In addition, if you have a legal interest that may be adversely affected by the proposed action, you may have a right to an administrative contested case hearing. You must make the request for such a hearing either orally or in writing at the public hearing or meeting for which this notice is given. Hawaii Administrative Rules (H.A.R.) Section 13-167-52(a). If you request a contested case hearing, you will have the opportunity to present to the Commission oral or written evidence or testimony or both to establish your standing. You may present your testimony or evidence on standing at the meeting or public hearing described above or, alternatively, at a hearing set by the Commission at a later date. If you request a contested case hearing either orally or in writing, you must also complete and file (or mail and postmark) a written petition for a contested case with the Commission within ten days after the date of the public hearing or meeting noticed here. Petition forms are available from the Commission. H.A.R. Section 13-167-52(a). If you do not make such a request or fail to file a timely written petition with the Commission, the consequence is that you will be precluded from later obtaining a contested case hearing and seeking judicial review of any adverse decision. H.A.R. Chapter 13-167.
