Education Requirement

Graduation from high school, or equivalent. One year of work experience requiring the ability to read, comprehend and apply written directions or a high degree of verbal skill may be substituted for the Education Requirement. This requirement may be met from part-time and/or unpaid work. There must, however, be evidence that participation was on a continuous basis but not necessarily on a full-time normal work basis.

Experience Requirements

Applicants must have had progressively responsible experience of the kind and quality described below and in the amount shown in the following table, or any equivalent combination of training and experience:

Specialized Experience: Progressively responsible work experience which involved inspecting premises for evidence of various pests and vectors; recommending and initiating necessary corrective activities or other work experience in the field of public health which has given the applicant knowledge of general sanitation and vector-control measures.

Technical Advisory and/or Supervisory Experience:

Applicants must possess one or any combination of A or B below:

- A. Technical Advisory Experience

Progressively responsible work experience which involved providing technical assistance and advice to major land users in implementing proper source reduction measures to reduce or eliminate breeding sources of vectors. The work experience must have included such duties as inspecting major vector breeding areas, conferring with major land users, and assisting in promoting effective corrective action to reduce or eliminate vector breeding sources.

B. Supervisory Experience

Responsible work experience in the field of vector control which included such duties and responsibilities as coordinating and assigning the work of vector control personnel and crews; evaluating performance; providing technical assistance in difficult and problem cases; and conducting training of subordinate personnel engaged in vector control or other general sanitation work.

*For the Vector Control Inspector III level, applicants must possess Supervisory Aptitude. Supervisory aptitude is the demonstration of aptitude or potential for the performance of supervisory duties through successful completion of regular or special assignments which involve some supervisory responsibilities or aspects of supervision, e.g., by serving as a group or team leader; or in similar work in which opportunities for demonstrating supervisory capabilities exist; or by the completion of training courses in supervision accompanied by application of supervisory skills in work assignments; and/or by favorable appraisals by a supervisor indicating the possession of supervisory potential.

**For the Vector Control Inspector V and VI levels, applicants must possess at least one (1) year of Supervisory Experience.

Substitutions Allowed

Graduation from an accredited four (4) year college or university with a bachelor's degree in chemistry, biology or a closely related science may be substituted for one (1) year of Specialized Experience.

Quality of Experience

Possession of the required number of years of experience will not in itself be accepted as proof of qualification for a position. The applicant's overall experience must have been of such scope and level of responsibility as to conclusively

demonstrate that he/she has the ability to perform the duties of the position for which he/she is being considered.

Selective Certification

Specialized knowledge, skills and abilities may be required to perform the duties of some positions. For such positions, Selective Certification Requirements may be established and certification may be restricted to eligibles who possess the pertinent experience and/or training required to perform the duties of the position.

Agencies requesting selective certification must show the connection between the kind of training and/or experience on which they wish to base selective certification and the duties of the position to be filled.

Tests

Applicants may be required to qualify on an appropriate examination.

Physical and Medical Requirements

Applicants must be able to perform the essential functions of the position effectively and safely, with or without reasonable accommodation.

This is an amendment to the minimum qualification specifications for the VECTOR CONTROL INSPECTOR series which were approved on May 16, 1973.
