**REPORT SUBMITTED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO
THE 2011 LEGISLATURE PURSUANT TO H.C.R. 199,H.D. 1, ADOPTED BY
THE 2010 HAWAII STATE LEGISLATURE.**

H.C.R. 199, H.D. 1, requested that the Department of Human Services report the aggregate number of recipients receiving benefits under both QUEST and a private health care plan.

On June 30, 2010, there were 213,853 enrollees in the QUEST program. There were 15,006 recipients receiving QUEST benefits who also had a private health care plan.

This number reflects information reported to the Department by recipients and may not accurately reflect the total number with a private health care plan. Some states require that private health plans transmit enrollment information of their members to the state Medicaid agency so that Medicaid has this information and does not pay for services covered by a private health plan. Hawaii does not have such a law.
