TESTIMONY OF BURT SAKATA

1. This testimony is provided in support of Surface Water Use Permit Application ("SWUPA") No. 2334, for existing uses, filed with the Commission on Water Resource Management on April 23, 2009, for four parcels in Waihe'e, Tax Map Key ("TMK") Nos. (2) 3-2-005:011 ("Parcel 11"), (2) 3-2-005:013 ("Parcel 13"), (2) 3-2-005:019 ("Parcel 19"), and (2) 3-2-005:039 ("Parcel 39") and SWUPA No. 2335-N, for new uses, also filed with the Commission on Water Resource Management on April 23, 2009, for three parcels in Waihe'e, including Parcel 13, TMK No. (2) 3-2-005:015 ("Parcel 15"), and TMK No. (2) 3-2-005:017 ("Parcel 17").

2. The domestic water use on this property is a protected public trust purpose.

3. The deed to Parcels 15 and 19 contains a reservation of appurtenant rights. I understand that because of this reservation, the appurtenant water rights may be extinguished for

Parcels 15 and 19. Nevertheless, as stated in my application, I reserve the right to claim appurtenant water rights. Therefore, in the event of a legal determination that these appurtenant rights were not extinguished, I am providing further information regarding water use at the time of the Māhele.

4. Parcels 11, 13, 17, and 39 have been in my family for generations, and I have no evidence, indication, or other reason to believe that our appurtenant rights to Parcels 11, 13, 17, or 39 were reserved.

5. Based on the information set forth below, I request recognition of appurtenant rights for TMK Nos. (2) 3-2-005:011, :013, :015, :017, :019, and :039 in the amount of 2,543,100 gallons per day. I request a Surface Water Use Permit for my current and future reasonable-beneficial uses for TMK Nos. (2) 3-2-005:011, :013, :015, :017, :019, and :039 of 384,354 gallons per day, of which 4,254 gallons per day was the existing use on April 30, 2008.

QUANTIFICATION OF APPURTENANT RIGHTS

A. QUANTIFICATION OF APPURTENANT RIGHTS ON PARCEL 11

6. Parcel 11 is 0.07 acres and is a pō'alima of Land Commission Award ("LCA") No. 7713:24 to Kamamalu, confirmed by Royal Patent (R.P.) No. 4475. I am attaching various Māhele documents that confirm water use on TMK No. (2) 3-2-005:011 at the time of the Māhele. The pō'alima is bordered to the north by LCA No. 4405-V:1 & 2 to Wahalua, to the south and west by LCA No. 7686 to Kawaa, and to the east by LCA No. 4444:3 to Kaahu.

7. Attached as "2334-SAKATA-1" is a true and correct copy of LCA No. 4405-V.

8. The LCA map for LCA No. 4405-V in 2334-SAKATA-1 indicates 'āpana 1 & 2 is bordered to the south by the pō'alima that is now Parcel 11.

9. Attached as “2334-SAKATA-2” is a true and correct copy of LCA No. 7686 to Kawaa, the original and translated native testimony in support of LCA No. 7686, and a translation of the native register.

10. The LCA map for LCA No. 7686 in 2334-SAKATA-2 indicates the location of the pō‘alima that is now Parcel 11 on the north side of LCA No. 7686.

11. Attached as “2334-SAKATA-3” are true and correct copies of LCA No. 4444 to Kaahu and original and transcribed foreign testimony for LCA No. 4444.

12. The LCA map for ‘āpana 3 of LCA No. 4444 in 2334-SAKATA-3 indicates ‘āpana 3 is bordered to the west by the pō‘alima that is now Parcel 11.

13. The documents in 2334-SAKATA-1 through 2334-SAKATA-3 prove Parcel 11 was a pō‘alima at the time of the Māhele.

14. I understand that pō‘alima were cultivated 100% in wetland kalo at the time of the Māhele.

15. Based on the documents indicating that Parcel 11 was a pō‘alima at the time of the Māhele, Parcel 11 has appurtenant rights and the quantification of the appurtenant rights is the amount of water sufficient to grow wetland kalo on 0.07 acres using traditional methods.

