, then the easy answer would be yes the advertising laws and rules apply regardless of the type of media. However, it was recognized that not all discussions rise to that level and may be purely social.

Commissioner Suiso arrived at 9:11 a.m.

One thing to consider is that once the licensee is granted a real estate license, the licensee is never a civilian. Whether or not real estate is a topic of conversation, licensees are constantly marketing themselves.

As it is, technology is constantly changing and it is futile to make a general determination of advertising laws and rules violations applicable to all models of internet social interaction. Violations occur on a case-by-case basis and the individual licensee should consult with the brokerage firm's policies and procedures manual. If the licensee is in doubt on whether the conduct violates the laws and rules, to be on the safe side, disclosure should occur.

When the commissioners asked if any further guidance is necessary, Mr. Oh stated he understood the position of the Commission from the discussion that transpired.

### Legislative Acts and Resolutions

Commissioner Abrams stated that Act 66 relating to the Mortgage Fraud and Prevention Act was signed into law.

### Ad Hoc Committee on Consumer-Broker Relationships
