





Parcels 1,2,3 from Kapupuu in 1842. Parcel 4 was from her makuahine in the same year. Parcel 5 from Kamakaipooa before the death of Nahienaena in 1836. The sweet potato parcels at Waiohuli in Kula were from Kole in 1844. Parcel 8 from Kuihewa in 1845. It was Kuihewa’s ancient land received from Kapohaku. No opposition. Kaai returned these lo’i for Haawahine. He swore on the Holy Bible to return them to Haa.