B. QUANTIFICATION OF APPURTENANT RIGHTS ON PARCEL 15

16. Parcel 15 is 0.03 acres and is part of a pō‘alima of LCA No. 7713:24 to Kamamalu. I am attaching various Māhele documents that confirm water use on TMK No. (2) 3-2-005:015 at the time of the Māhele. The pō‘alima is bordered to the east by LCA No. 4444:1 to Kaahu and to the south by LCA No. 4444-B to Keapu.

17. Attached as “2334-SAKATA-4” is a true and correct copy of LCA No. 4444-B, and the original and transcribed foreign testimony in support of LCA No. 4444-B.

18. The LCA map for LCA No. 4444-B in 2334-SAKATA-4 indicates the parcel is bordered to the north by “po 5”, or the pō‘alima that is now Parcel 15.

19. Attached as “2334-SAKATA-5” is a true and correct copy of LCA No. 4405-LL to Laupahulu, and the original and translated native testimony supporting LCA No. 4405-LL.

20. The LCA map for ‘āpana 3 of LCA No. 4405-LL in 2334-SAKATA-5 shows the entire western border of ‘āpana 3 is shared with the pō‘alima that is now Parcel 15.

21. The documents in 2334-SAKATA-4 and 2334-SAKATA-5 prove that Parcel 15 was a pō‘alima at the time of the Māhele.

22. Based on the documents indicating that Parcel 15 was a pō‘alima at the time of the Māhele, Parcel 15 has appurtenant rights and the quantification of the appurtenant rights is the amount of water sufficient to grow wetland kalo on 0.03 acres using traditional methods.

C. QUANTIFICATION OF APPURTENANT RIGHTS ON PARCEL 39

23. Parcel 39 is 0.11 acres and is comprised of a pō‘alima of LCA No. 7713:24 to Kamamalu. I am attaching various Māhele documents that confirm water use on TMK No. (2) 3-2-005:039 at the time of the Māhele.

24. The pō‘alima is bordered to the north by LCA No. 4405-V:1 & 2, as indicated by the LCA map for ‘āpana 1 & 2 of LCA No. 4405-V in 2334-SAKATA-1, and to the east by LCA No. 7686, as indicated by the LCA map for LCA No. 7686 in 2334-SAKATA-2.

25. The documents in 2334-SAKATA-1 and 2334-SAKATA-2 prove that Parcel 39 was a pō‘alima at the time of the Māhele.

26. Based on the documents indicating that Parcel 39 was a pō‘alima at the time of the Mahele, Parcel 39 has appurtenant rights and the quantification of the appurtenant rights is the amount of water sufficient to grow wetland kalo on 0.11 acres using traditional methods.

D. QUANTIFICATION OF APPURTENANT RIGHTS ON PARCEL 13

27. Parcel 13 is 0.61 acres and is wholly comprised of LCA No. 7686:1, confirmed by R.P. No. 6284. I am attaching various Māhele documents that confirm water use on TMK No. (2) 3-2-005:013 at the time of the Māhele.

28. The documents in 2334-SAKATA-2 relating to LCA No. 7686 indicate 'āpana 1 in the 'ili of Papaina included eleven lo'i kalo, "some small kulas," and a house lot. Given the existence of rock walls and the high concentration of lo'i kalo in this area, I believe the majority of the parcel was lo'i kalo, with only small areas of dryland cultivation on the lo'i banks. Based on the common house lot size at the time of the Māhele (0.25 acres), I estimate the amount of land cultivated in wetland kalo was 0.36 acres (0.61 total acres – 0.25 acres for house lot).

29. Based on the Māhele documents in 2334-SAKATA-2, Parcel 13 has appurtenant rights and the quantification of the appurtenant rights is the amount of water sufficient to grow wetland kalo on 0.36 acres using traditional methods and for one house lot.

