

Minimum Qualification Specifications
for the Classes:

BUILDING CONSTRUCTION INSPECTOR I, II & III
(BUILDING CONST INSPECTOR I, II & III)

Basic Experience/Education Requirements:

Work experience which involved tasks that demonstrated the ability to read and understand oral and written instructions; and write simply and directly, and perform arithmetic computations.

Graduation from high school, or equivalent, may be substituted for the work experience described above.

Experience Requirements:

Except for the substitutions provided for below, applicants must have had progressively responsible experience in the quantities shown in the table below and of the types and quality described in the paragraphs below, or any equivalent combination of training and experience.

Building Construction Insp I	2	0	2
Building Construction Insp II	2	1	3
Building Construction Insp III	2	2	4*

General Experience: Journey level experience in the building construction trades which demonstrated knowledge of the full range of specialized knowledge, skills, abilities and practices used in such trades, including knowledge of building construction methods and materials and safety requirements and practices, and the ability to read and interpret blueprints and sketches.

Specialized Experience:

- A. Building construction inspection work experience; or
- B. Supervisory work experience, over a force of skilled trades workers

in the building construction industry that involved responsibility for interpreting plans and specifications and inspecting the quality of workmanship and materials for adherence to such plans and specifications.

For the III level, at least one year of experience must have been comparable to the Building Construction Inspector II level in the State service.

* Applicants for the Building Construction Inspector III level must possess supervisory aptitude.

Supervisory Aptitude: Supervisory aptitude is the demonstration of aptitude or potential for the performance of supervisory duties through successful completion of regular or special assignments which involve some supervisory responsibilities or aspects; by serving as a group or team leader, or in similar work in which opportunities for demonstrating supervisory capabilities exist; by completion of training courses in supervision accompanied by application of supervisory skills in work assignments; or by favorable appraisals by a supervisor indicating the possession of supervisory potential.

Quality of Experience:

Possession of the required number of years of experience will not in itself be accepted as proof of qualification for a position. The applicant's overall experience must have been of such scope and level of responsibility as to conclusively demonstrate that he/she has the ability to perform the duties of the position for which he/she is being considered.

License Requirement:

Applicants must possess a valid license to drive in the State of Hawaii.

Substitutions Allowed:

1. Graduation from an accredited college or university with a bachelor's degree in civil engineering or architecture may be substituted for the two (2) years of General Experience required.
2. Excess Specialized Experience may be substituted for the General Experience on a month-for-month basis.

Tests:


Applicants may be required to qualify on an appropriate examination.

Physical and Medical Requirements:

Applicants must be able to perform the essential duties and responsibilities of the position effectively and safely, with or without reasonable accommodation.

This is an amendment to the minimum qualification specification for the classes BUILDING CONSTRUCTION INSPECTOR I, II and III (BUILDING CONST INSPECTOR I, II & III), that was approved on April 27, 1973.
