for the Class:

CABINET MAKER I

Distinguishing Characteristics

This class reflects a journey level Cabinet Maker. Positions in this class perform skilled work in constructing, repairing and remodeling a wide variety of high grade wooden furniture and articles.

Examples of Duties: *(Positions may not be assigned all of the duties listed, nor do the examples necessarily include all of the duties that may be assigned. The omission of specific statements does not preclude the assignment of such duties if they are a logical assignment for the position. The classification of a position should not be based solely on the examples of duties performed.)*

Constructs, repairs and alters furniture and other articles, such as desks, tables, chairs, drawers, book cases, cabinets, window frames and doors; adjusts, sets up and operates wood working hand tools and machines including the shaper, saw, lathe, planer, router, jointer, mortiser, tenoner, molder and gainer; measures, cuts, and shapes parts from stock to proper size, shape and dimensions; cuts, trims and fits joints; assembles parts with glue, dowels, nails and screws; installs hardware such as hinges, catches and drawer pulls; installs window frames and doors; reads blueprints and sketches in laying out work; estimates time and material; replaces broken or missing parts with matched woods in repairing furniture; and may assign tasks to other cabinet makers.

Minimum Qualification Requirements

Training and Experience: A combination of education and experience substantially equivalent to successful completion of apprenticeship training or four (4) years of experience in carpentry work, one (1) year of which shall have been in cabinet making.

Knowledge of: Practices, tools, equipment, and materials used in cabinet making; qualities, uses and adaptability of woods and hardware; and occupational hazards and safety precautions of the trade.

Ability to: Set up, adjust and operate woodworking machines; use various hand and power tools; read, interpret and work from plans, blueprints, sketches and working


drawings; estimate time and material requirements; construct and repair high grade furniture and fine woodwork; work to close tolerances; and give and follow oral and written instructions.

Physical and Medical Requirements

Applicants must be able to perform the essential functions of the position effectively and safely, with or without reasonable accommodation.

This is an amendment to the specifications for the class CABINET MAKER I, which were approved on December 15, 1967.