E. QUANTIFICATION OF APPURTENANT RIGHTS ON PARCEL 17

30. Parcel 17 is 0.81 acres and is comprised of the entirety of LCA No. 3770-B:1 to Paiki, confirmed by R.P. No. 8066; the entirety of LCA No. 4444-B to Keapu, confirmed by R.P. 8065; and the entirety of LCA No. 4444:1 to Kaahu, confirmed by R.P. 6380. I am attaching various Māhele documents that confirm water use on TMK No. (2) 3-2-005:017 at the time of the Māhele.

31. Attached as "2334-SAKATA-6" are true and correct copies of LCA No. 3770-B:1 to Paiki, and the original and translated native register in support of LCA No. 3770. Although the attached copy of the original LCA No. 3770-B is labeled 3770, it is mislabeled and should be labeled LCA No. 3770-B. The shape of 'āpana 1 drawn on LCA No. 3770 matches the shape of

the parcel on the TMK map labeled LCA 3770-B:1. Therefore, the attached LCA No. 3770 is the correct document for LCA No. 3770-B 'āpana 1, located within Parcel 17.

32. The documents in 2334-SAKATA-3, 2334-SAKATA-4, and 2334-SAKATA-6 confirm that Parcel 17, in the 'ili of Papaina, was cultivated in wetland kalo: the native register in support of LCA No. 3770-B in 2334-SAKATA-6 states that 'āpana 1 was in lo'i kalo at the time of the Māhele; the foreign testimony in support of LCA No. 4444-B in 2334-SAKATA-4 states there were four taro patches on the parcel; and the foreign testimony in support of LCA No. 4444 in 2334-SAKATA-3 states that 'āpana 1 contained five taro patches at the time of the Māhele. Also, Parcel 17 contains ancient rock walls that were clearly ancient lo'i. Based on the Māhele documents in 2334-SAKATA-3, 2334-SAKATA-4, and 2334-SAKATA-6, Parcel 17 has appurtenant rights and the quantification of the appurtenant rights is the amount of water sufficient to grow wetland kalo on 0.81 acres using traditional methods.

F. QUANTIFICATION OF APPURTENANT RIGHTS ON PARCEL 19

33. Parcel 19 is 12.341 acres. Parcel 19 includes a portion of LCA No. 7713:24 to Kamamalu and eight pō'alima of LCA No. 7713:24. The rest of the parcel is comprised of: the entirety of LCA No. 3434:1 & :2, confirmed by R.P. No. 4930; a portion of LCA No. 3510:1, confirmed by R.P. No. 4118; the entirety of LCA No. 3515, confirmed by R.P. No. 4095; the entirety of LCA No. 3886-B:1, confirmed by R.P. No. 5991; the entirety of LCA No. 3997, confirmed by R.P. No. 6075; the entirety of LCA No. 4284:2, confirmed by R.P. No. 3657; the entirety of LCA No. 4303 & 4304:2, :3, confirmed by R.P. No. 5358; the entirety of LCA No. 4304-B:1, confirmed by R.P. No. 4893; the entirety of LCA No. 4405-FF:1, confirmed by R.P. No. 5402; the entirety of LCA No. 4405-LL:1 & :2, confirmed by R.P. No. 5986; the entirety of LCA No. 4417:1, confirmed by R.P. No. 4116; LCA No. 4438-B:1.1 & 1.2; a portion of LCA

No. 4440, confirmed by R.P. No. 4094; and the entirety of LCA No. 8365-B:2. I am attaching various Māhele documents that confirm water use on TMK No. (2) 3-2-005:019 at the time of the Māhele. I am also including a TMK map of the parcel that indicates the location of the pō'alima, each LCA, the diversions from the 'auwai, and the existing uses on the property.

34. Attached as "2334-SAKATA-7" are true and correct copies of LCA No. 3434:1 & :2 to Kaaamakua and the original and translated native testimony supporting LCA No. 3434:1 & :2.

35. Attached as "2334-SAKATA-8" are true and correct copies of LCA No. 3510:1 to Kaakina and the original foreign testimony supporting LCA No. 3510:1.

36. Attached as "2334-SAKATA-9" are true and correct copies of LCA No. 3515 to Kuamoo and the original foreign testimony supporting LCA No. 3515.

37. Attached as "2334-SAKATA-10" are true and correct copies of LCA No. 3886-B:1 to Napela and the original foreign testimony supporting LCA No. 3886-B.

38. Attached as "2334-SAKATA-11" are true and correct copies of LCA No. 3997 to Heulu and the original foreign testimony supporting LCA No. 3997.

39. Attached as "2334-SAKATA-12" are true and correct copies of LCA No. 4284:2 to Kekumoku and the original foreign testimony supporting LCA No. 4284.

40. Attached as "2334-SAKATA-13" are true and correct copies of LCA No. 4303 & 4304:2, :3 to Kekahuna and the original foreign testimony supporting LCA No. 4303 & 4304.

41. Attached as "2334-SAKATA-14" are true and correct copies of LCA No. 4304-B:1 to Maikaaloa and the original foreign testimony supporting LCA No. 4304-B. The TMK map incorrectly identifies this parcel as LCA No. 3404-B:1.

42. Attached as “2334-SAKATA-15” are true and correct copies of LCA No. 4405-FF to Ku and the foreign testimony (both the original and a transcription) supporting LCA No. 4405-FF.

43. Attached as “2334-SAKATA-16” are true and correct copies of LCA No. 4417:1 to Keoili and the original foreign testimony supporting LCA No. 4417.

44. Attached as “2334-SAKATA-17” are true and correct copies of LCA Nos. 4438-B to Kekaula and the original foreign testimony supporting LCA No. 4438-B.

45. Attached as “2334-SAKATA-18” are true and correct copies of LCA No. 4440 to Keino and the original foreign testimony supporting LCA No. 4440.

46. Attached as “2334-SAKATA-19” are true and correct copies of LCA No. 8365-B:2 to Kalua and the original foreign testimony supporting LCA No. 8365-B. Although the attached copy of the original LCA No. 8365-B is labeled 8365, it is mislabeled and should be labeled LCA No. 8365-B. The shape of ‘āpana 2 drawn on LCA No. 8365 matches the shape of the parcel on the TMK map labeled LCA 8365-B:2. The surrounding parcels also support that LCA No. 8365-B:2 is the correct LCA number for this parcel. 2334-SAKATA-19 shows that LCA 4417:1 is bordered to the east by land granted to Kalua. Similarly, 2334-SAKATA-4 referring to LCA No. 4444-B shows the parcel is bordered to the south by land granted to Kalua. 2334-SAKATA-5, referring to LCA No. 4405-LL also states ‘āpana 2 is bordered to the west by land granted to Kalua. Finally, 2334-SAKATA-17, referring to LCA No. 4405-FF, indicates the parcel is bordered to the north by land granted to Kalua. Taken together, these LCAs show the land marked as LCA No. 8365-B on the TMK map is the same as ‘āpana 2 in the LCA labeled LCA No. 8365. Therefore, the attached LCA No. 8365 is the correct document for LCA No. 8365-B ‘āpana 2, located within Parcel 19.

47. Attached as “2334-SAKATA-20” is a true and correct copy of the TMK map for Parcel 19 with our diversion points and areas of water use marked.

48. Attached as “2334-SAKATA-21” is a true and correct copy of the TMK map for Parcels 11, 13,17, 15, 19, and 39.

49. 2334-SAKATA-20 and 2334-SAKATA-21 indicate the location of pō‘alima and LCAs within Parcel 19.

50. The documents in 2334-SAKATA-5 and 2334-SAKATA-7 through 2334-SAKATA-21, referring to LCA Nos. 3434:1 & 2, 3510:1, 3515, 3886-B:1, 3997, 4284, 4303 & 4304:2 & 3, 4304-B:1, 4405-FF:1, 4405-LL:1 & 2, 4417:1, 4438-B:1.1 & 1.2, 4440, and 8365-B:2, confirm that Parcel 19 was cultivated primarily in wetland kalo at the time of the Māhele, with one house lot.

51. The native testimony in support of LCA No. 3434 in 2334-SAKATA-7 states that all three ‘āpana were “taro sections” and that ‘āpana 2 included 7 pō‘alima. The LCA map for LCA No. 3434 in 2334-SAKATA-7 also depicts a pō‘alima on the western border of ‘āpana 1 and a second pō‘alima in the southeastern corner of ‘āpana 2. These two pō‘alima are currently within Parcel 19.

52. The foreign testimony in support of LCA No. 3510 in 2334-SAKATA-8 states that there were nine lo‘i kalo in ‘āpana 1 at the time of the Māhele.

53. The foreign testimony in support of LCA No. 3515 in 2334-SAKATA-9 states the parcel was “one piece of kalo land.” The LCA map for LCA No. 3515 in 2334-SAKATA-9 also depicts a pō‘alima on the northwestern corner and a second pō‘alima in the southwestern corner of the parcel. These two pō‘alima are currently within Parcel 19.

54. The foreign testimony in support of LCA No. 3886-B in 2334-SAKATA-10 states ‘āpana 1 was a “moo of kalo.” A mo‘o is a narrow strip of land, smaller than an ‘ili. The LCA map for LCA No. 3886-B in 2334-SAKATA-10 also depicts a pō‘alima within ‘āpana 1. This pō‘alima is currently within Parcel 19.

55. The foreign testimony in support of LCA No. 3997 in 2334-SAKATA-11 states the “land consist[ed] of one piece of kalo.” The LCA map for LCA No. 3997 in 2334-SAKATA-11 also depicts a pō‘alima (“po 5.”) on the northwestern border of the parcel. This pō‘alima is currently within Parcel 19.

56. The foreign testimony in support of LCA No. 4284 in 2334-SAKATA-12 states ‘āpana 2 was “10 loi in the ili of Paukauila”. The LCA map for LCA No. 4284 in 2334-SAKATA-12 also depicts the same pō‘alima on the western border of ‘āpana 2 that is depicted in LCA No. 3434.

57. The foreign testimony in support of LCA No. 4303 & 4304 in 2334-SAKATA-13 states ‘āpana 2 contained “a section of kalo and house lot” and ‘āpana 3 was “one loi[.]” The LCA map for LCA No. 4303 & 4304 in 2334-SAKATA-13 also depicts a pō‘alima on the western border and a second pō‘alima on the eastern border of the parcel. These two pō‘alima are also depicted in LCA No. 3434:1 and LCA Nos. 3434:2 and 4284:2.

58. The foreign testimony in support of LCA No. 4304-B in 2334-SAKATA-14 states the land “consist[ed] of one piece of kalo and kula land[.]”

59. The foreign testimony in support of LCA No. 4405-FF in 2334-SAKATA-15 states that there were “9 taro patches” at the time of the Māhele.

60. The native testimony in support of LCA No. 4405-LL in 2334-SAKATA-5 states that ‘āpana 1 was a “patch pauku,” which I understand to mean an area of lo‘i kalo, and ‘āpana 2 contained “5 taro patches.”

61. The foreign testimony in support of LCA No. 4417 in 2334-SAKATA-16 indicates that ‘āpana 1 was a “moo of kalo,” which I understand to mean an area of lo‘i kalo. The LCA map for LCA No. 4417 in 2334-SAKATA-16 also depicts a pō‘alima within ‘āpana 1 and a second pō‘alima on the western border of ‘āpana 1. These two pō‘alima are currently within Parcel 19.

62. The foreign testimony in support of 4438-B in 2334-SAKATA-17 indicates that ‘āpana 1, mahele 1 and mahele 2 was a “section of loi in Mookahi.”

63. The foreign testimony in support of LCA No. 4440 in 2334-SAKATA-18 states the land was a “piece of kalo and kula land[.]”

64. The foreign testimony in support of LCA No. 8365-B in 2334-SAKATA-19 states that the land consisted of “one piece of kalo and kula land in the ili of Makaaka.”

65. 2334-SAKATA-20 indicates approximately 5 acres of Parcel 19 are comprised of lands from LCA No. 7713:24 to Kamamalu.

66. 2334-SAKATA-7, 2334-SAKATA -9 through 2334-SAKATA-13, 2334-SAKATA-16, and 2334-SAKATA-20 also establish the eight pō‘alima on Parcel 19.

67. Based on the Māhele documents in 2334-SAKATA-7 through 2334-SAKATA-20 and 2334-SAKATA-5, Parcel 19 has appurtenant rights. The quantification of the appurtenant rights is the amount of water sufficient to grow wetland kalo on 7.091 acres (total acreage of Parcel 19 is $12.341 - 0.25$ acres (one house lot, which were commonly 0.25 acres each) = 12.091

acres – 5.0 acres (the area of land attributed to LCA No. 7713:24) = 7.091 acres) using traditional methods, plus the amount of water for one house lot.

G. TOTAL QUANTIFIED APPURTENANT RIGHT

68. It is my understanding that, on average, taking into account fallow lo'i and uncultivated areas such as banks between lo'i, healthy wetland kalo requires between 100,000 and 300,000 gallons of water per acre per day ("gad"), and that areas with greater proportions of lo'i in cultivation will require an amount closer to the upper end of this range.

69. It is my understanding that 600 gallons per household per day is the Maui County water standard for domestic water use.

70. Based on the above calculations, Parcels 11, 15, and 39 have appurtenant rights and the quantification of the appurtenant rights is the amount of water sufficient to grow wetland kalo on 0.21 acres. Parcel 13 has appurtenant rights and the quantification of the appurtenant rights is the amount of water sufficient to grow kalo on 0.36 acres, plus the amount of water for one house lot. Parcel 17 has appurtenant rights and the quantification of the appurtenant rights is the amount of water sufficient to grow kalo on 0.81 acres, plus the amount of water for one house lot. Parcel 19 has appurtenant rights and the quantification of the appurtenant rights is the amount of water sufficient to grow kalo on 7.091 acres, plus the amount of water for one house lot. Thus, all of my land has appurtenant rights and the quantification of the appurtenant rights is the amount of water sufficient to grow wetland kalo on 8.471 acres using traditional methods, plus the amount of water for three house lots.

71. Thus, in my best estimation, the water rights appurtenant to TMK No. (2) 3-2-005:011, :013, :015, :017, :019, and :039 is 2,543,100 gallons per day ("gpd") (8.471 acres x 300,000 gad) + (3 house lots X 600 gpd).

AMOUNT REQUESTED UNDER PERMIT

72. Currently, I receive water from the kuleana 'auwai on the south side of Waihe'e River, which receives water from a pipe in the Spreckels Ditch. The pipe empties into an open 'auwai. I divert some of the water through several intakes on Parcels 17 and 39 to irrigate my non-commercial garden, which includes banana, fruit trees (including mango and citrus), hō'i'o, and tropical flowers. The rest of the water flows through the open ditch back to the South Waihe'e Kuleana 'auwai.

73. I estimated that on April 30, 2008, I was using about 4,254 gpd for my non-commercial, domestic garden on about 1.248 acres on Parcels 11, 13, 19, and 39.

74. My existing water use is not gauged. We estimated our existing water use for our noncommercial gardening by multiplying the net acreage of parcels 11, 19, and 39 (0.01, 1.12, and 0.088, respectively) that we had in bananas, fruit trees (including mangos and citrus), ho'i'o, and tropical flowers on April 30, 2008, by the 2002 State of Hawai'i Water System Standard for Maui County of 3000 gallons per acre per day for a total of 3,654 gpd (1.218 acres x 3000 gad).

75. Parcel 13 is also entitled to 600 gpd per single family home or house lot, according to the 2002 State of Hawai'i Water System Standard for Maui County, as I use water outside my home on Parcel 13 for gardening, including our hō'i'o, tropical flowers, etc.

76. Based on this information, I estimate my existing water use for parcels 11, 13, 19 and 39 as 4,254 gallons per day.

77. We formerly cultivated wetland kalo in the ancient lo'i throughout the various parcels; however, there was not enough water to cultivate kalo on my land without affecting my neighbors' use of the water downstream. If there was enough water for all of the kuleana users, I

would restore 1.267 acres of ancient lo'i kalo on Parcels 13, 15, and 17. The kalo would be used for my personal and for sharing with my 'ohana and neighbors.

78. In addition to the amount requested for my domestic garden, I am requesting a permit for the amount of water necessary to irrigate 1.267 acres of lo'i kalo, which, based on the water duty for kalo, is 380,100 gpd (1.267 acres x 300,000 gad).

79. Although I am not seeking a separate water allocation for my diversified agriculture, I intend to use some of the water used to cultivate kalo, after it flows through my lo'i, to irrigate approximately 12 acres of macadamia nut trees on our land. Based on a water duty of 2,500 gad (the amount the Water Commission allocated to diversified agriculture in the Waiāhole decision), we estimate about 30,000 gpd of the 380,100 gpd will be applied to our mac nuts. All water that remains after seepage into the aquifer would be returned to the South Waihe'e Kuleana 'auwai.

80. Based on the existing water use on Parcels 11, 13, 19, and 39 of 4,254 gpd and the desired new water use of 380,100 gpd, I request a water use permit in the amount of 384,354 gpd for my current and future uses (4,254 gpd + 380,100 gpd).

REASONABLE-BENEFICIAL ANALYSIS

81. "Reasonable-beneficial use" is defined as "the use of water in such a quantity as is necessary for economic and efficient utilization, for a purpose, and in a manner which is both reasonable and consistent with the state and county land use plans and public interest." Hawai'i Revised Statutes § 174C-3.

82. My existing and proposed use of water is "economic and efficient" because I only use the amount I need to irrigate my diversified agriculture and would only use the amount

needed to cultivate kalo on a limited portion of my land and only for personal use. My application is for an existing and new use on land zoned for agriculture.

83. The use of stream water to irrigate lo'i kalo and diversified agriculture is also consistent with the state and county land use plans and the public interest. My land is classified by the State as agricultural, and zoned by the County as agricultural. The water use on my land for domestic cultivation is in the public interest and fulfills a public trust purpose.

84. The quantity of water I am requesting is necessary for the irrigation of healthy lo'i kalo, my non-commercial garden, which includes banana, fruit trees (including mango and citrus), hō'i'o, and tropical flowers, and diversified agriculture, including macadamia nut trees.

ALTERNATIVES ANALYSIS

85. Because my land has appurtenant rights to stream water, I am not required to provide an alternatives analysis to show that I have no practicable alternative source of water. My appurtenant right is for stream water, not for water from any other source, and my exercise of this right enjoys maximum protection and first priority under the law.

86. Nonetheless, the Alternatives Analysis set forth in SWUPA No. 2334 and SWUPA No. 2335N remains applicable, true, and correct; that is, there are no practicable alternatives. An alternative water source that would require me to pay for the volumes of constantly flowing water for lo'i kalo necessary to keep temperatures cool and support healthy kalo, would make such a practice economically impossible. I would effectively be denied my appurtenant rights.

SUMMARY

87. In sum: (1) my domestic water use is a protected public trust purpose; (2) the exercise of my appurtenant right is a protected public trust purpose; (3) because I have

appurtenant rights for Parcels 11, 13, 17, and 39, I am entitled to at least 406,200 gpd; (4) if appurtenant rights survived the deed's reservation for TMK Nos. (2) 3-2-005:015 and (2) 3-2-005:019, I am entitled to at least 2,136,900 gpd; (5) at this time, I request a permit for my reasonable-beneficial uses on my land of 384,354 gallons per day, to irrigate diversified agriculture and a non-commercial garden and so I can restore some of the ancient lo'i on my property, which are alone and cumulatively a reasonable-beneficial use of stream water, and for which there is no practicable alternative.

I, BURT SAKATA, do declare under penalty of law that the foregoing is true and correct.
